This Saturday, July 15, marks the sixth annual Purdy Festival. The event will feature a 5K, car show, free rides for kids, livestock show and plenty of food and entertainment.

Each year, the Purdy Festival is held in the city park with events spanning the entire day, the earliest beginning at 7:30 a.m. and things winding down around 4 p.m.

Memorial cross placed in honor of fallen Barry County officer Carl Cosper, Jr.

A memorial cedar cross has been placed at the site of a car crash that took the life of Barry County Sheriff's Master Sergeant Carl Cosper, Jr., who died while on duty on April 7 of this year. The cross was made by his partner at the Sheriff's Department, Randy Kalbaugh.

Kalbaugh placed the cross along the road where Cosper wrecked while headed to a domestic dispute in Seligman. Kalbaugh said, "I wanted to do something for Carl. I know he would have done it for anybody else. So I wanted to put a memorial cross at the scene of the accident."

Cosper worked for the County Sheriff's Department for ten years with six of those while Kalbaugh's partner. Kalbaugh said, "Carl has touched a lot of people's lives, and it was something to give back to him."

While the memorial was Kalbaugh's idea, it became a group effort. Fellow Barry County Sheriff's officers contributed: Terry Meek and his wife, Katie, gave mulch to keep the weeds down around the cross, Scott Salkill donated the red cedar for Kalbaugh to make it, and Chris Hutson donated the spike to drive it into the ground.

Cedar being chosen for the cross was no accident. Cosper was known for his love of red cedar and regu-

larly made cedar chests to donate for an annual raffle to raise money for the Sheriff's Department Angel Tree program, which gives underprivileged children gifts for Christmas. He also made a sign for the Sheriff's department while Mick Epperly was in office, which Cosper gave to Epperly when he retired, as well as a frame with Epperly's

Epperly said, "He took care of people. He was very sincere about it, did what he could to help them."

Epperly added, "He made that sheriff's sign, and he hung it out by the door while I was there. He told me, 'When you retire, I want you to take it with you.' And I still hang it here at the house. I see Carl every time I walk by it."

He added that he also has a cedar chest at the foot of his bed that Cosper made.

Kalbaugh said, "He was always making stuff for deputies here. He enjoyed doing those things for people."

So when Kalbaugh decided to make something in honor of Cosper, he put in a lot of heart and thought in how it should be done.

The red cedar cross placed along Highway 37 has Cosper's badge number, 76, at the top, a blue line in honor of law enforcement, the memorial pin from Cosper's funeral and the numbers engraved of the officers who worked with him over the years.

Kalbaugh said, "It was my

son Cameron's idea to put 76 at the top, which was his number. Then we have his end of watch (EOW), April 7. After I stained it, my wife came out and said, 'Why don't you put a blue line for law enforcement?' And she brought out Carl's memorial pin from the funeral, so I made a circle and got it embedded in the cross,

It was a lot of effort, but Kalbaugh did it because he felt it was right. He took the cross to the Sheriff's office

Cassville to seek engineering firm to move forward with water, sewer overhaul

The City of Cassville is moving forward with seeking an engineering firm to oversee the overhaul of the water and sewer systems. The project is made possible after Cassville residents passed an \$11 million bond in April to do major reconstruction and repairs to both the water and sewer systems to be in compliance with the Department of Natural Resources' requirements.

City Administrator Steve Walensky approached the City Council on Monday night, July 10, asking to move forward with a request for qualifications from engineering firms that would be able to meet the city's requirements. Walensky said he would like to approach the council with a recommendation at the September City

Council meeting.

Walensky's timeline is outlined in the request for qualifications. The request will be issued on July 31 with proposals due to the city by August 25. After conducting interviews and reviewing the proposals, Walenksy plans to make a recommendation to council on September 18.

The engineering firm will oversee all aspects of the project, and as previously discussed, the city wants to plan the water and sewer construction in conjunction with the city's use of transportation tax funds to fix roads. Walensky said, "We don't want to fix the same road twice, so the goal has always been to work the water, sewer and streets in conjunction with each other."

He added, "We still have the fact that we



Golden man injured after ejected from motorcycle

Golden man Keith R. Hauck, 57, was injured after being ejected from his motorcycle on Sunday, July

According to the Missouri State Highway Patrol crash report, Hauck was driving westbound on MO 112 three miles south of Cassville when the crash occurred around 11:40 p.m. Hauck was driving a 2001 Harley Davidson Sportster

when he ran off the roadway and overturned. Hauck was ejected from the motorcycle, sustaining moderate injuries.

Hauck was transported to Mercy Hospital in Cassville for treatment. He was not wearing a helmet at the time of the crash.

The motorcycle was extensively damaged and towed from the scene by Brice's Towing, of Cassville. Natural Resources. The city

will always be looking at all three projects in unison."

The other aspect of the project that is currently in the planning stages is the funding for the bond. Walenksy said he is looking at the Federal, State and private sectors to determine who will issue the city the bond. He said, "The USDA has us locked in at 2 percent, but I'm also working with the State Revolving fund through DNR and DA. Davidson, our financial advisor, to look at the private sector. I want to get the best transaction I can get for our community."

He added, "I'm hoping they all come together, because I can't do anything until I get the funding for the city. We're hoping to get those answers this month, and I'm hoping that by August, I'll have an answer to the financial question for the council."

As far as the sewer and water repairs, Walensky said there will be a better idea of the timeline of when work will begin once an engineering firm is selected and funding is secured.

The primary reason the city pursued the issue was to be compliant with an agreement made with the Missouri Department of agreed to fix the wastewater treatment issue, which was that untreated water was being released in Flat Creek, usually due to heavy flooding and rain, voluntarily through an agreement in 2011. With extensions granted in 2015, the city was faced with a \$5.4 million sewer repair issue, but no funding to complete it until the bond passed yesterday.

The sewer project will involve replacing most of the aging main line, which is allowing water to infiltrate the lines and causing an excess of ground and rain water in the sewer system to be treated at the wastewater plant. The plant is not equipped to treat the additional influx of water through leaks, which is what was leading to untreated water being released into the Flat Creek.

The city added water system repairs to the bond issue, as well. The proposed \$4.9 million water system plan will involve increasing pipe size and looping dead-end lines to prevent stagnant water that has to be pumped out.

Walensky said, "We're concentrating on the sewer side first because of our requirement from DNR on the I/I compliance."

Motorcycles collide near Roaring River injuring three

After being ejected, the motorcycle reentered the roadway, striking another motorcycle, a 2015 Yamaha Roadster driven by Anthony R. Cypret, 33, of Cassville, also headed northbound.

Tanner and Anthony Cypret's passenger, Casey D. Cypret, 30, of Cassville, were both taken to Mercy Hospital in Rogers, Ark., for moderate injuries. Anthony refused treatment for minor injuries at the scene. All riders and passenger were wearing helmets at the time of the

and other officers engraved their numbers on it, representing those who worked with Cosper over the years.

Kalbaugh said, "When you first met Carl, he looked like this big, mean, gruff guy, and he really doesn't take anything from anybody, just really business-only. But once you got to know him, the guy had a big heart. We dealt with a homeless guy in Exeter that found a dead turkey on the roadway. A call came out about a suspicious individual butchering a turkey.

"When we made contact, the guy told us he was homeless, had lost his job, and that he found that turkey, and he was going to butcher it and eat it. After talking to him, Carl told him to hang on a second, came back around and told me that he thought God was speaking to him. He said, 'God is telling me to help this guy.' He made a call, took the guy to McDonald's to get him something to eat, and then took him to Lucky Strike where he'd already arranged for him to have a job."

Cosper had also asked Kalbaugh to help find him a place to stay.

Kalbaugh continued, "Carl told me awhile later that he was going to go check on that guy, but he showed up at the office the next day. He

told Carl he had moved into his own apartment and still had his job. He thanked him for taking the time to help him. There are so many stories like that about Carl."

Epperly said, "Carl was a great officer, and he was a person you could always count on all the time to get projects done. He had a heart of gold."

Cosper was also appreciative of what he had in his job and his family, as well as his comrades. Epperly said, "Once a week at least, he would come up, shake my hand, and say 'Thank you for my job.' He didn't ever take it for granted. He was always loyal to the department."

Kalbaugh said, "Once I got to know him, he was this big old teddy bear. We've had other deputies who couldn't afford to purchase their own firearms, and he would collect donations. He got another deputy a utility belt. That's just how he was."

Kalbaugh even went a step further and was recently approved to become the Sheriff's Department's new firearms instructor in Cosper's stead. He was already apprenticing under Cosper to become a concealed carry instructor, but once he died, Kalbaugh is focusing on taking Cosper's place in the fire-

On the day that Kalbaugh, Cosper's family, and other officers placed the cross on the side of the highway, pictures were taken to commemorate the event. However, it wasn't until later that something about those photos was a bit revealing. It was pointed out to Kalbaugh that there are

two rays of sunshine in one of the photos, one shining on Carl's mother, Sylvia, and one on the cross itself. Kalbaugh said, "That was Carl saying he approves."

Cosper's memorial cross is placed on Highway 37 between Washburn and Seligman at the scene of the crash.

Cassville replacing flooded police cruiser

The City of Cassville voted to accept a bid on the replacement police car for one that was totaled during severe flooding on April 28 of this year.

Cassville City's Council voted to approve a bid from Les Jacobs for a 2017 Ford Explorer for \$28,600. The local bid was \$296 above the State's bid, however, it requires two officers to drive to Jefferson City to pick up the State bid vehicle, costing more than the discrepancy between the two bids.

Police Chief Dana Kammerlohr said they expect to receive the new vehicle in about three months. When asked about the flooding incident she said, "An officer was trying to get from point A or point B during the flood, and he drove through a low point, sinking the car. The water was deeper than it seemed to be." The incident occurred in the Able 2 parking lot

She said the officer had no major disciplinary action taken against him. An insurance claim covered the replacement of the vehicle. Chief Kammerlohr added, "It was completely accidental."

During the July City Council meeting, another vehicle was voted to be disposed of, which has been in use of the Department for four years. The Dodge Charger had over 80,000 miles on it and is being released as part of the regular rotation. Chief Kammerlohr said the vehicle was replaced as part of the standard rotation and was replaced by a 2017 Ford Explorer earlier this year.

She said, "We've had the vehicle, but we had to get the equipment transferred over to the new vehicle that we could. The rest was purchased on a grant."

Chief Kammerlohr told council that she plans to pursue an online option that other police chiefs have had success with to get the best amount out of the vehicle when it sells.

During the July meeting, Chief Kammerlohr also requested to give the right of first refusal to Cassville Police Officers on their old weapons that are being discarded due to age. She said, "The firearms are 17 years old and it's time to replace them." Officers are allowed to purchase their firearm from the department for \$150 if they choose. Otherwise, they will be put out for

Runners at the 17th annual Firecracker 5K and 10K saw the Branson Landing event turn into a steeplechase as they battled torrential rains and standing water throughout the respective races.

Cameron Byrley Springfield was the overall champion in the 5K, posting a time of 16:43. Jacquelyn Griffin of Ozark was the women's 5K winner, running 20:30.

Carter and Clark Blunt of McKinney, Texas, controlled the 10K event. Carter touched the tape in 34:34.6 with brother Clark second in 34:34.8. Springfield's Rosie Laughlin was the top woman 10Ker, finishing in 44:18.

"It was a fairly flat course overall which made it a nice easy run, although it was a bit narrow for the number of runners," said Ragsdale, the acknowledged leader of a group of Cassville runners known as "The Jog Squad".

She failed to mention the overwhelming rain that soaked shoes and apparel before the race ever started. Standing water was a hazard, especially along the gravel lane at the south end of the course, where ankledeep holes lurked beneath the muddy water. Water hid directional paint and mile markers, leading to several runners straying off course. Runners without GPS devices could only wonder what their pace was at any given point.



But as every runner knows, "place is more important than time.'

being pulled behind the boat in a tube at Little Indian Cove when the tube hit a wake. She was thrown from the tube and hit the water, causing her injuries.


The girl, who was wearing a life jacket, was taken to Cox South Hospital in Springfield with serious injuries.

Barry County Health Department June Food Service Report





"Understanding the Alphabet Soup of USDA" starts 9 a.m. on July 20 at the MU Southwest Research Center, says MU Extension agriculture business specialist Jim Spencer.

Representatives of USDA Farm Service Agency, the Natural Resources Conservation Service and USDA Rural Development will provide information on how to access their agencies' ser-

Afternoon sessions will include the Missouri AgrAbility Project and the U.S.

Department of Veterans Affairs' Vocational Rehabilitation and Employment program. Information to help participants and their families make informed health insurance decisions will be presented by MU Extension's Health Insurance Education Initiative, funded by Missouri Foundation for Health.

Participants will discuss operational orders such as a business and marketing plan and case studies; a free lunch will also be served.


MU Extension, through a grant from the USDA Office of Advocacy and Outreach to help veterans, Latinos and socially disadvantaged persons who want to farm, offers the program to increase agribusinesses and enterprise development. Karen Funkenbusch serves as director. Patricia Barrett, Debi Kelly and Eleazar Gonzalez serve as co-directors.

The USDA 2501 grant helps beginning farmers and others evaluate and plan their farm enterprise. Participants attend a set of practical seminars and field days to learn from MU Extension specialists, farmers and agribusiness operators

The grant comes at a critical time, Funkenbusch says. More than 300,000 veterans are expected to return to their rural Missouri roots in the next decade. "Many of them will seek work in agriculture," Funkenbusch says. Latinos also represent one of the fastest-growing populations of new farm operators.

USDA helps fund this program as part of an \$8.4 million set of grants to 24 states through the Outreach and Assistance for Socially Disadvantaged and Veteran Farmers and Ranchers Program, also known as the 2501 Program. "Understanding the Alphabet Soup of USDA" is offered near military bases and areas identified by USDA as "StrikeForce" and "Promise Zone" initiatives as part of the grant.

MU's Southwest Research Center is in Lawrence County at 14548 Highway H, Mount Vernon. It was established in 1959 with the purchase of an 898-acre site representing soil types in this region. For more information about the center, go to southwest. cafnr.org.



Federal disaster loans still available for nonprofits

Director Tanya N. Garfield of the U.S. Small to apply for an SBA Economic Injury Disaster Business Administration's Disaster Field Operations Center-West today reminded Missouri private nonprofit organizations of the Aug. 1, 2017, deadline to apply for an SBA federal disaster loan for property damage caused by severe storms, tornadoes, straight-line winds and flooding that occurred April 28 - May 11, 2017. Private nonprofits that provide essential services of a governmental nature are eligible for assis-

According to Garfield, eligible private nonprofits of any size may apply for SBA federal disaster loans of up to \$2 million to repair or replace damaged or destroyed real estate, machinery and equipment, inventory and other business assets. SBA can also lend additional funds to help with the cost of making improvements that protect, prevent or minimize the same type of disaster damage from occurring in the future.

In addition, SBA offers Economic Injury Disaster Loans to help eligible private nonprofits meet working capital needs caused by the disaster. Economic Injury Disaster Loans may be used to pay fixed debts, payroll, accounts payable and other bills that cannot be paid because of the disaster's impact. Economic injury assistance is available regardless of whether the private nonprofit suffered any property damage. Private nonprofits have until March 2, 2018,


