# Dog attack sparks new talks about possible Cassville leash law

A vicious dog attack in Cassville last week left a woman severely injured and others demanding changes to city ordinances to draft a leash law in the city. Cassville Elementary School counselor Kristie Preddy was walking on Wednesday, August 7, when she was attacked in the early morning hours by two dogs near the intersection of 12th and Main Streets.


Preddy suffered serious injuries, including two broken arms and at least 25 bite wounds. In an interview on Monday, August 14, she said she would have to have at least two surgeries on her left arm, and they will know more this week regarding the extent of the injuries on her right arm.

She explained what she remembers from the attack early Wednesday morning, "I was just walking down the street exercising in the morning, and the dogs crossed the street and attacked me.

"It was kind of blurry, so I'm not sure how long it lasted."

Preddy said one person posted on Facebook they saw the attack and honked to try to deter the dogs, but they were too afraid to get out of their vehicle to help. She said the attack was disorienting and details are difficult for her to remember. "I don't even remember anyone being there."

Cassville Police officer Anthony Larson took a report on the incident at 5:47 a.m. and was able to locate the dogs and get them into quarantine at a local veterinarian's office, according to Cassville Police

Department detective Danny Boyd.

The Barry County E9-1-1 Center took two calls at 5:45 a.m. about the incident, one from a passerby and one from Preddy herself.

Det. Boyd confirmed the owner of the dogs has been cooperative regarding the investigation and quarantining of the animals.

Preddy, who frequently walks for exercise in the city, said while dogs are common, she didn't expect to have something like this happen. She said, "You see them every once in awhile, and sometimes they'll come up to you, but usually you can stomp your foot and they'll leave you

alone. I've never had one close to attacking before this."

Preddy's mother, Nadean Davis, requested to speak at the Cassville City Council meeting on Monday, August 12, to talk about what happened and ask the city to do something about the lack of a leash law inside city limits.

Preddy said, "Mom has tried to get an ordinances for years. This very easily could have been her. Had it been a child or an elderly person, I'm not so sure they would have survived the attack. I don't know that they could have kept fighting for as long as I had to fight."

Davis and Preddy, along with about a dozen other com-

munity members, showed up for the Cassville City Council meeting on Monday evening, August 12. Davis addressed the council with her concerns and brought up points regarding safety inside the city and residents' attitude regarding not keeping their dogs contained since the city has no leash law on the books.

This isn't the first time leash laws have been requested by city residents, but the council's vote has always been that there aren't enough funds for a dedicated animal control officer and to build a pound.

Davis has addressed council before about the dog issues before as she regularly walks the streets in town and picks

# Wheaton School partners with Access for new mental health program

School for the Wheaton R-III School District began on Tuesday, August 13. Along with all the new faces and remodeled structures, a brand new health program will be making its debut in the school.

The program, provided by Access Family Care Medical and Dental Clinics, is a mental health program that will allow students to communicate with a licensed counselor via a live video chat system located at the school.

According to Wheaton superintendent Dr. Lance Massey, the school began talks with Access about the program previously before reaching a formal agreement in June.

"Quite a while ago, Access approached us as a school and said that they were working on a grant and would like us to pilot a program where they would provide tele-mental health therapy. So, we began that discussion, and they have since received the grant," said Massey.

Massey went on to explain that the program will be provided by Access at no cost to the school. Access acquired grant funding specifically designed to aid rural areas in receiving improved access to mental healthcare.

"The grant is to help rural communities get better access to students that have mental health needs," explained Massey. "We got everything finalized back in June with a memo of understanding about how all of this is going to work. We're going to begin those services for students here in the fall."

The program will put a licensed counselor, employed by Access, in the school occasionally to touch base with the school's counselor about


There will be free popcorn and snocones for all in attendance. Bluegrass music will be played live during the day. There will also be a free hot dog and chips lunch served form 11 a.m.

Staponski, 59, is charged with on Tuesdays at the Monett two counts of assault in the High School Performing first degree or attempt, two counts of armed criminal action and one count of unlawful use of a weapon.

According to affidavits of probable cause by the Barry County Sheriff's Department deputy Kyle Rhea, Staponski pulled a semiautomatic pistol ally run for six weeks before on two road district workers who were inspecting damage to the road of Farm Road 2057 on July 14 around 6:30 p.m. The victims claim Staponski pulled the slide back to chamber a round and

threatened to kill them if they did not leave.

Staponski allegedly held the gun on the victims until they drove away. The victims also reported she threatened to have her dog attack the workers, as well.

Staponski is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$50,000 cashonly bond.



counselor, that's going to be on-site at various times during the school year," said Massey. "There's not a set schedule for how many days or hours a week they're going to be here."

According to Massey, the program will be a resource for students facing mental health issues outside of the scope of what can be handled by the school's counselor. However, Wheaton School's counselor Becky Krissman will act as a liaison between the school and

"Our person from Access will ideally be on campus every week to meet new students that are new referrals that she visits with when she is on campus," said Massey. "If the students or the counselors decide that they need to meet with that student every week, then they will take actions to schedule time to put them in the telehealth program."

Equipment for the video

component of the program has been provided to the school and, according to Massey, is currently in the installation

"I would expect sometime next week we will have all of the components of the telehealth so that we can start using it immediately, if needed," said Massey. "I don't completely know all the products. What has been described to me is something like an oversized monitor that has got a camera that can move with the actions of the student."

Massey also stressed that the program will require parent permission to participate in the program, explaining that the school will not place a student in the program without parental consent.

Massey went on to explain the district's enthusiasm for the program, explaining his hope that the program will not only benefit the student body,

but the Wheaton community as a whole.


"It's a very new program. We're extremely excited about it. We think that it's going to benefit the students and the community of Wheaton as a whole," Massey said.



up trash.

She told the council members Monday, "The faces of council are different than when I was here before, but the issue is the same. Dogs have been allowed to run in this town as long as I've been here, and that's been 40 years. There are numerous people that have told me they've been bit by dogs in this town, and it takes a dog mauling to happen to get the town in an uproar. Because dogs are being allowed to run, you have handicapped your own police force to take care of the situation.'

She also told council that many walkers in town are now carrying pistols to protect themselves from the dogs. She said she has even talked to dog owners in town where she has had repeated issues with their pets while she walks inside the

city limits. She said, "The owner of that dog will call that dog back and I've told her to put the dog on a leash. Her comment is I don't have to because we don't have a leash law in this town".

Davis added, "The whole thing keeps coming back to how much it's going to cost the city. No body is saying how much it's going to cost my daughter and her family."

Davis continued, "Does someone have to die in this town before an ordinance is passed and a leash law and a fence law is passed to keep these dogs from running free?

"Please find some way to pass a dog or pet ordinance where dogs have to be on leashes and have to be behind fences, something to protect the people in this town. If this had been a small child walking

to school, we would be planning a funeral service."

After Davis and a handful of others addressed the council, mayor Bill Shiveley said council members have already had discussions with a few city staff members on how to take care of the animal issues in the city. However, he did not offer a plan or a time line for when changes would be made. He said, "The council is committed to doing something, but I don't know how we're going to

Shiveley's main point was the city would need to find a funding mechanism to pay for a leash law. He said, "To establish a leash law you're going to enforce and take care of the animals you're going to pick up is just somewhere in the neighborhood of \$200,000 to \$250,000 to start. To qualify,

you have to have the truck. You have to have the person hired to do it. You have to have a place to impound them where they will be taken care of." Shiveley said he spoke to the City of Monett and said they told him it was between \$40,000 and \$50,000 each year to run it.

He did not specify where his figures for the initial start up came from. Shiveley did give statistics on the calls involving animals so far this year. From January 1, 2019, to July 31, 2019, the total number of calls for service for the Cassville Police Department was 4,170. Of those, the calls for service involving animals was 99. Calls for service involving vicious animals including dog bites were 14. The number of animal-related citations was eight so far.

Council member Jon Horner thanked Davis for coming to the council and expressed how sorry he was about the attack on Preddy. Horner also said, "I've put a lot of thought and prayer into this and it was a horrible incident. I concur with that the mayor said. I have no problem putting to a vote of the people a measure to put a leash law into effect and properly fund it. I have no problem with that being the next step for that the council do."

Horner emphasized the importance of a funding mechanism for a leash law because of the requirements of caring for an animal. He said, "If you're going to take into possession someone's dog, you've taken on an awesome responsibility. You've got to feed and care for this dog."

Horner continued, "You cannot do it halfway. You have to do it right. To do things right, it would require a funding mechanism. I would have no problem at all putting it to a vote of the people a sales tax to put a leash law in and fund it correctly."

As far as the dogs that attacked Preddy, on Monday, August 12, Boyd said, "We also got an order from the judge to euthanize the two dogs, and that was done this morning."

The owner of the dogs, Carla Costlow, went to court for one of the dogs involved in the attack on Preddy not even two weeks before Preddy was attacked. That dog was accused of attempting to bite a smaller dog that was being walked by its owner on February 23, 2019, according to Boyd.

Costlow requested a trial in that case, which is what delayed the court date. Boyd said, "She had trial on this case on July 29 in Cassville City Court. She was ordered to pay a fine and she told the judge the dogs were outside the city, to which it is obvious they were not."

The charge in that case was for a vicious animal. The judge in that case and the upcoming case is Cassville City Judge Randee Stemmons.

Costlow has four municipal charges against her for the two dogs that allegedly attacked Preddy. She will go to court on August 19 for two counts of having a vicious animal and two counts of dogs not having rabies tags.

Preddy said she is focusing on her recovery and has tried to remove herself from the negativity of the situation. She said, "Part of the reason why this has been so difficult is I'm an animal lover. We have our own pets and our own animals. That makes it so much more difficult. I can't ever imagine anyone owning a dog that they would allow to hurt someone."

Preddy added that she wanted to dispel rumors online that the dogs were mixed breed dogs and not pit bulls as people have claimed on social media.

According to MDC Elk and Deer Biologist Aaron Hildreth, who presented the elk-hunting plan at the meeting, MDC will begin offering a limited season for hunting elk once the herd of about 175 animals reaches a minimum of 200 with an annual herd growth rate of at least 10 percent and a herd ratio of at least four cow elk for every bull elk.

According to MDC research, the herd will likely reach 200 animals by 2020. With that in mind, MDC has designated a nine-day archery season for elk running Oct. 17-25, 2020, and a nine-day firearms season for elk running Dec. 12-20,

Hildreth noted that the number of permits for a possible 2020 hunt has yet to be determined.

"If the elk population is below desired numbers in early 2020, the Conservation Commission may choose to not open the online application process or issue any permits for a fall 2020 hunt," he explained. "We will then focus on 2021."

MDC hopes to eventually reach a target population of 500 animals and will use hunting to manage herd size and location.

Elk are a native species in Missouri but were hunted to extinction in the state through unregulated market hunting during the late 1800s. MDC worked with the Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources to reintroduce the native species by capturing and transporting wild elk from Kentucky to a remote area of the Missouri Ozarks. The reintroduction effort took place in 2011, 2012, and 2013 with most of the 108 relocated animals being cow elk with some calves and immature bulls. Their numbers have grown, and their range has expanded in recent years to cover por-

tions of Carter, Reynolds, and Shannon counties. The area consists of nearly 80 percent public land interspersed with tracts of private property.

#### **Hunting Framework**

Under MDC's framework, elk hunting would be limited to Missouri residents at least 11 years of age who have their huntereducation certification or are exempt from hunter education by age (born before Jan. 1, 1967). Hunting permits would be assigned through a random lottery of all applicants. MDC will require a \$10 application fee to be eligible for the limited hunt with a \$50 permit fee for those selected through the lottery. MDC will limit the random lottery to one application per-person, per-year with a 10-year "sitout" period for those drawn for a permit before they may apply again.

The hunting zone will be limited to Carter, Reynolds, and Shannon counties, but will exclude the special refuge portion of Peck Ranch Conservation Area where elk were initially reintroduced.

"Permits issued each year will be valid for a nineday archery season beginning the third Saturday in October and a nine-day firearms season beginning the second Saturday in December," Hildreth explained.

He added that the timing of the seasons was designed to avoid the peak of elk breeding during late September and early October and to avoid the elk season coinciding with portions of the firearms deer season.

"The allowed hunting methods for each season will be the same as for deer hunting," Hildreth said. "The permits will allow for the harvest of one bull elk with at least one antler being greater than six inches in length. Successful hunters must Telecheck their harvested elk, like for deer."

On Saturday, September 7, firefighters from five states are convening at Missouri State University (MSU) to participate in a special memorial event to honor the heroes lost in the terrorist attack on September 11,

In memory of the firefighters and rescue workers who lost their lives trapped inside the collapsing buildings, the attendees of the memorial will climb the stairs at Plaster Stadium at MSU repeatedly until they have equalled the 110 stories climbed by the rescuers on the day of the tragedy. Firefighters climb while wearing full rescue gear.

According to an official press release from the Springfield Area Memorial Stair Climb organizers, over 300 participants, 200 of which are firefighters, are expected to turn out for the event this year.

Travis Littler, a firefighter and paramedic who has been with Cass-

ville Fire for eight years, is hard at work setting up a team to undertake the climb.

"We set up a team for Cassville Fire," said Littler. "Anybody who wants to participate from the fire department or their families can sign

Before the event, firefighters are asked to raise funds for the National Fallen Firefighters Fund. In the past, the event raised over \$40,000 to benefit the NFFF.

"All that money goes to the National Fallen Firefighter Foundation, and they use all that money for medical expenses, funeral costs and all that stuff for line-of-duty deaths all across the country," explained Littler.

According to Littler, two other Cassville firefighters signed up to take the climb this year with more expected to commit before the event.

Littler is a longtime supporter and participant in the event. He explained that while it has its utility as a publicity event, its true purpose is to honor and remember the sacrifices made by fire and rescue workers on the day of one of America's greatest tragedies.

"I think it's my fifth year doing this," said Littler. "I saw them putting on the event in Springfield and, not only is it good P.R., but it's a good event to help people remember 9/11 and what it was about."

The long-time firefighter explained that the experience is something special to see firsthand.

"It's a humbling experience at the climb. Everyone is so heartfelt. It's a really heartwarming experience all around," Littler said.

duction of elk to the area and local communities have benefited from an increase in tourism related to elk.

MDC will reserve at least one permit from the annual random lottery for resident landowners with at least 20 acres within a specified boundary within Carter, Reynolds, and Shannon counties. The special landowner permits will be nontransferable and may only be filled on the landowner's property.

"Qualifying landowners will not be required to pay the \$10 application fee but will still pay a \$50 permit fee if selected," Hildreth said. "If selected, they will not be required to wait 10 years before again applying for the landowner permit. Qualifying landowners may apply once each year for a regular hunting permit and for a special landowner permit but may receive only one permit annually."

#### Public Comments and **Next Steps**

MDC held several public meetings in communities around the elk restoration zone last December where staff discussed possible elkhunting details. MDC also offered a statewide online comment period.

As part of the rulemaking process, MDC is now again asking for public comment on the proposed elk-hunting framework through Aug. 31 at short. mdc.mo.gov/Z49. Refer to the following specific rules open for comment.

## **PERMITS:**

3 CSR 10-5.700 Resident Antlered Elk Hunting Permit. This rule establishes a permit for residents to take an antlered elk in open counties during the elk hunting season.

3 CSR 10-5.705 Resident Landowner Antlered Elk Hunting Permit. This rule establishes a permit for resident landowners to take an antlered elk on their property within the resident landowner permit zone during the elk hunting season.

#### **SEASON SPECIFICS:**

3 CSR 10-7.700 Elk Hunting Seasons: General Provisions. This rule establishes general provisions for hunting elk.

3 CSR 10-7.705 Elk: Hunting Season. This rule establishes seasons, limits, and provisions for hunting

3 CSR 10-7.710 Elk: Landowner Privileges. This rule establishes provisions for resident landowners to hunt elk on their property within the resident landowner permit zone during the elk hunting season.

**HUNTING ON PUBLIC** LAND:

3 CSR 10-7.715 Elk: Regulations for Department Areas. This rule incorporates elk hunting on department areas in Chapter 7.

3 CSR 10-11.190 Elk Hunting. This rule establishes provisions for elk hunting on department ar-

The Commission will consider input received during this public comment period and make a final decision to move forward, modify, or withdraw the proposed framework during its Oct. 11 meeting.

If the framework is ap-

proved, MDC staff will then compile and review biological data on herd size, growth, and structure to determine if the inaugural hunt will occur in 2020. If the data supports a hunt for 2020, MDC staff will then present their recommendations on permit numbers to MDC's Regulations Committee and Conservation Commission early

MDC staff will continue to use biological data on herd size, growth, and structure in future years to determine the number of permits issued for each sea-
