## Two injured in wreck involving emergency service vehicle

Two people were injured in a crash that involved an emergency vehicle on Saturday, July 15.

According to the Missouri State Highway Patrol crash report, Ryan W. Pace, 27, of Springfield, was driving southbound on Highway 39 at Stallion Bluff Road, one mile north of Shell Knob. Pace was driving a 2017 Ford Explorer with both the emergency lights and sirens acti-

Pace passed a 2000 Pontiac Sunfire, driven by Kenneth E. Shepard, 67, of Aurora. The Sunfire then

turned into the path of the emergency vehicle.

Both Pace and Shepard suffered minor injuries during the crash. Pace was transported by private vehicle to Mercy Hospital, in Cassville. Shepard was transported by ambulance to Mercy Hospital, of Springfield. Both men were wearing seatbelts at the time of the crash.

Both the Explorer and Sunfire were totaled and towed from the scene by Wilson's Wrecker. The estimated damage to the emergency vehicle was \$20,000 according to the crash report.

## Big changes for downtown Cassville building

If you've driven down Main Street in Cassville lately, chances are you've seen some rather impressive changes to one of the buildings on Main Street near the square. Local attorney Blake Fields recently completed the renovations to his new office, and it deserves a second glance.

Fields, a Cassville native, has been practicing law in Cassville for five years; however, it's only been in the last year that he moved his office to the downtown area. Previously, he utilized space in the same building with the late Emory Melton's law office on 9th Street.

Now that Fields' doors are open and renovations are nearly complete, Fields discussed all that went into the building at 605 Main Street.

After purchasing the building in September 2015, Fields, along with his parents Gary and Gayle Fields and contractor Johnnie Hilery, made plans for how to utilize the space which used to house the late Tom Cardin's law office and Kristy Montz's chiropractic clinic. Fields explained, "Tom's office used to be half of this building and part of the building next door, then Kristy's office was fully in this building. However, when the roof joist collapsed, it impacted both offices.

"So when we bought this, we thought we would replace one joist and be done with it, but that wasn't the case."

Fields says that, after removing the woodwork, plaster and covering under the roof, it was clear that multiple joists needed to be replaced, not just the one. He said, "The joists were just rotting; it wasn't going to work. So we jacked the roof up about eight inches and replaced them to fix it."

From there, the renovations continued in a much larger way. He said, "The original plan was to just move into Tom Cardin's old office, but it stemmed into a project with the office next door, and we had to make changes after the roof was done."

While some of the rooms exist similarly to the way they were in Montz's office, some walls have been knocked down, some rooms combined to make the area a more usable space for the needs of his office.

The changes didn't come without ups and downs and Fields admits it took much longer than he initially planned. He laughed, "Well, my dad did flood the building three different times." But all's well that ends well.

He said, "You get headaches with every type of construction, but my dad rolled up his sleeves with this and helped with the entire proj-

"And I can't say enough about Johnnie Hilery and TJ Daniels, who did the construction. Johnnie picked up a job that became ten times longer than he ever intended to do. He did the trim, ceiling, floors; all hand done by Johnnie and TJ.

"I've worked with a lot of construction guys and was very impressed with not just the end result, but the grit and determination. There were a lot of changes, of course."

On the outside, the whole front of the building has been bricked and changed. Fields actually designed the front of the building loosely around sketches that had been designed for Cassville Main Street Association's DREAM (Downtown Revitalization and Economic Assistance for Missouri) plans. He said, "I was part of those [DREAM] meetings, and they had

## Local meeting to shed light on voter ID law

When voters in Missouri head to the polls this fall, getting a ballot will be a bit different than in previous years. In response to confusion about the law, Secretary of State Jay Ashcroft's office has initiated a campaign called Show It 2 Vote to educate voters locally on how the law

In the November 2016 General Election, Missouri voters approved a constitutional amendment requiring voters to verify their identities before voting. This amendment and the related law, HB 1631, took effect on June 1 for all future elec-

The first election that will fall under the law in Barry County will be the August 8, 2017, election, according to the Secretary of State website. The town hall-style meet-

ing will be held at the Cassville Library on Wednesday, July 26, from 3:30 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. At that time, Ashroft's staff will be available to inform voters on how the election procedure will be different.

A lot of controversy has surrounded the measure, which led to the Show It 2 Vote initiative. Ashcroft released a statement, "In today's world, fraud and identity theft are constant threats. The best way to protect your vote is a strong voter identification requirement so that you can be confident that no one else is using your name to steal your voice."

The Chair of the Missouri Democratic Party condemned the law, saying, "No matter how hard Jay Ashcroft tries to spin these voting restrictions, the new rules going into effect today are still an unacceptable attempt from the Republican



### Five injured after ejected from shuttle near Shell Knob

Five people were injured after being ejected from a shuttle vehicle in Shell Knob over the weekend. On Saturday, July 15, an EZ Go Shuttle, similar to bigger capacity golf cart, hit an embankment, throwing the passengers and driver from the vehicle.

The Missouri State Highway Patrol crash report stated the crash occurred on Knob Hill Lane in Shell Knob around 5 p.m. The driver of the shuttle, Merle Y. Bell, 64, of Wichita, Kan., was driving northbound on Knob Hill when she truck an embankment. Five people were ejected from the vehicle, suffering minor to moderate injuries.

Bell was moderately injured. A passenger, Nancy A. Cone, 66, also of Witchita, Kan., suffered minor injuries. Both of the women were transported to Mercy Hospital in Berryville, Ark., by ambulance. Three other passengers, all 16 years old and also from Wichita, suffered minor inju-

ries and were transported by private vehicles to Mercy Hospital of Berryville, Ark., as well.

No one on the shuttle was wearing a safety device at the time of the crash. The shuttle only sustained minor damage and was driven from the scene.



Later that day, the classmates, except Madonna Sipes, attended the Purdy Alumni Association meeting







architects create a vision for Cassville's downtown, so I used that to design the front of the building."

Inside, Fields said that his mother, Gayle, was the driving force. He said, "My mom literally designed the interior completely: from the woodworking, the pictures on the wall, the furniture. She did a phenomenal job."

The detail work that went into both the interior and exterior of the building is a great addition to Cassville's downtown area, and Fields is hoping that the rental space he has next to his office will add to that existing vision.

He said, "Since we built my office in just one side, Tom's old office is still functional office space I have for rent. I would like to regenerate downtown as much as we can. We don't have enough foot traffic businesses, and I would love to see some kind of business in that space, like a coffee shop, that would get more people walking downtown."

Fields' office also has a large conference room that is available for people in the area to rent and use for meetings or presentations. The conference room includes a large TV, internet access, HDMI connection and internet access.

Fields also said he hopes the community comes to see the renovations. He laughed and mused, "If you're curious and want to take a look, you don't have to get arrested to come do it, I promise. Just come in and look around."

Fields will have an open house for the community to come view the renovations to the building. The open house is salted for Monday, August 21, from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. and refreshments will be served.

Fields is a 2006 University of Missouri graduate and attained his law degree

at the University of Missouri Kansas City. He previously worked as a law clerk and as an attorney in the Kansas City area for a year before returning to Cassville to raise a family. While not a successor to either attorney, Fields is also the custodian of records for the late Emory Melton and Tom Cardin. Former clients of either attorney may contact Fields' office for copies of records from Melton or Cardin's offices.

Blake has been married to Kelsey for five years, and they have two children together, Max, 3, and Mick, 1.



## Deer feeding ban in place for Barry County

The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) has expanded restrictions on feeding deer and placing minerals for deer from 29 to 41 counties throughout the state, effective July 1. The goal of the expanded feeding ban is to help limit the spread of chronic wasting disease (CWD). The 41 counties comprise MDC's CWD Management Zone. MDC designates counties in and around where CWD has been found as part of its CWD Management Zone.

The 12 new counties are: Barry, Benton, Cedar, Dade, Hickory, Ozark, Polk, St. Clair, St. Francois, Ste. Genevieve, Stone and Taney. They were added in response to finding CWD in Jefferson and St. Clair counties during MDC's sampling efforts last season and the finding of CWD last year in hundreds of deer in northwest Arkansas near the Missouri border.

According to the Wildlife Code of Missouri, the placement of grain, salt products, minerals, and other consumable natural and manufactured products used to attract deer is prohibited year-round within counties of the CWD Management Zone. Exceptions are feed placed within 100 feet of any residence or occupied building, feed placed in such a manner to reasonably exclude access by deer, and feed and minerals

present solely as a result of normal agricultural or forest management, or crop and wildlife food production practices.

The 12 new counties join these 29 existing counties of the Department's CWD Management Zone: Adair, Boone, Callaway, Carroll, Chariton, Cole, Cooper, Crawford, Franklin, Gasconade, Jefferson, Knox, Linn, Livingston, Macon, Miller, Moniteau, Morgan, Osage, Putnam, Randolph, Schuyler, Scotland, Shelby, St. Charles, St. Louis, Sullivan, Warren and Washington.

"CWD is spread from deer to deer and the potential for transmission increases when deer gather in larger, concentrated numbers," said MDC Wildlife Disease Coordinator Jasmine Batten. "Feeding deer or placing minerals for deer unnaturally concentrates the animals and can help spread the deadly disease."

## Fall Mandatory Sampling in 25 Counties

As part of its efforts to find and limit the spread of CWD, MDC will again require hunters who harvest deer in any of 25 select counties of the CWD Management Zone during the opening weekend of the November portion of the firearms deer season (Nov. 11 and 12) to present their harvested deer at one of 56 MDC sampling stations so tissue samples can be taken to test the animals for CWD.

The 25 mandatory CWD sampling counties include new counties added to the CWD Management Zone, counties with previous CWD positives, and counties very near previous positives. They are: Adair, Barry, Benton, Cedar, Cole, Crawford, Dade, Franklin, Hickory, Jefferson, Knox, Linn, Macon, Moniteau, Ozark, Polk, St. Charles, St. Clair, St. Francois, Ste. Genevieve, Stone, Sullivan, Taney, Warren and Washington.

MDC will also continue to offer voluntary CWD sampling opportunities throughout the 2017-2018 deer hunting season at more than 55 participating taxidermists and designated MDC offices around the state.



## 4-H cow camp educates future dairy farming youth

A prominent Springfield dairy farm played host to 49 youth age 8-18 as part of the Missouri 4-H Dairy Cow Camp May 24-26, 2017.

According to Karla Deaver, 4-H Youth Development Specialist, University of Missouri Extension, Robthom dairy farm has hosted Missouri 4-H Dairy Cow Camp for 22 years, and the 2017 camp was a record-breaking year for attendance.

Organizers from University of Missouri Extension say the camp is significant for two reasons. First, it is designed to encourage youth wanting to go into the dairy industry. Second, it provides campers with an opportunity to learn a variety of life skills, including teamwork, cooperation and responsibility.

"This camp draws attention to the importance of farming and its important role in Missouri's economy. It provides youth a "hands-on" opportunity to care for dairy animals and learn about many aspects of dairy production while

learning life-skills at the same time," Deaver said. "Our attendance was the highest it has been in the history of the camp, and we had several on a waiting list, demonstrating dairy cow camp is still relevant to our 4-H families."

Campers work in pairs under the direction of adults and take part in workshops to learn about judging dairy animals, dairy management, animal care ethics and showmanship. Older teens serve as group leaders and counselors for the younger 4-H members. Persons working in the dairy industry visited with campers about careers in the dairy industry as well.

In addition to educational workshops on dairy heifer management, foot care, the origin of the major dairy cattle breeds, showmanship, dairy cattle judging and quiz bowl, campers participated in sessions enabling them to be certified in Show Me Quality Assurance. The activities, designed

as a series of learning stations, help 4-Hers develop both personal and project skills. Stations included an animal health tool identification, hay testing, feed-stuffs, calf care and a special presentation from the International Association of Fairs and Expositions looking at how to reduce e Coli outbreaks at fairs from the exhibitor point of view.

A judging contest and showmanship competition provide the culmination for the camp. In the dairy judging contest, first place junior was Maria Vedder, of New Haven, and second was Molly Archer, of Falcon. In the senior division, first was Kylie Scrivner, of Ava, and second was Whitney Yerina, of Phillipsburg. The top oral reasons were given by Logan Archer, of Falcon, followed by Avonlea Bergthold, of Marshfield.

In the showmanship competition, winning the junior division was Molly Archer, of Falcon, and second was Mikayla Angelo, of Fair Grove. In the intermediate division, first was Alyssa McCarty of Gentry, Ark., and second was Brooke Vedder, of New Haven. In the senior division, first was Whitney Yerina, of Phillipsburg, and second was Serena Stewart, of Ava.

A number of other awards were handed out, including a rookie award to Ada Bluel, of Monett. Teamwork awards were given to Quinn Northrup, of Republic, Roper Voskamp, of Mt. Vernon, and Garrett Henke,

of Moscow Mills. Quiz bowl awards were given to Logan Archer, of Falcon, and Kylie Scrivner, of Ava. Case Melzer, of Harrisonville, and Kalaa Clark, of Seymour, earned good attitude awards. Kylie Scrivner, of Ava, earned the most improved award. Molly Archer, of Falcon, earned the sportsmanship award, while Logan Archer, of Falcon, earned the leadership award





#### SOUTHWEST R-V SCHOOL DISTRICT OF BARRY COUNTY, MISSOURI APPROVES SALE OF \$1,300,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS

The Board of Education of the Southwest R-V School District of Barry County, Missouri at a regular meeting on June 15, 2017 approved the sale of \$1,300,000 General Obligation Bond Issue to its Municipal Bond Underwriter, L.J. Hart & Company of St. Louis, Missouri. "We appreciate the strong vote of confidence we received from local patrons at the election and want to lock in interest rates that are highly favorable," stated Danny Dalton, President of the Board of Education. These new money General Obligation Bonds were approved by about 80% of the voters at the April 4, 2017 election, for the purpose of providing funds for repairs to the gymnasium, replacement of Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning, and to construct additional restrooms.

The bond marketing process provided the first opportunity to invest to local financial institutions and according to Larry J. Hart, President and CEO of L.J. Hart & Company, the Security Bank of Southwest Missouri purchased \$200,000 of the bonds. This strong local support was very helpful to the success of the financing. "It is nice that our marketing procedures facilitated this local involvement while still receiving attractive interest rates," commented Ms. Tosha Tilford, Superintendent of Schools. The Board of Education selected the negotiated sale of the bonds in order to capture current market conditions, to be certain that local banks received an opportunity to purchase the bonds, and because the proposed interest rates were fair based upon current conditions in the municipal bond market. Ms. Tilford stated that the District did compare proposed interest rates with the national bond indexes and other Missouri issues with a similar rating quality sold at competitive and negotiated sales to be certain that rates for the District's bonds were favorable. "Based upon pricing of these other financings, and the national indexes for AA rated General Obligation Bonds our rates were as good as or better than some public sales and other negotiated sales for a similar quality level of bond issue," Ms. Tilford remarked.

The information shared by L. J. Hart & Company indicated that the bonds are scheduled to mature on March 1, 2018 through March 1, 2030 with reoffered yields ranging from 1.00% to 2.25% and the total interest expense coming in consistent with the original projections. The District is selling \$450,000 of term bonds maturing on March 1, 2030 with an interest rate of 5.00% to yield 2.00% to the March 1, 2022 call date, which produces additional funds for the projects in the amount of \$59,409.00. The interest income from the bonds is exempt from federal and state of Missouri income taxes and the bonds were available in \$5,000 denominations. These bonds carry a "AA+" rating from Standard & Poor's Corporation due to the District's participation in the State of Missouri Direct Deposit Program coordinated through the Missouri Health and Educational Facili-

The bonds do contain optional redemption (call) provisions on March 1, 2022 at no penalty that will facilitate the reduction of future interest expense in the event of prepayment or a future refunding to lower rates if market conditions make it economically feasible. The financing proceeds are expected to be available to the District by July 14, 2017 and will be promptly reinvested by the District to earn additional interest for use in the completion of the projects. The legal documents to complete the issuance of the bonds were prepared by Lori Lea Shelley, Esq. of Mickes O'Toole, LLC in its role as bond counsel for the District.


