Purdy Schools request bond issue votes for campus FEMA shelter

The Purdy R-II School District is requesting a \$2.3 million bond to build a tornado shelter with the aid of FEMA grants. The bond measure will appear on the August 2, 2016, Primary ballot and the measure will not require a tax increase for citizens.

Purdy voters are being asked to approve the issue, allowing the school to utilize a portion of their debt capacity to acquire a bond. If the bond passes, there will be no additional taxes for Purdy School District residents, but rather it will allow the school to borrow the funds to get the tornado shelter constructed.

The plan for the shelter shows the building at around 8,000 square feet, and it will be able to house around 1,300 in the event of an emergency. If school is in session, the facility would be open on campus, however, since FEMA is involved, residents that live within a certain area near the shelter will also receive a letter if they are in the evacuation

Main Street sidewalk work to begin next week

The sidewalk replacements being made to Main Street in Cassville are set to begin next week and should be completed by March 31, 2017. The project, initiated and planned by the Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT), is expected to cost \$900,000.

MoDOT announced in mid-March of this year that the sidewalks along Main Street between 5th and 17th Streets would be replaced in order to make them ADA compliant. Since then, it has been a waiting game to wait for the final dates to be revealed.

The project stirred up different feelings from the community due to the necessity of removing some of the older senior sidewalks at Cassville Schools. The school formed a committee to come up with a replacement, and a monument is currently in the works to house all of former graduates'

July 18 and will continue until spring of next year. The first part of the project will begin near Cassville School to ensure that work is completed by the time school starts on August

As the crews move forward, most of the work will be completed at the side of the road, but lane closures will be possible depending on the work area. As they move toward the downtown area, the contractor will communicate with local businesses about entrances to their shops and how to minimize the impact on local commerce as crews proceed with the project.

The contractor for the project is Branco Enterprises, Inc., of Neosho. Funding for the project comes from federal funds designated for sidewalk improvements and pedestrian crossings to be compliant with the Americans with Disabili-

While work is slated to finish by March 31, 2017, weather and/or construction delays are

Sheriff's Dept. finds bomb in towed car

The Barry County Sheriff's Department found a bomb in a car towed after a chase through Exeter. Both the driver and the passenger were arrested on drug-related charges, and after the bomb was found, both will likely face charges for the explosive device as well.

According to the affidavit of probable cause, Barry County Sheriff's Deputy Alvin Zabala was in pursuit of a car near Farm Road 1075 in Exeter on July 7 just after midnight. The driver attempted to flee, but eventually lost control of the vehicle on private

Officers found a large

amount of cash in the vehicle, as well as methamphetamine, small plastic bags and a scale. Jeffery B. Stout, 35, of Seligman, and Sharra D. Westlin, 34, of Verona, were arrested and charged with distribution of a controlled substance. Stout was also charged with resisting arrest by fleeing, causing substantial risk to

will be held on Monday, July 18, beginning at 6 p.m., and there will be a free barbecue dinner for those attending. The Barry County Republicans host this event annually as a way for local residents to get to know the candidates appearing on the Primary and/or General Election bal-

David Cole, of the Barry County Republicans, said, "Statewide candidates, congressional candidates, as well as our local candidates will be there, and it'll be a good opportunity for voters to see all of these people in one place. It'll be a good thing."

Senator Blunt will be the featured speaker, and each of the candidates on the national, state and local levels will be given the opportunity to address the crowd and present their positions.

Senator Blunt is a United State Senator representing Missouri since 2011. Sen. Blunt was Missouri U.S. Congressional Representative for the 7th District from 1997 to 2011. He also served as Missouri Secretary of State from 1985 to 1993.

This will not be a forum with open questions, but rather an opportunity for voters to get to know the candidates running for office.

Contested local races are the positions of Barry County Sheriff and Barry County Public Administrator. The Republican candidate who takes the August Primary will face Democrat candidate Dave Ruark in the General Election on November 8. The Public Administrator Republican candidate will be unopposed in the General Election.

Additional candidates on the Republican Primary Ballot were also invited. Contested offices are U.S. Senator, Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State, Attorney General, and U.S. Representa-

tive for District. Unopposed in the Primary are incumbents State Treasurer Eric Schmitt, District 29 Date Senator David Sater, District 158 State Representative Scott Fitzpatrick and Northern District County Commissioner Gary Schad. Additionally, Matt F. Cupps is going to be facing incumbent Democrat Wayne Hendrix in the General Election

The August 2, 2016, Primary Election is already open for absentee voting which will conclude on Monday, August 1. Polls will be open the day of the Primary from 6 a.m. to 7

Yonkerville Store, Cassville Bowl burglar to serve five years

The man arrested for both the Yonkerville Store and Cassville Bowl burglaries was sentenced to five years incarceration after pleading guilty in court on June 23.

Jerry Ray Hartkopp, 54, of Wheaton, pled guilty to two counts of possession of a controlled substance, three counts of burglary in the second degree, one count of theft of a credit device, one count of property damage in the first degree and two counts of theft/stealing of \$500 to \$25,000 in value.

Hartkopp's first charge of possession of a controlled substance came from an investigation of his home in March 2016. When officers arrived, Hartkopp's girlfriend, Marsha Branham, was attempting to get rid of drugs by flushing them down the toilet. Hartkopp was charged with possession of methamphetamine for the drugs found in his apartment.

Hartkopp was charged with breaking into the Yonkerville Store in Monett and stealing \$175 in cash, a collection of collectible coins and credit cards and doing \$1,000 worth of damage during the break in on March 27, 2016.

When Hartkopp was booked into the Barry County Jail for other crimes, he was wearing the same jacket he was wearing when he broke into Ziggie's Cafe in Monett on March 7. The security footage at Ziggie's showed Hartkopp. He stole over \$5,000 in cash from the cafe from the safe and cash register, as well as damaging the ATM and stealing an unknown amount of money from it.

Finally, the Cassville Police Department tied Hartkopp to the Cassville Bowl burglary on March 5, 2016, where he threw a rock

through the glass door, damaged vending machines to steal change, stole bank bags containing \$544, as well as tools, two bowling balls and a box of gift cards to the bowling alley.

Hartkopp was sentenced to five years on each of the theft/stealing charges, burglary charges, credit theft charge and possession charges. He was sentenced to three years on the property damage charge, but all of his sentences were set to run concurrently, so he is to serve five years incarceration with the Department of Corrections overall.

BOMB from FRONT

Following the case, the vehicle Stout was driving was towed by Brice's Towing of Cassville. The Sheriff's Department executed a search on the vehicle, and Detective Doug Henry said he found a bomb in the backseat.

Henry said, "While searching, I saw an item in the back seat with black tape and wires. I started to remove the tape, and I could tell it was an explosive."

The Barry County Sheriff's Department enlisted the assistance of the Bentonville, Ark., Bomb Squad and the Cassville Fire Department to get the bomb secured.

As of time of press, additional charges have not been filed against Stout or Westlin of the explosive device, but Barry County Prosecuting Attorney Amy Boxx anticipates charges for unlawful possession of an explosive device to be filed against the pair by the end of the week. Stout and West-

lin are each being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of \$40,000 bonds.

Washburn woman's kidnapper sentenced to more time for Barry County charges

Mathew Miller, 22, of Eagle Rock, was sentenced to more time for Barry County charges related to the kidnapping of a Washburn woman in January 2014 and a drug conspiracy at the Barry County Jail in

Miller was one of two brothers who pled guilty to kidnapping the Washburn woman, putting her in the trunk of her car, stealing from her bank account and then pushing her down a hill and abandoning her car in the Roaring River arm of Table Rock Lake.

Miller's more ous charges originated in

McDonald County where the woman was abducted from, but he pled guilty to felonious restraint and tampering with a motor vehicle in Barry County and was sentenced to seven years incarceration on each charge.

After being arrested for the kidnapping, Miller up additional charges for his role in a drug conspiracy where he and another inmate convinced a jailer in Barry County to bring marijuana to them. He was also charged with escaping with another inmate from the McDonald County Jail, as well.

Miller was sentenced to seven years incarceration for his role in the drug con-

spiracy and another four years for the escape from Lake Homes Realty, LLC

CREATIVE WAYS TO CUT **COLLEGE COSTS**

When considering this option, make sure credits at the two-year college fully transfer to the four-year school students hope to enroll in after earning their associate's degrees.

· Remain in-state for undergraduate degrees. In-state tuition at public universities remains a considerable bargain over out-of-state tuition or tuition at private universities. Students planning to do postgraduate work might benefit by enrolling in instate public universities and saving their money to finance their postgraduate educations. Students who hope to attend a public university in a state that borders their home state may be eligible for a border waiver, which grants them in-state tuition even though they attended high school outside of the state.

Attending college has never been more expensive, but students and their parents can explore various options that can help reduce the cost of college tuition.




Officers arrested Clancy and he is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$30,000.

ing for a tax increase. We can meet our goals without raising taxes. Two, it allows us to continue on our little master building plan that is purposeful. it's part of a real vision of what education in Purdy looks like. The bond helps us make it a multipurpose building and address a ton of our needs."

The FEMA grant for the building will cover 75 percent of the base costs of a storm shelter, however, the school wants to use the additional funding to make the building more multipurpose. Instead of a "box," the building will be converted into a dual purpose storm shelter and performing arts center.

The bond will also make it possible to have a new preschool, new parking and a new band/choir room. It is yet to be determined what the seating capacity of the performing arts center will be until plans are finalized.

Dr. Chancelor said, "We can build a box and wait for the tornado to come, or we can use a bond and use that building every single day and the tornado shelter is available to us."

The building is to be constructed in the open area between the playground and existing preschool with the lobby facing Highway C.

Dr. Chancelor added that the preschool has been a longterm goal for the district. He said, "We identified that our preschool was 20 years from being condemned. It all started with how to get a preschool. Well, if we get a FEMA building, we can have a preschool. We have a waiting list for kids to get into our preschool, and we'll be able to expand."

While there is not a set time line for the project, it will happen if the bond is successfully passed and the FEMA paperwork is approved. The school anticipates a six-month construction window once the project formally begins.

Other schools in the district have undertaken similar projects in recent years. Cassville Schools has two FEMA shelters, one near the elementary, intermediate and middle schools, and one near the high school. Wheaton voters passed a bond measure to build a FEMA shelter earlier this year in April with funds anticipated to be distributed in August.

The exact wording on the August 2 ballot reads:

"Shall Purdy R-II School District, Barry County, Missouri, issue its general obligation bonds in the amount of \$2,300,000 for the purpose acquiring, constructing, improving, furnishing and equipping school facilities, including but not limited to (1) construction of a multipurpose facility qualifying as a FEMA storm shelter, contingent upon receipt of a 75% FEMA grant for the facility, and (2) to the extent funds are available, adding classrooms to existing buildings? Approval of this proposition is estimated to result in no tax increase over the existing debt service levy of \$0.73 per one hundred dollars of assessed valuation of real and personal property."

A 'yes' vote will allow the school to take out a bond for the project, and a 'no' vote will deny the school to take out the bond. No taxes are anticipated to be raised with the measure.

Absentee voting for the August 2 Primary is currently open and will close Monday, August 1. The polls will be open for voting Tuesday, August, 2, 2016, from 6 a.m.





Barry County Courts send 11 to prison in the month of June

• Jinifer L. Babcock pled guilty to stealing of \$500 to \$25,000 in value. Babcock was granted a suspended execution of a five year incarceration sentence and five years supervised probation.

Babcock was arrested when the Cassville Police Department was dispatched to Walmart on February 6, 2014, for a woman leaving the store with a cart full of items without paying for them. When officers arrived, Babcock was still in her vehicle in the parking lot. Inside the black SUV, they found a flashlight, clothing, teeth whitening strips, a bathroom faucet and many other items. The total value of the stolen merchandise was \$1,108.92.

Babcock is to serve probation until June 21, 2021.

• Roger Dale Balch, of Cassville, pled guilty to theft/ stealing of \$500 to \$25,000 in value. Balch was already on probation for charges in 2014 of property damage in the first degree, tapering with a victim or witness, and assault in the third degree. His guilty plea to the stealing charge resulted

in a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

Balch was on probation for damage to the picnic tables at the Cassville City Park, as well as threatening a witness to the damage. The more recent incident occurred in December 2015 when Blach was charged with stealing a six foot by 12 foot double axle U Haul trailer.

Balch is to continue to serve probation until June 20, 2021.

• Jeremy L. Burton, of Cassville, made an Alford plea to burglary in the second degree. Burton was already on probation for a guilty plea to passing bad checks in 2014. Burton was sentenced to five years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

Burton's recent charge originated from an investigation in November 2015. Burton entered a residence without permission and demanded \$20 from the victim before stealing her purse. He also punched the victim in the arm, causing large

bruising.

Burton was on probation for passing bad checks in 2014. Burton wrote multiple checks to Ramey's that he knew would not be paid.

• Rebecca Lynn Chaddock, of Cassville, pled guilty to non-support. Chaddock was granted a suspended imposition of sentencing and two years unsupervised probation.

As of March, 15, 2015, Chaddock was in arrears on child support for her two minor children. Chaddock was ordered to pay from \$313 per month to \$379 per month dependent on year. Chaddock was in total arrears of \$10,995.71 as of December 23, 2014.

Chaddock is to serve probation until June 20, 2018.

• James Conrad, of Fulton, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance. Conrad received a suspended execution of a seven year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections and five years supervised probation.

Conrad was charged after a search of his vehicle in March 2015 yielded methamphetamine.

Conrad is to serve probation until June 25, 2021.

• Morgan Meckenzie Conway, of Monett, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance. Conway was granted a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation

Conway was charged after being pulled over by the Missouri State Highway Patrol on June 27, 2015. Conway admitted to having used methamphetamine recently, and she had a Valium in her possession that she was not legally entitled to.

Conway is to serve probation until June 20, 2021.

• Thomas Ryan Cummins, of Monett, had his probation revoked for charges he pled guilty to in 2015. Cummins pled guilty to theft of a credit device and four counts of forgery, and he is now to serve five years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

Cummins' charges originated when a purse was stolen from a vehicle in 2014, and the credit card inside was used to make multiple

charges. Cummins was in concert with another for the theft and charges. Cummins signed a false name.

• Dalton Ross Evans, of Gateway, Ark., pled guilty to burglary in the second degree and theft/stealing of \$500 to \$25,000. Evans received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

In November 2015, Evans forced entry into a resident on Farm Road 1090 in Seligman, damaging the door. Once inside, Evans stole a 60 inch flat screen TV valued at \$2,309.76. The TV was located in Gateway, Ark.

Evans is to serve probation until June 20, 2021.

• Mark Dwight Fixico, of Okemah, Okla., pled guilty to non-support with the total arrears longer than 12 months. Fixico received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years unsupervised probation.

In April 2010, Fixico was ordered to pay \$206 a moth in support of his minor child. Fixico was in total arrears for more than 12 months, owing \$9,330.81.

Fixico is to serve probation until June 20, 2021.

• James Lee Flanigan, of Hillsboro, pled guilty to four counts of forgery. Flanigan received a suspended execution of a seven year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections and five years supervised probation.

son's checks at Fast trip and Casey's in Cassville in November 2015.

Flanigan is to serve probation until June 20, 2021.

• Jerry Ray Hartkopp, of Wheaton, pled guilty to two counts of possession of a controlled substance, three counts of burglary in the second degree, three counts of theft of any credit device, and property damage in the first degree. Hartkopp was sentenced to between three and five years incarceration with the Department of Corrections for each charge.

Hartkopp was charged for possession after methamphetamine was found in his home where there are minor children in April 2016. In March 2016, Hartkopp broke into the Yonkerville Store in Monett and stole \$175 plus collectible coins and credit cards. Around \$1,000 of damage was done to the building.



Missouri girls qualify at Olympic Trials

While Emma Coburn, the third-ranked women's steeplechaser in the world, won as expected at the Olympic Trials in Eugene, Oregon, on Thursday night, a pair of Missouri girls stole the show and the other two Olympic qualifying spots. Nixa's Courtney Frerichs and St. Louis native Colleen Quigley placed second and third, respectively, to earn spots on the USA national team for the Rio Olympics.

Coburn led most of the race, cruising home in the fifth-fastest time ever for an American woman in the 3K steeplechase event, 9:17.48. Frerichs was a distant fourth entering the gun lap, but outkicked Quigley over the final 300 meters to take second.

Frerichs finished in 9:20.92 to 9:21.29 for Quigley.

The two Missouri girls approached the final straight-away in a virtual dead heat along with Stephanie Garcia. But Garcia clipped the last barrier and fell, while

Frerichs and Quigley chased Coburn to the finish line.

The time was a monster PR for Frerichs, who set the NCAA 3K steeplechase record this season with a 9:24.41.

In the men's steeplechase event, former College Heights distance dynasty standout Caleb Hoover barely missed qualifying for the final by .10 seconds, running 8:37.7 in his preliminary heat on Monday.

Earlier, in an event not emphasized by the media, two other Missouri girls punched their ticket to the Olympics. Gwen Berry and Deanna Price both qualified in the hammer throw finals on Wednesday. Berry took the silver medal with a throw of 239-9, and Price claimed the bronze, also throwing 239-9 with her best effort.

Finally, Brittany Borman of De Soto earned a spot in the Olympics for the second time, placing third in the discus event on Saturday with a throw of 185-6.

Sweatfest slays state standards

On a hot and muggy evening at Strafford, state standards tumbled like dominoes as many of Missouri's best road racers turned out for an assault on the record books on Saturday. The bulk of the records fell in the 2-Mile, where two dozen single-age records were eclipsed.

From 6-year old Todd Lucas of Springfield to 68-year old Ron Boyer of Fair Grove, new state marks piled up at an amazing rate. Part of the reason for the record harvest was the nearflat out-and-back course. Another factor, alluded to in an earlier running blog, is the lack of certified courses for this distance.

While neither the men's or women's overall state records fell, the race was arguably the largest single-race treasure trove in Missouri road racing history.

One of the highlights of the 2-mile event was the matchup of elite masters runners John Howland, 67, of Jefferson City, and Henri Coeme, 63, of Neosho. These two have simply defied age and have retained excellent sprint speed well beyond the

abilities of most of their contemporaries.

After running side by side for nearly a mile and a half, Howland surged ahead when Coeme suffered a severe cramp. While Howland flew home in 13:00, Coeme shut it down and jogged in to avoid further injury. Even at that, he still recorded a new single-age record with his 14:22.

I was no match for Howland and normally would not be for Coeme, but I was also in a different age-category. My 13:47 2-mile record for M60 probably won't last long, but it at least raised the bar for future runners.

My claim to fame with this run? I now hold single age records for the 2 Mile, the shortest distance recognized in the Missouri record book and for the 50 mile, the longest distance recognized. I also have a few in between, but the bookends represent a total approach to the sport.

But if I was really fast, I would just run the 100.

Meters, not miles.

See you at the starting line.

Local author signs multi-book deal with publisher

A long-standing Ozarks tradition culminated into a five-book deal for local Cassville author Prix Gautney. Publisher Oghma Creative Media out of Arkansas offered Gautney a five-book deal for a young adult fantasy series called "Evershade" plus an additional book deal for a western novel titled "The Cochetopa Kid."

"Evershade" came about after something her son told her years ago. Gautney said, "Each autumn, we harvest black walnuts, and one year, the walnuts began to fall weeks before the huller opened to buy them. We hoarded the walnuts in an enormous mound at the corner of our house, and I told him that we were the keepsers of the walnuts. He said that we were the 'Walnut Keepers.' I thought "The Walnut Keepers" would make a good title, so I stashed it away in my mind for a couple of years, eventually developing an entire world around the one idea."

While Gautney didn't end up sticking with the title and instead went with "Evershade," the premise stayed the same. The story is about woodland creatures who made Evershade their home, and those creatures are the Walnut Keepers.

Gautney's writing has been a long-standing part of her life. She is a part of a writers' group called Mid South Writers. The group attends a conference in Eureka Springs, Ark., each fall, and that is where she was offered the deal.

Gautney signed up to pitch the story of Everyshade and one other to Oghma. Last fall, she also won first prize in the western category sponsored by western author Dusty Richards, leading her to get another contract. In all, Gautney will be writing five books in the "Evershade" series and one for the western novel "The Cochetopa Kid."

The first two chapters of "The Cochetopa Kid" were published in the magazine "Saddlebag Dispatches" last month and can be read online at www.saddlebagdispatches.com.

Gatuney's first novel in the Evershade series is titled "Season of Crows" and will be available through Amazon and Barnesandnoble. com on July 22. Some copies will be available locally, but those locations are yet to be announced.

Local contributions also helped to make "Evershade" possible, including an illustrated map and development of a complete language for the turtles by local artist Ben DeVore. Springfield artist David A. Frizell did the cover

Gautney lives in Cassville and has two children, Nefertiti, 14, and Quixote, 12.

Gautney will be discussing her book at the Cassville Library on Monday, July 25, at 7 p.m. as part of the summer reading program.







Extension office offers simple tips save water

Farmers and rural residents can use simple tips to conserve water in the home during drought, says University of Missouri Extension water quality specialist Bob Broz.

Many farmers and rural residents rely on private water wells. Groundwater levels may have little time to recharge when there is low precipitation and high demand.

Wells close together may feed from the same water source, known as an aquifer. Water outages, sudden drops in water pressure or surges, and cloudy or heavily silted water may be signs that your well is not keeping up with demand, Broz says.

Users may also experience problems with valves, waterlines, pumps, well casings and pressure tanks during drought. "It is important to work with a licensed pump installer and well driller to properly diagnose the problem and decide what corrective action to take," Broz says.

The best approach is to save water by simple measures in the home, he says. Two-thirds of water used in the average home is in the bathroom.

Talk with family members and visitors about ways to conserve water:

Turn water off when brushing your teeth. This saves about 2 gallons of water. Use a glass to rinse.

Turn water off when shaving. This saves 4 gallons of water. Plug the sink and use as little water as possible to wet and rinse your face and clean the razor and sink

Don't use the toilet as a waste can. Toilets use 3 to 6 gallons per flush. Put your trash in the trash can instead of flushing it down the toilet.

Take short showers. Limit showers to about four



to five minutes. A 10-minute shower uses about 55 gallons of water. Replace old shower heads with new high-efficiency ones.

Taking baths instead of showers can save water if you don't fill the tub with more than 25 to 40 gallons.

Kitchens are another area where water is often wasted, Broz says. Automatic dishwashers use 9-12 gallons per load. Run the dishwasher only when completely full. Dishwashers may actually use less water than hand washing, Broz says. If you hand wash dishes, use a container of rinse water rather than rinsing dishes under a running faucet.

Garbage disposals use about 2 gallons of water each time they run. Compost your waste instead. Don't leave the faucet running when you clean vegetables.

Automatic washing machines use about 45 gallons of water per load, Broz says. Run full loads or adjust the water level properly.

Also, clean your sidewalk and driveway with a broom when it's hot outside. Washing your driveway can take 60-120 gallons of water.

Watering your lawn and shrubs also takes large amounts of water, so do it wisely and at the right time of day.






