As Roaring River State Park gears up for the fall Kids' Fishing Day on August 20, hatchery manager Paul Spurgeon said they are still looking for volunteers to help run the event.

Spurgeon said they anticipate between 800 and 900 tags to be handed out at their annual fall event, and it takes around 75 volunteers to assist with the operations. That is on top of seven staff members from the hatchery as well as at least two or three additional people from other Missouri Conservation Department offices pitching in their efforts.

Spurgeon said it's been a challenge in recent years to get volunteers for some of the more basic positions. He said, "We need some people to just help run the BB gun target shoot, hand out tags and a couple of other classes. That is where I'm lacking."

They usually aren't short on volunteers to actually help kids fish the banks. According to Spurgeon, that is one of the more popular volunteer positions. He said, "Most of our volunteers come down to be with the kids out on the bank. We have quite a few of those, but we need more people for hands-on stuff under the tent."

Marionville driver seriously injured after hitting trees

A Marionville driver was seriously injured after running off the road on a Farm Road outside of Purdy. According to the Missouri State Highway Patrol crash report, Jason S. Wilson, 36, of Marionville, had to be transported for serious injuries.

On Monday, August 8, Wilson was driving a 2002 Mitsubishi Galant on Farm Road 1168 eight miles east of Purdy when he travelled off the left side of the road. The Galant then struck two trees before coming to rest. The crash happened around 11 a.m.

Wilson was seriously injured and was transported by ambulance to Cox South Hospital in Springfield. The Galant was totalled and was towed from the scene by Brice's Towing of Cassville.

Wilson was wearing a seatbelt at the time of the crash.

Seligman PD to participate in Drive Sober campaign

Local police will be out in full force as part of the annual nationwide August/Labor Day Crackdown weekend "Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over" substance–impaired driving crackdown. The crackdown, which will include high-visibility enforcement throughout Seligman, will run from August 19 through September 7, 2016.

The effective nationwide substance-impaired driving crackdown will include high-visibility enforcement, high-profile events, and will be supported by national paid advertising, creating a comprehensive campaign to curb substance-impaired driving over the August/ Labor Day weekend holiday.

Seligman Police Department said its officers will be aggressively looking for substance-impaired drivers during the crackdown and will arrest anyone caught driving impaired.

Although it is illegal in all 50 States, the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico

to drive impaired (having a blood alcohol concentration of .08 or higher), far too many people across the nation get behind the wheel after consuming too much alcohol. The latest statistics from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration underscore the serious nature of the nation's continuing drunk driving epidemic.

"Every year, about one third of all motor vehicle traffic deaths involve one or more substance-impaired drivers or motorcycle operators," said Chief Terry Burgess. "Preliminary data indicates in 2015, 196 people were killed and 663 seriously injured on Missouri's roadways in crashes that involved at least one substance-impaired driver." That works out to approximately one substance-impaired driver involved fatality every 1-3/4 days and one substance-impaired driving serious injury every ½ day.

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City of Cassville improves parks for citizens

The Cassville City Park is a busy, fun place, and the city has completed several projects to get the park and Aquatic Center geared up the many community events, including beginning the process to attaining an easement to make entry to the park easier.

The basketball and tennis courts have been resurfaced and there have been two pickleball courts were added. The pool has been repainted and the slide has new fiberglass at the Aquatic Center.

The City of Cassville wants to improve access to the city park by gaining an easement off Highway 248 between Jim Bryant Supplies and the park

entrance. The road from Jim Bryant Supplies is very rough with potholes and broken asphalt, while the part of the road owned by the City is smooth and in good shape. The improvements to Highway 248 have also created more problems, too. The City wants to make the entire entrance road smooth and maintain it. Jim Bryant's son has been approached with this idea, and he has agreed. Once the agreement has been finalized. the City Council will name the easement Jim Bryant Street or Road.

This past spring there were baseball and softball games for girls and boys ages 4 to 16, sand volleyball teams and, of course, the pool

ing hours of entertainment. This fall, the community can look forward to soccer, flag football and Mighty Mites, which will be hosted by the YMCA with practice at the Aquatic Center. The YMCA is also hosting adult flag football and adult slo-pitch softball at the park. There is also an independent sand volleyball league that meets on Thursday nights. Crowder sets schedule for Adult Ed. classes

Adult Education and Literacy (AEL) Classes are set to begin in Cassville, Monett and Seligman. AEL classes include instruction for all or any of these areas: academic skills including math, language, social studies, science, and reading; high school equivalency prep; college placement prep; WorkKeys prep for the National Career Readiness Certificate (NCRC); ASVAB prep; college and career transitions.

The Missouri High School Equivalency (HSE) certificate is obtained after passing the HiSET test (formerly the G.E.D. test).

During orientation students need to take pretests in order to determine academic areas of strength and weakness and post-test after receiving instruction in order to determine the student's educational improvements. The pace of learning and length of attendance is dependent on each individual student. Instructors and staff counsel students and develop individualized learning plans. However, all students are required to attend a minimum of 40 seat hours and have a post-test before leaving.

Adult Education & Literacy instruction is designed to expand the educational opportunities for adults and to establish programs that will enable adults to acquire basic skills necessary to function in society and allow them to secure training that will enable them to become more employable, productive and responsible citizens as well as allowing them to continue their education to at least the level of completion of secondary school and transitioned to a job or col-

Crowder College AEL has added Brad Dorris as an AEL Transition Specialist to the program staff to individually

assist students on the step following high school equivalency. Whether it be college, job, or job training the student will have access to the support of the Transition Specialist during this period.

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Missouri to start solar roadway pilot project

Visitors to the Historic Route row Initiative, which aims to 66 Welcome Center at Conway will see the installation of solar panels in late September. The Missouri Department of Transportation has partnered with Solar Roadways of Sandpoint, Idaho, to install and help test the company's solar panels on a 12-foot-by-20-foot area of the main sidewalk at the westbound Welcome Center.

The pilot project will allow MoDOT to test how the hexagon-shaped panels fare in Missouri's weather, and are particularly interested to see how effective the panels will be at melting snow and ice during the winter months. The pilot project will test the LED lights in the panels, to see if there is potential for them to take the place of traditional pavement stripes. Officials will also be monitoring the amount of energy produced, and looking at how that can be used to help power the Welcome Center and offset running costs.

The project is part of MoDOT's Road to Tomordevelop public-private partnerships to look a new and innovative ways to fund Missouri's transportation infrastructure. The sidewalk project with Solar Roadways will cost \$102,000, which comes from federal funds earmarked for such research. If the pilot project is successful, MoDOT will consider the potential of crowdfunding to expand the project into the parking lot, or onto the entrance ramps to the interstate, to test how the panels hold up under traffic.

Laurel McKean, MoDOT Assistant District Engineer, says, "This is a really exciting project to be able to take the spirit of Route 66 combined with innovations in transportation to carry that spirit into the future."
