Charges filed against Tyson Foods for fish kill

After meetings with the City of Monett and the Department of Natural Resources and the Missouri Conservation Department, Missouri Attorney General Chris Koster moved forward with a lawsuit against Tyson Foods in Monett for the chemical dump that resulted in a huge fish kill in Clear Creek.

The incident began May 16 when a pretreatment operator unknowingly began releasing a truckload of ALI-MET, a liquid feed additive, into the sewer system. While the pretreatment operator claimed that the chemical was only released for five to ten minutes, the result was over 100,000 fish being killed in a 4.5 mile stretch of the creek between Monett and Pierce City.

The untreated chemical industrial wastewater overwhelmed the wastewater treatment facility in Monett, allowing a high concentration of ammonia to be released into the creek. Tyson has placed ads in various lo-

cal newspapers apologizing to the citizens of the area for the mistake.

Koster stated, "Missouri's waterways are among our state's most important natural resources. Tyson's conduct threatened the vitality of Clear Creek as a resource for Southwest Missouri. Tyson Foods must be held accountable for dumping pollution into the waterways of Southwest Missouri, and this conduct must not happen again."

The lawsuit against Tyson includes six counts against the plant for pollution of state waters and violations of Missouri's hazardous waste laws. Koster is seeking compensation for the damage to the stream as well as reimbursement for the state's costs during the investigation.

Koster is not seeking criminal penalties because there was no evidence that the company intentionally released the chemical. However, Tyson Foods faces civil penalties of up to \$10,000 per day for the span of May 19 through May 29.

Cassville Police Dept. approved for new vehicle

At last week's Cassville City Council meeting, the aldermen approved a bid for a new police vehicle to be utilized by the Cassville Police Department. The new vehicle, a 2015 Ford Interceptor Utility AWD, will replace the force's 2010 Dodge Charger

Currently, the Cassville Police Department has access to seven different vehicles that are used by the 11 officers. Two of the vehicles have over 100,000 miles on them, including an old City vehicle used by the Internet Crimes Against Children Investigator and a donated Impala.

At any given time, the department uses three vehicles for patrol with others used as needed for investigators. Like many police departments are finding, Cassville has been leaning toward SUVs in their new vehicle purchases primarily because newer sedans are much smaller than older models, making it difficult to modify them for police use with a cage in the back and room for equipment. However, the

new Interceptor is an all-

wheel drive sedan designed specifically for police use.

According to Chief Dana Kammerlohr, "We try to replace one vehicle a year to keep the mileage down. Once you reach over 100,000 miles, the value does down on trade or sale and also, there is more maintenance on these high mileage cars."

This year's budget included funds designated specifically for a new vehicle to replace the Charger which has 95,058 miles and is bringing \$6,250 in trade-in value. The department sought bids from both the state and local Ford dealership Les Jacobs. The difference between the bids was \$99, but when considering the amount spent on gas and officers' time to go pick up a vehicle in Columbia, the Council voted to accept the bid of \$26,649 offered by Les Jacobs.

Kammerlohr stated, "The Department's goal is to have dependable vehicles for the officers." Currently, the rotation plan for vehicles in the department is to keep each patrol unit for three years. Usually, the units are trav-

E911 budget to include upgrades, vehicle

At the quarterly meeting of the Barry County E9-1-1 Board, the group passed the 2014-2015 budget for the center which included upgrades to their systems and a new vehicle.

Mike Phillips, E9-1-1 director, stated, "For the most part, the budget is the same as in previous years. Most of the time, budgets increase about one percent each year, but I chose to leave it as it was. The only differences will be some of the upgrades the Center needs." The budget for the year is set at \$1,378,300, a jump from 2013-2014's \$1.038 million due to special projects.

The funding for E9-1-1 comes from a 3/8 cent sales tax from throughout the county, an amount that the board decided to hold steady for the upcoming year which runs July 1, 2014, through June 30, 2014. For this year's budget, the estimated tax revenue is \$1.35 million, a slightly more conservative estimate from last year's approximate \$1.37 million. Phillips stated, "I

prefer to lean to the more conservative side of the tax estimates."

While the budget is close to the same, the primary differences are a \$30,000 increase for a new vehicle, \$12,000 for flooring maintenance, \$30,000 for a loan refinance, two new full time personnel, and \$50,000 for recording system upgrades. Phillips said, "At this time, we have no way to record emails or text messages, and that change is coming. Eventually, it will be a requirement, and we want to be prepared. We just started replacing different systems last year, so most of the equipment we use is seven years old." Phillips estimated that it'll still be a couple years before Barry County will be

able to receive 911 texts.

Phillips said the new vehicle for the department is needed primarily due to training. He stated, "When we have state-wide training, it is at Lake of the Ozarks. The vehicle we have now only gets 17 to 18 miles per gallon. Then while we are gone, no mapping or ad-

dressing can be done because the only vehicle is gone. It's creating conflicts once or twice a month where someone has to wait for their addressing for up to two weeks because there isn't another vehicle. For people in the county, that's a problem. They can't have utilities or financing until they have an address, and we are the ones to do that."

Phillips is looking at more fuel efficient options for the Center that can transport five people and luggage for training. E9-1-1 won't be trading in their existing vehicle, but maintaining it until maintenance issues arise.

Finally, the center is also refinancing their building loan which will result in a \$200,000 saving of the life of the loan. When the building was constructed seven years ago, it was purchased under a 20 year loan. The refinance will be done through Commerce Bank for a 13 year loan at 2.96 percent interest on the remaining \$1.8 million. Payments will decrease from \$198,000 per year to \$185,000 to \$190,000.

New commissioners for Mineral Rd. Dist.

After two of the three Mineral Road District commissioners resigned, The Barry County Commissioners have appointed two new commissioners in hopes of satisfying district residents and keeping the road district in action.

Around 15 people showed up the County Commissioners' chambers on Monday, June 16, to request new appointments to the road district after Jerry Craig and Cary Cheek resigned. The only remaining road district commissioner was Jenise Isley, who was elected in April's general election. According to state statutes, if only one district commissioner remains and the district is inactive, the County Commissioners can absorb the

district into county responsibility.

On Thursday, June 18, the County Commissioners Cherry Warren, Gary Schad and Wayne Hendrix appointed Ron Stricklin and Bill Stednitz to fill the two open seats on the Mineral Road District. Warren stated, "We tried to choose appointments with equal distribution in

The sale will be on Friday and Saturday beginning at 7 a.m. at The Point, located on Highway 76 in Cassville.



Jury returns guilty verdict for Summers

After a three-day jury trial, Sandy Nicole Summers, of Exeter, was found guilty of assault in the 3rd degree, a class C misdemeanor, for an assault that occurred in 2011.

According to statements of probable cause, Barry County Sheriff's Deputy James D. Stepp, responded to a call of an assault on July 31, 2011 near Farm Road 2170 in Exeter. Sandy Summers and the victim, C.H., were engaged in mutual combat with the victim at the edge of both parties' properties.

The trial began on May 14, with the guilty verdict returned on May 16. Judge Robert Foulke sentenced Summers to a \$500 fine for the event. The case was sealed until June 18 until Foulke reduced the security. Thus far, no appeal has been made in the case.







ocal student creates new photo software

Alex Filatov, Oakwood Christian School director

Nathaniel Heston, a 17 year old Java programmer, created the product NomenChanger, a program that displays, renames and organizes up to 3,500 digital photos in less than an hour. Last week, Heston brought the NomenChanger concept to the point of product testing after about four months of hard coding.

NomenChanger is a multi-platform program. It is written entirely in Java. NomenChanger is taken from two words, Latin and English, meaning simply, "name changer."

Heston created a name for his new software line called Hillbilly Technology. The number one goal of Hillbilly Technology is its ease of use. Two big, bare feet, crossed at the ankle, are the trademark of the software. "What," said Heston, "is more basic than bare feet." Grinning, he continues his sales pitch, "No extra layers. . . Your toes can breathe. When you kick your shoes off, it means you're comfortable, done with work. And, any Arkansas Hillbilly would say, 'Don't like my feet, I don't care. I didn't take them (shoes) off for you, and I won't put 'em back on for you either.' It's simple. Just like my software, it must be simple, easy to use. No apologies."

Nathaniel continued, "A lot of the people I talk to say that computer software is complex and confusing. Look at MS Office, you have to take a class. A class? And afterward, you still can't stop the program from attack-editing your work." Nathaniel continued, "I want my programs to be

that easy to use, something my grandparents won't be afraid to use."

Nathaniel began his work on the NomenChanger project shortly after graduation in December 2013. He got the idea from hearing his father complain about sorting family pictures one day. "Dad had counted the number of clicks needed to rename one of the thousands of family photos. 'Select, view, close, select, rename, click to focus, type the new name, and click Okay to finish.' Then, do it again 10,000 times more. I just rolled it all up into one big click. Now dad is happy."

After Heston built the program, "Testing was humiliating," he said. "I got people I knew to be my critics. My sisters are merciless in their pursuit of perfect. Of course, there were a few mistakes, Heston explained.

Angela, the second of Nathaniel's three sisters jokingly said, "At the beginning, even his error messages had errors. He was always a little different; he is, after all, one boy among three girls, but he really has a good product and has made us all very proud."

Heston's father Frank, the past administrator of Oakwood Christian School said, "Nate's program is surprisingly simple and yet sophisticated underneath. It really makes sense of thousands of pictures, mountains of unsorted, untitled pictures taken over years and years, in an a relatively short time. I like it."

Product testing began at 9:30 p.m., Saturday, June 14, 2014, after final coding was completed. Various types of computers will try find errors in the program over the next few weeks. All functions will be systematically checked before making the product available for mass use. Heston hopes to get his product to market as early as this Summer 2014.

"I wanted to be a programmer when I was a sophmore at Oakwood Christian School," replied Heston when asked about the beginnings of programming. "My mom is my inspiration. She is a super computer analyst at J. B. Hunt. I grew up under her desk in my baby seat. I didn't really know I would be good at programming until the last year or so. And, I still have a lot to learn, but I really like what I do."

The young programmer graduated from Oakwood Christian School in December 2013 at age 16. He has worked as software developer for Oakwood Christian School since 2012. He developed a project linking bar codes on the back of the Oakwood Student ID's to a Time and Attendance program he helped create. In Nathaniel's Sophomore year, he wrote a Grade Book program to enter and calculate student grades and pro-

duce reports.

Nathaniel graduated with honors from Oakwood Christian School. He was the first Oakwood student to graduate with a high school degree in Computer Science. Currently, Heston is at work on the NFC (Near Field Communication) project at Oakwood, using proximity chips to bring up student data, reminders, testing, and academic strategies.

He is a second term freshman, attending Northwest Arkansas Community College with plans to transfer to Missouri State Southern University in the Spring of 2015. He is working on a university degree in computer science.

"In a year or two, I'd like to work for my mom's company, J. B. Hunt, in Lowell, AR. They have a great internship program there to get experience and still pay the bills while in college."

Nathaniel is the son of Frank and Sonya Heston and grandson of Chuck and




Dickerson Park Zoo visits Purdy students

The Exeter School Board held their monthly meeting on June 18, 2014. Board President Eric O'Neill called the meeting to order at 6:56 p.m. with six board members in

The consent agenda was approved. Dr. Raney discussed the finance report, utilities report and the food service report with the board.

Mr. Jordan gave the elementary report to the Board. Summer school is seeing an average of approximately 93 students attending daily. The classes are divided as such: Kindergarten and 1st grade with approximately 18 enrolled, 2nd grade with approximately 15 enrolled, 3rd and 4th grade with approximately 20 enrolled, 5th and 6th (split) with approximately 18 enrolled, 6th (split), 7th and 8th grade with approximately 24 enrolled, and Credit Recovery has approximately 12 students enrolled.

The summer school food program is going well with students able to eat breakfast and lunch free of charge.

Mrs. Mandy Mattingly met with the Board and spoke about the 21st Century Grant which she wrote and had just returned from Jefferson City where she travelled to hand deliver the grant paperwork.

If received, the grant will award the district a total of \$487,129.00, over a five year period. The mission of the grant is to help families in the community by providing a safe, fun place before and after school, inspire learning through academic activities and help better prepare students for college or a career after graduation. The district has asked 11 businesses and groups to partner with them as part of the requirements set forward by the grant. Those 11 partners are: YMCA, University of Missouri Extension Office, The Cassville Democrat, Barry County Sheriff, Crowder College, Security Bank, Roaring River State Park, FASCO, Exeter PTO, Exeter Booster Club and the City of Exeter. When approached, Mrs. Mattingly stated that all businesses and groups willingly agreed to participate, which was greatly appreciated. Districts will be notified in mid-September as to whether the grant was awarded or not. There will also be three, six-week adult classes offered and five family activity


Dr. Raney discussed APR. There will be a second reading of the MSBA 2014B Policy Updates.



"The greatness of a society and it's moral progress can be judged by the way it treats its animals," Mahatma Gandi.

This being said, we certainly are failing here in our community and county. We have uncared for animals running loose in Cassville. Countless dogs and cats are dropped off in rural areas by uncaring people. Unwanted puppies and kittens are given away in the Walmart parking lot with no thought as to the future of these animals. Some are just left there.

In our throw away society, we are also throwing away animals like so much trash.

The Humane Society of the United States of America estimates 130,000 dogs are abandoned each year. They estimates there are 70 million feral cats in our country.

Stray animals more often then not, meet unfortunate fates. They can starve to death, become traffic fatalities, succumb to predators or contract fatal illness of injury and die painful deaths.

believe a Religions person who is cruel to a defenseless animal will undoubtedly be cruel to defenseless people and a person who cares for the lowest of creatures will certainly care for his fellow man.

For those people who think they have the right to dump an unwanted animal, what rights are being violated to those people that put up with these animals? Are they supposed to care for all of them?

Missouri has statutes. Missouri-Cruelty-Consolidated Cruelty Statue MOST 578005-188 and MOST 566111. This statute states, "A person is guilty of an animal neglect when he or she has custody or ownership of an animal and fails to provide adequate care, which results in substitutional harm to the animal. A person is guilty of abandonment when he or she has knowingly abandoned an animal in any place without making provisions for its adequate care."

Animal neglect and abandonment is a class C misdemeanor upon the first conviction with enhancement to a class B misdemeanor for subsequent convictions.

A person is guilty of animal abuse when a person intentionally or purposely kills an animal in any manner not allowed by law, purposely or intentionally causes injury or suffering to an animal, or having ownership or custody of an animal, knowingly fails to provide adequate care and control. Animal abuse is a class A misdemeanor unless the person was previously convicted.

First, we need to stress that all pets (not used for breeding programs) be neutered, males and females. An intact male will find an

intact female. Second, we need to create awareness and understanding on the proper treatment of animals, to treat animals with respect, prevent unwanted harm to them and, in the long run, eliminate stray, abused and unwanted animals within our community and county.



As part of continued efforts in keeping school patrons informed, the Southwest R-V School Administration provides monthly information concerning Board Meetings.

A recap of the June 12, 2014, regular meeting is as fol-

The Board convened for its meeting at 7 p.m.

The Board approved the consent items, including accepting the resignations of Vision Impaired/Hearing Impaired teacher Tamara McNabb, elementary teacher Jenna Shaffer, special education teacher Bakhytgul Strange, and middle school teacher Byron Stephens. Also approved were the hirings of middle school teachers Melissa Brewen, Jacqueline Fuller, Jerry Gusta, Joy Jameson, and elementary music teacher Mary Ellen Conrad.

In respect to old business items, the board approved the purchase of new scoreboards for the middle school gymnasium, opting for boards from Daktronics, similar to those located in the high school. The board also approved amending the 2013-2014 budget, contingent on June revenue and expenditures.

Under new business, the board approved the amended 2013-2014 budget as the preliminary 2014-2015 budget. It was also decided to solicit bids on the district's banking services. In addition, district salary schedules were approved for the 2014-2015 school year, as were the pay rates for substitute teachers, cooks, custodians and bus drivers. Facility rental fees will remain the same, and only a modest increase will take place in respect to school lunch prices. According to a federal calculation tool requirement, lunches will increase a dime, from \$1.50 to \$1.60 for K-4 students, and from \$1.75 to \$1.85 for grades 5-12.

Pertaining to Special Services, the board also approved the IDEA Assurance Statement, the Special Education Compliance Plan, the Proportionate Share Plan, and contracting for Vision Impaired services as provided by Blazing Canes for the 2014-2015 school year. Finally, under new business, the board approved a second installment of proposed policies and procedures as provided by the Missouri School Board Association.

Under administrative and program evaluations, the board reviewed the monthly maintenance and administrative reports. Topics of discussion included work on the track and field facility in respect to constructing a storage building. The abundant precipitation our area has been receiving has obviously delayed progress.

The board was in closed session approximately 80 minutes, discussing personnel items.

The next regular meeting is scheduled for July 17, in the High School Library, at 7 p.m.
