Barry County Sheriff's Dept. aids Secret Service in arrest

On Monday, July 24, Detectives with the Barry County Sheriff's Department aided United States Secret Service agents in apprehending a Cassville man being indicted in a south Florida Federal Court. According to a press release by Barry County Sheriff Gary Davis, Quinton Hymas, 34, of Cassville, was arrested without incident at his home.

The press release also states Hymas is wanted for his alleged connection with a multi-state fraud investigation. Another man connected to the crime, James Carrington, reported to be from either Marionville or Aurora, was arrested in May of this year for the same fraud case.

Davis' press release reported that Hymas was transported to Springfield by Secret Service agents and went before a Federal Magistrate yesterday, Tuesday, August 1. As of time of press, no additional information had been released by the U.S. Department of Justice or the Southern District of Florida United States Attorney's Office.

Earlier information provided from the Department of Justice from Thursday, May 4, stated that eight defendants were charged in a multi-count indictment for an elaborate \$1.67 million automobile fraud scheme.

The original eight charged in the indictment were Mark David Johnson, 41, of Ft. Lauderdale, Fla., David William Wheat, 66, of Ft. Pierce, Fla., Michael Kennedy Brown, 53, of Delray Beach, Fla., James Carrington, 37, of Aurora, Jana Kabelova, 41, of Ft. Lauderdale, Fla., Michael Munday aka Mickey, 41, of North Miami, Fla., Juan Ottavianelli, 71, of north Miami

Back-to-school safety in forefront for area officers

With one area school resuming classes as early as next week, local law enforcement officers have their eyes on students' safety as children walk to and from school in the coming weeks. Cassville Police Chief Dana Kammerlohr said that students, parents and drivers need to be aware of safety as well as some changes to traffic procedure in the city now that school is going back in session.

Chief Kammerlohr said, "People need to be aware and realize that they need to be patient with traffic as school starts up. It's always hectic the first few days of school."

She made some suggestions that will help parents, other drivers and students as the new school year begins.

First, she said to be prepared for changes in traffic and time constraints. "Parents should allow plenty of time to drop off their children or pick up their children after school."

She also said that all driv-

ers need to be more vigilant in their driving during those high-traffic times of the day. She said, "Do not text and drive. Period. It is especially dangerous in school zones, but it shouldn't be done at all. It's not worth someone's life to take that risk."

She also added that, after officers and school representatives voiced concerns, there will be a change made to one street in Cassville that will impact drivers leaving the school both in the mornings and afternoons. The City of Cassville has installed a new sign that prevents left-hand turns from 14th Street onto Main Street as you're leaving the school.

Chief Kammerlohr said, "It'll cause a little bit of inconvenience, but there are alternative routes when you're leaving the school. This is for the safety of the kids on the crosswalk."

After MoDOT put in ADA-compliant sidewalks along Main Street, the crosswalks near the Rock Gym changed. It is now more difficult for police officers and crosswalk attendants to ensure kids are safe as they cross from the school to the opposite side of Main Street at the corner of



Parents of Cassville students will need to plan alternate routes when leaving the school after picking up or dropping off students. It is now no left-hand turn on 14th Street.

14th Street. "We put in a folddown sign, so the no left turns will only apply when kids are coming to school and leaving school in the afternoon. With the MoDOT changes, kids are now having to cross two streets, and it's very difficult for the officer to keep up with the two different areas where kids are walking as well as traffic turning left. If drivers turn right, it's a safer procedure for the kids crossing the

crosswalk."

The Chief also made suggestions for alternative routes that will be safer for students. She said, "They can turn before Main Street and use a side street to go back, or they can turn right on Main Street and take an alternate route back toward downtown wherever they need to go."

She added, "It depends on the day, but Cassville can have a lot of walkers. It's more in the

Seligman mayor announces resignation Charlea Estes doesn't know when or if he'll

Seligman mayor Garry Thornton stepped down from his seat and resigned at a special board meeting on Tuesday last week. Thornton, who served the city in the capacity of police chief prior to being elected mayor, cited health reasons for why he is no longer able to be in the position.

Seligman city clerk Brian Nichols said, "He resigned for health reasons. Right now, he isn't living in town, and he be able to move back. If he is able to move back, he'd like to run for the mayor position again."

Thornton was first elected as Seligman's mayor in April 2016 for a one-year term. He sought reelection in the April 2017 General Municipal Election and was voted in for a two-year term. However, Thornton was hospitalized right before the election, according to Nichols.

Cassville man arrested for drugs, stolen police equipment

SUSPECTED BLACK TAR HEROIN FOUND

officers found what they believe to be black tar executed. He said, "We did take him into cusneroin in his possession. He is being charged with four counts of possession of a controlled substance, unlawful possession of drug paraphernalia, resisting arrest for a felony, and stealing (\$750 or more). Travis Wayne Jones, 40, of Cassville, is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$45,000 cash-only bond.

The Cassville Police Department executed a search warrant at Jones residence on Ivey Street on July 21. Cassville Police Department Detective Danny Boyd stated, "Officer Beck had gathered intel against Jones in order to secure the search warrant."

Officers reported finding an Altoid can with 85 marijuana seeds inside, as well as a cut soda can with white residue Jones said was a crushed pill. Officers also found a pen tube coated in a white substance that field-tested positive for methamphetamine.

During that same search, officers also found a tactical bullet proof vest and inserts that was identified as belonging to the Cassville Police Department. The carrier vest was valued at \$216 and the inserts were valued at \$800. Boyd said the vest that was recovered was stolen from an officer's home.

> A few days later, on July 25 around 10 p.m., Jones was seen walking on West Street toward Main Street in Cassville by a Barry County Sheriff's Deputy. The deputy and two other officers, knowing Jones had active warrants, made contact with Jones, who proceeded to flee on foot, according to the affidavits of probable cause. After a foot pursuit, Jones was apprehended and continued to resist arrest. The deputy reported having to use a Taser to subdue Jones and take him into custody.

> After Jones was searched, officers located a plastic bag filled with a large amount of white crystal-like substance, pills and another brown substance resembling black tar heroin. The white powder field-tested positive for the presence of methamphetamine. In a baggie, six small pills were identified as Diazepam and another half pill of an Oxycodone. He also had 44 small baggies commonly used to sell and distribute controlled substances, according to the

Two Cassville people killed and one injured in Billings crash

Two Cassville residents died in a car crash near Billings on Tuesday afternoon. The Missouri State Highway Patrol crash report stated that the single-vehicle crash killed two and seriously injured a third person.

The report stated that on Tuesday, August 1, Joan M. Schoelzel, 82, of Cassville, was driving a 2002 Mercury Grand Marquis with two passengers: Jerold E. Schoelzel, 87, and Justin D. Schoelzel, 44. Around 2:20 p.m., Schoelzel was driving westbound on US-60 one mile west of Billings when she ran off the right side of the roadway and struck a ditch. The car overturned multiple times, ejecting the rear passenger from the vehicle.

Justin was pronounced deceased by the Christian County coroner at 3:16 p.m. Jerold was pronounced deceased at 3:26 p.m. at the scene.

Joan was airlifted to Cox South Hospital in Springfield for serious injuries.

The Grand Marquis was totaled and towed from the scene by Hillbilly Wrecker, of Marionville.

These were the 61st and 62nd fatalities for Troop D in 2017.

The Missouri State Highway Patrol crash report stated the crash occurred on Highway 112 about two miles south of Cassville around 9:35 p.m. on Sunday, July 30.

Michael E. Easley, 28, of Cassville, was driving a 2016 Kawasaki Ninja when he attempted to overtake another vehicle. Easley lost control of the motorcycle, ran off the roadway, struck a mailbox and overturned.

afternoon than in the morning because there is foot traffic across the crosswalk at the daycare, as well."

With so many kids walking to and from school, parents are encouraged to talk to their kids about safety and to be aware of adults they do not know trying to speak with them, "Make sure you tell your kids to not go with people unless they have permission from their parents," Kammerlohr said.

"Talk to your children who are walking to always be aware of their surroundings. It they are going to cross the street, look both ways and make sure that is no traffic coming. Tell them to never dart in front of a car, even if they think they can beat it. But also, it someone approaches them and tries to them to get into a car, make sure they know of safe places they can go along their route and where to find trustworthy adults."

She said that she is not aware of any incidents lately of attempted abductions or adults approaching children, but it is always a good idea to talk to kids about what to do in the slim chance it happens to them.

Man charged after alleged assault, threat to burn down police station

A Monett man racked up multiple charges after threatening officers who were arresting him for an alleged assault. Harry Todd Herschel II, 27, was charged with terroristic threat in the second degree, two counts of assault in the third degree, one count of assault in the third degree on a special victim, resisting arrest, and property damage in the second degree. Herschel is being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$40,000 cash-only bond.

According to the affidavit of probable cause, the Purdy Police Department was dispatched to an assault in an apartment on Monroe in Purdy last week. When

officer Russ Nichols arrived on the scene, reported that there were two victims who claimed Harry physically assaulted them. Harry then admitted to assaulting the two victims, as well.

When Nichols took Harry into custody, he stated Harry began pulling away from him, failing to comply with orders. Harry then allegedly kicked and beat the rear doors and windows of the police car, breaking a switch panel on the passenger door. Nichols was also injured in the altercation while taking Harry into custody.

During the altercation, Harry allegedly made several threats, including that he would burn down the

Prior to serving as mayor, Thornton was a police officer for the city starting in September 2011, chief of police from September 2012 to May 2014, and then a reserve officer until April 2016.

Thornton was unable to attend meetings since being reelected. Mayor pro-tem Michael Avers has been fulfilling the role since then. Avers has been an alderman with the city since December 2014.

In an interview, Thornton said, "Someday I hope to return to Seligman, but right now, it's not a possibility." Thornton said he had to have his spleen removed earlier this year and subsequently was in a coma for three months. At one point, Thornton said he was on 15 different antibiotics and died multiple times while hospitalized. It is a medical miracle that he was brought back and resuscitated.

Once he was released from the hospital, he knew he had to leave Seligman to live closer to his medical care team.

"I hate every minute of it. I didn't want to resign as mayor, but due to my health conditions, I have no choice," Thonton stated.

He continued, "I love the town. I love the people. I hate losing my friends and moving so far away, but at this point in my life, I don't really have a choice. Between all of my doctor's visits, my nurses coming to the house and my physical therapist, it's not an option."

Thornton was also an officer with the Cassville Police Department and formally resigned from that position last week, as well.

Cassville Chief of Police Dana Kammerlohr said, "We will miss him, and he was a loyal, dependable and honest officer. He kept us laughing in the office, and we wish him the best."

As much as it pained Thornton to admit he had to resign from the positions, he knew it was the only thing he could do. "When I woke up, I couldn't move my legs or left arm, but they've come back to me after rehab. I'm a lot better than I was, but I've got a long way to go."

Nichols said Thornton made a positive impact on the city during his time in office. He said, "I worked with Gary for several years, both as the mayor and chief of police. I'll certainly miss seeing him here and having him around. He really cares about the community and wanted to improve things for everyone."

Nichols added, "In this job, it's hard to find someone for the position who is in it for the right reasons. So many times, people want to get in just to fix a certain problem, but he was here to be a part of

the community and to help in any way he could.

"He's just a good guy."

While serving as mayor, Thornton said he feels like they accomplished good for the residents of Seligman. "I wanted to help make a difference in the community and improve the livelihood of the citizens there. While I was mayor, we did the walking trail, got new playground equipment and got HARPS to open up. I enjoyed it," Thornton stated.

Nichols said one additional thing about Thornton's parting, "We can just hope that he'll return to the community later and continue to make it even better."

Thornton also expressed, "I thank everyone who voted for me and hope they understand that it's because of the medical conditions, not because of the job."

As far as a new mayor to fill Thornton's shoes, Nichols said, "We may find an interim mayor, but it's not a set thing that we have to go out and find a mayor to fill that role. I'm not sure what the board's intentions are in terms of moving forward with that, but we'll be discussing it at the next meeting on August 14."

The open seat for mayor of Seligman will go back up for election in April 2018 for a single year term. Avers will continue to serve as mayor pro-tem until a decision is made regarding Thornton's empty seat with the city during the August city council





Eagle Rock man arrested after alleged assault, kidnapping

An Eagle Rock man, Christopher A. Stills, 34, is being charged with domestic assault and kidnapping after allegedly choking his girlfriend until she was unconscious and holding her in his home for two days.

According to the affidavits of probable cause, the Barry County Sheriff's Department investigated the incident, which began on July 17 on State Highway 86 in Eagle Rock. According to the officer's report, Stills choked the victim, who he was in a relationship with, until she was unconscious. The victim said she regained consciousness as Stills was dragging her body into house. The victim said Stills then punched and headbutted her in the face and threatened to kick her throat in if law enforcement was called.

After the assault, Stills allegedly took the victim's keys when she tried to leave, choked her again until she was unconscious and drug her back into the house.

The victim reported that Stills did not go to work for the following two days to make sure she did not leave. It wasn't until Stills left to go to the doctor for a note excusing him from work that she was able to access a phone to call for help.

Stills is charged with domestic assault in the first degree and kidnapping in the second degree. He is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$50,000 cash-only







Missouri reports strong progress in flooding recovery

Less than five weeks after Missouri received a major disaster declaration for historic flooding and severe storms, the state's disaster recovery team today reported that more than \$66 million in payments to disaster survivors is helping fuel the state's recovery effort.

Gov. Eric Greitens' request for a federal disaster declaration was approved on June 2. Through July 5:

- The Federal Emergency Management Agency has made more than \$10.2 million in grant payments for emergency home repairs, rental assistance, the replacement of essential personal property and other eligible expenses to 1,588 disaster
- The U.S. Small Business Administration has approved approximately \$9.1 million in low-interest disaster loans to more than 140 homeown-

ers, renters and businesses.

• The National Flood Insurance Program has made payments totaling just under \$47 million in payments to 931 Missouri policyholders. NFIP continues to process more than 350 additional

The updated figures were released during a joint media update call hosted by leaders of Missouri's state recovery team and FEMA. Both the state and FEMA emphasized the importance of homeowners and renters quickly applying for assistance, since the deadline for FEMA and SBA assistance is Aug. 1.

"Our state recovery team, FEMA and our local partners are all working in close coordination to get the word out that the time to register for assistance and ask questions about the help available is now," Missouri Disaster Recovery Coordinator

Patrick Baker said. "We are pleased with the assistance provided thus far. Our team will continue to work to identify programs through which further assistance may be made available during the long-term recovery effort."

"It is important for those who have been impacted to register for assistance," FEMA Deputy Federal Coordinating Officer Constance Johnson-Cage said. "Don't eliminate yourself from consideration. Call 800-621-3362 before the Aug. 1 deadline and see if we can help. It only takes about 20 minutes and we may be able to assist in your recovery"

Under the federal disaster declaration, 27 Missouri counties are eligible for Individual Assistance: Bollinger, Butler, Carter, Douglas, Dunklin, Franklin, Gasconade, Howell, Jasper, Jefferson, Madison, Maries, McDonald, Newton, Oregon, Osage, Ozark, Pemiscot, Phelps, Pulaski, Reynolds, Ripley, Shannon, St. Louis, Stone, Taney, and Texas.

FEMA reported that since June 8, it has operated 23 disaster recovery centers across the disaster area. Those recovery centers have logged more than 1,600 visits by survivors for one-on-one counseling on available assistance, flood insurance, mitigation methods and disaster loans from SBA. Currently, DRCs remain open in Carter, Howell, Oregon, Ozark and Stone counties. The DRCs in Carter and Howell counties are scheduled to close at 2 p.m. on Saturday, July 8. Check the state's disaster recovery page at https:// recovery.mo.gov/ for details.

SBA offers low-interest disaster loans to businesses of all sizes, most private nonprofit organizations, homeowners and renters. The deadline to apply for a loan from SBA is Aug. 1, 2017. SBA also offers low-interest

Training Wheels

Last summer, we journeyed to Colorado for some altitude training. This year, we stayed closer to home but adjusted our training to include more cardio. More cardiovascular work normally implies more run time, and more opportunity for injury due to the exaggerated exposure to impact. Both muscles and connective tissue are more prone to strains, sprains and tears when exposed to long, continuous workouts.

We turned to cycling as the best option for added training.

With Josie's reliable Schwinn and my Giant strapped to the bike carrier on the Toyota, we spent many hours exploring the Razorback Regional Greenway in northwest Arkansas. Denver had a great paved trail system for bikers, but the pig trail from Crystal Bridges to southern Fayetteville is as good as any in the country.

Never brave enough to tackle the entire 31-mile trail in one outing, we focused on out-and-back journeys on specific trail sections. From Crystal Bridges to the trail head at Pinnacle Hills is about 7 miles, with rest rooms and water at both locations. There are some significant hills on this piece, but it is heavily shaded in spots and we considered it the most beautiful trail sec-

Travelling south from Pinnacle Hills to Lake Springdale was a challenge. Mostly open countryside with some long uphill grades and one impossible hill coming back, this trail section wore me out. Plus, the new trail head park at Lake Springdale lacked any working water fountains and there were no restroom facilities of any kind.

My best advice for this leg is to make sure you stop at the convenience store halfway, and DON'T go down the big hill to the lake. You will have to come back sometime, somehow. When exhaustion forces you to walk your bike up a hill, it tends to overshadow all the fun parts of the ride. But if you're a stud rider, go for it.

We made one trip from Lake Springdale to Lake Fayetteville. There was some neat stuff along the way. The trail goes right by the Mill Cemetery in north Springdale, so we took a few minutes to check on the Stubblefields buried there. After a tour of downtown, the trail parallels Powell Street before diving off to the much larger Lake Fayetteville just southeast of the Fayetteville Mall. This was my favorite trail section. And there were bathrooms!

The tour around Lake Fayetteville is just over five miles, and then the final leg south to Walker Park is

another nine miles. Those nine include a number of underpasses and tunnels. Tunnels!

The trail goes by the Razorback cross country course, crosses the historic downtown section of Dickson Street and disappears into a tree-sheltered path for the final two miles.

We had so much fun riding together that we didn't think of our outings as workouts. There was plenty of work and sweat involved - and long naps afterwards - but it was 99 percent pure enjoyment. Still, the physical benefits of cycling are enormous. Serious pedal pushers enjoy the same cardiovascular benefits and muscle gain as marathon runners. After all, cycling is a great sport in its own right.

For athletes looking for

cross training, cycling provides that extra boost with few negatives. No amount of running can prepare your quads for the stress of a tough set of hills on a 20-mile bike expedition. If you hate going to the track for sprint work, biking provides a solid substitute.

Riding the trail is so much safer than road riding. Except for the few road crossings, there is little interaction with motor vehicles. Drivers are generally aware of bike traffic at intersections and yield accordingly. The drivers in Springdale get an A+ for their commitment to bicycle safety.

We did encounter a few runners, walkers, and stroller pushers on the trail. Give people plenty of warning, announce your intentions..."PASSING ON YOUR LEFT"...and use safe and courteous riding practices, always.

If you don't bike or haven't in a long time, maybe now is the time to reacquaint yourself with this great activity. You never forget how.
