## Tensions rise as Ash Road Commission seeks road bids

An ongoing conflict between select residents of the Ash Road District and the road district commissioners has grown increasingly heated over the past few meetings with Monday's meeting being no exception. The debate in question

pertains to the commissioners requesting bids for contracting out maintenance of the 30 miles of county roads in the district. Currently, the district employs two men, Erwin Harp and Robert Hendrix, to do all of the maintenance and repairs. The road district commissioners, Dale Stewart, David Dalton and Jesse Taylor, are working to find a compromise between what is fiscally responsible for the taxpayer funds and the requests of the residents. Bid requests for the district were submitted after the June 12 meeting with the favor of Dalton and Taylor with Stewart opposing.

Due to the increasing tensions during previous meetings and an alleged death

threat against one of the commissioners, two sheriff's deputies were in attendance at the Monday night meeting to ensure peace between the commissioners, the employees and around 15 Ash Road District residents there to voice their concerns over the contractor bid requests.

Taylor, elected in April of this year, stated during the meeting, "I'm not trying to hurt anyone. We're just trying to look at other alternative options that might make for better roads."

In response, Lisa Sickles, resident, stated, "I've never heard complaints about our road district, and now you all want to come in and change it." Those in attendance at the meeting stressed that they are satisfied with the road maintenance as is within the district and fear the repercussions of contracting the work out.

Liana Hendrix, resident and wife of employee Robert, stated, "I feel like there should have been more due diligence on the commis-

sioners' part as to what's actually entailed in maintaining the district and what needs to be done. If there's a tree in the road, I can't wait an hour for a contractor to come out to take care of it before I leave for work. If a road is impassable due to floods or deep

# **August Primary drawing near**

Just a little over one month remains for Barry County voters to familiarize themselves on the questions confronting them in the Tuesday, August 5, Primary election.

Republican primary voters will be choosing a nominee in the three-man race for Presiding Commissioner between incumbent Commissioner Cherry Warren, Eastern and former Southern District commissioner Eddie A. Davison of Shell Knob, and Seligman Police Chief Terry L. Burgess. Voters will choose between Steven J. Dunker, of Cassville, Matthew Thomas Weatherman, of Golden and Amy Boxx, of Monett, in the three way race for Prosecuting Attorney. Each of the offices are for four year terms. No Democrats filed for any of the county offices in Barry County.

All incumbents from the other county offices are unopposed for election. They include County Treasurer Lois Lowe, State Representative Scott Fitzpatrick, County Collector Janice Varner, Circuit Clerk and Recorder Craig Williams, County Clerk Gary Youngblood, for

Associate Circuit Judge in Division One, Johnnie Cox, and Associate Circuit Judge in Division Two, Robert Foulke.

There are five Constitutional amendments that will be voted on. These will be discussed later. Only one other Primary contest is between incumbent Congressman Billy Long and challenger Marshall Works.

Perhaps the most controversial question to be settled by the Primary voter is the State Highways requested sales tax hike.

The state's transportation department has been funded for over 100 years by a gasoline tax, which at present is 16 or 17 cents a gallon out of the \$3.40 a gallon charge currently paid at the pump by motorists. The state transportation department want to tax a revenue source which has never been used to fund transportation costs.

On the Democrat side of the Primary ballot there is only one primary race. There are two candidates for the office of Congressman of the Seventh District are Genevieve Williams and Jim Evans.

## **Ozark Property Rights** chairs to enjoy the display group holds political forums



Representative Scott Fitzpatrick spoke to the Ozark Property Rights Alliance on Thursday, June 27, about the legislative session and to address concerns about grant changes offered by The EPA through The Missouri Department of Natural Resources.

The Ozark Property Rights Alliance, a local group of Barry County citizens concerned with protecting the property rights of citizens are holding a series of politically-geared forums for the community in coming weeks.

On July 17, they will host the candidates for presiding county commissioner. Both meetings will be held at 7 p.m. at the Crowder Community Building on Highway 37.

compare the cost of contracting the labor out to the cost of the current work being done. He said, "Our largest expense is wages. Plus we have to maintain all of the equipment that the district owns and there's insurance.

Taylor added, "When you look at other districts, a lot of them go with a contractor because it saves money and can improve the roads."

Dalton and Taylor each travelled the roads of the county regularly for their employment. Taylor used to do work fro the phone company in the district and Dalton is a postal carrier. Both claimed that there are roads that need attention to continue to utilized by outside parties like the postal service.

Another woman in attendance, Misty Pendergraft, stated, "Ash is a poor district, but our roads are great for what we have. We travel these roads every day, and we like them. We're happy with the district. We don't want changes."

Dalton assured the residents that the commissioners are listening to their concerns. Taylor said, "All we're trying to do is look at something different."

For the 30 miles of roads, the district received \$70,146.96 for 2013. Of that, around 78 percent went to employee wages and related insurance and workers compensation according to the financial statement turned over to the county. The remainder of the funding covered gasoline, diesel, equipment repair and road materials such as gravel. Dalton stated, "We're listening to the people, but

The teenagers participated in official ceremonies and activities, like raising and lowering the flag each day, as well as team building workshops, hiking, fishing, community service and others. The area 4-H programs have a long history of going to Camp Smokey for over 60 years. According to Bob McNary, 4-H Youth Specialist for Jasper County, "Historically, 4-H camps were some of the original users of the group camp facilities found at Roaring River and Camp Smokey, and today, we are still utilizing them."

Each summer, the 4-H program holds four camps at Roaring River with a new special camp being held for the first time this year. The Clover Kids Camp is for kids ages 5-7, two sessions of Member Camp for ages 8-12, and the Teen Camp are the regularly held camps. This year, 4-H will also have an Alumni Camp for adults wanting to attend.

McNary stated, "These camps have been going on for years, and we have seen most of these campers grow up through our 4-H pro-

gram. So, seeing live skill development is the most important aspect of camp." He said those life skills include evaluating decisions, using financial resources wisely, time management, keeping track of personal belongings, settling disagreements helpfully, clearly stating thoughts and feelings, following directions, interacting with different people, following instructions, accepting responsibility, and following through on commitments.

Reinforcing those principles is vital to the core of 4-H philosophy and helping

the kids become successful adults.

McNary concluded, "Summer camp is one of the most valuable learning experiences a child can have. Young people need strong relationships and emotional

skills to meet today's challenges. Through camping, young people learn independence, responsibility, how to get along with others, and how to make the right decisions. Camp promotes cooperation, teamwork, and

respect for other people and our natural environment." He added, "Camping also
