

Keith Daniels wins **Barry County Public** Administrator race

With three facing off for the Republican nomination for Barry County Public Administrator, Keith Daniels, of Exeter, edged out the competition, winning by 139 votes. Daniels will be running unopposed for the position in the November 8 General Election.

Daniels said, "I'm very happy in the results. But I'm very gratified in the campaign and being able to meet so many people. I've met so many really, really nice people who have been kind to me, and I can't remember truly one person who was negative about my campaign. It's been nothing

but positive. Win or lose, it was a great experience for me. Going forward, I know I have a challenge, but I feel very much ready to take it on."

Gary Davis takes Republican Sheriff nomination

DAVIS TO FACE RUARK IN NOVEMBER GENERAL ELECTION

It came down to 65 votes to determine who would be the Republican nominee for Barry County Sheriff in the November 8 General Election, but retired FBI agent Gary Davis pulled out ahead. Davis earned the nod at around 24 percent of the vote with 1,565 supporters, beating out former Highway Patrolman Travis Hilburn's 1,500 votes.

Davis was on the courthouse lawn along with many other candidates and supporters Tuesday night, waiting for the results to be read. Throughout the evening, the tallies were close between Hilburn and Davis, with the two going neck and neck from start to finish.

Davis shook hands with a number of community members after the unofficial results were released. When asked what his plans were to celebrate, he said, "Tomorrow, I'm going to go to McDonald's and have my coffee like I did every day before campaigning and tell those guys, but I think I'll buy them all their coffee this time."

Davis continued, "These guys are the ones who convinced me to run, so I want

to share that with them."

When asked about how he felt about the outcome, Hilburn said, "It came close. Congratulations to Mr. Davis. I'll do it again in four years."

Terry Meek, currently with the Barry County Sheriff's Department, "I'm not supporting anyone in the race right now. I'm disappointed, obviously and I put a lot of work into it, but the people voted and they made their decision."

Meek said he won't run in future races.

Iames Smith said, "I just want to thank everyone who supported me and I made some really great friends through the campaign." Smith said he may consider running in the future, but that is to be determined.

Danny Boyd and Justin Fohn couldn't be reached for comment by the time of press.

Volunteers move CHS sidewalks

When Cassville Schools announced a pending MoDOT project was going to destroy the commemorative sidewalks for Cassville High School graduates, it was met with a lot of emotions. The school came up with alternatives, originally hoping MoDOT could work around them, but in the end, they would have to be removed.

Cassville Schools formed a committee to see how they could honor the former graduating classes without the sidewalks stamped by multiple generations of students. Currently, the school is working on a monument that will be more permanent since many of the sidewalks had deteriorated with age.

The time has come that MoDOT has begun their side-walk project to replace the current ones along Main Street in Cassville, and a group of concerned citizens rallied together and got permission from the school, MoDOT, and the company doing the work, Branco, to try to save the sidewalks before they were demolished.

It's been a whirlwind to try to get them removed and out of the way before MoDOT works on the sidewalks. On Thursday, July 28, volunteers Corky Stehlik, Brice Stehlik, Cody Epperly, Derek Couch, Johnnie Cox, Joe Trotter, Eli Stehlik, Wyatt Stehlik and Haydn Stehlik worked to move the slabs of sidewalk.

Some of the pieces have been lifted and stayed intact, while some of the older slabs have cracked, but the volunteers hope they can be pieced back together.

As far as the eventual home of the sidewalks, that is anyone's guess.

Exeter man dies while driving, causes wreck

An Exeter man died from a medical condition last week while he was driving, causing a car crash a mile south of Purdy. According to the Missouri State Highway Patrol crash report, James W. Lomax, 56, of Exeter, was driving northbound on Missouri 37 when the crash occurred.

Lomax was driving a 2002 Chevrolet Trailblazer when he died of a medical condition unrelated to the wreck, according to the report. The Trailblazer crossed the center line and struck a towed unit of a 2016

Kenworth driven by Terry L. Warhurst, 43, of Corinth, Miss. Lomax's SUV continued to run off the right side of the roadway and struck a road sign. Both vehicles had minor damage.





Transform spaces into cozy retreats

Purdy Schools bond issue passes with overwhelming 81 percent margin

Voters gave heavy favor to a bond issue that will allow Purdy Schools to build a FEMA tornado shelter on campus, as well as new preschool and music classrooms. Unofficial results showed 81.5 percent of Purdy District voters favoring the bond issue and only 18.5 percent opposing the issue. The tally came in with 608 yes votes and only 138 against.

The \$2.3 million bond will allow the school to borrow against their bonding capacity to supplement FEMA grant money to allow for the building to be more multipurpose than just a storm shelter. The bonding will not impact taxes for residents in the district.

The plan for the shelter shows the building at around 8,000 square feet,

and it will be able to house around 1,300 in the event of an emergency. If school is in session, the facility would be open on campus. However, since FEMA is involved, residents that live within a certain area near the shelter will also receive a letter if they are in the evacuation area in the event of a major storm.

There is no set time line in place for when the shelter will be completed, but they will begin the paperwork immediately now that the bond has passed. Purdy Schools Superintendent Dr. Steven Chancelor said he anticipates a six-month construction window.

He said, "We are excited. We knew it was a high voter turn out. We kind of watched it. I voted at 6 a.m., and I stood in line. I knew the day started out well.

"We felt like we had a good plan and something that made sense and was reasonable and something that people could support. Obviously we got that, and we're very happy."

It will be a bit of a lag

before the Purdy sees any visible progress on the building; however, there will be a lot of behind-thescenes work that will be done by the school.

Chancelor said, "The hard part is not seeing a lot of activity for awhile. We're still very early in the process of the FEMA paperwork, so there will be a lot of back and forth with that and submitting paperwork and getting feedback, but I hope that we can get through the early spring or after the first of the year see some activity. We expect a short construction period."

A big part of the advantage of upgrading the FEMA shelter is the school will be able to have new preschool classroom and choir/ band classrooms as well as being able to use the building for a performing arts venue. While FEMA provides 75 percent of the base cost of the building itself, any extras that allow it to be multipurpose are on the school district to pay for.

The bond will go to provide the remaining 25 percent plus any additional funds to make the building multipurpose. A final cost will be determined further in the process.



A sold out Bedlam Run 5K saw 587 runners - 355 of them women - take to the streets of Tulsa's Blue Dome district on Saturday in the seventh annual edition of a race that has rapidly grown into one of Oklahoma's premiere running events. A fun precursor to the college football season, the Bedlam Run highlights the OU/ Oklahoma State rivalry, with Sooner red and Cowboy orange displayed promi-

nently throughout the venue. Luke Murphy, a 4:23 miler for Tulsa's Lincoln Christian High School, was the overall winner with his 16:58 perfor-

Brylee Wilson of Cassville, just two months removed from 7th grade, turned on the jets in the final sprint down 2nd Street to claim the women's division championship in 21:21. Wilson placed 17th overall on the USATF-certified course.

The 10K event was also a sellout, attracting 419 runners. Collin Carpenter of Broken Arrow claimed the victory in 38:39. I finished

19th overall with a 46:27.

But this day was all about Wilson, and the after-race crowd buzzed over her per-

Brylee stuck to her race plan, holding back on the two big hills in the initial mile. As soon as she topped the Detroit Street overpass, she caught Tulsa's Ella Euraste. The pair raced side by side until the final stretch.

Speed kills

Speed is a God-given talent. You either have it or you don't. In a distance race, all other variables being equal, the fastest runner will win. 



Going to grandma's: Helping foster kids feel at home

Can you imagine being taken from your home with all your belongings in a trash bag? Every day, this happens to children taken from their homes for safety reasons and placed in foster homes. These children are already dealing with loss and confusion and then having to leave with just a trash bag adds to their loss of dignity. Jennifer Humphrey recognized this tragedy and decided something had to be done. This was the beginning of Going to Grandma's House, A Foster Care Dignity Project. Humphrey has worked in Children's Services for 20 years, with 10 of them as an investigator, so she has first hand knowledge of the trauma children face when leaving their home. Her first goal was to ensure every investigator take a suitcase to homes where children were going to be removed from unsafe conditions. She shared the idea on Facebook hoping someone would take charge because she was busy working and raising her

children. No one stepped up, and then one day she was in a flea market and saw two suitcases. She felt GOD was telling her to take on this important project. She began gathering suitcases and speaking to churches and schools and encouraging suitcase drives. Today, she has collected over 100 suitcases and distributed them to Barry, Lawrence and Stone counties' Children's Services. Humphrey also works in Jasper County so she takes suitcases there too. Humphrey and her children clean up the suitcases and place a special name tag and prayer cloth inside each one. The cloth has been prayed over to give blessings to the children for their safety and security. This is a physical object that they can keep and hold and know there are people who pray and care for them. Many times this is their first exposure to God and prayer.

When children are removed from their home, they can pack their belongings in a real suitcase they can keep forever. Then it can be easily stored under a bed and it provides a place children can keep things they accumulate such as awards from school, gifts, clothes, etc., while in foster care. Then they can take the suitcase back home and share what they have gotten with their parents.

Jessica Baugh was a foster child and remembers leaving her home at three years of age with only a Wal-Mart sack with her things. She is one of Going to Grandma's biggest advocates. She promotes this suitcase idea in her hometown and provides a real life example of how much a suitcase means to a child.

Humphrey feels very blessed to be involved in the project and encourages everyone to start gathering suitcases. If you have a donation and live in Barry County, take it to Kim Horner, Sr. Office Support Assistant at Children's Division in Cassville.
