Warren, Boxx take Republican Primary Election

As votes came in from the 19 different Barry County precincts last night, a crowd gathered on the Barry County Courthouse lawn waiting to hear the results. The importance of the Primary Election was paramount for candidates running on the Republican ballot as none of the local seats will face any Democrat opposition in the November election. The importance of the election was prevalent in the voter turnout. Of Barry County's 20,234 registered voters, 6,342 cast ballots, totalling 31.34 percent voter turnout.

With the first few precincts reporting, Prosecuting Attorney candidate Amy Boxx commanded a strong lead against challengers Matthew Weatherman and Steve Dunker, and the race was de-

termined early as Boxx's votes widened the gap between her and the other two candidates with each new precinct's votes being tallied. By the time all votes were counted, Boxx won the Republican nomination for Barry County Prosecuting Attorney. The unofficial numbers for the race were Boxx - 3,216, Weatherman - 1,044, and Dunker - 952.

Following the reading of the results, Dunker commented, "I wish Amy nothing but the best as Prosecutor for the county." Weatherman added, "I look forward to working with her in the future."

The race to watch last night ended up being the Presiding Commissioner race between incumbent Cherry Warren and challengers Eddie Davison and Terry Burgess. Vote tallies between Warren and

Davison, a former commissioner for the county, were close from the beginning. As results were read, Warren's lead over Davison was tight from the beginning with only 44 votes separating them at one point. Once all votes were tallied, Warren won the nomination for his sixth term as Presiding Commissioner for the County. The unofficial results for the race were: Warren - 2,360, Davison - 2,219, and Burgess - 734. Warren closed out the narrow race with just 141 votes between him and Davison.

After the results were announced, Warren stated, "I'm very thankful to the voters of the County for the confidence that they have in me to serve. I appreciate everyone who voted for me. It was a tough campaign, but I look forward to serving the citizens of Bar-

ry County for another four years."

Challenger Terry Burgess stated, "I want to thank everyone that supported and stood behind my ideas. I think this was a great starting point for me and something to build on in the future."

Other Republican candidates that ran in the Primary Election unopposed were: County Clerk Gary Young-

blood, Circuit Clerk Craig Williams, County Treasurer Lois Lowe, Collector Janice Varner, Associate Circuit Judge Division I Johnnie Cox and Associate Circuit Judge Robert Foulke.

Walmart Express coming to Seligman

For residents in the Seligman area, shopping options will increase by this December with the addition of a Walmart Express in the southern Barry County town.

The store broke ground last week according to Erica Jones, senior manager of communications for Walmart, in an inter-

view. Jones said that the store hopes to open in mid-December and that a grand opening ceremony and a community event are in the planning stages. She stated, "We're excited to be a part of the Seligman community and can't wait for everyone to come in and see the store."

The store's location will be at the intersection of High-

way 112 and Highway 37 in Seligman. Once completed, the store will be around 12,000 square feet and will house a variety of departments. Walmart Express stores are a fairly new addition to the Walmart chain, bringing smaller stores to communities that need more

Former Eagle Rock postmaster sentenced

Tammy Dickinson, United States Attorney for the Western District of Missouri, announced that the former Eagle Rock postmaster was sentenced in federal court today for conspiring to rob or burglarize a convenience store.

Michael Joe Stubblefield, 51, of Cassville, sentenced by U.S. District Judge Gary A. Fenner to three years and eight months in federal prison

without parole.

On Dec. 18, 2013, Stubblefield pleaded guilty to participating in a conspiracy to commit robbery and to transporting stolen goods.

On multiple occasions in March 2012, Stubblefield, who was then employed as the postmaster at the U.S. Postal Service office in Eagle Rock, met with confidential infor-

Youngblood says those claims are false. He stated, "The voting machines worked perfectly."

Officer Privett cleared on fatal shooting

The tragic incident that revolved around a Cassville officer-related shooting in June of this year came to a close Friday when the officer was cleared of criminal charges by the Prosecutor's office.

Corporal Donald Privett with the Cassville Police Department was dispatched to a disturbance at an apartment building on Old Exeter Road on June 10, 2014, in Cassville. When Privett arrived, the young man on the scene, Johnathon Gerster-Thomas, 25, Cassville, began hitting him with a metal pipe. In an act of self-defense, Privett shot Gerster-Thomas who later died en route to a hospital in Springfield.

According to Barry County Prosecuting Attorney Johnnie Cox, Corporal Privett was justified in his use of force against the man during the assault and his office will not be pursuing criminal charges. Cox stated,

"It was a tragic incident that occurred. When I spoke to Gerster-Thomas's mother, even she did not hold any ill will toward Officer Privett regarding the shooting."

Cox made his determinations based on reports from the Missouri State Highway Patrol Division of Drug and Crime Control, the Cassville Police Department, the Barry County Sheriff's Department, as well as written statements and an autopsy report. Cox said that the last thing he had been waiting on to make a final determination was the autopsy report received by his office on July 22. Gerster-Thomas's autopsy was performed by Southwest Missouri Forensics in Springfield.

Privett was reinstated to full duty Friday, August 1, upon release of the information from Cox's office, according to a statement released by Cassville Police Chief Dana Kammerlohr.

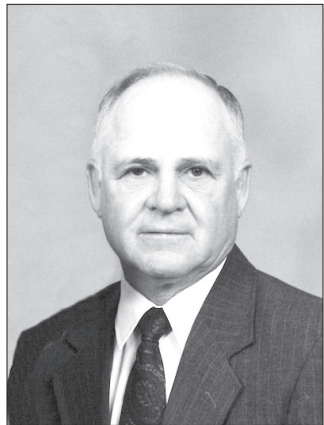

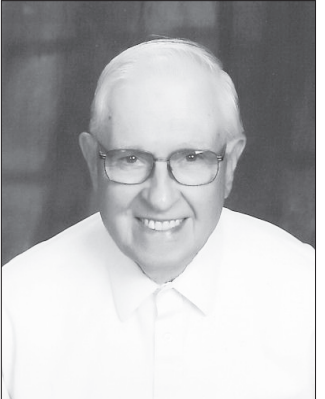

One killed in MO 90 crash

One man was killed on Sunday in a car crash near Washburn.

Brian A. Sharp, 31, of Seligman, was travelling westbound on MO 90, two miles of west of Washburn in a 1979 Chevrolet Corvette with passenger Kenneth A. Patterson, 48, Seligman. According to the Missouri State

Highway Patrol crash report, Sharp's vehicle ran off of the roadway and struck a culvert where the car overturned.

Patterson was pronounced dead by Deputy Coroner Charles McManus at 6:50 p.m. on Sunday. Neither of the men were wearing seatbelts at the time. This is the 59th fatality for Troop D.

Kids Fishing Day slated for Aug. 16

Fishing helps kids discover nature. Helping children get hooked on the thrill of fishing will be the focus of Kids' Fishing Day on August 16 at Roaring River State Park. A hatchery tour will show how trout are raised. A program on Missouri snakes will be given using live specimens. If kids attend three classes, they will be entered into a drawing for prizes. The drawing will be held at 5 p.m. Children must be present to win. Classes are also open to the whole family, but only children may enter the drawings.

Mercy offers help for depressed seniors

A new opportunity is opening up at Cassville's Mercy Hospital that will bring some much-needed help to senior citizens suffering from emotional and behavioral health problems.

The program is called Senior Life Solutions, and it is one of very few like it offered in Missouri. Senior Life Solutions is intensive outpatient designed for people aged 65 or older who are experiencing mental health issues.

According to Kathy Holle, LPN and nurse for the program, anyone can refer a person for the program. She stated, "If someone has a friend or neighbor who they think needs some help, we can at least get a name and phone number and call them and see if they are interested." She also noted that someone doesn't have to be 65 years or older and that people will be assessed individually as to whether they would benefit from the program.

Symptoms that the pro-

gram says to look for are: crying, hopelessness, loneliness, restlessness, sadness, coping with loss, decreased energy, difficulty sleeping and low self-confidence. However, each person is assessed on an individual basis for what they need.

The program is run by a board-certified psychiatrist, a licensed therapist and other professionals to ensure that clients are getting the care they need. After an initial consult and a determination is made as to what each patient needs, the program has group therapy on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 9 a.m. until 12:30 p.m. with a few breaks. The program will officially start in Cassville on August 20. Holle said, "A therapist leads the group sessions, but if the group gets to be too much, they can always take a break and go for a walk with me if they need to."

Patients will also meet with the therapist and psychiatrist on staff regularly for private

sessions to work on individual progress.

Holle said, "Most people go through the program in three to four months, but some might be in it of 10 or 12 months. There isn't a cut off time." The group caps out at about 10 patients at any given time.

Holle also said that the program has regular follow-up after completion to make sure that graduates are still doing well. "We plan some fun things for follow-up, like the graduates will come back for a reunion and get to see each other again. We make sure that they aren't finishing and then just left. We make sure they are still doing okay after."

The Hospital has remodeled the area that will be used for the program so that the group therapy room and program leaders' offices are all in the same area for patient convenience. Holle said, "I hope that people will be receptive to this program because there is definitely a need for it."

mants, who were cooperating with law enforcement, to coordinate a staged robbery or burglary at Uncle Roy's Convenience Store. Several of those conversations were recorded.

Stubblefield asked one of the informants, who was an employee of the store, to provide detailed information

about the location of cameras, closing operations and employee schedules, location of storage areas for valuable liquor, and other specific details regarding the operation of the store. Both confidential informants believed the purpose of Stubblefield's inquiries were his desire to conduct a robbery when the confiden-

tial informant was on duty at the convenience store or possibly a burglary of the facility, utilizing the employee's access information to carry out the plan after the store was closed.

When that employee was terminated from the store, Stubblefield abandoned the plan of a staged robbery and turned his attention toward a possible take-over robbery. In addition to discussing the planned robbery, Stubblefield also described how those taking part in the robbery could place cash, masks and other items related to the robbery in Postal Service packaging that Stubblefield would provide. After the robbery, co-conspirators would drop these items at the USPS drop box in front of the USPS facility in Eagle Rock. As Stubblefield was the only individual with access to this box, he would be able to retrieve the cash and other items from the drop box.

Stubblefield planned to create a diversion for law enforcement officers by having co-conspirators make a false 911 call while other co-conspirators robbed the store.

During the continuing investigation, it was determined that Stubblefield had also intercepted and stole at least two shipments of precious metals bound for THR Associates, a company that buys gold and silver items. Stubblefield referred to these thefts during his contact with the confidential informants. The gold and silver items were sold for a total of \$6,480.

This case was prosecuted by Supervisory Assistant U.S. Attorney Michael Oliver and Assistant U.S. Attorney James Kelleher. It was investigated by the FBI, the United States Postal Service – Office of Inspector General, and the Barry County Sheriff's Department.

CMS upgrading courtyard security

Both student safety and comfort were topics at hand when the Cassville R-IV School District made plans to increase security around the Middle School courtyard this semester.

For the District, it was important to come up with a security solution that would ensure that no unauthorized parties have access to the school while students are there during the day. As it stood, anyone who entered the courtyard to gain access to the Middle School through the courtyard doors which remained open during the day so that students could go back and forth between the cafeteria and main building.

As a solution, the District decided to put up an ornamental fence around the Middle School Courtyard as a cost-efficient means to keep students both inside the buildings and the courtyard safe.

Superintendent Richard Asbill stated, "When we looked at what our needs are, it was more important to keep certain people out of the buildings and courtyard instead of

keeping students out of the courtyard." Many students enjoy spending time in the courtyard outdoors after lunch before their next classes begin. It is a social area where students have a bit of freedom to gather. The school just wanted to make sure that students were safe while there.

The 60 feet of decorative fencing that will have a locked gate during the day cost the District \$6,920, significant savings when compared to putting in individual door security systems.

The courtyard area that the middle school students gather in has six different doors to the buildings. For the District to install card readers on each door for students to be able to access the building, it would have cost around \$18,000, around \$3,000 per door. By using a fence, Asbill says that it will keep people from accessing the buildings, which was a primary objective, but also keep the students in the courtyard safe from any threats.

Work will begin on the project sometime in September.

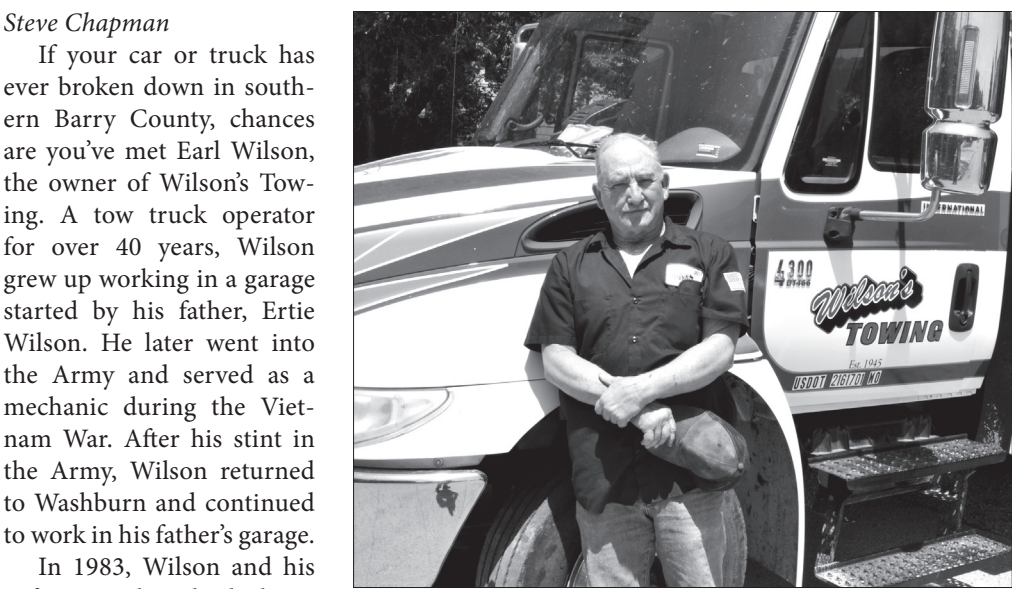

his calls are for vehicles that have landed upside down in creeks.

One incident that stands out to him, however, hap-pened in Golden, where the driver of a Hummer chose to ignore signs warning that the road had been closed, much to his misfortune.

"He drove right through with the 'Road Closed' signs up, went past that, went out on the lake and floated out," Wilson said. "He got out of the car and went back to get a tow truck to pull it out. When he got back, the Hum-mer was gone. It had floated out on the lake and sank. He had to get scuba divers to find and recover it."

Sometimes, it's not bad choices, but plain bad luck that sends business Wilson's way. He recalls the time the owner of a truck was trying to load a boat onto a trailer when the brake failed.

"He backed his boat trailer into the water to load

his boat, put his pickup in park, and got back in the pickup bed," Wilson said. "It jumped out of park and into reverse, and it backed out into the water. It went 40 feet out and 50 feet down." Wil-son still has the picture of a diver holding a fish that was found in the truck's cab after it was recovered.

While Wilson enjoys the towing business, like any other profession, it does have its downside. For Wil-son, the downside is police impounds. Sometimes, after their vehicles are impound-ed, the drivers have come to Wilson and demanded he re-lease their vehicles In some cases, they became so belligerent that Wilson has had to call the police to his lot.

"It makes for hard feel-ings for everybody," Wilson said.

For the most part how-ever, Wilson's experiences have been overwhelmingly positive.

"I like it, the excitement, the challenge of getting a car out of the creek or a ravine," he said.

In fact, Wilson has no plans to give up towing trucks anytime soon. When asked about his future plans, he simply said, "I'll retire someday."

Children from families whose current income is at or below those shown are eligible for free or reduced price meals. Applications are available at the school office. To apply, fill out a Free and Reduced Price School Meals Family Application and return it to the school. The information provided on the application is confidential and will be used only for the purpose of determining eligibility. Applications may be submitted any time during the school year. A complete application is required as a condition of eligibility. 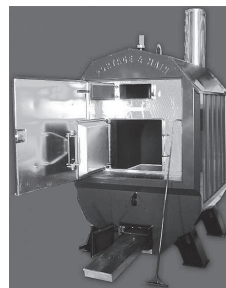

Barry County courts send 18 to prison in July

• **Jack Ray Bailey**, Kimberling City, pled guilty to theft/stealing of \$500 to \$25,000. He received five years incarceration in the Department of Corrections (DOC).

On July 18, 2010, Bailey took a black Dell laptop into the restroom at the Cassville Walmart where he removed the security device from the package. He then put his child's clothing on top of the computer in a cart and left the store. Bailey returned the next day to attempt to take another computer when he was apprehended. He also had warrants from Stone County and Branson West. The computer was valued at \$948.00.

• **Timothy L. Block**, Purdy, pled guilty to burglary in the 2nd degree. He received a suspended imposition of a sentence with five years supervised probation.

On August 6, 2013, the store front window of Modern Variety in Monett was broken and merchandise was missing. Block admitted to breaking the window and stealing two cartons of cigarettes and

two cans of chewing tobacco. Block is to serve probation until July 22, 2019.

• **Michael Stephen Bohanan**, Cassville, pled guilty to two counts of theft/stealing of any controlled substance. Bohanan received a suspended imposition of sentence with 120 days incarceration.

Around January 1, 2013, Bohanan took a bottle of hydrocodone pills from a residence on Fair Street in Cassville where he was helping the person living there. On April 21, 2013, Bohanan took a bottle of hydrocodones from a medicine cabinet at a residence he was visiting in Wheaton.

• **Anthony Dale Buck**, Purdy, pled guilty to two counts of possession of a controlled substance. He received a suspended imposition of sentence with supervised probation for five years.

On August 1, 2012, the Missouri State Highway Patrol stopped Buck for expired plates. Upon questioning, Buck admitted to having hydrocodone pills and mari-

juana. Troopers also found a straw for snorting narcotics and a marijuana pipe, as well.

On June 5, 2013, Buck was found to be driving with a suspended license. He was found to have a spoon with methamphetamine residue, marijuana and a marijuana pipe in his possession.

Buck is to serve probation until July 22, 2019.

• **John Robert Caldwell**, Monett, pled guilty to resisting arrest by fleeing, creating a substantial risk of serious injury of death to another person. He was sentenced to four years incarceration in the DOC.

On May 20, 2014, Caldwell fled from officers who were trying to pull him over for displaying plates of another vehicle and failing to stay in a single lane. He passed other vehicles in an unsafe manner in speeds in excess of 90 miles per hour. The chase lasted for 33 miles on various state highways and county roads. After Caldwell ran his vehicle off of the roadway, he fled on foot.

• **Karen Lynn Campbell**, Seligman, pled guilty to possession of a forging instrument. She received three years incarceration with the execution of that sentence suspended.

ed in favor of three years supervised probation.

On December 6, 2012, Campbell was behaving in a manic way at her probation and parole meeting. Campbell was found to have concealed a bottle of clean urine for her test. She stated that it was her own from four days before.

Campbell is to serve probation until July 22, 2017.

• **Jeremy A. Cape**, Purdy, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance. He received a suspended imposition of sentence with five years supervised probation and must successfully complete the drug court program.

On June 17, 2014, officers with the Southwest Missouri Drug Task Force investigated a residence on Farm Road 1155 in Barry County. They found methamphetamine, syringes and spoons that all field-tested positive for meth. Cape was hiding under the house when officers found him. He also had a baggie of methamphetamine on his person.

Cape's probation is set to end on July 21, 2019.

• **Gordon Carey**, Springfield, pled guilty to two counts of possession of a controlled substance. He received three years incarceration in the DOC.

On April 11, 2014, The Southwest Missouri Drug Task Force conducted a narcotics investigation on Highway WW near Verona. When they arrived, officers noticed a strong chemical odor. On the front porch, officers found an active batch of methamphetamine near the door. Inside the residence there were multiple items within the meth lab on site. Carey was the responsible party.

• **Justin Craig Childress**, Purdy, pled guilty to receiving stolen property and was sen-

tenced to five years incarceration in the DOC.

On July 5, 2011, officers found silver serving pieces, jewelry and hand tools in a storage building and building that Childress had access to in Monett. The property was stolen from Lawrence County. The value of the property was \$3,072.

• **Earnest Gene Clow** pled guilty to tampering with a motor vehicle in the 1st degree, burglary in the 2nd degree, and theft/stealing of \$500 to \$25,000 in value. He was sentenced to four years incarceration with the execution of that sentence suspended in favor of supervised probation.

On January 24, 2013, Clow stole a 1978 Ford Pickup from Fairview. The truck was moved to Farm Road 2095 in Purdy. Clow then dismantled the vehicle and took the parts to Triple P Recycling to sell the parts as scrap.

Between September 15 and 30, 2013, Clow took \$5,000 worth of Native American collectibles from a storage facility on Chestnut in Butterfield. He then sold the collectibles.

Clow is to serve probation until July 21, 2019.

• **Teresa Kay Davis**, Verona, pled guilty to theft/stealing of more than \$25,000. Davis was sentenced to eight years incarceration in the DOC and was ordered to pay \$174,693.57 restitution to Les Jacobs Ford.

Between January 2010 and November 2012, Davis embezzled money from Les Jacobs Ford where she as a bookkeeper.

• **Jake Justin Dimello**, Seligman, pled guilty to burglary in the 2nd degree and theft/stealing of less than \$500 value. He received a suspended imposition of sentence with supervised proba-

tion for five years.

On June 26 and 27, 2014, Dimello stole tools out of the victim's garage on Private Road 1083 near Seligman. The tools were valued at \$1,219.00.

Dimello is to serve probation until July 22, 2019.

• **Danny Elliott**, Seligman, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance and received three years incarceration in the DOC.

On January 28, 2011, Elliott was found to be in possession of perocet, a controlled substance. Elliott crushed and snorted the medication with a 15 year-old minor.

• **Matthew R. Elliott**, Monett, pled guilty to DWI-Alcohol as a persistent offender. He received three years incarceration in the DOC with the execution of that sentence suspended for supervised probation.

Elliott is to serve probation until July 21, 2018.

• **Bobby Simon Guilbeau**, Shell Knob, pled guilty to unlawful possession of a firearm and possession of a controlled substance. He was sentenced to five years incarceration in the DOC with the execution of that sentence suspended with supervised probation for five years.

On November 4, 2013, Guilbeau was investigated by conservation agents for taking deer with a firearm when firearm season was closed. He

was in possession of two illegal deer antlers and an illegal turkey. He also had a 12 gauge shotgun and a .22 rifle that he was not legally able to possess. He also had marijuana and methamphetamine residue in baggies along with paraphernalia.

Guilbeau is to serve probation until July 22, 2019.

• **John R. Harper Sr.**, Monett, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance from an arrest from 2009. He received a suspended imposition of sentence with three years supervised probation. He is to serve probation until July 2, 2017.

• **Zachariah S. Hill**, Republic, pled guilty to theft/stealing \$500 to \$25,000 in value and resisting arrest for a felony. He was sentenced to two years incarceration.

On April 22, 2014, Paterostro broke into an apartment on Monroe in Purdy. He then assaulted the victim by punching him with his fists.

• **Bertram Louis Paul,** Cassville, pled guilty to endangering the welfare of a child in the 1st degree. He received a suspended imposition of sentencing with five years supervised probation.

On July 15, 2012, Bertram hit a child known to have a history of seizures, hearing and speech problems, and believed to have Neurofibromatosis on the side of the head with a tv remote control, causing a blood vessel to burst and hemorrhage behind his ear drum.

• **Charles T. Peterson,** Rocky Comfort, pled guilty to unlawful possession of a firearm and was sentenced to seven years incarceration in the DOC with the execution of that sentence suspended.

He will serve supervised probation until July 22, 2019.

• **Dejay Eugene Ragain,** Aurora, pled guilty to statutory rape in the 2nd degree in March 2013. His probation has since been revoked and he

is to serve seven years incarceration in the DOC.

Between September 5 and October 31, 2012, Ragain had sexual intercourse with a 16 year-old girl.

• **Dennis Keith Raines** made an Alford plea for two counts of manufacture of a controlled substance. He was given a suspended imposition of sentencing with supervised probation for five years.

He is to serve probation until July 22, 2019.

• **Alexdandrea Reed,** Berryville, Ark., pled guilty to burglary in the 1st degree in June 2012. Her probation has since been revoked and she is to serve 120 days shock incarceration.

In January 2012, Reed and her mother committed burglaries on Farm Road 1267 near Cassville. Tthe stolen property was then found later in their home.

• **Matthew David Smith** pled guilty to endangering the welfare of a child in the 1st degree and possession of a controlled substance. He received three years incarceration in the DOC.

On December 12, 2012, Whittington had possession of a baggie with methamphetamine residue on Commercial Street in Purdy.

Whittington is to serve probation until July 21, 2019.

• **Michael Scott Williams,** Duenweg, pled guilty to non-support. His probation has been revoked and he is to serve 120 days shock incarceration.

• **Eva D. Wright,** Aurora, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance and received five years incarceration in the DOC.

On December 18, 2013, Wright had methamphetamine and paraphernalia in her bag.

Court to implement electronic filing Washburn man opens new gun shop

The Barry County Circuit Court is planning to implement the Missouri Electronic Filing (eFiling) System to enhance access and efficiency. This implementation is one of a growing number that allows the smallest, most rural court to the Supreme Court to accept filings from attorneys electronically.

"We are pleased with the shift towards electronic filing," Circuit Clerk Craig Williams said. "In making the change, we can offer attorneys extended hours of access to cases, providing them greater flexibility, reduce their costs for printing, copying and mailing, and better serve attorneys and their clients alike."

The Missouri eFiling System allows courts to receive, process and manage cases electronically. Attorneys can check the status of cases or submit filings without making trips to the judicial center, calling during business hours or waiting for available staff support to conduct a search. Public case docket information has been available in the court of appeals and other courts across the state through Case.net and is accessed easily through the Barry County Circuit Clerk's website at www.barrycountycrd.com and Missouri courts website at www.courts.mo.gov.

With electronic filing, case documents will be stored electronically at the court and will be viewable electronically through Case.net by Missouri attorneys who are registered and subscribed to the Missouri eFiling System. Access to public case documents by the general public or Missouri attorneys who are not registered users is available at the court during normal business hours.

"We are excited about being part of this growing initiative," Circuit Clerk Williams said, "But, as with any change in computer systems, we have a learning curve to overcome as we transition from paper to electronic case documents. We ask for everyone's patience as we become more comfortable with this new way of doing business."

The Supreme Court of Missouri, all three districts of the Missouri Court of Appeals, and various circuit courts within the State of Missouri, including Lawrence County, have converted to electronic filing successfully – an effort that has received considerable support and acclaim.

Barry County is currently scheduled to implement electronic filing September 2, 2014.

Hunters and gun enthusiasts have a new place to shop for firearms in Washburn. Steve Pendergraft, owner of Elkhorn Construction, has recently opened a new business, Three Corners Firearms. Pendergraft said the opening of the firearms shop is the fulfillment of a long-term goal.

"It's just something I've been wanting to do for about 30 years, and I finally decided it was time to do it because one of these days I'm going to get too old to do carpentry work."

At present, Pendergraft's inventory includes an assortment of pistols and rifles, including Berettas, Smith & Wessons, Winchesters and Rugers. However, if customers want something that he doesn't have on hand, Pendergraft says he can get it for them.

"I'll sell just about anything anyone wants, as long as it's not fully automatic," he said. "If I don't have it, I can order it if it's available."

Pendergraft estimates that most of his firearms fall in the cost range of \$300 to \$400. Ammunition is also available for sale.

"They're not the most expensive guns; they're not the cheapest guns. I just try to stay kind of mid-range on stuff," he explained.

Those wishing to purchase a firearm, Pendergraft says, must pass a federal background check before he can sell it.

"If you decide to make a purchase, the you have to fill out the form and, yes, I have to call it in and run you through the background check," he said. "And if you check out okay with them, they'll tell me to proceed with it and I can sell you the firearm. If they deny it for some reason, then I can't sell it to you."

Pendergraft added that background checks usually only take a few minutes, but if for some reason the ATF doesn't respond to a background check request in three days, he can proceed with the sale.

While opponents of gun ownership decry guns as dangerous, Pendergraft scoffs at that claim.

"It's not the gun that does the killing, it's the person. It's just like any other freedom; if you go taking (gun ownership) away, what's next? Just look around the world at the populations that don't have weapons, what's happening to them? If it's not their government, it's some kind of a militant group. They have no way to protect themselves. And if you didn't have (gun ownership) here, it would be the same thing here."

When it comes to his future plans for the store, Pendergraft says he hopes to grow it and eventually make it a second profession.

"One of these days, when I hopefully get quite a bit older, I hope it will be a retirement job. Something I can do to fill in the retirement years and kind of get me through," he concluded.

Three Corners Firearms is located in Washburn on Highway 37 next to Amanda's Shear Image and across the road from the Washburn Fire Department and Egan's Supply. The store is open from 6 p.m. to 9 p.m. on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays. Store hours on Saturdays are from 8 a.m. to 12 p.m. The phone number for Three Corners is (417) 846-7906.
