Bayless Home renovations finishing, home to be open for tours Saturday

In 17 years, a historic home in Cassville has gone from condemned to renovated, and will soon be opening up for meetings and special groups. Thanks to the efforts of the Barry County Genea-logical and Historical Society (BCGHS), the Bayless (also known as the Bayless-Salyer) House has new life breathed into it.

Last week, BCGHS mem-ber, editor and registrar Georgia Hart was on site to talk about recent renovations, the last few things still needed by

the group and to show off a recent donation of furniture and a painting by local antique collector Fredalene Horner.

Hart said, “We’re praying and hoping it will be open for club meetings and whatnot soon.”

In 2000, the group stepped forward to purchase the home after it had been condemned by the City of Cassville. A back section of the home had caved in and it was, by all definitions, uninhabitable. As soon as they bought it, they began working on it.

As donations slowly came

in, the group would refin-ish things. While a lot of the brickwork and flooring was original, many other things had to be redone or patched up. In 2014, a large donation from a former Barry County resident’s estate provided the momentum for the group to get most of the house finished. That donation of \$50,000, by the late Margie Pannell, put the BCGHS much closer to their goal of being able to offer the historic home for meetings and get together.

With new windows, a newly finished staircase and

improvements throughout, there are only a few things the group hopes to complete. Hart

said, “We still need a stove for the kitchen and a little table for in there, as well. Then we need

an old dining table and chairs.” Other items include electric fireplaces for the double back-

MSHP urges safety on Halloween

Arkansas man injured in Golden crash

Colonel Sandra K. Karsten, superintendent of the Missouri State Highway Patrol, encourages everyone to incorporate safety into their plans for Halloween.

Trick-or-treaters are reminded to watch for traffic while they are out and about this Halloween. Remember to look both ways when crossing the street. Use sidewalks wherever possible when you're walking around a neighborhood. Trick-or-treaters are urged to do so while it is light outside. Increase visibility by taking a flashlight with you, especially after dark. An adult should always accompany small children, and older children should stay in groups.

Give some thought to safety when choosing a costume. Consider make-up rather than masks, since masks can make it difficult to see oncoming traffic. Wear light-colored clothing or add reflective tape to dark costumes to make them visible. Flame resistant costumes are the best ones.

Parents, please remind children to approach only familiar houses that are well lighted. Talk with them about never entering a stranger's house or vehicle. Consider trick-or-treating with your children for their safety and because it's a fun way to spend an evening.

Everyone should stay alert when driving on Halloween. Young children excited by Halloween could dart in front of a vehicle. Slow down, and drive with extra caution. If

you are headed to a costume party, make sure the costume doesn't hamper your vision while you're driving to the event! Motorists picking up and dropping off trick-or-treaters may result in an increase in the number of vehicles on the road, therefore affecting traffic patterns. Please be courteous and stay alert for trick-or-treaters of all ages. Distracted drivers are dangerous drivers; when you're driving keep your eyes on the road, not on your phone.

Halloween isn't just for children. Many adults enjoy dressing up and visit haunted houses or attend gatherings of friends. If you attend a Halloween party that includes alcohol, make sure you have a sober, designated driver for the trip home. Alcohol, even in small amounts, slows reaction time and dulls the senses. Drinking alcohol could have a sad and possibly deadly result.

A Rocky Comfort man was injured last week when the van he was driving hit a horse in the road. According to the Missouri State Highway Patrol crash report, the crash happened around 5:30 a.m. on Thursday, October 19.

Mark E. Tarrant, 62, of Rocky Comfort, was driving eastbound on Route B in a 2002 Chrysler Town and Country van. About two miles west of Purdy just east of Farm Road 1045, Tarrant hit a horse. The van then ran off the right side

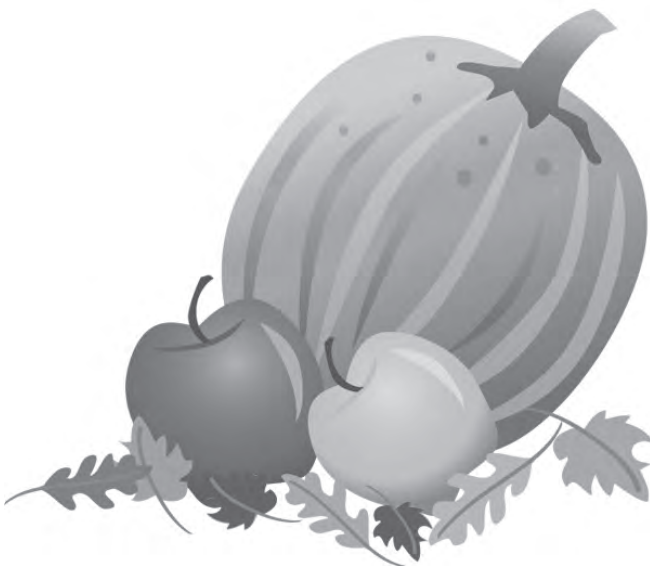

Drug Take Back Day this Saturday, Oct. 28

The Cassville Police Department is participating in the D.E.A. Prescription Take Back Day again. The entrance will be in the back of the building using the Council Chamber door.

The Prescription Take Back Day is to help people to properly dispose of unused medications. Proper disposal of medication helps to protect the environment and keeps the medicine from being flushed into the water system. This also helps keep

the medication out of the hands of people who do not have a prescription or need for the medication but want to use it for recreational use only.

The Cassville Police Department is encouraging people to take the time to clean out their medicine drawers and cabinets and properly dispose of their unused medicine.

They will also accept over-the-counter medications.

Inhalers, illegal drugs or sharp objects (i.e.syringes) will not be accepted. Medications will not be accepted from medical clinics, pharmacies or veterinary clinics.

Man arrested on statutory rape charges

A man from the Kansas City area has been charged with statutory rape from an alleged incident while he was on vacation at Table Rock Lake in 2013. Richard Thomas Woodbridge, 32, of Greenwood, is charged with statutory rape in the first degree for sex with a child under the age of 14.

Charges were filed against Woodbridge in June of this year, but the victim's mother advised that the incident had allegedly happened while they were on vacation at Table Rock Lake in Golden between June 3 and June 10, 2013.

Woodbridge also has multiple charges against him in Jackson County. According to court records, Woodbridge turned himself in and confessed to the incidents. He is charged with three counts of statutory sodomy in the first degree - deviate sexual intercourse with a child under the age of 14, statutory rape in the first degree and statutory rape in the second degree.

Woodbridge posted bond at the Jackson County Jail on October 16 and was then booked into the Barry County Jail on October 24 after being brought from Jackson County.

Woodbridge is currently being held in the Barry County jail in lieu of a \$100,000 cash-only bond. He has an arraignment slated for tomorrow, Thursday, October 26, at 8:30 a.m. in front of the honorable Judge Robert Foulke.

Woodbridge has a jury trial scheduled in Jackson County for February 26, 2018.

Washburn woman arrested after alleged stabbing

A Washburn woman has been charged with domestic assault and armed criminal action after an alleged stabbing.

Tabitha Page Gregory, 31, of Washburn, is charged with domestic assault in the first degree and armed criminal action. She is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$40,000 cash-only bond.

According to the affidavits of probable cause, the Barry County Sheriff's Department took a report last week of an assault. According to the victim's statement, Gregory, the victim's girlfriend, had stabbed him in the chest after they had gotten into an argument. The victim had to be transported to the hospital via helicopter for serious injuries.

When officers interviewed Gregory, she claimed the victim was hitting and kicking her. She told officers that when he kept coming at her after she told him to stop, she stabbed him in the chest with the knife. She said she then helped the victim in the house and called 911.

BAYLESS from FRONT

Bayless Home History

The Bayless home was originally built in the late 1870s by John M. Bayless. By 1879, Bayless wrote in his journal that they were living comfortably in the home. His complete journal has been copied and archived to be displayed in the home once the renovations are complete.

Bayless and his brother, W. K. Bayless, originally lived in Washburn. He would eventually become a well-known and respected community member, serving as a county official. Bayless came from humble beginnings, but worked his way up to owning a mercantile store and lumberyard, as well as beginning the first private bank in the county.

Bayless lived in Cassville until 1901 when he moved to Claremore, Oklahoma, until his death in 1907. The iconic home on Townsend would become part of his heritage and history.

Following the Bayless family, the home was purchased by the Salyer family who made a variety of changes, including a different porch and conversion of the interior to house apartments in the 1930s.

John Q. Hammons was a tenant in the home at one point, sparking his generous donation to help reclaim the house and preserve it for historical reasons.

In 2000, the home was purchased from the widow of the late Dr. Johnson, who also had an office next door to the property.

The renovations to the home have been dramatic to bring the two-story red brick building up to code while maintaining historical integrity. The back portion of the building had to be completely rebuilt when the brick walls collapsed.

The roof had to be redone, including the clay tiles. The porch's ceiling is adorned with custom-made tin tiles matching the originals.

The originally-collapsed back portion is now the Roden Room, dedicated to Mildred and Lorn Roden for their efforts in raising funds for the project. This room is a research room, including a donated microfilm reading machine.

The Lea Room sits next to the Roden room, which is where the old marriage records from the Barry County Courthouse are housed. Mrs. Bob Lea gave the funding in memory of her husband.

For the home, most donations have been made in honor or memory of a loved one with ties to the area. Each window will have a plaque beside it, naming the person who was honored by the donation.

to-back fireplaces that were in the home originally.

Horner's donation of furniture included five chairs, a couch and painting by Victor Dolding from 1819.

When questioned why she opted to donate the painting and furniture to the Bayless House, Horner said, "I just wanted a beautiful resting place for it."

She said the painting was purchased at an auction in Springfield. The scene is a marketplace in Rome.

She added, "I drive by to see the house and all they've done to it."

The transformation has been pretty incredible in the 17 years the BCGHS has owned the home. Aside from being a meeting place, they are also keeping records on site. Hart said, "Our main research and books and things will stay at

the Cassville Library because they're used more there, but we have the county's marriage records here as well as other research materials."

Hart said, "We're really proud of how much we've gotten done and how far we've come."

I want to remind readers to be careful trick or treating this year. There are the usual traffic issues to be wary of, but I want to remind everyone of a particular hazard in Cassville when out this year.

We live in Chinquapin, and as you may remember, there was an incident with a dog killing another dog here. Fortunately, that dog was relocated, and I felt a little safer in my neighborhood.

In September, my 9 year old son and I were out selling popcorn for a fundraiser. Being the good mom, I took him out in the neighborhood. We came to our neighbor's house. Her daughter opened the door and let the dog out. As I stepped off the porch, the dog bit me.

The owner had said the dog would go to live with her daughter, so I felt much safer after and made no other mention of the incident. As of today, October 23, the dog was running loose in my yard. This naturally made me fearful of leaving my own car to go into my own home.

The police were wonderful in contacting me quickly after I made a report. This incident prompts me to let your readers know to be cautious this season while out trick or treating. I can only imagine the damage that would have been done if the dog had bit my son instead of me.

Please steer clear of homes

with dogs aggressively barking and do not pet any stray dog in town. We, of course, desperately need a leash law to prevent further injuries, but in the meantime do what you need to protect yourself and your children. Please, teach your children on what to do if they see a stray dog.

Until a leash law is in effect, our children are at risk of injury or worse. I don't want to think of what would have happened if a 3-4 year old child had come innocently to my neighbor's door and had received the same bite, but instead of to my calf it could have been their face or worse. Cassville needs to put a law into effect not to put undue strain on the budget, but to protect her citizens. I fear the law will only be changed when a horrific attack occurs to one of our children.

Two were charged with marijuana distribution after officers executed a search warrant at a Monett apartment. Sebastian Delmonte Waibel, 17, of Monett, and Cameron Michael Torpacka, 18, of Monett, are each charged with delivery of 35 grams or less of marijuana and unlawful possession of drug paraphernalia.

On October 19, the Combined Ozarks Multi-Jurisdictional Enforcement Team Drug Task Force aided the Monett Police Department with a search warrant at an apartment on 6th Street in Monett.

Once inside, officers found \$3,855 in cash in the apartment, some in a false book in a safe. In plain

sight, officers saw a scale with a cup with marijuana residue inside. There were also other people in the apartment there to purchase marijuana, according to their statements.

Officers located five large vacuum seal bags of marijuana, marijuana extract, and marijuana oil, as well as paraphernalia in the home.

Waibel allegedly admit-

ted to selling the marijuana, but he believed it should be legalized, and he was planing to move to Alaska where it is legal.

Torpacka was the tenant of the apartment, and he allegedly admitted to officers that he allowed Waibel to live there and sell drugs out of the apartment.

During the search, officers also found a handgun Waibel claimed was stolen

and was used to prevent from being "ripped off." While the search warrant was executed, officers saw multiple text messages come in on Wiabel's phone that appeared to be about drug sales as well as another telling them the cops were coming and to get rid of their drugs.

Waible and Torpacka were both released on their own recognizance.

Wildcats defeat Hollister, take on Reeds Spring Friday

The Cassville Wildcats dominated Hollister in the district opener on Friday night, posting a 47-0 victory at Wildcat Stadium.

The Wildcats scored touchdowns on seven straight possessions, and the Cassville defense limited the Tigers to just four first downs in the shutout.

It could have been worse. The game ended with Cassville's freshman quarterback Killian Barbee taking a knee at the Hollister 7-yard line.

This was a textbook example of the advantage of a high district seed. By vaulting into second position with the victory over Mt. Vernon last week, Cassville earned a home game against the 2-7 Tigers, a team that started

the season with victories over Pleasant Hope and Cabool, both Class 1 schools. Friday's 47-0 decimation sent Hollister home with an 8-game losing streak to end the season.

The Wildcats scored at will in the first half of this contest. The first Cassville possession was a dud, hampered by a first-down penalty. But a DJ Whiten interception gave the Cats possession at midfield, and set the stage for the scoring fest.

Hollister finally crossed midfield late in the second quarter when Logan Armitage ran 20 yards with a fake punt, giving the Tigers a first down at the Cassville 36-yard line. But Jackson Bekemeier was sacked by Evan Kessinger on second down, and again on fourth down by Logan Carlin. The Wildcats took over at the Hollister 45-yard line with just 24 seconds left in the half.

Carlin burst outside to the sideline for a 14-yard gain, and Cassville called time out.

There is considerable debate among football purists as to the name of the trick play that Clay Weldy had saved for this situation. But whether you call it the "Hook and Lateral" or the Hook and Ladder", it hooked the Hollister defense.

Haney rifled a pass to Ethan Hoppes on the left hashmark, and Hoppes nonchalantly pitched the ball to Bowen Preddy as he raced by.

Preddy motored down the sideline and into the endzone with just 8 seconds showing on the clock. Reese drilled yet another extra point and Cassville took a 28-0 lead to the dressing room.

Haney threw two touchdown passes in less than five minutes to open the third quarter as Cassville opened a 40-0 lead. Haney hit Preddy

on a skinny post route for a 64-yard strike on the second snap of the quarter, and then found White open in the seam for a 26-yard score. Counting the "hitch and pitch" play, Haney had thrown for three touchdowns on his last three pass attempts at that point in the game.

Knight returned a punt down to the Hollister 32-yard line late in the third quarter to set up Cassville's final score. Tolbert creased the Hollister defense for a 16-yard touchdown run to boost the lead to 47-0.

The Wildcat reserves ran out the mercy clock in the fourth quarter. Jacob Housekeeper burst through the line for a 21-yard gain to the

Hollister 15-yard line in the waning seconds, but Lance Parnell had his team take a knee to end the game.

Cassville improved to 7-3 with the victory, and will host Reeds Spring in a Class 3 District 4 semifinal on Friday night. T

he Wolves improved to 8-2 on Friday night when they dismantled Monett, 59-6. Reeds Spring is riding an 8-game winning streak after opening the season with losses to Mt. Vernon and Cassville.

Cassville Clean Up Oct. 30 to Nov. 3

The City of Cassville’s annual fall clean-up will be held October 30 through November 3. Republic Services will accept additional household waste and large items on regular collection days.

The following items will be accepted at the curb: barbecue grills; patio furniture; outdoor furniture; sofas; dressers; loveseats; recliners; desks; televisions; bundled guttering; beds, including hide-a-beds, mattresses and box springs; wood pallets; waste from small remodeling or wood projects, materials must be cut into four-foot sections and stacked; sinks; toilets; cabinets; vanities; carpet that is cut into four-foot lengths and bundled; fencing that is cut into four-foot lengths; and bicycles.

Republic Services will not accept: tires, yard waste, large quantities of ash, dead animals, raw sewage, waste oil, hazardous materials, wet paint containers, chemicals, flammable substances, lead or acid batteries, or waste from

large remodeling or construction projects.

Appliances will also be accepted. Cassville residents can set large appliances at the curb side for Republic Services to collect. There is a \$15 fee. Residents must pay the fee to Republic Services in order to schedule the pick-up of the appliance. The following large appliances will be accepted after the \$15 fee has been paid: dishwashers; washing machines; dryers; water heaters; and stoves. Republic Services will also accept refrigerators, freezers and air conditioners that display a tag from a licensed technician proving that all freon has been removed from the item.

Yard waste will be accepted as normal at the Yard Waste facility behind the Cassville Aquatic Park.

Barry County Courts incarcerate 8 in the month of September

• **Gary Don Adams**, of Monett, pled guilty to endangering the welfare of a child in the first degree as a first offense with no sexual contact in 2016. Adams' probation has since been revoked and he was sentenced to seven years incarceration with the department of Corrections with the execution of that sentence suspended and five years supervised probation.

On February 28, 2016, the Missouri State Highway Patrol assisted in a pursuit that began in Benton County Arkansas. While en route, Adams crashed his vehicle. A woman and an 18 month old baby were also in the car.

Adams had been speeding from officers at speeds that reached between 90 to 100 miles per hour. When Adams crashed, he ran into a barbed wire fence. Adams could not pass a sobriety test on the scene.

Once Adams was transported for medical treatment, officers found two glass pipes used for smoking marijuana. There was also a wooden box in the vehicle that contained marijuana.

Adams is to serve probation until September 18, 2022.

• **Matthew M. Aguilar**, of Springfield, pled guilty to leaving the scene of a motor vehicle accident with an injury or property damage and resisting arrest by fleeing while creating a substantial risk for injury or death in 2016. Aguilar has since violated his probation and was sentenced to four years incarceration with the Department of Corrections with the execution of that sentence suspended and five years supervised probation.

On October 9, 2013, the Monett Police Department initiated a traffic stop of a Jeep driving on the wrong side of the roadway. When the vehicle finally stopped, the driver fled on foot. Officers arrested another passenger who fled on foot. However, a second passenger had been thrown from the vehicle and was taken to Cox South Hospital in Springfield via helicopter for injuries.

Aguilar was the driver of the vehicle who fled on foot.

Aguilar is to serve probation until September 19, 2022.

• **Damian Arreola-Chico**, of Monett, made an Alford plea to unlawful use of a weapon - possession of a weapon and a felony-controlled substance and trafficking in drugs within a motor vehicle. Arreola-Chico received a suspended execution of a ten year incarceration sentence and five years supervised probation.

On August 9, 2016, Arreola-Chico was arrested for drug trafficking and unlawful use of a weapon. A confidential source admitted to purchasing methamphetamine from Arreola-Chico in the past.

Under officers' supervision, the confidential source purchased half an ounce of crystal methamphetamine from Arreola-Chico. In total, the confidential source purchased over an ounce of meth-

amphetamine.

When officers pulled him over, they seized two ounces of methamphetamine, a .45 caliber pistol, two holsters, multiple .45 magazines and a case of ammo.

Arreola-Chico is to serve probation until September 18, 2022.

• **Michael James Bogle**, of Purdy, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance in 2016. Bogle has since had his probation revoked and he is to serve 120 days shock time with the Department of Corrections.

On August 25, 2016, Bogle distributed methamphetamine and marijuana. Officers found a ledger for his transactions as well as items for packaging and distributing narcotics. Officers found a glass pipe with methamphetamine residue and a bag of methamphetamine.

• **Ruben James Christy**, of Monett, pled guilty to property damage in the first degree and tampering with a motor vehicle in the first degree. Christy received a suspended execution of a three year incarceration sentence and four years supervised probation.

On September 16, 2016, Christy broke a glass door, window, window screens, a flower pot, a dead bolt and door handle at a residence on Private Road 2012 in Monett. The total damage was \$935.

Then, on June 18, 2017, Christy stole a 2004 Oldsmobile from a residence on Highway 112 in Cassville.

Christy is to serve probation until September 18, 2021.

• **Joshua Steven Clifton**, of Morrison, pled guilty to burglary in the second degree. Clifton was sentenced to five years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On August 8, 2017, Clifton broke into the Yonkerville Store in Pierce City. Clifton stole at least \$27 worth of lottery tickets and \$300 worth of cigarettes. He also broke a glass door with a rock.

Clifton was identified with the security camera footage. Officers when to a home where Clifton was staying, but the woman in the residence said she did not know where he was and refused to give officers his last name.

When officers caught Clifton, he told them that drugs made him do stupid things.

• **Bryan Dewayne Davis**, of Cassville, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance. Davis received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

On June 1, 2017, Davis was found to have a glass pipe with methamphetamine residue, two digital scales, a manual scale, clear plastic bags and 38 yellow pills.

Davis is to serve probation until September 13, 2022.

• **Dakota Ray Dunham**, of Gerald, pled guilty to sexual misconduct or attempt involving a child under 15 as a first offense. Dunham received a suspended execution of a four year incarceration sentence with the Department of Cor-

On February 28, 2015, Dunham sent pictures of his privates to a thirteen year old girl using his cell phone.

Dunham is to serve probation until October 27, 2022.

• **John Gary Ellrick**, of Purdy, made an Alford plea to tampering with a motor vehicle in the first degree. Ellrick received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

On December 20, 2015, Ellrick was riding in a car with his son and a few other people. They saw a car parked on Farm Road 1135 and began going through it, looking for things to steal. After, they worried about fingerprints, so they set the car on fire.

Ellrick is to serve probation until September 19, 2022.

MO hunters encouraged to Share the Harvest

The program works by deer hunters donating their extra venison -- from several pounds to whole deer -- to participating meat processors throughout the state who grind and package the deer meat. The packaged venison is then given to food banks and food pantries for distribution to Missourians in need of food assistance.

“Hunters started Share the Harvest because they saw a need in their communities,” said MDC Director Sara Pauley. “And hunters remain the driving force behind this popular program that helps feed our fellow Missourians who are in need. We sincerely thank the thousands of deer hunters who support Share the Harvest, along with the many participating meat processors and sponsors.”

Processing fees are covered entirely or in part by numerous local sponsors, along with statewide sponsors that include: MDC, CFM, Shelter Insurance, Bass Pro Shops, Missouri Chapter Safari Club International, Missouri Chapter National Wild Turkey Federation, Midway USA Inc., Missouri Food Banks Association, and United Bowhunters of Missouri

Hunters should contact individual processors to determine what funds are available. The cost of processing is the hunter's responsibility when funds to help cover the full cost of processing are not available.

“Share the Harvest is a partnership of citizens, agencies, organizations, and corporations working together to provide healthy, protein-rich meat to those who may otherwise go without,” said CFM Executive Director Brandon Butler. “Hunters across Missouri should be proud of this

outstanding program.”

Nearly 4,300 Missouri deer hunters donated more than 198,000 pounds of venison to the program last deer season. Since the program was started in 1992, Share the Harvest has provided more than 3.6 million pounds of lean, healthy venison to help feed hungry Missourians.

Information about donating deer from CWD counties

Share the Harvest is committed to providing healthy venison to help feed hungry Missourians.

Deer donated to Share the Harvest that were harvested in the seven Missouri counties where chronic wasting disease (CWD) has been found will be tested for the deer disease. Deer that test positive for CWD will not be used and will be properly disposed of. The seven counties are: Adair, Cole, Franklin, Jefferson, Linn, Macon, and St. Clair.

CWD is a deadly illness for white-tailed deer and other members of the deer family called cervids. MDC is working with conservation partners to find cases and limit the spread of CWD. Based on CWD testing MDC has conducted, the disease appears to be relatively rare in the state at this time with only 42 cases found in seven counties out of more than 76,000 deer tested around the state.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), there have been no documented cases of CWD in humans. As a safeguard, the CDC recommends hunters strongly consider having their harvested deer tested for CWD before eating the meat if the animal was harvested from an area where CWD has been found. The CDC also recommends not consuming an animal that tests positive for the disease. For more information on CWD, visit mdc.mo.gov/cwd.
