### Car crash ends at Casey's gas pumps

The Cassville Casey's was the site of a major crash on Monday when a minivan crashed into the guard at the gas pumps. According to Cassville Chief of Police Dana Kammerlohr, one of

her officers reported that the van failed to negotiate the curve on Business 37, also known as Main Street, and then traveled down an embankment, struck a culvert and eventually crashed into the gas station.

Multiple eyewitnesses on the scene were present for the wreck, and bystanders scattered when the crash occurred.

Eyewitness Liam Mills was present at the gas station during the wreck. He said, "We were getting in the car and someone started yelling 'Run!' and so we did." When they looked back, they saw the van crashed into the pump guard. Mills added, "It was so loud, we didn't know if it was going to blow up or what."

The wreck yielded three injuries, the driver, Tiffany Kenra Jones, 24, and two minor children, ages four and five. The three were transported to a Springfield Hospital for treatment. Another passenger, an infant, had no reported injuries at the time of the crash.

### Abuse charges made against drunk man after 911 call

A Cassville man has been charged with abuse of a child and endangering the welfare of a child after allegedly hitting his stepchild. The stepfather, Shad Joseph Turner, 45, of Cassville, is charged with the crimes and is being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$20,000 bond.

According to the affidavit of probable cause by the Missouri State Highway Patrol, they were called to the scene by a 9-1-1 call by a child who could not speak while on the phone and was being forced to get into a car. According to the report and officer observations, Turner hit the child multiple times in the face and shoulder, and the trooper took photos of the child's eye red and swollen as well as cut and his shoulder, which was also red and cut, on Wednesday, June 29.

When asked, Turner claimed he had a few drinks at Lucky T's gas station but nothing since. Officers found that he had multiple prior arrests for driving while intoxicated and that his drivers license was currently revoked.

Once transported to the Cassville Police Department, Turner was tested and had a blood alcohol level of 0.22 percent, almost three times the legal limit.

### Meet the candidates for Barry County Sheriff

Responses from other Barry County Sheriff candidates are on pages 10A-14A.

#### Why did you choose to run for Barry County Sheriff?

I am a Barry County native who has watched this County deteriorate dramatically over my lifetime. Drug usage amongst our young people has skyrocketed and the crime rate overall has followed. The current Administration at the Sheriff's Office has done many good things for this County but there are many more that could be done. I feel that more aggressive enforcement of the drug laws will decrease all crime in general.

#### What qualifications do you have that make you the best candidate for the job?

I served over fourteen years as a Missouri State Trooper. I am a veteran of both the United States Marine Corps and the Missouri National

Guard for a total of 17 years where I have been in a supervisory position for 14 years. I have been certified as a major crash reconstructionist, a drug recognition expert, a standardized field sobriety test instructor, a radar laser instructor, and a breath alcohol administrator for the Data master, Into DMT, and the alcosensor IV. I also have training in undercover operations, underage alcohol compliance, and commercial drivers license testing.

While I agree that the court has the final say on what happens to people distributing drugs in our county, it should be the job of every law enforcement officer to relentlessly pursue those that choose to make and sell drugs in Barry County. I will stress the importance of this to each and every officer and ensure that they aggressively pursue these criminals, while still maintaining a good relationship with the community and responding to reactive calls in a very timely manner.

#### What do you feel is the biggest concern in the current operation of the Sheriff's Department, and how would you propose to remedy it?

First, a new Sheriff would need to evaluate the current operation, employees, equipment, and reports to know what concerns need to be addressed. After speaking to citizens around the county, the feedback I am getting is that some areas are feeling neglected. Citizens have told me they feel response times are slow and that some areas are not being patrolled. The biggest concern I have heard is about the drug activity in Barry County. I would plan to continue to build on the organization that is in place. I would work very close with the commissioners to get items, equipment and training for the deputies to make them able to do their job more effectively. I want to lead a department that has public safety at the forefront. The Sheriff's Office needs to use all resources available, including public involvement, by offering education on knowing what to look for in regards to criminal activity. I feel that getting our citizens more involved will help deter drug activity.


What changes do you hope to make if you are elected? Instead of making changes, I would like to build on the current organization and move forward together for the citizens of Barry County. I will spend a lot of time observing, listening, and evaluating the needs of the department to make sure we have all the information to make the right decisions. There may be some restructuring regarding administrative duties to better fit the department. The first action would be to have a meeting with all the personnel and explain my expectations regarding the department and their duties. Then meet with each one personally, to get their thoughts on what changes they believe should be made. I want to have an open door policy, where people can voice concerns and issues they may have.

#### What do you feel the Sheriff's role should be within the community and the Department?

The Sheriff is the highest elected official in the county who is responsible for keeping the peace and enforcing the law. I believe the Sheriff is not only an administrator, but should also be involved in investigations. The Sheriff also needs to be involved in community activities and public relations. I believe in working management and leading by example. The Sheriff should be able to perform any duty he would expect his fellow officers to perform. I also believe educating the community regarding what to look for and how to identify drug activity is a must. My goal as Sheriff is to help the department and the community work together to decrease crime in our county.

#### What makes you a better candidate over your competitors?

I cannot judge the other candidates, that is for the voting citizens of Barry County to do. Law enforcement is not a job, it is a calling. To be an effective sheriff, you first need to realize you work for the citizens who elected you. I have the ability to bridge agencies. I have worked in several different areas throughout the county and have a better idea of what these areas need from the Sheriff's Office. Having lived in the northern part and worked in the southern part of the county, I have a much wider view of the county needs. I have the experience

I plan to bring the department forward with new technology and training to make the

department more efficient and provide the officers with as much information as possible, thus allowing them to make informed decisions and keep them safer. This would also allow officers to

#### What do you feel the Sheriff's role should be within the community and the Department?

The Sheriff's Department is the lead law enforcement agency within the county. The Sheriff is therefore responsible for the safety of all the citizens of the county, and as an official elected by the people, the Sheriff has the responsibility of being the last line of defense for the people served against the over reach of big government. Within the Department, the Sheriff is respon-

### Webworms are an annual nuisance

Jon Skinner Missouri Department of

Conservation Webworms are an annual nuisance to the homeowner in the Ozarks.

The tents they make over many branches are now starting to become evident on some trees. Last year was an exceptional year for the moths. The right environmental conditions seemed to have been present for them to reproduce at a high level. Whole trees were enveloped. A unique site.

Now is the time to look for webs in trees. Do you have to accept this unsightly attack on your tree? Surprisingly enough, you can! Most attacks are of no significance to the tree and the tree will be fine in the following year. The worms are eating leaves and reducing the trees ability to convert sunlight into sugar, but the time this is occurring is also when the tree starts to shut down for the winter. So, the damage is minimal to the tree.

If you want to address the webworms, now is also the best time to apply control measures. There are some ways to remove the worms from your tree. Breaking up the webs with a stick or high pressure sprayer will expose the worms to predators. Often, this is all that is needed.

Some people want an easy-to-use chemical to kill



without breaking up the web first, most of the chemical is wasted and kills good insects in the process. This webbing provides good protection to the worms from penetrating water and dust. Once the webbing is broken

the worms. Unfortunately, off, the chemicals can reach the worms.





with a very limited amount of resources. Meeting the mission of the office will require a very detailed analysis of the office workload and the costs associated with running the office. As I've already stated, this office serves approximately 160 people which is more than any of our adjoining counties of Stone, McDonald and Lawrence counties. The Barry County Public Administrator's office daily has to make crucial decisions pertaining to client's healthcare and well-being. This office is responsible to their clients on a 24/7 basis with a staff of two people which includes the Public Administrator and an administrative assistant who is budgeted for 35 hours a week.

What changes do you hope to make if you are elected? Some changes that I think would be very beneficial for the Public Administrator's office include:

- A review of the current office Policies and Procedures needs to be completed. Often, in a very hectic environment with a small staff, this is one of the issues that are not addressed. 





Drownings do not typically occur as dramatized on television. Drownings occur quickly and in many cases, the drowning itself is not actually witnessed. The victim is there one minute and gone the next. Life jackets are an important part of drowning prevention, whether boating or simply swimming from the shoreline or a dock. It is imperative for children to be instilled with the habit of wearing a life jacket whenever they are around the water. State law requires children under seven to wear a life jacket while on a watercraft, but that is only a minimum requirement. Life jackets clearly benefit persons of

It is common for teens and even adults to overestimate their swimming ability, so even if a person chooses not to wear a life jacket, keeping a life jacket or other adequate flotation within reach is imperative. It is difficult to judge distance on the water, so what appears to be a short swim across a pond, lake, or river may actually be further than you think. The current on rivers may also extend your swim beyond your abilities. Panicking is a key component of drowning. The best way to avoid panic is to be prepared around the water. Once the struggle to stay afloat begins, it may be too late to retrieve a flotation device. Clearly, the best practice is to wear a life jacket.

As we get into what is typically the hottest weather of the year, help ensure you don't become a drowning victim. Make sure you and your loved ones are prepared when they hit the water.

Watercraft must consider the effect their actions have on others: Share the waterway and use common sense, good judgment, and courtesy to ensure the safety of all. Life jackets save lives. Wear It!!





### Mark Twain Forest teams with Boy Scouts

In 2008, the Ava/Cassville/ Willow Springs (ACW) Ranger District of the Mark Twain National Forest hosted the first of five projects, termed Arrow-Corps5, implemented by the Boy Scouts of America (BSA). Arrowcorps5 was the largest, most complex, and most challenging conservation venture for BSA of its time-spanning five National Forests across the nation. Forest Service and Order of the Arrow (BSA's national honor society) established a unified incident command (IC) to plan and implement the Arrowcorps5 project on the Mark Twain National Forest. In June of 2008, over 600 participants volunteered their time to perform glade restoration on 134 acres, cutting eastern red cedar. The area known as Bateman was transformed

from a wide, grassy bottom into a base camp much like the tent cities seen at wildland fire camps. Despite a lack of electrical hook-ups, the IC team was able to construct restrooms, showers, kitchens, and recreation facilities.

The glade restoration was a true ecological success; and Arrowmen5 percipients achieved a sense of comradery, built endurance, and created life-long memories. The Forest Service officially named the glade, the Arrowmen Glade to give recognition to the great group of participants for their remarkable accomplishment.

On March 19, 2016, the Arrowmen Glade was officially dedicated with BSA and Forest Service staff present. Many memories, laughs, and some tears were shared. Darla Rein, Natural Resource Specialist with the Forest Service, ranks this project as a highlight of her career. "The bonds made with people and the professionalism of all involved is indescribable – I am truly proud to be a part of an amazing project."

Matt Walker was the Order of the Arrow Incident Commander in 2008. "The Order of the Arrow and the US Forest Service formed a textbook Joint Incident Command structure to help secure the environment of the Arrowmen Glade; and everyone involved felt a huge sense of pride at our accomplishment of removing an invasive species," stated Walker. "We liked to call it a 'peak experience.' This project not only improved the glade, it also showed almost 600 Boy Scouts how to make a difference in the environment. This was truly a great project which will have lasting effects on the lives of everyone involved."


