Viney Creek public meeting meant more questions than answers

Five years after it was tabbed for closure, questions still remain about the future of Golden's Viney Creek Recreation Area. A public informational meeting was held last week by Missouri State Parks representatives to talk to the public about their concerns and provide updates about plans for the future.

Viney Creek Recreation Area is owned by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. However, when the site was shut down due to budgetary issues in spring 2014, Missouri State Parks stepped in to operate the property to keep it from being shuttered.

In March 2014, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers office stated that the recreations budget was cut by \$500,000. Viney Creek was the least visited of the 14 parks on Table Rock Lake and was in the red around \$13,000 annually in terms of operating cost.

Now, State Parks is a year and a half from the end of the contract and is seeking public input regarding what to do with the property.

Missouri State Parks director Ben Ellis was at the meeting on Thursday night, and he said, "We have a backlog of \$188 million in repairs and renovations at our existing state parks. So, people that go to these other parks are saying, 'Wait, you're taking resources from my favorite park and putting it into another area that's not even designated.' It's a very awkward position."

Ellis is referring to multiple repairs on top of standard operating cost for Viney Creek, which isn't a Missouri State Parks Property. Conflict between the former state parks director and the Missouri legislature arose when funds were used for opening new parks instead of maintaining existing properties in the past.

Ellis explained, "A year ago when I came in, we had about

\$200 million worth of deferred maintenance. During the last full administration of eight years, there was very little improvement in our state park infrastructure and there was a great deal of focus on expansion of our state parks system. We heard that loud and clear from our legislature.

City of Purdy starts over on road annexation plan

After nearly three years, the City of Purdy is back at square one for a proposed road annexation that would extend city limits on State Highway 37, Route C and 9th Street.

Purdy mayor Bo Prock said the length of time the proposed annexation sat in limbo was the main factor for why they are starting over. Prock said, "It was due to inactivity with the commissioners. MoDOT felt like it had taken them too long to respond and the project was no longer valid with the information they

Prock was at a standstill with the Barry County Commission for two and a half years because of a couple of property owners who were vocal opponents to the road annexation. The annexation will only include the roads, not the individuals' properties unless they voluntarily wanted to join the city. However, due to that opposition, the county commission would not sign off on the annexation.

By the time that was settled, MoDOT required the city do a new public meeting and mail out letters, asking for input. "We finally got the letter from the commissioners to approve it, but MoDOT said

it had been too long," Prock While the city's mayor has been frustrated with the project's turn, he is optimistic that things will move more quickly. "We are starting over from scratch on the annexation project, but

this time, I expect things

to go very quickly and very

smoothly." He said he doesn't believe opposition will hinder the road annexation this time. "I was able to produce 24 people in favor of it out of the 30. That is the overwhelming majority, and it

should carry," he said.

everything approved, Purdy's annexation will include the west side of Highway 37 and the entirety of Business 37 from the north point of Purdy to the south point of Purdy.

Arkansas man pleads guilty in federal court to taking minor across state lines for sex

An Arkansas man pled guilty to taking a minor across state lines for sex last week in federal court. The suspect, Joseph Snow, 25, of Winslow, Ark., was found with the victim, a fourteen year old girl, in Roaring River State Park after her father reported her missing.

According to federal court documents, the victim's father contacted the Washington County Sheriff's Office on January 25, saying his daughter was missing and was suspected to be with Snow. The victim's father also turned over her cell phone, which had photos of the two engaged in sexual intercourse.

When authorities attempted to locate the victim through her cell phone signal, presumably a second phone, it was shown to be in Roaring River State Park. Barry County Sheriff's deputies searched the park on January 27, where they found Snow and the victim walking out of the woods.

Affidavits of probable cause filed by the Barry County Sheriff's Department stated the victim's father was aware of a romantic relationship between the two, which he was ending. The report

also stated the victim left a note making Romeo and Juliette references before she went missing.

Both Snow and the victim admitted to sexual activity at Roaring River and in Snow's vehicle in Arkansas.

Snow was initially indicted on six counts: four counts of sexual exploitation of children, one count of transportation of a minor with intent to engage in criminal activity and transportation of child pornography.

In Snow's guilty plea, he pleads guilty to the one count of transportation of a minor with intent to engage in criminal sexual activity and requests the other five charges be dropped. If the court accepts his plea, Snow faces a minimum of 10 years imprisonment up to life and a maximum fine of \$250,000. Snow would have to serve a minimum of five years before the possibility of supervised release. Snow would also be on the sex offender registry for the rest of his life.

Snow still faces two charges in Barry County, according to court documents: statutory rape in the second degree and endangering the welfare of a child in the first degree creating substantial risk.



• How do you plan to promote a working relationship with all county offices and officials?

As County Clerk, I intentionally limited my involvement in outside organizations so I could focus solely on my elected duties and responsibilities. First and foremost, if elected Commissioner, I will not be involved in any other occupation in order to devote my full time to the responsibilities of the Presiding Commissioner duties. I plan to focus on one of my highest priorities – improving communication throughout

Communication and cooperation are key to working together with various offices and officials. I believe availability and openness for the discussion of new ideas are vital to building good relationships. These are skills I was able to utilize in my role as County Clerk.

• What is your opinion of the present budget and what changes, if any, would you make if elected?

For the most part, I am satisfied with how the funds have been distributed in the past with the exception of employee wages. I believe it is important to address the high turnover of County employees caused by wage differentials within similar jobs. In some cases, these inequities can be found within the County. For example, a law enforcement officer who works for the County does not make a wage comparable with officers in Cassville, Monett and Lawrence County. This constant turnover has been detrimental to County operations and I believe there would be a significant cost reduction based on less frequent training of new employees.

Currently, each budget is created for a single year dealing on a reactive basis with whatever issue seems to be most

important at the time. I will work towards developing a budget that will allow the County to become more proactive in an effort to effectively plan and meet future needs. The ability to weather

an occasional economic downturn brings
stability to the County and I will advocate for a
healthy reserve fund.

• If elected, how would you be sure to hear the concerns of all demographics of Barry County citizens?

"Now it's \$188 million, so it's down a little bit, in maintenance on state parks and historic sites.

"There is a three to five year plan of \$20 million annually to deal with the deferred maintenance. That focuses on the commitment to the state parks that are state parks. In this case, it is my responsibility now to figure out how we move forward to provide the services this community needs with the limited resources we have."

Issues plaguing Viney Creek included flood damage, vandalism, the shower house burning down and trash dumped on the grounds regularly. One of the boat ramps was also closed due to flood damage, and damage around concrete pads where large fifthwheel-type campers have created issues.

However, the largest issue remains with the wastewater system, which

barely passes quarterly inspections.

Due to Viney Creek not being an official state parks property, repairs that need to take place fall into the Army Corps' court. Ellis said, "I sent a letter today to [the Army Corps] that said, 'We are deficient in these areas, and we would like for you to consider to bring this up to code.' I'm hopeful that they will consider that. I'm not very hopeful that anything will come of it."

The main line item is the wastewater system, the shower house that burned, and the lack of compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).

As far as operating Viney Creek, Ellis said, "The state took on that responsibility, and it was a bad decision. But we're stuck with it now."

Ellis will be the one to ultimately make the decision regarding what to do with the recreation area when the contract is up next year. He said, "The reasons that led to the Army Corps' decision to shut it down are basically still here. It's still the issue that state parks stepped in to breach, trying to build a bridge between not closing it and figuring a way out.

"It's going to have to deal somehow with partnerships. "If you have ideas, what

can we do?"

In an attempt to curtail some of the vandalism, park staff have a gate closing the property during the off season, barring trespassers.

Attendees to the public meeting raised questions about the gate being used, saying it was never gated when the Army Corps operated the site. The representatives explained the need to close it off for liability reasons.

Overall, the public opinion was concerned and positive. Many attendees mentioned supporting ideas that could cut costs for the

park, including not building a new shower house to prevent any further strain on the wastewater system, and turning the site into primitive camping.

Right now, the park is co-managed by Roaring River State Park and Table Rock State Park employees. The superintendent of Table Rock State Park, Carl Bonnell addressed the visitors to the meeting, explaining some of the challenges they are facing. He said, "We decided to do this with volunteer campground hosts in 2015. We've had difficulty getting people to do that. We've had a lot of turnover. We've also had some issues with flooding in 2015 and

Overall, without changes, it appears Viney Creek Recreation Area could close to visitors in 2020 if issues aren't addressed.

Ellis and other representatives expressed hope that the community would help come up with solutions to the recreation area.

Ellis said, "Quite frankly, we're struggling. I think everyone here tonight would agree that the State Parks are not doing a very good job. We're trying to figure out how we can move forward. We're trying to find out how we can provide an economic engine in the area to support this. We're looking at what are the most critical needs in each area: is it the boat ramp, is it day use, is it the camping? We need to know what you want for this area."

Attendees at the public meeting received comment cards to fill out to help Ellis determine the fate of the site. Comment cards were also sent to the Barry County Commission for those who could not attend.

to residents regarding the annexation, and ten days after, they will set a public meeting. Prock said, "I'm hoping in 120 days, we'll have this taken care of."

If the roads are annexed, the benefit will be fairly quick for the city in terms of safety and financial gain. Prock said, "We have a safety situation on Highway 37. This will allow our city police officers to help our firefighters immediately on accidents."

Currently, officers can go help, but they aren't the first to be dispatched, which has been an issue, according to Prock, who also serves on the fire department. The way it stands, Barry County Sheriff's office is dispatched to help work wrecks not inside the city limits.

There is also at least one business that would like to voluntarily join the city if the annexation goes through. Prock said, "If we get to do the road annex as written as we want to, right away a large business will be in town. Eagle Logistics will be a part of the city. It'll be an immediate monetary benefit for us.

"We've also got five signed letters from people who want to voluntarily annex into the city limits. We'll gain more customers. We'll have the first growth in property for the city in Purdy probably for the last fifty years. We haven't really had anything come into the city in the last fifty and probably longer than that."

Any property, other than the road, would be a voluntary annexation, not required. Residents can choose to stay outside of the city limits.

The annexation would allow residents to hook up to city water lines that are already in place, as well.

Domestic assault with gun leads to charges

The man accused of domestic assault, including shooting at a former romantic interest in May, is currently in jail facing charges of burglary in the first degree, domestic assault in the second degree, armed criminal action and unlawful possession of a firearm. Anthony S. Cooper, 35, of Republic, was booked into the Barry County Jail on July 20.

According to affidavits of probable cause by the Barry County Sheriff's Department, Cooper went to the residence of a former romantic partner in Verona on May 6 of this year. Once Cooper arrived, the victim told another person visiting not to let him in, saying Cooper was not supposed to be there.

The guest let Cooper

in, and when the door was opened, Cooper allegedly pulled a handgun on the two people inside, pointing it in the victim's face. Cooper then allegedly hit the victim in the back of the head multiple times for "talking about him", leaving a golf ball-size bump.

Cooper then kicked the victim in the forehead leaving a contusion, asked if the victim "knew what he would do", and

fired the handgun by her head and left the residence.

When officers arrived, the observed a 9 mm shell casing in the living room and a bullet fragment in the kitchen.

Cooper was not legally allowed to possess a weapon due to being a convicted felon.

Cooper is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$50,000 cash-only bond


Koeffler suffered serious injuries in the crash and was taken by ambulance to Mercy Hospital in Springfield.

Use extra caution around boat docks

Colonel Sandra Karsten, superintendent of the Missouri State Highway Patrol, encourages boat dock owners to take the necessary precautions to make their dock safe from stray electrical current. Tingling and numbness in the extremities while swimming in the water has been a common statement made by individuals who survived incidents involving electrical current near docks. Swimming away from any dock suspected to be charged with electricity is the safest course of action. Exiting the water at the shoreline, a safe distance from the electrically charged dock, or swimming to a nearby dock, would be the alternative. It should be noted, if there are metal dock cables securing the electrically charged dock to the shoreline, the metal cables may be charged with electricity and should be avoided also.

There are specific regula-

tions on many of Missouri's lakes. Dock owners should adhere to the regulations set forth by the dock permitting authority.

"Warm weather has arrived in Missouri and many people will begin enjoying time on our state's lakes and rivers," said Colonel Karsten. "While it is convenient to have electricity available on a boat dock, it is important to be responsible. Make sure you have taken the necessary precautions for your dock, so the area is safe for your family and friends to enjoy."

Life jackets are always a good choice when on or near a dock. All swimmers are encouraged to use a life jacket, especially young children and inexperienced swimmers. Whether you're swimming near a dock or fishing from one, chose to Wear It!




