

Wheaton fires up for BBQ this weekend

This Saturday, August 27, marks the 58th annual Wheaton BBQ. The festivities will begin at 11 a.m. with the Wheaton Street Machines car show and conclude with the duck race, which begins at 8 p.m.

Each year, the Wheaton Fire Department hosts the BBQ as a way to bring the community together and also raise funds for the fire protection district. One of the most popular events for the city, a large crowd gathers each year to take part in the festivities, and this year is sure not to be any different.

The Wheaton BBQ will host a variety of fun activities for people of all ages. At 11 a.m., the Spud McCracken Memorial Horseshoe Tournament will begin. For more information about the tournament, call (417) 835-3003.

The food service will

begin at 11:30 a.m. This year's faire will be a half BBQ chicken with a baked potato, baked beans, bread and milk or coffee for \$6. The kids portion will be \$3. They will also offer a homemade pulled pork sandwich with baked beans for \$5. On site will also be the firemen's ice cream stand and the homemade pies by the Wheaton United Methodist Women.

For kids, there will be carnival rides at no charge from 1 p.m. to 8 p.m. Free activities are made possible through donations from area businesses and community members. The Wheaton FFA will also have a petting zoo during the event.

In the evening, the grandstand will host live music. Beginning at 4 p.m., Realife will perform, and other bands to follow include the Fly'n Buzzards Bluegrass band, Final Des-

Monett man arrested for child abuse Purdy Ramey's robbers caught

A Monett man, Terry Dewayne Swofford, 40, of Monett, was charged with three counts of child abuse last week for allegedly hitting three children with a belt, leaving bruises.

According to the affidavits of probable cause by the Monett Police Department,

three children, ages 12, 7 and 4, were taken to the Monett Police Station by their mother to report the abuse after a report was made on August 13.

The three children said Swofford, their mother's boyfriend, hit them with the belt when they did not do as they were told. The report

indicated Swofford was upset that the children had gotten out of bed in the night to eat snack food. All three had visible bruising, according to the reporting officer.

Swofford is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$100,000 bond.

On August 16, around 9 a.m., an unknown male and female entered the Ramey's store in Purdy and began walking around the store, acting suspiciously, according to Purdy Police Chief Jackie Lowe.

The female, acting as a lookout, stood by the checkout line to watch for store employees, while the male went behind the counter and stole cigarettes.

A store clerk observed the male behind the counter and confronted him.

The male suspect then attempted to leave the store with the cigarettes without paying for them, leading to a physical struggle between him and the female clerk.

The male suspect then shoved the clerk down before fleeing the store on foot.

The female suspect then walked outside, and left in the same direction, driving a maroon colored Chrysler Sebring convertible.

The female suspect then drove to the Country Corner Store in Purdy where she picked up the male sus-

pect.

Acting on information obtained during a meeting of Barry-Lawrence Crime Stoppers, the female suspect was identified as Dawn R. Kettner, age 25, of Pierce City.

It was reported that Kettner and an unknown male driving the same maroon Chrysler Sebring convertible had cashed a forged check in Aurora that had allegedly been stolen from a woman in Pierce City.

A bank surveillance photo captured the suspect vehicle and license plate showing that the vehicle was registered to Ms. Kettner.

Kettner was located at a residence in Pierce City and was detained until Purdy officers could arrive.

Kettner was transported to the Monett Police Department where she was interviewed by Officer Jon Egleston of the Purdy Police Department in regards to the strong armed robbery that occurred in Purdy.

Kettner denied knowing who the male suspect was,

stating that she thought that his name was "Thomas" and that was an acquaintance of her ex-boyfriend.

While interviewing Kettner, she requested that her brother go to her residence and retrieve her dog that had been left there alone.

It was there that Kettner's brother, along with a Pierce City police officer, located the male suspect inside of Kettner's apartment.

The male suspect was identified as Scotty Ray Robertson, age 31, of South Carolina.

Robertson was taken into custody by Officer Egleston and was transported to the Barry County Jail.

He has been charged with Second Degree Robbery and is currently being held on \$20,000.00 bond.

Kettner was also charged with Second Degree Robbery and Hindering an Investigation by providing false information.

She has posted a \$15,000 bond and was released.

Cattlemen's Association to hold tour in Barry County

The Southwest Missouri Cattlemen's Association will hold an educational tour in Barry County on Sept. 17.
"Three unique farms have agreed to serve as tour hosts," said Eldon Cole, livestock specialist with University of Missouri Extension.
The first stop at 1:30 p.m. is at Anderson Ranch, Seligman. Owner Gary Anderson and farm manager Lindell Mitchell will discuss their 300 Angus-based cow herd (with a small amount of Gelbvieh and Simmental in them).
"The herd has been built on buying top-performing bulls and retaining outstanding heifers. A combination of Bermudagrass and novel fescue round out their forage program. About 90 percent of their hay is barn-stored," said Cole.
To reach the first stop take Missouri 37 south of Seligman to Arkansas 62. Follow 62 about one mile west to Gann Ridge Road take it to the right and follow the signs to the Anderson corral.
The second stop at 3:30 p.m. will be south of Exeter off of MM. A & W Brooks Farm with Phillip and his children Audra and Will features 220 breeding females. The forage is primarily Kentucky 31 fescue with some sudan raised to background fall calves. Heifer calves are evaluated and handled according to the Missouri Show-Me-Select. Several of these heifers will be in the SMS sale Nov. 18 at Joplin Regional.
"The Brooks have followed their cattle in the feedlot, being sold on video auctions and sold direct off the farm. A key feature in the

An Oklahoma woman had to be airlifted for injuries last week when she wrecked south of Cassville. According to the Missouri State Highway Patrol, Heather R. Ryon, 28, of Catoosa, Okla., had to be transported for serious injuries from the wreck.

Barry County courts send 11 to prison in the month of July

• **Bradley Young Archer**, of Pierce City, pled guilty to DWI-Alcohol. Archer was granted a suspended imposition of sentencing and two years unsupervised probation.

Archer's charges originate with a Missouri State highway Patrol traffic stop on August 23, 2014. Archer was clocked at driving 89 mph in a 60 mph zone on MO-37, south of BB. When the arresting officer made contact with Archer, the officer reported that he smelled strongly of intoxicants.

Archer failed the field sobriety test and admitted to having both marijuana and a marijuana pipe in his vehicle at the time of the

arrest. Archer's blood alcohol level was reported to be 0.053 percent, and he had two prior DWI convictions.

Archer is to serve probation until July 18, 2018.

• **Shane Michael Ayala**, of Pierce City, pled guilty to two counts of distribution of a controlled substance. Ayala received a suspended execution of a 10 year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections and five years supervised probation.

Ayala's charges originated from an undercover operation by the Missouri State Highway Patrol. An undercover officer purchased marijuana from him on three separate occasions: April 5,

2012, April 12, 2012, and May 7, 2012. The officer purchased a quarter of a pound twice and attempted to purchase a half of a pound on the third date, but Ayala did not return with the drugs after receiving the money. The transactions took place in the Monett area.

Ayala is to serve probation until July 18, 2021.

• **Carl E. Barnes**, of Aurora, pled guilty to 22 counts of passing a bad check of \$500 or more in 2015 and is now to serve 120 days of shock incarceration time.

Barnes had multiple bad checks passed in 2014 at Rapid Robert's In Monett. Totals of the checks ranged from \$12 to \$57.60.

• **Joseph Lee Bass**, of Branson, pled guilty to five counts of burglary in the second degree and one count of tampering with a motor vehicle in the first degree earlier this year in March. Bass was sentenced to seven years incarceration with the Department of Corrections of which he is to serve 120 days of shock incarceration. His shock incarceration

began, and he is to be incarcerated until November 18, 2016.

Bass was convicted of breaking into multiple hunting cabins in 2015, and also stealing a car from Uncle Roy's in Eagle Rock. Multiple flat screen TVs were stolen, and officers saw Bass and another man running from one of the cabins.

• **Richard Baugh**, of Belton, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance in 2013 and has since had his probation revoked. Baugh is to serve 120 days of shock incarceration with the Department of Corrections until November 16, 2016.

On June 4, 2012, law enforcement was dispatched to a theft from the Walmart in Monett. Loss prevention with the store saw Baugh stealing from the store before he fled with the employee chasing him. When arrested, Baugh also had 0.7 grams of methamphetamine on him.

• **Dakoda Buck**, of Holiday Island, Ark., pled guilty to assault in the second degree and theft/stealing of less than \$500 in value. Buck received a suspended im-

sition of sentencing and is to serve unsupervised probation for a year.

Buck was arrested after a severe assault in Eagle Rock April 29, 2014. According to the reporting officer, Buck broke into the residence by kicking the door in and then proceeded to assault the victim by choking him and punching him in the head. He also banged his head on the countertop. The victim blacked out during this and was bleeding out of both ears. Buck and his accomplice then stole the victim's hand gun and a telescope worth approximately \$1,000.

Buck is to serve probation until July 7, 2017.

• **Ricky J. Buller**, of Monett, pled guilty to two counts of non-support in 2015, and his probation has since been revoked. Buller is to serve 120 days of shock incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

Buller was in arrears for child support on two different children. As of October 30, 2014, he was in arrears of \$13,009.06 for one child and \$8,808 for the other child.

• **Phillip David Clow**, of Purdy, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance and DWI - Combined Alcohol/Drug intoxication as a persistent offender. Clow received a suspended execution of a four-year incarceration sentence and five years supervised probation.

Clow's charges originated from a traffic stop by the Missouri State Highway Patrol on January 11, 2016.

A trooper pulled Clow over for not having an illuminated license plate and not wearing a seatbelt.

Once pulled over, the officer noted multiple open beer cans and a container of alcohol in the car. He also smelled heavily of intoxicants and could not complete field sobriety tests.

A search of his person yielded a baggie of generic Xanax pills.

Clow is to serve probation until July 18, 2021.

• **Timothy Cooper**, of Huntsville, Ark., pled guilty to theft/stealing of less than \$500. Cooper received a suspended imposition of sentencing and two years unsupervised probation.

On April 17, 2014, Cooper presented a check to Shumaker Tire for new tires, lug, nuts, fuel and other fees. The check totaled \$809.09 and was signed by the owner of Hidden Valley Guest Ranch. Cooper did not have permission to use the check but filled out the rest of the check to purchase the tires.

Cooper is to serve probation until July 19, 2018.

• **Andrew David Cunha**, of Shell Knob, pled guilty to DWI-Drug Intoxication as a persistent offender and DWI-Alcohol as a persistent offender. Cunha received a suspended execution of a four-year incarceration sentence and five years supervised probation.

Cunha was arrested on two separate occasions in July and August 2014 by the Missouri State Highway Patrol when he was found to be driving his motorcycle while intoxicated. He had prior convictions for DWI, as well.

In July, Cunha was arrested on MO 39 north of Shell Knob going 93 miles per hour. In August, Cunha was clocked going 113 miles per hour near the bridge in Shell Knob. When the officer pulled him over, he attempted to start his motorcycle and drive off again. Both times, he was clearly intoxicated.



Cunha is to serve probation until July 19, 2021.

• **Richard Dewayne Deshields**, of Stella, pled guilty to resisting arrest for a felony by fleeing causing risk of injury or death and resisting arrest for a felony. Deshields received a suspended execution of a four-year incarceration sentence and five years supervised probation.

In both June and October 2015, Deshields fled from law enforcement by driving recklessly and at high rates of speed. He had an active warrant and informed law enforcement he wasn't going back to prison no matter what.

Deshields is to serve probation until July 18, 2021.

• **Elizabeth Jessi Edwards**, of Bentonville, Ark., pled guilty to burglary in the second degree and and theft/stealing of \$500 to \$25,000 in value. Edwards received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

Edwards was charged for breaking into a home on Air Park Drive in Golden and stealing multiple items. Edwards attempted to pry the front door open but could not and went to the sliding glass door on the back of the residence. She stole tools, food, silverware, dishes, towels, blankets, toilet tissue, paper towels and plastic bags. She stole more than \$500 worth of items from the home.

Edwards is to serve probation until July 19, 2021.

• **Ashley Griffin**, of Aurora, pled guilty to distribution of a controlled substance and possession of a controlled substance. Griffin received a suspended execution of a seven-year incarceration sentence and five years supervised probation.

Griffin was arrested after a pursuit by the Missouri State Highway Patrol beginning in Monett and ending near Pierce City. On December 19, 2015, the Missouri State Highway Patrol attempted to pull Griffin over for failing to have a front license plate and displaying the rear plate of another vehicle. Griffin failed to yield to the officer and threw contraband from the vehicle while fleeing.

Once pulled over, officers found that Griffin was currently wanted for a felony parole violation. Contraband thrown from the car included multiple prescription pills, a bag of marijuana, a digital scale, straws and items with methamphetamine residue.

Griffin is to serve probation until July 18, 2021.

• **Rebecca Lynn Hinman**, of Monett, pled guilty to receiving stolen property. Hinman received a seven-year incarceration sentence of which she will serve 120 days of shock time with the Department of Corrections.

Hinman was arrested and charged after a burglary was reported at Krueger Storage in Monett in May 2012. Monett Sheet Metal reported over \$31,000 worth of air condition units, line sets and Freon were stolen from the storage unit.

On May 8, Hinman was found at Triple P Recycling with another party with \$7,288 worth of stolen new air conditioners parts inside their vehicle. Hinman claimed they found the parts in the ditch near Seligman, Aurora and Verona.

• **Payton W. Horner**, of Cassville, entered an Alford plea to property damage in the first degree and unlawful use of a weapon, discharging it into a home or motor vehicle. Horner received a suspended imposition of sentencing and three years supervised probation.

On January 27, 2016, the Barry County Sheriff's Department received a call about damage to a rental home. The owners said they believed their son, Horner,

had shot the residence with a .22 caliber rifle after being asked to leave his father's property. Damage included \$1,400 for windows, \$300 to the drywall and \$50 to the outside of the home.

Horner is to serve probation until July 19, 2019.

• **Roy Wayne Johnson**, of Seligman, pled guilty to theft/stealing of \$500 to \$25,000 in value. Johnson received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

Johnson is to serve probation until July 19, 2021.

Johnson was charged after a theft from the Monett Walmart in August 2015. When officers arrived, they checked the surveillance and saw Johnson and a woman with children in shopping carts. The woman took the cart full of merchandise and left the store without paying while Johnson took the children to the car and picked them up.

• **Brandi Elaina Lackey**, of Bentonville, Ark., pled guilty to possession of a con-

trolled substance and resisting arrest for a felony. Lackey received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

On March 10, 2015, Lackey was arrested following a Southwest Missouri Drug Task Force investigation of a residence on Old Wire Road in Washburn. When officers arrived, five people were in the residence, including Lackey. Inside the residence, officers found multiple methamphetamine manufacturing operations.

Lackey was found with three methamphetamine pipes. When Lackey removed a syringe from her pants, she stuck her finger. She became combative with officers and tried to flee. Then, said she had taken all of the drugs she had so she wouldn't be found in possession. She was transported for an overdose following the investigation.

Lackey is to serve probation until July 18, 2021.

• **Krystal Lee Nation**, of Cassville, pled guilty to

burglary in the first degree in 2014, endangering the welfare of a child in the first degree in 2015, and assault in the second degree in 2015. Her probation has since been revoked. Nation is to serve five years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On October 25, 2012, Nation was arrested after she was found to be harassing a man who had a restraining order against her. The victim said he was sitting in his home when Nation kicked the back door in and tried to attack him with a stick while

screaming, "I'm going to stab your other eye out." The door had around \$400 worth of damage.

On March 8, 2014, Nation attacked the same victim by attempting to strike him with a clock shaped like a saw blade.

• **Dalton Eugene Nelson**, of Piedmont, pled guilty to three counts of distribution of a controlled substance and one count of burglary in the second degree in 2015. Nelson's probation has since been revoked, and he is to serve five years incarceration with the Department of Cor-

In June 2013, Nelson was arrested after an undercover narcotics operation by the Missouri State Highway Patrol. An officer purchased one gram of methamphetamine from Nelson in Monett.

• **Mahailya Dawnelle Pryer**, of Springfield, pled guilty to theft/stealing of any credit card in 2013. Pryer's probation has since been revoked, and she is to serve three years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

Pryer was arrested after breaking into a vehicle to steal a purse in May 2013.

Officers with the Monett Police Department questioned Pryer who said that she broke the window, stole the purse and attempted to use the credit cards in the wallet to make purchases, but they were denied.

• **Lisa Dianne Seabolt**, of Exeter, pled guilty to three counts of theft/stealing of \$500 to \$25,000 in value in 2012. Seabolt's probation has since been revoked, and she is to serve five years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

In July 2011, Seabolt was employed at Red Rose Inn in Cassville. During a shift, she stole jewelry from six different residents. She also had prescription drugs in her possession when she was arrested. Then, in February 2012, Seabolt was found to have stolen medication,

• **Danette Janieann Stillwell**, of Golden, made an Alford plea to assault on a law enforcement officer in the second degree. Stillwell received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

On August 15, 2014, Stilwell went to a victim's residence armed with a gun, trying to enter. Stilwell then went home and begun firing the gun. When officer arrived, Stilwell tried to

resist officers and escape, including trying to hit other people and kicked one person in the knee, scratched them, causing blood to appear, and then kicked the window of the patrol vehicle, dislodging the window.

Stilwell is to serve probation until July 18, 2021.

• **Zachary N. Vance**, of Cassville, made an Alford plea to theft/stealing of less than \$500. Vance received a suspended imposition of sentence, two years unsupervised probation and must pay court costs.

Vance and another person stole an unknown number of tires and wheels from Ball and Prier Tire in Golden over the course of two and a half years. When Vance was confronted by the owners, he admitted to helping the other man steal the tires, as well as putting the other party in contact with the name of someone who would buy the tires.

• **James Wagner**, of Madisonville, Tenn., pled guilty to burglary in the second degree and theft/stealing of \$500 to \$25,000 in value. Wagner received a suspended execution of a seven-year incarceration sentence and five years supervised probation.

Wagner is to serve probation until July 18, 2021.

• **Danny Pat West, Jr.**, of Monett, pled guilty to burglary in the first degree in 2013 and possession of a controlled substance in 2015. West's probation has since been revoked, and he is to serve five years incarceration with the Department of

Corrections.

In 2013, West's arrest was from July 2012 when he broke into an apartment in Monett and stole electronics. West also punched the victim in the face.

In 2015, West was arrested for methamphetamine possession.

• **Kevin Lee Whittington** pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance and assault in the first degree causing serious injury. Whittington received a suspended execution of a seven-year incarceration sentence and five years supervised probation.

• **Patrick Ray Williams**, of Cassville, pled guilty to two counts of driving while revoked or suspended as a first offense. Williams received a suspended execution of a one year jail sentence and two years unsupervised probation.

Williams was arrested in September 2014 and October 2015 for driving while revoked, of which he had been convicted of six times prior to that incident.

Williams is to serve probation until July 18, 2018.

The series with Lamar has a history of blowouts. You have to dig all the way back to 2006 in the record book to find a game decided by less than three touchdowns. Five of the last nine games have been shutouts.

Last year, the Tigers got the last proverbial monkey off their backs when they finally won the Big 8 Conference championship, a title that cruelly eluded them despite the annual dominance of Class 2. Lamar came into Friday's season opener with a string of five consecutive state championships. Cassville won five games last year.

"You can't make mistakes against a good football team," Lance Parnell said

after the 38-6 loss to Lamar in last year's game. "Those mistakes get magnified, good football teams take advantage of mistakes."

That quote rang true again on Friday night as turnovers and mistakes put the Wildcats so deep in the hole they couldn't see daylight.

After looking prepared and poised in the jamboree, the Wildcats seemed rattled at Lamar. After receiving the opening kickoff, Cassville turned the ball over on the third snap from scrimmage. Shannon Haney's pass attempt was tipped and then picked by Lamar's Trey Loooney. The Tigers navigated the short field in just four plays, with Stuart McKarus scoring from 5 yards out with 8:51 on the clock. The successful 2-point conversion gave Lamar an early 8-0 lead.

After a short kickoff return pinned the Wildcats inside their own 10-yard line, a 12-yard River Phelps run moved the chains. Phelps gained 6 more yards

on the next play, but then a wild option pitch was recovered by Lamar at the Cassville 26-yard line.

Two possessions, Two turnovers

Lamar capitalized on the opportunity. Matt Whyman connected with Trey Mooney for a 12-yard scoring pass that gave the Tigers a 14-0 lead with 6:21 left in the opening quarter.

Cassville regrouped and put together a respectable drive on the following possession. The Wildcats moved from their own 20-yard stripe to midfield in nine plays, but were forced to punt on 4th and 9. Phelps' rugby-style kick was marked dead at the Lamar 39-yard line.

Daggers

Luke Hardman broke into the Cassville secondary on a first-down dive play, and raced 61 yards for a touchdown to give Lamar a 21-0 lead at the end of the first quarter.

Following a Cassville three-and-out, Lamar drove 66 yards in seven plays to claim a 28-0 lead with a Cooper Lucas one-yard scoring plunge.

Shannon Haney was sacked in the end zone for a safety and a 30-0 score.

Hardman reprised his earlier scoring effort with a 72-yard TD run for a 36-0 Lamar advantage with 7:12 left in the first half.

Scott Bailey sent out his second string offense to close out the half, and the second half passed quickly with an uninterrupted running clock.

Midway through the final period, a muffed punt gave Lamar another short field. Dante Stall scored from 18 yards out to create the 50-0 final score.

Every game is a learning experience. Every game is a competitive experience. Every game is a life experience. The Cassville players and coaches have a week to prepare and improve before the next challenge.

"Life ain't about how hard you hit. It's about how hard you can get hit, and keep moving forward," Rocky Balboa.

The Wildcats host Reeds Spring, a 47-34 winner over Mt. Vernon, in the home opener at Wildcat Stadium on Friday night. Kickoff is set for 7 p.m.

MSHP warns to watch for buses

The Missouri State Highway Patrol reminds drivers to pay attention every time they are behind the wheel, but especially before and after school when children are walking, biking, or driving to school. Many schools throughout the state have started their 2016-2017 school year. This brings a change in traffic patterns. It is critical for drivers to be alert, especially near school zones, playgrounds, and bicycle paths. School buses and parents taking their children to school will join other motorists on the road and affect the morning and afternoon commute. Whatever route you drive, expect this additional traffic and prepare by allowing extra time to reach your destination.

Afternoons can be especially dangerous. Most traffic crashes involving young drivers (under the age of 21) in 2015 occurred between 3 p.m. and 4 p.m., when school typi-

cally lets out. Drivers need to be aware of the increased traffic during this time—not just in areas around school, but all around town. Remember: Many of these drivers are inexperienced. It is important to encourage those young drivers to remember driving is a full-time job. Using a cell phone, texting, or adjusting the radio can be the distraction that leads to a traffic crash. Texting is against the law for anyone under the age of 22.

When you see a school bus, follow the law. Missouri law states that on a two-lane road, if a school bus is stopped and displaying warning signals while loading or unloading children, drivers must stop when meeting and following the bus. However, it is only necessary to stop on a four-lane highway when following the bus. Drivers, when you see a stopped school bus, stay alert. Children may not be aware of traffic and dart unex-

pectedly into the roadway.

In 2015, one person was killed and 376 people were injured in school bus crashes. Missouri experienced 960 traffic crashes involving school buses last year. Parents are encouraged to talk to their children about riding a bus, walking, or driving to school in a safe manner. If they ride a bike, please make sure they wear a helmet and follow traffic laws. Let's help Missouri students return to school safely.

The only 100 percent survivable crash is the one that never happens. Make sure everyone in the vehicle is properly restrained in a seat belt or child restraint. Every day as we travel on Missouri's roadways, we trust that every driver on the road is going to obey the speed limit, pay attention, and drive sober. "Don't Violate The Trust."

Wet July, August impacts crops statewide

"Wet" and "wetter." Those words set the theme of an Aug. 2 teleconference for University of Missouri Extension agronomists.

Heavy rains on the first two days of August followed what may have been the ninth-wettest July since 1895.

Preliminary state average rainfall was 6.5 inches, said Pat Guinan, MU Extension climatologist.

He reported heavy rains started August with 3 to 8 inches overnight in a swath in northern Missouri from the Iowa line near Bethany, to Carrollton then east to near Marshall and ending southwest of Columbia.

"The front just stalled there," Guinan said. "It didn't move all night."

The next night, a smaller area in northeastern and east-central Missouri had 3 to 6 inches of rain. Centered on Mexico, Mo., that storm reached south through Gasconade County.

Normally dry, August started this year with flood warnings for bottomland cornfields.

Mostly, the regional specialists reported corn benefits from the rain. Some producers added aerial applications of nitrogen to replace nutrients leached away.

The time for adding nitrogen is done, said John Lory, MU Extension nutrient specialist.

A regional agronomist

reported that a yield check showed that "dryland" corn might out-yield irrigated corn this year.

Soybean crops ranged from forming first leaves to start of blooms. However, farmers know that beans can start late and finish with record yields if not hit by early frost.

Reports of Japanese beetles that had dominated past calls are on the wane. Beetle populations leave crop fields and head to grassy pastures to lay their eggs.

Mainly beetles feed on edge rows of corn and soybean fields, not whole fields.

Forage production drew more discussion than field crops this week. Cool-season grasses continued to make abundant grazing.

However, an early warning came of two infestations by fall armyworms. Both had been caught early and sprayed.

Armyworm attacks start near Arkansas and work their way north. The moving mass of worms can strip pastures bare overnight.

Farmers are alerted to watch for the pest to catch them early. They require quick response.

Ben Puttler, retired MU entomologist, said wet weather could help control armyworm invasions. A fungus can devastate the population.

Wet, warm weather favors the fungus.

Craig Roberts, MU Exten-

sion forage specialist, said past years of heavy summer rains hurt alfalfa fields. If alfalfa plants turn yellow, their nitrogen-fixing nodules may be inactive. Water-soaked soils kill the rhizobia bacteria that fix nitrogen from the air for plant use.

If the stand is thin, the alfalfa field can be interseeded with orchard grass and red clover. That boosts hay yields. If alfalfa is to be planted into the same field, the alfalfa needs to be taken out of production for a year, then reseeded.

It will be vital to inoculate the seed to re-establish the rhizobia culture in the soil.

"With thicker stands, it may be possible to add the inoculum to the soil with a drill," Roberts said he knew of no Missouri research on that practice but had heard of it working.

Guinan's weather outlook indicated a continued wet early August. Heat and humidity will prevail into next week.

The teleconferences between MU state and regional extension specialists help keep all up to date on new problems. Calls are made weekly through the growing season.

In normal years, most crop pests dry up by mid-August. This week, the group will decide whether to share ideas until September.

Farmers can seek help on pest problems through local MU Extension centers.
