Former Monett substitute teacher charged for sex with student

A former Monett substitute teacher is charged with having sex with a student. Charges against the former substitute Loryn Marie Barclay, 24, of Monett, in both Barry and Lawrence Counties.

According to the affidavit of probable cause by Monett Police Department officer Jay Jastal, who also serves as the school's resource officer, received an anonymous tip on Thursday, April 27, that there was a possible sexual relationship between Barclay and a Monett High School student.

Jastal reported he spoke with the alleged student, a 17 year old in the district, on May 3 ,and that the student confirmed that he had engaged in an sexual relationship with Barclay. The student told the officer that they had intercourse and oral sex multiple times.

The student went on to report that Barclay had performed oral sex on him in a vehicle at Monett's North Park, which is in Lawrence County, and sexual intercourse had occurred in his family home in Monett, which is in Barry County. The officer reported that all events had occurred after the student's 17th birthday.

Barclay was questioned by officer Jastal at the Monett Police Department on May 4. Barclay admitted to having an "inappropriate relationship" with a student at Monett High School while she was employed as a teacher. Barclay reported she had sexual intercourse with the student on two separate days at his family's home and confirmed the account of oral sex at the Monett North Park.

Barclay told officers the events had happened between November and December 2016.

When officer Jastal spoke with Monett High School principal David Williams, he said the school district wished to pursue criminal charges against Barclay. Barclay was relieved of her teaching duties on April 27. REports indicate Barlcay had been hired full time as a paraprofessional in January.

Lawrence County Prosecuting Attorney Al Don Trotter filed charges against Barclay on June 23, and Barclay posted a \$25,000 corporate surety bond of \$25,000 on June 25. Barclay faces two counts of sexual contact with a student by a teacher, class D felonies.

Barry County Prosecuting Attorney Amy Boxx filed charges against Barclay on June 26. Barclay posted a \$10,000 cash bond in Barry County on June 29.

Barclay faces two counts of sexual contact with a student by a teacher in Barry County as well.

Exeter teen killed in dirt bike wreck

An Exeter teen was killed in a dirt bike collision on Sunday afternoon. Both Dalton T. Horn, 18, of Exeter, and the driver of the other dirt bike, Alex W. Brannum, 29, of Russellville, Ala., died as a result of the crash.

According to the Missouri State Highway Patrol crash report, Horn, driving a 2004 Yamaha WR250, and Brannum, driving a 1996 Yamaha YZ250 H1 collided while driving on Layton

Hollow Road, four miles south of Rocky Comfort. The crash happened around 12:30 p.m. on Sunday, July 2.

Both Horn and Brannum were airlifted to Freeman

West Hospital in Joplin. Dr. Buchele pronounced Horn deceased at 2:09 p.m. and Brannum deceased at 4:23 p.m.

Horn was an Exeter class of 2017 graduate.

These were Troop D's 49th and 50th facilities in 2017. Neither were wearing safety devices at the time of the crash.

Barry County courts incarcerate 7 in the month of May

• **Anthony Craig Ash**, of Golden, pled guilty to DWI-Alcohol as a persistent offender. Ash received a suspended execution of a four year sentence and five years supervised probation.

On November 6, 2014, Ash was involved in a motor vehicle crash on Farm Road 1195. Ash was walking down the road after the crash when the Missouri State Highway Patrol stopped him. His blood alcohol level was 0.154 percent.

Ash is to serve probation until May 24, 2022.

• **Dustin Jarrett Bass**, of Aurora, pled guilty to three counts of assault on a law enforcement officer and resisting arrest for a felony. Bass received a suspended imposition of sentence and three years supervised probation.

In September 2016, Bass assaulted his brother and mother, saying he was going to kill them and was throwing items at them. When officers attempted to detain him, Bass fled on foot. When officers blocked him from escaping, he grabbed a metal table leg and rushed at officers with it.

Bass then ran upstairs but was stopped by a locked door. Officers had to tase him three times to get him to drop the weapon and be placed in custody.

Bass is to serve probation until May 15, 2020.

• **Jessica Jean Biggs**, of Murray, Kent., pled guilty to passing a bad check of \$500 or more in 2013 and made an Alford plea to burglary in the second degree in 2014. Biggs' probation has since been revoked. She received a suspended execution of a seven year incarceration sentence and is to serve supervised probation for five years.

Biggs' bad check charge was from a check for \$12.97 to Butterfield Stage Stop in January 2010. In February 2011, Biggs broke into a residence on Farm Road 2095 and stole prescription medications.

Biggs is to serve probation until May 16, 2022.

• **Robert Charles Boyd III**, of Shell Knob, pled guilty to DWI-Alcohol as a persistent offender. Boyd received a suspended execution of a four year incarceration sentence and five years supervised probation.

On May 11, 2016, Boyd was caught driving while intoxicated. The Missouri State Highway Patrol was stopped on Highway 86 and Castle Drive. He had prior DWIs.

Boyd is to serve probation until May 24, 2022.

• **Kristopher L. Bruner**, of Springfield, pled guilty to two counts of theft/stealing of less than \$500. Bruner was sentenced to 60 days incarceration in jail. Bruner had pled guilty to burglary in the second degree in 2012 and that probation has also been revoked and he is to serve seven years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

Bruner's charges originated from multiple different arrests. On January 25, 2008, Bruner was seen entering the Walmart in Monett where he and two other people put multiple items in a shopping cart. After visiting the bathrooms, the items were no longer in the cart; some were concealed in one of the people's purses. However, the stolen items were found in their car following the incident. The serial numbers matched the empty boxes they placed on the shelves after the contents were removed.

On September 23, 2008,

Bruner was arrested again when a vehicle was stolen from Wintech in Monett. When the vehicle was found in Carroll County, Arkansas, Bruner was in possession of the car, which he had crashed.

On September 12, 2011, Bruner's DNA matched a burglary case where he broke into Weiser Tent and stole checks from inside a desk drawer.

• **Daren Brian Carnefix**, of Cassville, pled guilty to domestic assault in the third degree as a first or second offense. Carnefix received a suspended imposition of sentencing and two years unsupervised probation.

Sometime around March 10, 2016, Carnefix was involved in a domestic assault. Officers arrived to see a woman who was severely beaten and was bleeding from the head and face. Carnefix had gotten into an argument that escalated and eventually struck the victim multiple times, knocking her unconscious. Carnefix then put his knee on her throat to choke her around 3 p.m. on March 10. Later, on March 11, just after midnight, the victim said Carnefix then kicked her multiple times in the chest, breast and abdomen while she was on the ground. A witness ran next door to call 911.

Carnefix is to serve probation until May 18, 2019.

• **Tara Nicole Carroll**, of Aurora, pled guilty to theft/stealing of \$500 to \$25,000 in value in 2015. Carroll's proba-

tion has since been revoked and she is to serve four years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On May 24, 2014, Carroll was at the Walmart in Cassville with another person. The two took a desktop computer in a cart, valued at \$998, without paying. Carroll and the other person were identified through security footage of that burglary, as well as an Aurora Walmart burglary.

• **Dustin Allen Cash**, of Aurora, pled guilty to receiving stolen property. Cash received a suspended imposition of sentencing and two years unsupervised probation.

On September 26, 2016, Cash was in possession of a 2011 Yamaha motorcycle inside a semi-trailer that had been stolen from Branson in August 2016. Cash told officers he "knew something was up" with the motorcycle.

Cash is to serve probation until May 2, 2019.

• **Amanda Kay Collins**, of Washburn, pled guilty to endangering the welfare of a child in the first degree as a first offense and forgery. Collins received a suspended imposition of sentencing and supervised probation for two years.

On August 19, 2016, Collins wrote a check that belonged to someone else for \$52.09 at White Oak Station in Seligman. On August 20, 2016,

Collins' child, 19 months old, was found with multiple insect bites on the child's head, face, arms, legs and back. There was also bruising on the child, and Collins was homeless, living with her daughter in a vehicle.

Collins is to serve probation until May 15, 2020.

• **Khlab K. Decker**, of Cassville, pled guilty to two counts of possession of a controlled substance, receiving stolen property, tampering with a motor vehicle in the first degree and stealing \$750 or more. Decker received a suspended execution of a five year incarceration sentence and five years supervised probation.

On February 19, 2016, Decker was in possession of methamphetamine at a residence on Farm Road 1100.

Sometime between January 27 and February 9, Decker stole tools from a garage on Farm Road 2185 in Cassville. After things were stolen from a car that Decker had access to, he was considered.

On January 2, 2017, Decker was caught driving a stolen truck. He was also in possession of a baggie of methamphetamine. When arrested, Decker also admitted to selling saws that were stolen.

Decker is to serve probation until May 4, 2022.

• **Janine Lynn Donnell**, of Cassville, pled guilty to endangering welfare of a child in the

first degree. Donnell received a suspended execution of a four year incarceration sentence and five years supervised probation.

Donnell is to serve probation until May 1, 2022.

• **Robert Leroy Dunbar**, of Cassville, pled guilty to non-support with the total arrears in excess of 12 monthly payments. Dunbar received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years unsupervised probation.

Dunbar was in arrears \$33,250.97 in child support from missed payments from July 2013 and on.

Dunbar is to serve probation until May 15, 2022.


• **Skylan Loyd Fare**, of Cassville, made an Alford plea to endangering the welfare of a child in the second degree. Fare received a suspended imposition of sentencing and one year unsupervised probation.

On March 29, 2016, Fare hit the victim with a closed fist in the back of the head, face, chest, ribs and jaw. He

also tackled her to the ground and kicked her. Fare also took the victim's cell phone so she could not call for help. During the altercation, Fare also knocked a child in the home into a heater.

Fare is to serve probation until May 15, 2018.

• **Jody Don Hatton**, of Goodman, pled guilty to resisting arrest for a felony. Hatton is received a suspended execution of a four year sentence and five years supervised probation.

On September 8, 2016, Hatton was stopped for wading in a no wading area in Roaring River. When officers approached him, Hatton gave a false name and date of birth. Hatton could not produce a fishing license and then fled the scene on foot. Hatton had an active warrant for probation violation for manufacturing drugs and resisting arrest.

Hatton is to serve probation until May 15, 2022.

- Phillips passed a bad check on December 17, 2013, for \$75.41, knowing it would not be paid.
- Phillips is to serve probation until May 16, 2022.
- **Felisha Waynett Philpott**, of Shell Knob, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance. Philpott received three years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.
- On June 15, 2016, Philpott was passed out under a tree
- in a backyard on Townsend Street. When officers made contact, she was dumping out her purse, which contained four syringes and 20 Diazepam pills.
