Cassville goes nuts for donuts and local schools benefit

A huge crowd gathered in the Tractor Supply parking lot on Old Exeter Road in Cassville last week, creating a lot of confusion for people driving by. The mob wasn't there for a mega sale or any of the other countless guesses for their presence at 1:30 p.m. on Wednesday afternoon. No, they were there for donuts from Hurts Donut in Springfield brought via a converted ambulance, known as their emergency donut vehicle.

In answer to the question, "You wanna Hurts Donut?" The answer is, yes, they did, and the donut delivery truck sold out a little over an hour after they arrived. While it's been awhile since Cassville had a dedicated donut shop, the hundreds of people in line in the sun Wednesday seemed a little excessive

for donuts. However, these aren't your grandmother's donuts, either.

Hurts Donut opened its

doors in downtown Spring-field just shy of three years ago. The shop boasts premium, specialty donuts with wild toppings. Donuts include the Cereal Killer (topped with cereal), Maple Bacon Me Crazy (topped with maple frosting and real bacon), the E.T. (topped with Reese's Pieces) and many others. Toppings and themes vary with dozens of different kinds to choose from.

While the joke is funny, and the donuts are tasty, even one of the owners admitted she was a little surprised at the turnout. Kas Clegg said, "We don't normally take our deliveries to cities with populations of less than 10,000,

but Cassville had the most votes, so we decided to go to Monett first and then Cassville." Between the two cities, Hurts sold out of the 650 dozen they had loaded up with.

So why make a big deal about people standing in line for donuts? Because it isn't just about the confectionary creations. Thanks to the droves of people who showed up at both the Monett and Cassville donut deliveries, both Cassville and Monett Schools are getting donations to their backpack programs.

Clegg explained that Hurts Donut gives back 10 percent of their sales to a local charity. They ask for citizens to vote for their

Kids should be packing up their tackle boxes and readying their poles for the fall Kids' Fishing Day event at Roaring River State Park this Saturday, August 20. Roaring River Hatchery manager Paul Spurgeon said they are anticipating between 800-900 tags handed out to kids for the all-day event.

Kids' Fishing Day is sponsored by the Missouri Conservation Department and is held at various parks across the state. Saturday will be the second kids fishing event of the year, with an earlier free day in May annually.

Spurgeon said his staff are stocking the waters with around 2,500 trout for Saturday's festivities beginning Friday evening. Staff also continue to stock various holes throughout the day.

Whether kids are trout fishing pros or have never held a rod and reel, Roaring River Kids' Fishing Day is an ideal time to get out on the river. Volunteers available will help any skill level to make sure kids enjoy their time at the park. There are also options for kids who aren't anglers. Various classes and events are held throughout the day to make the event fun for the whole family, regardless of interests.

Kids ages 15 and under can show up the day of the event to get their tags at the volunteer tent beginning at 6:30 a.m. Alternately, tags are also available for pick up the day before at the hatchery office until 9 p.m. Friday. Fishing will begin at 7 a.m. on Saturday and run until 8 p.m.

Drug trafficking operation busted

Last week, an undercover operation led to the arrest of a Monett man for weapons and drug trafficking charges. Damian Arreola-Chico, 26, of Monett, was charged with unlawful use of a weapon and drug trafficking in the first degree.

According to the affidavits of probable cause by the Missouri State Highway Patrol, Arreola-Chico was arrested following a confidential source purchasing methamphetamine from him. Cpl. Bryan, with the Patrol, saw texts messages between Arreola-Chico and

the confidential source.

The source then allegedly purchased half an ounce of crystal methamphetamine last week. When law enforcement officers were observing Arreola-Chico's residence on Cale Street in Monett to execute a search warrant, they saw him leave in his vehicle. When the Patrol pulled him over, a search of the vehicle yielded two ounces of crystal methamphetamine, a pistol, multiple magazines, holsters and a case of ammunition.

After Arreola-Chico was taken into custody, Cpl. Bryan executed the search

warrant on his residence where officers allegedly found a package of distribution-style plastic baggies, a large black digital scale, marijuana, a drug ledger, \$900 cash, another scale and a safe containing packaging and weighing materials with crystal substance on them.

In all, officers found approximately five ounces of crystal substance they believed to be methamphetamine. Arreola-Chico is being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$75,000 bond.

Two people were arrested last week in Shell Knob when they were allegedly found to be growing marijuana in their home. According to the affidavits of probable cause, the arrests were the result of a search warrant being executed on a home on Farm Road 2210 in Shell Knob.

On August 11, the Missouri State Highway Patrol executed the search warrant on the residence of Timothy M. Wiott, 48, of Shell Knob, and Sandra K. Barton, 49, of Shell Knob. Wiott's room resulted in a digital scale, a marijuana pipe, three grams of methamphetamine and three baggies of marijuana.



HOW TO ENJOY A FALL GARDEN

So many different vegetables come to life in the autumn. Broccoli, kale, collards, spinach, squashes, artichokes, and beets are just some of the many autumn planting options you can try. Celery also is best in the fall, and its harvest continues through winter in temperate climates. By replacing crops that have been harvested through the spring and summer with fallfriendly alternatives, you can keep your garden productive

Begin the process by counting back 12 to 14 weeks from the expected first frost date for where you live. Begin seeds for your autumn plantings indoors, because summer heat and dryness are not the best conditions to nurture

Enrich the soil with compost so that you can replen-The family will receive ish the nutrients lost from the

Each region is different, so learn about when to put plants in the ground for your region. If you are unsure, consult with a local garden center, where you can learn about various aspects of autumn gardening. Onions, shallots and garlic are best planted mid-fall after the soil

Gradually introduce seedlings to more sunlight and outdoor temperatures before they go in the ground, as they need time to adjust to the un-

Be sure to thoroughly water the garden. Newly planted beds should be kept moist to germinate and so established plants can take root. In addition, consider a shade covering so that the soil doesn't dry out or get baked in the sun. Mulch also can help retain moisture and keep the conditions ideal for your autumn vegetables to grow.

Remember that moisture and cooler temperatures can attract garden pests, so you may need to employ some strategies to keep them under control. For example, insect barriers and all-natural baited traps can keep slugs and snails from munching on your autumn plants.

The Board of Education approved the \$2.75 Operating Service Levy and \$0.85 Debt Service Levy per \$100 assessed valuation for the 2016-2017 school year. The Tax Rate Hearing adjourned at 6:41 p.m.

The Board convened at 6:41 p.m., approved the agenda and had no communications items.

The Board approved the Consent items, including the resignation of Kayle Leonhardt as High School Cheer sponsor and the hiring of Melissa Wood as preschool aide, Katrina Howard as a substitute cook, Maria Quantanilla as a substitute cook pending background check, and Karen Huffman as High School Cheer Sponsor.

There was no old business discussed.

The Board of Education approved the IDEA Assurance Statement, the Special Education Compliance Plan and the Proportionate Share Plan.

Regarding administrative reports, Jeff Payne, Beverly Bonner, Eric Roller, Kara Hendrix and Bob Vice gave the beginning of the year enrollment numbers, and Eric Roller briefed the Board on the new attendance, cell phone, "no travel" list procedures for the high school as well as an the incentive program. The Board reviewed Tom Lawrence's maintenance report. Some of the topics included renovation of the playground, the need for an additional storage building, replacing the band room east door and the new restroom partitions for the middle school gym restrooms.



out half the playbook to take the pressure off freshman quarterback, Shannon Haney. As a result, Cassville's passing game averaged less than 36 yards per game. The inability to convert on 3rd and long situations against quality opponents cost the Wildcats over the course of the 5-6 season.

In the controlled scrimmages on Friday night, the positive progress of the Cassville passing game was evident. Against Willard, Haney completed 4 of 5 tosses, and was sacked once. Against Parkview, he went 2 for 4. Against Bolivar, another 2 for 4 performance.

No interceptions.

The Wildcats had a mixed showing on the ground. Playing against the Class 4 and Class 5 defenses, the Wildcats popped a few runs into the secondary. But for the most part, Cassville's running game closely resembled MMA mayhem, squeezing out 2 and 3 yards a crack between the tackles. Garrett Knight's 14-yard crease against Bolivar on Cassville's final possession helped end the night on a high note.

Defense

The Cassville run defense was pretty solid. Parkview, with noticeable superior speed, broke some runs into the secondary. But the Wildcats mostly held their own at the line of scrimmage and especially between the tack-

But the Cassville pass defense, especially the secondary, was exposed early and often by the opposing quarterbacks.

"There is no defense against a perfect pass," - Dan


After Willard scored with a 25-yard strike, Parkview's aerial circus lit up the Wildcats with a pair of long scoring passes: a 28-yard laser to the corner of the end zone, and then a 40-yard go route down the left sideline.

Then the Bolivar Liberators took to the air for a 30-yard completion on their third snap against the Cassville defense. Two plays later, the Wildcats surrendered a 7-yard touchdown pass.

The struggle on pass defense raised the biggest red flag of the night for Parnell and his staff. The silver lining is knowing that firstweek opponent Lamar rarely





Deer and turkey hunting regulations changed

The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) reminds deer and turkey hunters of regulation changes that apply to hunting this fall.

Crossbows have been added as a legal method during archery deer and turkey seasons and also during the fall firearms turkey season. As a result, MDC has removed the "hunting method exemption" requirement for hunters to use crossbows during the archery deer season.

To offer additional hunting opportunities for youths, MDC has expanded the late youth portion of the fall firearms deer season from two to three days and moved it earlier in the season. It will now start on the first Friday after Thanksgiving instead of in early January.

MDC has reduced the length of the deer-hunting antlerless portion from 12 to three days and it now begins on the first Friday in December


The Department has eliminated the urban-zones portion of the firearms deer season and has moved the areas under statewide regulations. According to MDC, there were so few deer harvested during this portion that it proved unnecessary.

To help protect young bucks and increase the number of mature bucks, the harvest limit of antlered deer has been reduced from three to two during the combined archery and firearms deer hunting season. Only one antlered deer may be taken during the firearms deer hunting season, and only one antlered deer may be take prior to the November portion of the firearms deer season.

Hunters who harvest deer during the opening weekend of the fall firearms November portion (Nov. 12 and 13) in any of the 29 counties of the Department's Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) Management Zone in northeast, central, and east-central Missouri are required to present their deer for CWD sample collection on the day of harvest at one of 75 MDC CWD sampling locations throughout the 29 counties. Hunters also have the option of presenting just the deer head with about six inches of neck attached. Sampling locations will be open from 7:30 a.m. through 8 p.m.


