### Southwest building renovations almost complete

Southwest School District is moving forward with repairs as school starts this week. After voters passed a \$1.3 million bond for renovations and repairs to various build-

ings in April, the district secured bond financing and began repairs and renovations. Tosha Tilford, Southwest Superintendent, spoke about how the building renovations in progress would affect students in the

The Southwest R-5 School District's proposed bond issue was approved by the large majority of voters in April's General Municipal Election. The District requested \$1.3 million bonding from voters to make improvements and repairs to various buildings on the school's campus. Voters approved the issue

> 21 percent against it. The projects included in the bond issue are the middle school gym renovation, elementary bathroom repairs, as well as additional elementary rest rooms, and HVAC instal-


lation at the middle school. Southwest School Board voted to sell the \$1.3 million bond to L.J. Hart and Company of St. Louis. L.J. Hart's CEO said Security Bank of Southwest Missouri purchased about \$200,000 of the bonds.

The school budgeted for the project, which cost approximately \$28,000. Individuals donated to help cover the cost, as well. To preserve history in a more lasting way, the school formed a committee to analyze the sidewalk project and plan a monument with graduates' names instead of pouring new sidewalks or trying to save existing ones.

One of the sidewalk committee members, Cassville assistant superintendent Jill LeCompte said, "It would have cost us over \$100,000 to re-do the sidewalks that were being removed. Since the sidewalks were replaced by MoDOT, it wasn't as if they

Cassville graduating classes from 1922 to 1971 have their names on the monument. The Classes of 1972 through 2015 still have their sidewalks intact, so they were not included in the project.

For the most part, former graduates were on board with the monument, which is four different pieces along the outside of the J.C. Duncan Gym. There were a few vocal opponents, but the school determined it just wasn't feasible to replace the sidewalks. LeCompte said, "The sidewalks don't last. I understand the thought because my dad's name was on those sidewalks, but

### Man wanted in connection with Monett shooting in custody

The man accused of firing shots in a Monett parking lot last week is in police custody and charged with offenses in both Barry and Lawrence Counties. Brandon Ramos, 29, of Monett, is accused of assaulting another man in a parking lot and firing a gun.

Last week, the Monett Police Department put out information via their Facebook page that they were seeking two suspects in connection with a gun fired in the Memorys parking lot in Monett. Officers were seeking Ramos and the alleged driver, Lacey Rivera.

In the affidavits of prob-

able cause filed against Ramos, it states that the altercation involving Ramos and Rivera was on Sunday, July 30. According to witness and the victim's statement, Rivera and Ramos drove into the parking lot and confronted the victim.

Rivera allegedly told the victim to repeat what he had told her a week prior. The victim said he complied and told her and Ramos, "I know what you drive and I know what your license plate is and I know you sell drugs, so stay away from me." It was at that point that Ramos allegedly pulled out a small pistol, got out of the car and began hitting the victim. Ramos alleg-

edly fired the gun and then left in the car with Rivera.

Officers reported that they collected security footage as well as a .380 shell casing at the

According to a press release by the Monett Police Department, Rivera was found shortly after and taken into custody. No charges have been filed against Rivera at this time.

However, Ramos was not found until Wednesday, August 2, around 12:02 a.m. According to affidavits of probable cause, officers made contact with Ramos on 10th Street in Monett. Officers then reported that Ramos attempted to escape by punching Monett Police Chief George Daoud in the ribs and trying to flee.

Ramos is charged with unlawful use of a weapon and assault in the third degree in Barry County for the incident in the parking lot. In Lawrence County, he is charged with assault in the second degree on a special victim and resisting arrest for a felony. Ramos



#### Washburn man charged for guns, meth near Cassville

A Washburn man was charged with three felonies after officers allegedly found him in possession of firearms and methamphetamine. Trevis D. Sizemore, 46, of Washburn, is charged with two counts of unlawful possession of a firearm and one count of possession of a controlled substance.

According to the affidavits of probable cause, Sizemore was arrested after officers made contact with him at the intersection of Farm Road 2200 and Highway 37 near Cassville. Officers made a traffic stop, and Sizemore allegedly had a 10-22 Ruger Rifle and .45 calber Colt Ruger Blackhawk pistol. Sizemore is not able to possess firearms because he is a convicted felon.

Officers also found a baggie of white powder/rock substance near Sizemore on the ground. It field-tested positive

Southwest's library received some major TLC with new flooring and paint.

2030, with reoffered yields ranging from 1.00 percent to 2.25 percent, and the total interest expense coming in consistent with the original projections. The District is selling \$450,000

of term bonds maturing on March 1, 2030, with an interest rate of 5.00 percent to yield 2.00 percent to the March 1, 2022, call date, which produces additional funds for the projects in

the amount of \$59,409."

The school selected CTS Group to oversee the project and ensure things were done correctly throughout the whole process.

Initially, Tilford hoped

to have all of the projects completed by the 2018-2019 school year, however, their project management group anticipates finishing everything by mid-October of this year. Tilford said, "I cannot brag on CTS enough. I never expected to have things finished this quickly." The demolition phase of the project began the first week of June. Tilford added, "We are

in better shape just for the fact that the elementary school has a set of functioning restrooms which have more stalls. This time last year, I was worried every day that those restrooms were going to start backing up."

The project manager for Southwest's renovations, Jeremy Shivers, said, "We do lots of work for schools, and it's usually in a time crunch. We're used to only having a summer to get projects finished, so we've figured out how to do things quickly."

Since projects have been finished ahead of the initial schedule, students' displacement of activities will only be for the first couple weeks of the school year. Southwest students returned to classes today, Wednesday, August 9. As of right now, it seems that middle school students will have to share the high school's gymnasium until September, but then they will be able to continue as normal. No other projects were disruptive to students' daily activities.

Shivers said he anticipates the middle school gym repairs will be complete by the first of September. He said the wood floors are slated to be installed on August 14.

Of all of the projects Southwest has undertaken this year, the middle school gymnasium, affectionately known as "The Pit" to former and present students, has been the biggest. Initial plans were to stabilize

the foundation, replace the flooring and install HVAC so that the building would finally have air conditioning. However, once the project was underway, it was discovered that there was no steel support in one wall in the gym.

Tilford said, "There was nothing for them to stabilize onto. But CTS is in a contract with us that stays the same. So it didn't cost the district anything extra. We are totally on budget."

Other CTS project manager Sage Acorn said, "We knew the wall was pulling away from the structure of the building and, without doing extensive exploratory research into the wall, we could only provide an educated guess. We had originally thought we could install an engineered structural beam across the wall from the outside and through bolt it to the structure on the inside, holding the wall in place.

"Once we actually started the project and were able to cut into the wall, it was discovered that the wall had no bond beams, vertical or horizontal. In other words, the wall was not built to code. So we had to create vertical bond beams throughout the wall and then through bolt to the structural steel."

Shivers said, "The wall in the gymnasium was probably the most invasive aspect that we had to deal with, even more so than the new rest room facilities."

Currently, the gymnasium has received repairs in the wall, the ceiling has been insulated with spray foam insulation and beams have been painted. LED lights have been installed in the ceiling making the gym much brighter than in years past. The roof has been recoated. Finally, three HVAC units will be installed in the next week.

Children from families whose current income is at or below those shown are eligible for free or reduced price meals. Applications are available at the school office. To apply, fill out a Free and Reduced Price School Meals Family Application and return it to the school. The information provided on the application is confidential and will be used only for the purpose of determining eligibility. Applications may be submitted any time during the school year. A complete application is required as a condition of eligibility. A complete application includes: (1) household income from all sources or Food Stamp/TANF case number, (2) names of all household members, and (3) the signature and last four digits of social security number or indication of no social security number of adult household member signing the application. School officials may verify current income at any time

Foster children may be eligible regardless of the income of the household with whom they reside. If a family member becomes unemployed or if family size changes, the family should contact the school to file a new application. Such changes may make the children of the family eligible for these

Households will be notified of their children's eligibility status for free or reduced price meals. If any children were not listed on the eligibility notice for families receiving SNAP, TANF or FDPIR, the household should contact the school to have free meal benefits extended to those children.

If any child(ren) was not listed on the eligibility notice, the household should contact the LEA or school to have free meal benefits extended to that child(ren).

Under the provisions of the policy, the District Bookkeeper will review the applications and determine eligibility. If a parent is dissatisfied with the ruling of the determining official, they may wish to discuss the decision with the hearing official on an informal basis or he/she may make a request either orally or in writing to the Superintendent of Schools.

Hearing procedures are outlined in the policy. A complete copy of the policy is on file in each school and in the central office where any interested party may review it. USDA Non-discrimination Statement:

repainted, it'll look really clean and finished."

The rubberized flooring that was on top of the gym's wood floors has been removed, and Tilford said that will be salvaged and repurposed for use the elementary gymnasium. There is not a date for that project as it is separate from the overall renovations.

The other aspects of the bond-funded renovations are the elementary

rest room repairs as well as construction of the new rest rooms. There have also been nine new HVAC units installed in the middle school building.

Renovation of the existing bathrooms in the elementary was completed last week. All rest rooms in that building are new ADA-compliant, and the facilities received new plumbing, flooring, sinks and tiles along the wall.

New rest rooms are

slated next, which will be between the classrooms and multipurpose building. The slab has been poured, and stub outs are in place for rest room construction to begin fully in the coming weeks with completion planned for mid-October. A retaining wall also had to be installed to put in the foundation for the new rest rooms.

Southwest's maintenance staff is also hard at work completing projects that are not under the scope of CTS' services. Tilford said that there have been repainting projects in the middle school classrooms, third and fourth grade classrooms, as well as the locker rooms.

She said, "We've also been doing a ton of drainage work in front of the ball fields and around the library. We are also doing drainage work on the east side of the ball field so we don't have so much standing water during baseball season."


Tilford added, "The drainage work in front of the ball fields was needed, it really was a slip hazard."


In addition to drainage work, the library also had the carpet removed and the concrete stained. Tilford said, "It looks like a brand new library."

### Ditch the sandwich: Pack fun, healthy lunches all school year

It's time for back-toschool, which coincides with my annual struggle with packing school lunches. I see it in the future: the first day, my three little people will tote their new lunch boxes filled with uber creative lunches with fruits and veggies in every color of the rainbow. Cut to the last day of school,

"Guys, here's a handful of almonds, some chips and a peanut butter sandwich... are you sure you don't want school lunch today?"

I'm not dissing school lunches. My kids eat them sometimes, but they are also second to the lunches I (or they) pack to take with them. I also know that they get really tired of sandwiches by the time May rolls around, so I try to come up with options that aren't sandwiches and chips, which usually aren't very healthy anyway.

So, looking ahead to next week when I start whipping up quick, healthy and kidfriendly meals, I decided to talk to the nutrition program assistant at the Barry County University Extension office. Jacquie Howell has been in the nutrition field for seven years and offered up some good tips for parents planning to pack lunches for their kids this year. "Make sure it's something they will eat and that it meets the food groups and that it doesn't contain a lot of sugar or salt," she said.

I asked Howell additional of questions about what parents should avoid. She said,

"Snack cakes are one; fruit would be a better option. Instead of potato chips, vegetable sticks are a better choice. Processed meats should be avoided, too. Instead of processed meat, peanut butter is a better option a lot of the time as long as they aren't allergic." She added that if kids are in a peanut-free classroom, soy butter tastes very similar to peanut butter and kids usually can't tell the difference.

One piece of advice resonated with Howell, who also does cooking and nutrition classes for adults and kids: avoid processed foods. With a little foresight and prep, you can save money and your kid's health by packing real foods. Processed cheese was on her list of things to avoid,

She summed it up, "The less processed foods they put in there, the healthier the child's lunch will be."

Other than what to pack, Howell also said parents need to consider food safety. "Make sure it's packed safely so that it's cool if it needs to be kept cool. If you don't have a cold pack and something that can spoil, don't send that in their lunch. Most of the time, no, it doesn't make them sick, but one time is all it's going to take.

"Be aware of the safety issues and how things shouldn't be left at room temperature for more than two hours at the most, especially if they are packing chicken salad and that kind of thing."

So what can we pack other than sandwiches? Here are some ideas to jump start your lunch box creativity:

#### **Salads**

I know, I know. A lot of kids don't normally like salads, but think beyond a garden salad. Cold pasta salads with whole wheat noodles and plenty of vegetables, beans and maybe some grilled chicken are a great option. There are also plenty of Asian-inspired cold noodle salads. Chicken salad is more appealing to kids if you add

some cut grapes. You can even make fruit salads with savory bits of cut up walnuts and yogurt "dressing." Watch out on the yogurt though, some yogurt has more sugar than a scoop of ice cream. One of my kids favorites is a taco salad: Mix corn, beans, taco meat, lettuce, tomatoes, olives, and green onions with a dressing made of taco sauce and a little ranch dressing. It's great cold, and they can crunch up some tortilla chips

#### Wraps

Ditch the bread and go with a tortilla. Whole grain tortillas are even better. Pretty much anything you can think of can go in a wrap. To make them more kid friendly, you can roll them and then cut them in slices. Hummus and veggies are a favorite at my house, but you can use meat and cheese, maybe some mayo, whatever your kids would be willing to eat. They are more fun if they are colorful, so I like to use yellow bell peppers or carrot in them, too. Peanut butter and banana slices rolling up in a tortilla are a fun option, too.

#### **Dippers**

In case you haven't noticed, most kids will eat anything if they can dip it in a sauce. Cut up veggies, fruits, grilled chicken, unprocessed meat and more to serve with whatever sauce they prefer. I've sent lowsugar yogurt or peanut butter and a bunch of types of vegetables or fruit. I've also sent more savory sauces that are Asian-inspired. Some of the all-natural salad dressings at the grocery store work great for this, too.

Pro tip: poke a toothpick in them, anything on a stick is more fun to eat.

Letting kids assemble their own lunch is obviously popular or Lunchables wouldn't be a thing. However, there are much healthier and interesting choices than crackers, meat and cheese. Sending tortillas or pita pockets and some fillers to stuff inside gives kids a sense of control over their lunch. Kids could do a combination of vegetables, fruits, meats (not processed) or cheeses. My youngest loves loading up a pita pocket with cucumber slices and grilled chicken

One last piece of advice Howell gave was about helping kids be more adventurous with food so they understand it doesn't have to be the same sandwich every day. She said, "Parents are in a hurry and just trying to send what they can some days. But remember kids can try things, even things they haven't tried before, and you'd be surprised by what they like."

Help your kids give different foods a chance. You might be surprised by what they like.

Children from families whose current income is at or below those shown are eligible for free or reduced price meals. Applications are available at the school office. To apply, fill out a Free and Reduced Price School Meals Family Application and return it to the school. The information provided on the application is confidential and will be used only for the purpose of determining eligibility. Applications may be submitted any time during the school year. A complete application is required as a condition of eligibility. A complete application includes: (1) household income from all sources or Food Stamp/TANF case number, (2) names of all household members, and (3) the signature and last four digits of social security number or indication of no social security number of adult household member signing the application. School officials may verify current income at any time during the school year.

Under the provisions of the policy, the District Bookkeeper will review the applications and determine eligibility. If a parent is dissatisfied with the ruling of the determining official, they may wish to discuss the decision with the hearing official on an informal basis or he/she may make a request either orally or in writing to the Superintendent of Schools.

### Landowners join forces with MDC to eliminate feral hogs

When Ken Hobbs bought his 362 acres in Reynolds County, it was pristine and he planned to farm cattle and goats on the land. Then feral hogs moved in. Feral hogs are an aggressive invasive species. Their violent nature, rooting habits, and known diseases pose a threat to wildlife, farm crops, and the balance of nature.

"I had planned until this problem got so big to have cattle and goats in here," Hobbs said. "I'd be afraid to put cattle out there because there's no way I'm going to have a herd of cattle out there without broken legs, it's not

going to happen."

The feral hogs didn't only dash Hobb's hopes of farming his land, they've also significantly decreased the numbers of wildlife that once thrived on the property.

"My turkey population went from one that I could actually go out and see every day, 15 to 20 of them in a flock, and in three to four different places on my property. Now those no longer exist," he said.

Hobbs first began to try to control the feral hogs by shooting them and enlisting the help of his friends to trap small numbers of them at a

time.

"We've been trying to control the hogs for several years with our own small traps and hunting," Hobbs said. "But over the past two or three years, the problem has become so severe that there's no way to control them personally by hunting."

Now, on any given night, more than 30 feral hogs will congregate in Hobbs' front yard, leaving scat every foot or so and rooting up his once flat, lush yard into continuous divots. His fields are in even worse shape.

"These spots get rooted eight-to-10 inches, quite

often though it's 12, 16, sometimes 18-inches deep,"

Those damaged fields, the dashed hopes of farming, and the general destruction Hobbs has endured on his property are why he and other landowners reached out the Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) to help. MDC, United States Department of Agriculture and other partner agencies are working with private landowners to teach them how to trap whole sounders of feral hogs at a time, which is more effective than shooting the feral hogs.

Dean Bridger is an Iron County landowner about 20 miles away from Hobbs. Bridger also understands that it's just not possible to control feral hogs by hunting.

"I get a lot of people up and down the highway that say they want to shoot hogs and I say I've got 30 of them. I don't want one shot, I want them all shot because shooting one doesn't help me at all," Bridger said. "They say they'll come out every night but you can't do that. The hogs are fast. Once they get scared, they're gone to the four winds so you might be able to shoot one at a time."

But trapping isn't the only strategy that must be used against feral hogs.

"We have to look at this from a bigger picture, it can't just be one landowner doing this it has to be everybody," Bridger said. "We have to pull together, get them [hogs] all together and get them trapped."

Mark McClain, a wildlife management biologist with

MDC, is working hard to trap hogs and to pull people together on the effort. McLain leads feral hog elimination efforts in southeast Missouri. He spends a lot of his time with landowners like Hobbs and Bridger, outlining plans to trap the feral hogs on their property. This cooperation between landowners and conservation groups is the key to success in feral hog elimination.

"With the new innovations in traps and with more landowners on board, all of us getting together and working at it, we can saturate that landscape with effort and come up with better traps, better baits and better ways of doing things," McLain said.

So far in 2017, MDC and partners have removed 4,128 feral hogs from Missouri, which is a great increase from previous years. This is nearly double the progress that was made at the same time in 2016. Increased efforts and better technology continue to show success each year and McLain says MDC and its partners will continue improving until their goal is met

"As an agency with our partners, our goal is complete elimination of feral hogs from Missouri," McLain said.



- 5. MY CHILD'S APPLICATION WAS APPROVED LAST YEAR. DO I NEED TO FILL OUT A NEW ONE? Yes. Your child's application is only good for that school year and for the first few days of this school year. You must send in a new application unless the school told you that your child is eligible for the new school year.
- 6. I GET WIC. CAN MY CHILDREN GET FREE MEALS? Children in households participating in WIC <u>may</u> be eligible for free or reduced price meals. Please send in an application.
- 7. WILL THE INFORMATION I GIVE BE CHECKED? Yes. We may also ask you to send written proof of the household income you report.









