In the hot spot: COVID-19 numbers rise in southwest Missouri

According to a recent Joplin Globe article, Joplin's hospital referral region, which includes southwest Missouri, has emerged as one of the nation's hotspots for COVID-19 growth.

The Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS) said the significant case growth in southwest Missouri is being monitored and special attention is be-

ing given to food processing plants that employ many essential workers in the area.

According to the DHSS report, The state's "box-in" strategy approach is currently being used in the area where the outbreak is impacting citizens residing primarily in McDonald, Jasper, Newton and Barry Counties.

The "box in" strategy for the outbreak involves comprehensive testing, isolating

all infected people, locating all contacts of the infected people, and having those contacts self-quarantine for 14 days.

In McDonald County, Tyson Foods has worked with state and local public health officials and arranged for comprehensive testing of all employees, most of whom presented with no symptoms, and also agreed to operate at 60 percent capacity to allow

for those with positive results or close contacts of those positive cases to properly isolate or quarantine. Additionally, they are enhancing several infection prevention measures at the facility, including robust cleaning and disinfection practices.

Other clusters of cases in the region are also being monitored. DHSS statewide data shows that 310 of the 413 new cases reported to

the state from midday June 20-midday June 21 were those of residents of the City of Joplin and McDonald, Jasper and Newton Counties. DHSS is providing contact tracing support for the local public health agencies impacted by the case growth associated with these outbreaks.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) will also be deploy-

ing a team to the area this week to assist state and local health authorities with the epidemiological investigation. This investigation will determine risk factors for the COVID-19 spread in the Missouri counties bordering Arkansas where the outbreak has been ongoing, evaluate role of meat and poultry plant outbreaks in the com-

At the family's invitation, some 50 or so members of the Patriot Guard Riders formed a flagline at the entrance of White Funeral Home, Friday,

June 19, to honor Clifford "Mug" Hall, of Washburn, who passed away June 11.

Hall, a U.S. Army veteran, was assistant state captain for the Patriot Guard Riders for

many years himself.

According to Patriot Guard regional captain, R.J. Bailey, the original intent of the motorcycle group formed in 2005 was to shield families

of fallen veterans from those who would disrupt the funeral services of their loved ones.

"Think Westboro Baptist Church," he said.

According to Bailey, since its formation, the Patriot Guard Riders - a volunteer, 501c3 organization - has grown to include 8,000 members in Missouri and 400,000 members nationwide.

"When a family anywhere in the United States calls, those who are able travel to the funeral or memo-

"I'm taking this seriously now," says Cassville resident

Forty-year-old J.D. Hunter, of Cassville, is now a believer.

A couple of weeks ago, after spending the day working outdoors in high temperatures - a regular occurrence in his logging business - he chalked up symptoms of an illness that developed later that night to those of a heat-stroke. The symptoms were severe enough to warrant a trip to the emergency room,

where he was told that a heat stroke was the probable cause.

A couple of days later, when his symptoms hadn't improved, but became worse - with new ones developing every day - he decided a trip to the doctor was in order. There, it was recommended that he have a COVID-19 test. A rapid-response test was performed the same day by the Barry County Health Department. The results

were positive.

"I knew something was wrong," Hunter said. "I've never experienced anything like this before."

After the positive test result, Hunter's symptoms grew progressively worse, until, four days later, in order to breathe, he had to lie down on his bed with pillows under his stomach with his head hanging over the edge of the bed. He maintained that position, struggling for

his breath, for an entire day, he said. The next morning, he was able to breathe a little more easily.

"One more day, and I would have gone to the hospital," he said. "I wasn't over

the virus yet, though, not by a long shot. Regaining my ability to breathe normally was a gradual process; For a while, I couldn't talk on the telephone, or carry on any kind of conversation without

running out of air.

"It's a cardio thing," he continued, "and I've always been a cardio-workout guy. That's what's strange about

CoxHealth begins preoperative COVID-19 testing


Beginning June 22, CoxHealth will begin testing patients for COVID-19 prior to all surgeries and select procedures.

This decision, which includes all hospitals and facilities, is made to help streamline care as disease prevalence rises throughout the region. The results of the tests will allow for the use of proper personal protective equipment – as higher levels are required to prevent transmission of the virus – and appropriate placement of patients within the hospitals. It will also foster a safe environment for staff and patients, and help contribute to health data about the prevalence of COVID in local communities.

"CoxHealth began testing high-risk patients as the COVID pandemic began, but as we see prevalence in our community start to rise, we feel we must know whether or

Lawrence County reports eight new cases of COVID-19

not all of our patients are infected with coronavirus prior to surgery or procedures," says Karen Kramer, CHO and CoxHealth's Incident Commander for COVID-19 response. "It is important that we have this information so proper precautions may be taken if someone is infected, and help ensure the virus is not transferred to others."

Patients will be informed of where and when they should report for testing, which will be done approximately three days before a scheduled surgery or procedure. They are then asked to quarantine at home until their surgery to avoid contracting the virus.

Various testing locations are established throughout the area, helping patients stay close to home.

There is no estimation on when preoperative testing will end at this time.

The Lawrence County Health Department is reporting 8 new cases of COVID-19. This brings our total to 18 cases (7 resolved and 11 active). Three cases were acquired from workplaces with a current outbreak. Four are still under investigation to determine the origin. And one is a family member of a positive case. The Lawrence County Health Department is working diligently to notify all close contacts.

COVID-19 is still actively circulating and our county is not immune. Most people who get COVID-19 will only have mild symptoms; however, there are some members of our community who are at a higher risk of getting very sick. We must each do our part to protect them, ourselves, our loved ones and the rest of our community by practicing the following:

- Clean your hands often, either with soap and water for

20 seconds or a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.

- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Stay at home as much as possible.
- Put distance between yourself and other people (at least 6 feet).
- Cover your mouth and nose with a cloth face cover when around others.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces daily.

Visitors and patients at clinics are required to bring and wear masks/facial coverings during the clinic visit to protect staff, patients and the community during the COVID-19 outbreak. Temperature screenings continue for everyone who comes into CoxHealth facilities.

There are no changes to the current inpatient or emergency department visitor restrictions now in place.



Dr. Roark offers free appointments for defrauded MMJ patients

Missouri-based physician and vocal supporter of medical marijuana, Dr. Lisa Roark, MD, is stepping up to help 600 patients who were defrauded by a person pretending to be a physician who certified them for medical marijuana.

The Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services announced the incident in a press release on June 19 and Dr. Roark immediately offered to certify the defrauded patients at no charge through her clinic, Roark Family Health.

Dr. Roark said, "This is absolutely outrageous. Someone posing as a doctor did 600 fake physician certifications. Now, these poor patients have to scramble to get new certifications."

Dr. Roark does telehealth appointments for medical marijuana-seeking patients through her Cassville-based clinic, Roark Family Health. Dr. Roark is also the CEO and Medical Director of The Dispensary, LLC, commonly known as Cassville Dispensary, a medical marijuana dispensary opening later this year.

In the press release from DHSS, director Dr. Randall Williams said, "Through our many types of regulatory efforts, we remain watchful for any wrongdoing in order to protect Missourians. Our main concern is how this fraudulent activity negatively affects patients, and we are working to minimize the impact on them while also holding accountable those who are responsible."

First state MMJ facilities pass inspection

Two state-licensed medical marijuana facilities have successfully completed commencement inspections with the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS), the agency tasked with regulating the state's new program.

Both facilities, which have received authority from DHSS to operate, are cultivation facilities and will be among 60 total facilities in Missouri able to grow medical marijuana for infused-product manufacturing facilities and directly for retail dispensaries. DHSS is continuing the process of verifying all licensees' compliance with minimum standards for licensure. Facilities are able to request scheduling of their commencement inspection upon completion of these verifications. When an inspection is successfully completed, the facility is authorized to operate within the confines of Article XIV of the Missouri Constitution.

"This is a big step forward for patients in Missouri," said Lyndall Fraker, director of the Section for Medical Marijuana Regulation with DHSS. "We know qualified patients are eager to see dispensary doors open up in our state, and having cultivators now able to grow and soon supply these other facilities is something we are all very pleased to see," he said.

Locally, Dr. Lisa Roark hopes to see Cassville's medical marijuana facility, The Cassville Dispensary, inspected soon.

"As soon as we pass our state inspection and have Missouri-grown product available, we'll be ready to open our doors," she said.




The Central Crossing Senior Center may be closed for day-to-day lunches and activities due to the COVID-19 crisis, but it's still working to help their senior friends.

this virus.

"I'm not contagious anymore," Hunter said, but it will take a while to get my strength back."

Hunter does not smoke, although he admits to being maybe being 15 to 20 pounds overweight.

"I can't imagine how a smoker could survive the ordeal I've been through," he said.

"This virus caught me by surprise," he added. "It's weird stuff. I want to share my story for exactly that reason. COVID-19 doesn't affect everyone the same way. My entire household contracted the virus from me, including my wife, my four children and my little granddaughter. They all tested positive, but

toms - if they display any at all. Before I knew I was sick, I held my little granddaughter on my lap, and she caught the virus from me. Others who were in the vicinity, but were six feet away, did not.

"I think about my 65-year-old dad, who's smoked all his life - and still does - and it terrifies me to think about him contracting COVID," he continued. "I don't think he'd survive it."

Thankfully, Hunter is past the worst of the virus, but it's changed his perspective.

"If someone I loved - if my little granddaughter - had struggled with the virus like I have, I could never forgive myself," he said.

Cassville School News from Mary Hagens

June school board meeting

In the Board of Education meeting on June 11th, Cassville school leaders considered regular business matters as well as budget and re-entry challenges posed by COVID-19.

School administrators presented End of Year Summary Data, limited to the first, second, and third quarters.

According to the summer learning report, more than 500 K-6th grade students are participating in seated classes, while secondary students are utilizing virtual instruction. Approximately 140 high school students have earned or recovered credits. Dusty Reid updated progress on the Early Childhood wing and other ongoing projects.

The Board approved the minutes of the previous meeting, financial reports, administrators' reports, bills,

and other business. Former CMS music teacher Micah Boise was welcomed back as the CHS instrumental music instructor. Other new employees include Chris Redman, maintenance, and Brian Atkinson, transportation. The high school has not been able to find a Spanish teacher for the fall semester and will transition to a virtual learning platform.

According to Keith Robertson, "Even though we are not able to find a suitable certified Spanish teacher, we are still able to provide our students with that opportunity."

The Board approved the final expenditure amendment for 2019-2020 and approved the preliminary 2020-2021 budget. Dr. Asbill reported that the state withholds for May and June have significantly affected the budget. In other business, the Board

approved the 2020-2021 student and staff handbooks.

A committee composed of District staff and community representatives has begun the task of recommending Re-Entry Guidelines to the administrative team for their consideration. The final recommendations will be presented to the Board of Education for approval.

The Board went into closed session and approved the J.D. Riddle Trust transfer agreements, pending final legal review. This allows the District to accept the trust made by Mr. Riddle to establish a scholarship for future Missouri educators. After the closed session, the board approved the salary/rate schedules for certified and classified staff, the extra duty stipend schedule, and the extra duty personnel assignments.

Re-entry plans underway

The Cassville R-IV School District needs parents and community members to become involved in planning health guidelines in preparation for re-entry to school in August, so that any recommendations reflect a wide range of community input.

Administrators are leading school staff, parents, and community representatives in recommending guidelines for 2020-2021, necessary because, as Carter pointed out, there are "no laws outlining a response to the Corona virus."

In the first meeting, an es-

timated 30 participants gave feedback and posed questions about the re-entry process. These were used, along with additional criteria, to form small interest-based groups to use as references in the second session.

Robertson urged the groups to ask themselves, "Is this possible? Can we do these things for 176 school days?"

Each of the small groups developed two to four recommendations for the re-entry plan, and one spokesperson from each group shared their recommendations when the

large group reconvened.

Dr. Asbill urged participants to bring two or three friends to future committee meetings in the CHS Commons, emphasizing that they will be hard work.

After the committee has finished, the administrative team will review the proposals and make recommendations to the Board of Education for approval or amendment.

Robertson said, when completed, the plan will be a "living document," to be adjusted as necessary.



COVID-19 positive case identified at local restaurant

The Barry County Health Department is reporting that two persons employed at Lai Lai Asian Buffet and Dining in Monett have tested positive for COVID-19. Both cases are a result of community spread and the individuals are under an isolation order. Close contacts are being contacted and as appropriate ordered to quarantine. All of those identified cases will be monitored daily by the Barry County Health Department.

Roger Brock, Administrator of the Barry County Health Department, commented, "The owners of the restaurant are working closely with the Health Department to take all practical measures to ensure the safest possible environment for our citizens. Lai Lai's owner, out of an abundance of caution and a deep concern for staff, customers, and community, has volunteered to close the business until July 6." Additionally, they will complete an extensive deep cleaning of the restaurant, screen staff for symptoms of COVID-19 before each shift, require face coverings for all employees, and conduct frequent cleaning of all high touch surfaces.

Administrator Brock noted that COVID-19 is not food borne and diners are at no risk of contracting COVID-19 from their meal. There is a low-risk of contracting COVID-19 from employees who did not have a face covering.

Customers do not need to self-quarantine unless symptoms develop. Anyone who develops symptoms should call their primary care provider or the Barry County Health Department at 417-847-2114.

"It is our personal responsibility to continue physical distancing, wear cloth face coverings, avoid large groups, and wash hands and surfaces frequently, to avoid the spread of COVID-19 in Barry County," reminded Barry County Office of Emergency Management Director David Compton. On the closing of Lai Lai's Buffet, Compton said, "It is extremely commendable. The owners are demonstrating an exceptional personal commitment to their community in making a decision to temporarily close."

would make my hair stand on end if I were as fearful of death as I once was - and, yes, I confess to a morbid fascination with the whole business.

That doesn't solve anything, though. COVID-19 is still among us, and I would be remiss if I didn't report the facts as they're presented to me.

Our opinions regarding proper protocol are just that - *opinions*.

We can surmise about the need for the virus to run rampant in order to build up herd immunity; we can speak

of a lack of faith in God if a person feels the need to put on a mask; we can even cry foul play, suggesting it's a violation of our civil rights or some kind of conspiracy, if someone *asks* us to wear a mask.

At one time I might have fallen into one of those categories. But not anymore - not since I now have old friends and a tiny grandbaby. Both things have given me pause for consideration.

To me, it's a bit like tempting God, when we expect him to protect us in the face of our refusal to take practical measures to protect ourselves and others.

I'm not advocating huddling behind closed doors for the rest of our lives. Times have changed, though. The word "unprecedented" has been used far too often lately, but it's a good one.

Maybe new times call for new habits. Mask-wearing, for me, might be one of them. It's not fun, granted, but at least I won't need to worry about putting on lipstick.

munity spread of infection, estimate prevalence and determine risk factors for COVID-19 spread in the pediatric population and develop a community mitigation plan for the COVID-19 outbreak in those counties.

According to the CDC, there is no evidence to support transmission of COVID-19 associated with food. Coronaviruses are generally thought to be spread from person-to-person through respiratory droplets.

"We are grateful for our partnerships locally, federally and in neighboring states like Arkansas, that allow all of us to collaborate during these times that public health experts are in great need," said Dr. Randall Williams, director of DHSS. "It is also important to understand that this is a localized outbreak - not a surge of cases throughout the state - and together, we are responding accordingly."

At press time, the Barry County Health Department and Office of Emergency Management had reported a total of 36 cases in Barry County - a number which has tripled since June 12 - and the Lawrence County Health Department had reported eight new cases.

Most of the recent cases have been a result of community spread.

One person who tested positive visited the following locations on June 15

- The YMCA in Monett from 3 p.m. to 5 p.m.
- Monett Family Restaurant, from 11 a.m. to 12 p.m.

People who visited those locations on those dates, but who did not have close contact with the individual, are at low risk of contracting COVID-19, but should monitor themselves for symptoms.

One patient who tested positive was an employee of EFCO Corporation in Monett, a subsidiary of Apogee Enterprises.

Vice President of Communications for Apogee, Jeff Huebschen, said, in regard to the positive diagnosis, EFCO is following CDC guidelines for preventing the spread of the virus, including re-configuration of work stations to allow space for social-distancing. Temperature screenings and the wearing of face-covering are also required.

"The safety of our employees is our priority," Huebschen said.

The Barry County Health Department and Office of Emergency Management attribute the increase in COVID-19 cases in the area to the reduction of Phase 1 restrictions, the increase in large gatherings, and the increase in cases in neighboring counties.

"Our goal," Emergency Management Director, David Compton, said, "is for everyone to take personal responsibility for prevention of the spread of the virus, in order to avoid returning to additional restrictions."

If a person is unable to make it to one of the free COVID-19 community testing sites, other options are available.

The Health Department charges a \$10, cash only, fee for a rapid-result test. Call 417-847-2114 to speak with a healthcare worker to arrange for a test.

In answer to a reader's question, according to Office of Emergency Management Director, David Compton, funds from the federal CARES Act cover the cost of test media and machine for the health department, however, the \$10 fee goes toward the cost of test administra-

tion and protective apparel.

Neither CoxHealth nor Mercy Hospitals charge for COVID-19 tests if a patient schedules a virtual visit for a physician's referral.

Janell Patton, Community Relations Manager for CoxHealth, says, under the FFCRA and CARES acts, insurance carriers are generally required to waive any patient financial responsibility for COVID-19 testing.

"However," she said, "health care costs for insured patients are set by their insurance companies, so we can't comment across-the-board on how much patients pay for services."

According to Patton, with few exceptions, CoxHealth does not bill uninsured patients for COVID-19 testing.

To receive a referral for a test, CoxHealth encourages patients to make a virtual visit through their Virtual Visits program at www.cox-health.com/services/virtual-visits. Virtual evaluations are offered at no out-of-pocket responsibility for anyone throughout the region, regardless of insurance.

"If a patient is seen at a clinic or urgent care for an evaluation, as opposed to

a Virtual Visit, they will be charged their standard copay for the visit," Patton said. "However, we will strive to advise them of the virtual service so they could utilize it, instead, if possible."

Sonya Kullman, spokesperson for Mercy Hospitals, reports that Mercy is not charging for COVID-19 testing either, although they do request that a person not schedule an office visit.

"We ask that patients visit mymercy.net, or call their health care provider for a test referral, then a free test can be given at the hospital or clinic," she said.

The Barry County Health Department reminds residents physical distancing, wearing cloth face-coverings, and the frequent washing of hands and cleaning of surfaces are the best ways to prevent spread of the disease.

Symptoms of COVID-19 include fever, cough, shortness of breath or at least two of the following: fever, chills, repeated shaking with chills, muscle pain, headache, sore throat, or new loss of taste or smell. Symptoms may begin two days to two weeks after exposure.
