Kids' Fishing Day reels in over 900 anglers

Saturday marked another successful Kid's Fishing Day for Roaring River State Park. This year, the kids tags numbers were up from the previous fall kids fishing event.

According to Paul Spurgeon, Roaring River State Park hatchery manager, the park handed out 970 tags. Last year, there were only 888 tags handed out. Spurgeon said, "Our fall events are never as busy as the spring Kids' Fishing Day, but we were pleasantly surprised with the turnout." He continued, "We though that with some of the schools starting a week early, it might affect the attendance, but it was pretty steady all day, even though it rained a little bit."

The day proved to be successful for young fishermen as well, with many catching their limit in under an hour. This year's weight winners were Landon Hardy, with a trout weighing in at 4.88 pounds for the boys' overall

winner and Bonnie Robbins with a three-pound trout for the girls.

Events throughout the day drew crowds to learn about wildlife, nature preservation, camping and more. Many took part in fly fishing instruction, fish cleaning, archery and air rifle shooting. Others enjoyed cooking demonstrations and the stream exhibit.

This year's event was sponsored by Cabella's, Jim Rogers Concessions, David Waugh, Walmart, Les Jacobs Ford, Lucky Lady Trout Bait, Roaring River Alliance, Paradise Valley and the Cassville YMCA. Those sponsors provided food and the funds to run the event so that kids can fish for the day for free and participate in competitions as well as learn to fish. Spurgeon said the hatchery had 113 volunteers to keep things running throughout the day.

Enrollment varies for area schools

The statistics are in for the area schools' enrollment for the 2014-2015 school year.

Cassville Schools came in with the largest jump. This year's initial enrollment is 1,861. Last year, the school had 1,821 students. The overall increase was about 2 percent.

At Cassville, the Primary and Middle School each had fewer students in the building, but each had grades with significant increases. The school's first grade gained 18 students over last year, and the seventh grade has nine more. The high school's numbers are down 17 from last year with this year's graduating class set to be 118 students, a drop compared to the graduating class of 2014 with 134 students.

Southwest Schools had a slight drop in attendance when compared to last year's numbers. This year, school-wide enrollment is 182 students, seven fewer than 2013-2014's 789. Most grades for the district held steady and the graduating classes are similar in size. Last year's graduating class

was 51 and this year's is set to be 54. The school's overall enrollment fell about 4 percent this year.

Exeter Schools gained two students over last year's enrollment. For the 2014-2015 school year, K thorugh 12th grade has 329 students enrolled. Last year, the totals were 327.

Wheaton's enrollment is almost to the student when compared to the 2013-2014 school year. Last year, Wheaton's student count was 388 and this year is 387. While Wheaton's graduating class is significantly smaller at 22 instead of 36, kindergarten received a big bump in students with 40 enrollment compared to 21 last year.

The Purdy School District has 19 additional students this year comparatively. The enrollment numbers for Purdy are up about 3 percent, from 680 total in 2013-2014 to 699 this year. Building total for Purdy were similar with the biggest increase being the high school. Last year, Purdy High School had 197 students and this year, the school has 210.

Collings' death penalty sentence upheld

Christopher Collings, convicted of the murder and rape 9 year-old Rowan Ford in 2007, will still receive the death penalty for the crime after the Missouri Supreme Court upheld the ruling after Colling's attorney filed an appeal.

Collings admitted to Wheaton Police Chief Clint Clark on video that he had abducted, raped and murdered the girl. His attorney claimed that the video was a violation of his rights and

that Collings' judgment was impaired because of marijuana use before the crime. Judge George W. Draper III wrote, "This impairment did not prevent Collings from deliberating with respect to the planning, execution and cover up of Rowan's rape and murder."

Collings' defense was attempting to get the courts to lessen the charge of the death penalty to life in prison. Draper wrote, "Collings' death sentence is consistent with the punishment im-

posed in other cases in which the defendant abducted a young victim and then sexually abused and murdered the victim."

Ford's step-father, David Spears, pled guilty to lesser charges of endangering the welfare of a child and hindering the prosecution as no evidence tied him to the crime. Spears left the girl home alone in Stella where Collings abducted her and then took her to his home

Letter to the Editor...

The sudden cessation of funding to the Missouri Rehabilitation Center (MRC) has taken us all by storm. Other than the obvious uprooting of so many employees, there are many other factors to consider. The VA Clinic is an obvious topic for discussion. Although they plan to relocate by 2017 (a move largely promoted by Missouri Representative Billy Long), let's consider the impact the closure of MRC will have on the clinic and veterans served. How the VA will survive without MRC is indeed a big question. Please understand that the VA and MRC are two separate entities. The relationship between the two however, is very much a symbiosis; each complements the other. Security, building and grounds maintenance, laboratory, radiology, cardiac rehabilitation and pain management are all major services that are shared between MRC and the VA clinic. And those biscuits and gravy breakfasts that are so popular for everyone in the morning? You can kiss those goodbye...

Our patients are our lifeblood, our very reason for existence here at MRC. We watch them get better inch by slow, painful inch. Many of those served are indigent (no payer source) and so largely forgotten and diminished by much of society and many rehabilitation centers. The state appropriation has allowed us to take care of many who otherwise might have languished in a nursing home, or worse. We truly see miracles every day at MRC. Human beings who have suffered crippling overwhelming assaults on

their lives and their health enter our doors. Triumphant Survivors emerge. In between those events they engage in the fight of their lives to regain their health, independence, and function.

The city of Mount Vernon faces a huge crunch, as well. As reported in local news media, the city takes in about \$800,000 from services provided to the center, mostly in the form of utilities. Let's not forget, however, the businesses who serve the area, especially restaurants and gas stations. What will happen to small business owners who thrive on the lunchtime revenue generated from many hungry employees taking a breather away from the center?

I understand that budget shortfalls mean that our state officials must make some very difficult choices with allocations. However, we were already prepared to deal with an estimated shortfall of \$5M. Our leader, Mike Powell, was working very hard to bring other services on line to serve Southwest Missourians as well as shoring up the revenue stream at MRC. The two units I refer to would have served Dialysis patients and patients on long-term ventilators, unable to be weaned from those devices. Currently, the only rural dialysis unit in Southwest Missouri is located at Monett, in Barry County. Also, many of our vent dependent patients must be moved to Iowa and Illinois when they fail to wean from the ventilator. If we are talking about YOUR loved one, how far would you want them to move if they were ventilator dependent? How many miles per round trip would you want YOUR loved one to travel for dialysis services?

How about focusing on how we can help the Southwest Corner of Missouri where a dedicated and highly skilled workforce already exists instead of assuming everyone wants to travel to an urban center to receive health care and employment? Governor Jay Nixon, this closure rests in your hands and your legacy will reflect whether you choose to make a decision that benefits hundreds, if not thousands of people. Or, will you be known as the Governor who arbitrarily closed a health center in rural Southwest Missouri that has existed in service to the residents of this great state for 108 years? -Beth Garner, Exeter

- Never climb a utility pole or tower. The electricity carried through this equipment is very high voltage and could kill you.
- Don't play on or around pad-mounted electrical equipment.
- Never go into an electric substation for any reason, even on a dare.



A recap of the August 14, 2014 Tax Rate Hearing and regular meeting are as follows:

The Board convened for the Tax Rate Hearing at 6:30 p.m. Superintendent Bob Walker presented information pertaining to the district's Assessed Valuation, which totaled \$34,525,804. This figure reflects a slight growth from last year's assessment of approximately 1.3 percent. The Board approved maintaining for the 2014-2015 school year, the current tax rates of \$2.75 and \$.85 for the district's incidental and debt service funds, respectively.

Following the hearing, the regular meeting was called to order at 6:37 p.m.

The Board approved the Consent items, including the hiring of Sherah Farris and Carol Griffin as Special Education Paraprofessionals. Also approved were the following additions to district substitute personnel lists: Steve Knight and Ronnie Stanley (bus drivers), Stacy Hendrix (cook), and Tracy Buntin, Christina Campbell, Crystal Erway, and Jessica Lueckenhoff (teachers). Jeffery Dewitt was also approved as a substitute teacher, pending his completion of all DESE requirements.

There were no Old Business items for this meeting.

Under New Business, the Board adopted a resolution that will enable the district to prepay \$150,000 on the principal amount in respect to its General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2011. The district's debt service account has reached a balance that allows a prepayment to be made. This option will eventually save patrons \$33,075 in interest on future bond payments.







to pay the bowlers back most of those if they bowl in all 28 league games. For three-game bowlers, the league pays back \$250 of the \$280 each family pays for their games. 



near Wheaton and raped and murdered her before dumping her body in the Fox Cave sinkhole.

Draper also wrote, "Collings only accepted full responsibility for the murder after he disposed of Rowan's body, destroyed incriminating evidence, and spent a week lying and misdirecting law enforcement's efforts to locate Rowan."

Collings was originally convicted of the crime in 2012, but his defence filed appeals earlier this year after claiming that the court confused jurors and the verdict and sentencing was manipulated by emotional arguments.

coming in the second week of September and also accomplishments during the political year. When addressing the budget, Cassville Superintendent Richard Asbill brought up school funding issues and also asked about Amendment 3, a ballot initiative that would subject teachers to performance evaluations to determine their job retention in the local districts. Regarding the funding of school, Asbill also stated, "Level funding is not full funding. We still have \$350,000 that we have to ask local patrons to pick up the tab for the difference for our

district." McIntosh went into details about Blunt's work on the VA clinic closure announcement and Viney Creek. According to McIntosh, the recent decision to close the VA Clinic and the MRC was due to the University of Missouri not receiving a lease renewal. Blunt's office and others are working to at least delay the VA clinic's closure. Springfield and Joplin are each getting VA clinics to serve the veteran population

in the area. McIntosh stated, "The lease has laid on someone's desk for 16-18 months. I'm confident that reason will prevail and we can get that moving. It's a mix of state and federal issues. On the state side, there's MU, on the federal side, there's the VA."

Barry County Presiding Commissioner Cherry Warren addressed McIntosh regarding an announcement from the Missouri State Parks to not renew their lease to manage Viney Creek on Table Rock next year. Warren said that the decision was made based on the waste treatment system that needs to be replaced and will cost more than the State Parks will pay. McIntosh stated, "That park is one of five sand filtration systems left. The Corps would have to replace it themselves if they ran it."

Local wrestling club to provide new opportunities for area athletes

"Growing up, I had two brothers. One six years older and one 6 years younger. The three of us always enjoyed wrestling from a young age. It didn't matter if we were on

the mat, in the yard, or in the house, we were always going at it. We would learn from the older brother or teach the younger brother. It was a bonding experience that we still enjoy," stated Dr. Steve

Runnels, the driving force behind the Cassville's new wrestling club.

The Wildcat Takedown Club established board members in the spring of this year and has had several meeting to prepare for wrestlers.

The board consists of Dr. Runnels; David Hopper, Vice President; Troy Thompson, Treasurer; Gerald Houston, Secretary: and Chad Butler, Commissioner of Coaches.

Dr. Runnels moved to Cassville in 2005 because he and his wife, Stacy, were ready to start a family and wanted to raise them in a small town environment, similar to the one he grew up

"I noticed the great fan base that we had for football, but there wasn't any wrestling program in the schools. That was very rare for a small town," said Dr. Runnels.

Taking his passion for wrestling, Dr. Runnels began talking to parents in the community and learned that there was wrestling in the past, but the program had fell off along the way.

As the years past and Runnels' family continued to grow, he kept thinking about wanting his children to participate in wrestling.

"In 2007, we started having children. Again, the thought of wrestling had crossed my mind. I asked around a little bit here and there, never pursuing it too aggressively."

"In 2013, we had our third child. I decided that if we were going to have a program, then maybe I should be the one to do it and quit waiting and wishing for someone else to," Runnels stated.

Runnels started talking to then Cassville High School Athletic Director David Large on steps he should take in starting a local wrestling program. Large suggested starting out with a young program and see who was interested. Then eventuCassville Board of Education with a proposal of high school wrestling.

Later, Runnels was introduced to David Hopper, the Cassville Middle School shop teacher who was trying to accomplish the same task as Runnels.

"David Hopper was the push I needed. He has an extensive background in wrestling, both as a wrestler and a coach. His family is still very involved in the kids club in Grove, Okla. I believe he would be a great candidate for the future position of a high school coach. He also wrestled in college for Appalachian State."

After taking a soft poll to see area interest, the Wildcat Takedown Club was created.

The Board created a Facebook page for the club that took-off quickly getting over 100 "likes" within eight

The page is used to keep the community updated on wrestling events.

"We are looking at having an October sign-up date with

additional family members." While the club is seeking wrestlers, it is also in need of certain equipment for the young athletes and are appre-

ciative to any donations. "We are currently taking donations for the purchase of mats, singlets, equip., etc.. This is where we really need the community to pull together and help us out." said Runnels.

The Wildcat Takedown Club is using the PACE program's 501(C)3 for tax purposes while they apply for their own.

"There are also great opportunities for scholarships in the future," Runnels add-

"Gerald Houston is our only board member that has actually wrestled for CHS when they had a team. After wrestling at Cassville, he went on to wrestle for Crowder College," said Run-


Board member Chad Butler brings with him the knowledge of Nebraska wrestling where he was raised and competed in school.


