Commissioner, prosecutor candidates debate the issues at open forums

Both prosecuting attorney and presiding commissioner candidates got the chance to voice their plans if elected for office the August 5 Primary Election at an open forum at the Ozark Property Rights Alliance meetings the past two Thursday nights.

On July 17, presiding commissioner candidates Terry Burgess, Eddie Davison and incumbent Cherry Warren discussed topics ranging from revenue use, commissioner meeting hours, road district issues to how to help law enforcement.

Tax issues, an ever-popular topic in debates, were brought up in a variety of different ways, Thursday. When asked what they would do to grow revenue for the county, the men had differing answers. Davison discussed his plans to meet with business owners. He stated, “We need to listen to what business owners have to say. It’s part of our job to help grow the county and maintain a friendly business environment.” Burgess answered that he hoped to reach out to different municipalities to determine their needs and

ideas. He went on, “I’ll work diligently to help any business that wants to come into our county with new jobs.”

Warren answered that the county has a board to help bring in businesses that the commission created since he has been in office. He said, “Any time there’s a business seeking to come, we try to help.”

During the meeting, Davison took strong stances on growing the county and working with cities and businesses to encourage more growth to the county. Davison pressed hard on his intentions to make the commissioners more available to working people of the county, announcing his intention to hold commissioner meetings during evenings so that more people can voice their opinions and working to provide better options for Sheriff’s deputies and aiding the Sheriff’s Department.

Warren placed emphasis on his track record with the county and the direction the county is going in. Popular discussion topics for Warren included his intention to keep planning and zoning out of the county because it

would infringe citizen’s rights in the county and the responsible use of tax dollars locally.

On the previous Thursday, July 10, the three prosecuting attorney candidates also participated in a forum held by the Ozark Property Rights Alliance. Candidates Steve Dunker, Matthew Weatherman and Amy Boxx used the forum as a way to discuss their intentions for the prosecuting attorney position if elected.

Questions focused on how to better protect the children of the county, how to decrease crime and interface with the Sheriff’s Department, constitutional right infringement, and increasing quality of life in the county.

During statements in the evening, Boxx said, “The Prosecuting Attorney posi-

tion is not the place for on the job training. I believe I’m uniquely qualified for the position.” Boxx has served as current Prosecuting Attorney Johnnie Cox’s substitute in certain cases and also is the attorney for the City of Monett.

Dunker, current assistant prosecutor for the Aurora

Corbin concert, pre-show set for Monday

Ever since the announcement that Cassville’s local Country Dodge dealership had been selected a winning dealership to host a private, free concert by country star Easton Corbin, people have been waiting with bated breath for the concert date to arrive. The country singer is set to perform for a crowd of a little over a thousand on Monday, July 28.

Country Dodge was selected as one of the four dealerships given a private concert out of almost 100 dealerships that participated in The Next Crop Project, a fundraising drive held to benefit local FFA chapters. On Saturday, April 26, dealerships across the country paired with local FFAs to have a test drive event. For every test drive on that Saturday, Ram donated \$20 to that local FFA. Locally, Cassville, Purdy and Southwest FFA chapters participated, inviting members of the community to stop by Country Dodge and take a test drive to help their chapter. The result was over \$2,000 raised for their groups.

Kurt Berndt, general manager and partner at



Country Dodge, stated, “We just are very blessed to have been selected for this concert as a way to help the local FFAs.”

The tickets for the free concert were split among a variety of local people and places. Berndt said that the first half of the 1,000 tickets were given directly to the Cassville FFA chapter. Berndt said, “It was their decision to also share the tickets with Purdy and Southwest since they also participated in the fundraising test drive event.”

The remaining 500 tickets were dispersed to Country Dodge employees and family for helping with the project that helped bring the concert to the community, as well as sponsors of the pre party event Freedom Bank, Jersey’s, Fastrip, and Business Link. Other tickets were given to country dodge customers, and local community leaders. A few tickets were also dispersed to nonprofit groups for charity raffles, like the weekend’s Habitat for Humanity fundraising

Roof overlay, Fasco lease discussed at Council meeting

Park vandalism, a new roof overlay for city hall, and the FASCO building lease were among the topics discussed at the Cassville City Council on July 21. Steve Walensky, the Public Works Director, told the council there had been an increasing number of occurrences of vandalism at the City Park after nightfall.

“They seem to be working on the pavilion area, across from the Sheriff’s Department frequently,” Walensky said, “and they’ve been burning and carving up picnic tables.”

Walensky added that the eyebolts that secure the tables to concrete foundations had been broken. To prevent the more damage to the tables, valued at \$1,500 each, Walensky said the tables were removed from the park.

Another instance of vandalism included an incident in which vandals had torn up the men’s bathroom in the park and burned hay in the sink. To prevent this from happening again, Walensky said the men’s and women’s bathrooms are being locked after midnight.

Walensky also spoke to the council about the install-

ing of a new roof overlay on City Hall. He showed the council a sample of the material that would be used in the overlay and recommended to the council that they accept the bid from Delta Roofing, which was the lowest of the three bids for the job. He also added that there would be a chance to inspect the overlay after it was in place and that the inlay would come with a 20-year warranty. The council voted to accept Delta Roofing’s bid.

The council also had the first reading of a resolution to extend the lease of FASCO. In regard to FASCO’s option to purchase the land the factory is located on, Heinz asked if there was a stated amount of money in the original agreement with FASCO for how much they could purchase it for. City Clerk Darelyn Cooper explained that she thought it was \$1. She further explained it was her understanding that FASCO leases the property because they would be liable for the property tax if they purchased it. She also speculated that the cost of insurance might be a reason for FASCO leasing

Bill Gipson, Republican from Shell Knob, was named as an appointee to the Missouri Southern State University Board of Governors by Governor Jay Nixon last Friday.

Gipson has a long history with The Empire District Electric Company and currently serves as a member of its board of directors. Gipson was quoted in the Joplin Globe as saying, "I'm just honored to be appointed, and I think my expertise as a business manager will be beneficial to helping (President) Dr. (Alan) Marple and the rest of the administration at the university."

The Board is a total of eight members with Gipson rounding out the final spot. the property.

Heinz stated he was uncertain if he completely understood the terms of the lease agreement, and asked if the city possessed the original lease agreement document. Cooper said they have it, and she also stressed that the council was only having the first reading of the resolution, so it was only being introduced at that meeting.

She added the resolution would not be adopted until after its second meeting in August and invited council members to study the original document in the meantime. Alderman Jerry Marple suggested it would be best if the council accepted the first reading at that meeting and then those wishing to study the lease agreement before the August meeting would have their chance to do so. The council voted to accept the first reading of the resolution by a roll-call vote.

In other business the council voted to approve resolutions concerning the E-911 center's refinancing of a loan through the Industrial Development Authority. The council also voted to appoint Walensky as a representative to the Southwest Missouri Council of Government and to the Missouri Clean Energy District, accept the donation of a redbud tree from Beverly Shriver in memory of her daughter, Sharilyn Keiser, and authorize the city to dispose of city equipment

no longer in use, including a push mower, a service truck, a mixer motor, and a transformer. The equipment will be sold as surplus equipment.

Alderman Heinz also proposed making City Hall a smoke-free area, citing the

presence of used cigarette butts littering the property outdoors and the interest of promoting better health. The council discussed the proposal but tabled the discussion until a later meeting.

Crowder campuses offer adult education classes

Barry County residents who would like to get their high school equivalency diploma or go to college, but think it is out of their reach, are often pleasantly surprised after speaking to Julie DeNisco, the Adult Education and Literacy director for Crowder College.

“You would be surprised at how many students don’t think they can afford to go to Crowder, and they’re brought to tears when they find out they can go,” DeNisco said.

DeNisco says traveling should be no problem for those who want help earning a high-school equivalency diploma or help in improving some of their basic skills. Crowder has learning centers in Barry County found in Monett, Cassville, Seligman and Shell Knob. AEL classes at all locations provide students with training in a wide variety of areas.

“We offer High School Equivalency Prep, Compass Prep, Literacy, National Career Readiness Certificate, and basic skills prep for parents who have a high school equivalency diploma but want to help their kids with their homework.” She also added that the classes are offered for free.

Assistance is also available for those who have a

high school diploma or its equivalent, but are not sure they can go on to college or need help finding a job. DeNisco said the AEL program also has College and Career Transitions where the college helps students prepare for the next step in their careers.

“If they want help getting to the next step, we work with partners that can help them get into college or get a job; whatever they’re working on.”

Enrollment periods vary by campus, but DeNisco said they are typically every two weeks to a month, depending on the class. Students who miss an enrollment period can call the AEL Office and get scheduled for the next enrollment period.

While the classes are free, DeNisco cautions that students should be prepared to commit to 30 to 40 hours of instruction time. She added that students can divide this time between seated classroom time and an online instructor the department provides.

When she meets people who say they want to go back to school but they think they’re too old, DeNisco tells them there is no such thing.

“You’re never too old. Life-long learning is what we believe in. We have people of all ages and people of all ages

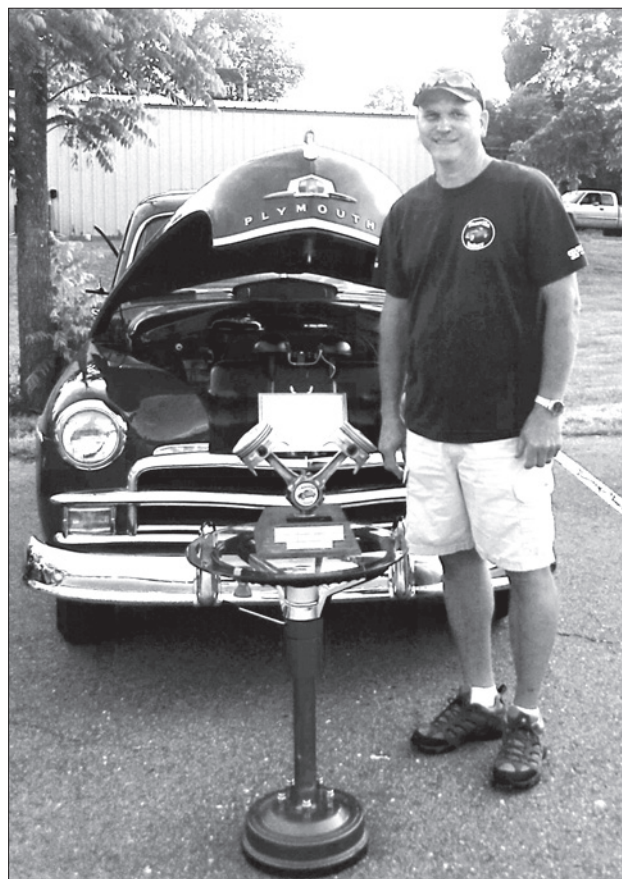

"I'm a typical hillbilly," Stogdill admits. He loves to hunt and fish. Over the years he has enjoyed watching his kids and grandchildren grow up and attends Pleasant Hill Baptist Church.

Stogdill has been all over. From trucking on the

icy ocean, constructing the pipeline and roofing in Alaska for eight years to being an extra several times in Columbia Motion Picture films. Stogdill has also worked for three different sheriff's departments.

Many years ago, Stogdill came up with the idea to turn pine into mulch after he rented an airplane and flew across the United States. With his idea, he started Southwest Litter in Washburn. The business made colored mulch shavings, and the National Forest soon wanted to use his ideas.

Stogdill was unable to maintain the mulch business due to heart problems. Stogdill admits, "My heart problems took away my livelihood." Stogdill couldn't handle running Southwest Litter anymore and had to turn to something else. Sheryl, his wife, took his passion for music and came up with the idea of opening a shop in his Washburn.

Five miles west of Washburn is where Stogdill grew up. He began school in a one-room schoolhouse of 20 students. "Technology was just starting to come along; it was a different time," Stogdill explained. He stated about his childhood, "I'm so thankful where I grew up and the time I grew up in. We never had anything. I was proud of who I was and where I came from." Later Stogdill graduated high school from Southwest.

Stogdill has always gotten along well with people. When asked who has made him the person he is today, he stated, "Anyone I've ever met in my entire life has shaped the way I view things. Kind or unpleasant, I take a piece of them. I just enjoy people."

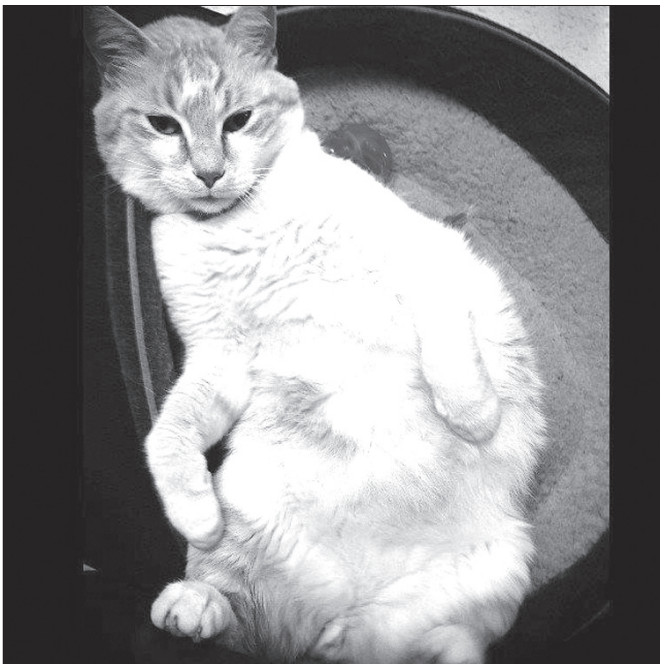

By appearances, the Cassville branch of Crowder College is not too different from other college buildings. The commons area has vending machines, pool tables, and various displays of information. Staff members are there to greet and assist students when they enter the building. However, there is one feature of the campus that makes it unique: a white and orange tabby named Chip Chip.

Chip Chip came to the campus about three years ago. According to Angela Seymour, the campus director, Chip Chip was shy at first around people but quickly warmed up to the students after they began feeding him treats. In time, he became so comfortable around people that the staff had trouble keeping him out of the building.

"The more familiar he became with everyone, the less shy he became. Then he started sneaking in the door and dodging in the door between students," Seymour said. "And we tried to get him back out, but he'd come back in."

Chip Kammerlohr, a veterinarian who was good friends with one of the campus staff members, gave Chip Chip his shots and other medications. He also neutered the cat to make sure Chip Chip didn't wander off. It was in Kammerlohr's honor that Chip Chip was given his name.

"Now he's here, and he's spoiled rotten. The students feed him snacks and treats, and he's fat and happy," Seymour laughed. She added that a staff member also keeps his food and water under her desk in the building.

Though Chip Chip appears to have a pretty good life at the Cassville campus, Seymour says he also provides a useful service to the students as a stress reliever.

"During finals week, he gets a lot more attention because petting an animal is a good stress reliever," she

said. "And it's just so cute because students will come in, and you can tell they're just stressed, and they just need a break."

"So they will just come by and pick him up and walk over to the chairs and just sit down and love on him and pet on him and de-stress," Seymour said.

Seymour also said Chip Chip has become so popular on campus that students will look out for him when they come in the building.

"We'll have students who'll come in, and if they don't see him, it's like 'Where's Chip Chip? Is he okay?'" she added.

For his part, Chip Chip also loves to be around the students, and Seymour says he is happiest when there are lots of people around.

"You can tell he doesn't like it when the students aren't here. He gets bummed when they're not here and really frisky when the traffic starts to pick up again, and he gets really excited when all the students are back."

Barry County's years past

40 years ago

The Barry County 4-H Achievement Day awarded six winners in Dress Revenue, Public Speaking, Good Grooming and Demonstrations. The six winners were Terry Brechbuhler, Becky Thompson, Holly Edmondson, Dwayne Kaiser, Connie McDougale and Selma McDougale.

U.S. Representative Wilson. J. Randall, Chairman of the Legal and Monetary Affairs Subcommittee of the House of Representatives, commended freshman Congressman Gene Taylor for his bipartisan work to reduce propane prices.

The 85th Annual Barry County Camp Meeting took place July 18. The camp was held in the county every July since 1889. The camp is sponsored by all the churches in the county. In the years past, it became an established tradition to hold the camp meeting to decide the site location, but in 1948 it was decided to permanently hold the camp at the Log Church.

30 years ago

Red Rose Inn facility neared completion. Red Rose Inn was a skilled nursing facility built on Old Exeter Road. The facility had six separate wings and 90 semi-private rooms.

Barry County school districts received \$1,709,936.21 in sales tax revenue last year from Proposition C, the one-cent sales tax for Missouri public schools.

Unemployment in Barry County continued its steady downward trend in May, falling to 5.8 percent, the lowest it had been since 1981.

20 years ago

Barry County property taxes rose and were expected to be higher than the previous year. Residential, commercial and agricultural combined with personal property, showed a total increase of \$10,849,220.

A highway project was set to next month. Missouri Highway and Transportation awarded Barry County with a \$229,156.17 contract. Changes included widening of the pavement on Route 37 at Route W near Butterfield.

Cassville School Board approved pay raises. A new salary schedule set teacher pay at a base of \$18,700 and \$350 increments.

John Lasley, of Springfield was hired by Exeter R-IV School Board to coach Boys Varsity Basketball.
