59th annual Wheaton BBQ this Saturday

One of the most iconic Wheaton events each year is coming up this Saturday, August 26, in the Wheaton City Park. This year will mark the 59th year of the annual Wheaton BBQ, sponsored by the Wheaton Volunteer Fire Department.

Events this year will be similar to past years with free rides for kids, a petting zoo and good food for everyone. Music, a horseshoe tournament and the duck race will be held throughout the day, as well.

Festivities will begin with the Wheaton Street Machine Show and Shine car show at 11 a.m. Following directly after is the Spud McCracken Memorial Horseshoe Tournament. Food will be served beginning at 11:30 a.m. and rides start at 1 p.m. The festival will wrap up with the duck race in the park at 8 p.m.

Music featuring the Fly'n Buzzards, Charles Goswick, No Apparent Reason, Ripplin Creek and Glory Bound will run from 2 p.m. until the duck race.

The children's carnival rides will operate from 1 p.m. to 8 p.m. The rides are made possible by donations from area businesses and individuals.

For those wanting a little more tame of a time at the BBQ, craft booths will also be on site in large tents with plenty of shade. Booth spaces are free.

This year's menu features a half BBQ chicken with a baked potato, baked beans, bread and milk or coffee. Adult meals are \$6 and kids eat for \$3. Homemade pulled pork sandwiches are \$5 and come with a side of baked beans. The fireman's ice cream stand and homemade pies by the Wheaton United Methodist Women will also be on site if you have a sweet tooth after the BBQ. Food will be served beginning at 11:30 a.m.

As the duck race wraps up the day's fun, community members will have a chance to win cash prizes. Cash prizes go from \$50 to \$500 for first through fifth places. There will also be two pairs of adult Justin boots given away during the duck race. The boots were donated by Justin Boots of Cassville.

Monett man charged with pistol theft

A Monett man is charged with stealing a pistol from Monett Gun and Pawn. Scottie Ray Myers, 41, is charged with stealing the gun.

On August 10, Monett Police officers responded to a call from Monett Gun and Pawn on East Broadway in Monett. The store was reporting a stolen handgun.

The store provided information about a Sig P320 9mm pistol valued at \$550 that was stolen. The theft occurred on August 8, and the security footage showed the suspect, who allegedly asked the price of the stolen gun's ammunition at the counter.

Myers was arrested on August 12 on active warrants. When questioned, Myers allegedly admitted to stealing the gun from Monett Gun and Pawn and told officers it would be under the mattress in his bedroom at an apartment on Bond. Officers were able to recover the gun in the location Myers told them.

Myers is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$50,150 bond, with \$20,000 of it on the gun theft charges. Myers is charged with stealing a firearm and unlawful possession of a firearm.

Cassville Middle School students were inspired to lift their eyes to the sky and dream big during an inspirational

presentation by a Wheaton High School graduate. Erisa K. (Hines) Stilley, an engineer for NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboabout her role in the Mars rover Curiosity in honor of the upcoming solar eclipse.

Students gathered in the ratories, spoke to the students

listened to Stilley talk about her experiences working in engineering, specifics of the Mars Curiosity project, and how she got to where she is today.

Stilley graduated with a Bachelor's Degree in mechanical engineering with a minor in math from the University of Miami. She then went on to MIT to earn two Master's degrees, one in aeronautics and astronomics and another in technology and policy.

Stilley talked to students about how different types of people help with missions like Curiosity, her roles and what goes into the engineering aspect. She also shared what it was like to see Curiosity land and operate on Mars and some of what scientists have learned from it being there.

Stilley is also working on the Mars 2020 mission. Part of her job is improving the rover from the previous mission.

A Monett man was charged with a Yonkerville burglary from earlier this month. Joshua Steven Clifton, 28, of Monett, was charged with burglary in the second degree, property damage in the second degree and stealing. Subsequently, Clifton was charged with failure to register as a sex offender.

According to the affidavits of probable cause, the Barry County Sheriff's Department was investigating a break in and burglary at the Yonkerville Store on State Highway 60 in Pierce City on August 8 between 3:42 a.m. and 7:18 a.m. The store reported that \$300 worth of cigarettes and at least \$27 worth of scratch off tickets were taken. The suspect smashed a glass door with a rock to gain entry to the store.

Officers were able to pull security footage that showed the suspect was a white male, tall and thin and was wearing a blue hoodie that covered the top of his face. Officers said that on August 10, they received an anonymous tip that the burglar was named Josh, what he was driving and who he was staying with in Monett.





According to researchers at the University of Colorado Boulder, sleeping outside can be beneficial to the sleepwake cycle. That's because spending time under the stars increases melatonin levels in the body. Melatonin is a hormone that controls wakefulness. Higher levels help the body relax and induce sleep. The researchers found that individuals who spent a weekend in the woods camping out at night fell asleep earlier and rose an hour and a half earlier in the morning. For those who don't like to camp, increasing exposure to daylight and then avoiding sources of artificial light (i.e., televisions and cellphones) at night can help create a similar effect.

167.031. School attendance compulsory, who may be excused — nonattendance, penalty — home school, definition, requirements — school year defined — daily log, defense to prosecution — compulsory attendance age for the district defined. - 1. Every parent, guardian or other person in this state having charge, control or custody of a child not enrolled in a public, private, parochial, parish school or full-time equivalent attendance in a combination of such schools and between the ages of seven years and the compulsory attendance age for the district is responsible for enrolling the child in a program of academic instruction which complies with subsection 2 of this section.

Any parent, guardian or other person who enrolls a child between the ages of five and seven years in a public school program of academic instruction shall cause such child to attend the academic program on a regular basis, according to this section. Nonattendance by such child shall cause such parent, guardian or other responsible person to be in violation of the provisions of section 167.061, except as provided by this section. A parent, guardian or other person in this state having charge, control, or custody of a child between the ages of seven years of age and the compulsory attendance age for the district shall cause the child to attend regularly some public, private, parochial, parish, home school or a combination of such schools not less than the entire school term of the school which the child attends.

To tell people that they HAVE to PROPERLY PLACE their child in a classroom as soon as 5 years old is just plain wrong. Look up the law for yourself. Be involved in your child's education. Please don't take the school official's word only. Have a blessed day.

Highway Patrol urges to have a safe Labor Day weekend

Colonel Sandra K. Karsten, superintendent of the Missouri State Highway Patrol, urges Missouri's travelers to drive and boat responsibly during the 2017 Labor Day weekend. Whether you are driving or boating, safety must be at the forefront of your plans.

In Missouri, 20 people died and 429 were injured in 1,028 traffic crashes over the 2016 Labor Day holiday. That means one person was killed or injured every 10.4 minutes. Of that total, troopers worked 293 traffic crashes, which included 139 injuries and 14 of the fatalities over the 2016 Labor Day holiday. Troopers arrested 100 people for driving while intoxicated

during last year's holiday weekend.

The 2017 counting period for the Labor Day holiday will be from 6 p.m., Friday, September 1, through 11:59 p.m., Monday, September 4,

The Highway Patrol will be participating in Operation C.A.R.E. (Crash Awareness & Reduction Effort) over the Labor Day holiday weekend. Speed, inattention, and impaired driving are leading causes of traffic crashes. Thus, all available troopers will be patrolling Missouri's roadways enforcing Missouri's speed limit, seat belt, and impaired driving laws, in addition to being available to assist motorists. Troopers throughout the state will participate in a special enforcement operation on September 1 and again on September 4. This operation will include Interstates 29, 44, 55, and 70, and U.S. Highways 60 and 61. Troopers will be targeting all traffic violations, and be especially vigilant of aggressive driving violations.

The only 100 percent survivable traffic crash is the one that never happens. Make sure everyone in the vehicle is properly restrained in a seat belt or child restraint. Every day as we travel on Missouri's roadways, we trust that every driver on the road is going to obey the speed limit, pay attention, and drive sober. "Don't Violate The Trust."

Col. Karsten reminds the public that the Labor Day holiday is a busy boating weekend. In 2016, there were 10 boating crashes which included zero fatalities and 10 injuries. There were no drownings over last year's Labor Day holiday. Troopers arrested 12 people for boating while intoxicated during last year's counting period. In an effort to increase safety on our state's waters, all available officers will be working over the holiday weekend. Missouri's boaters are asked to do their part by remaining alert for other boats and swimmers, and being courteous on the water. With more boats on the water, it is even more important to pay attention when operating a vessel.

Remember: Never operate a vessel while you are impaired. Alcohol consumption slows reaction time. Avoid overloading your boat with too many passengers and pay close attention to the boats around you. Check your vessel's navigation lights before heading out at night, be sure to have spare bulbs on board, and observe Missouri's nighttime speed limit of 30 mph on the water. Causing harm to another person or their property with an excessive boat wake may subject you to enforcement action



The Lamar Tigers, the perennial Class 2 state champions, ground out a 28-0 victory at Cassville on Friday night. Torrential rains turned the pristine field into a mudhole, and persistent lightning delayed kickoff until 9 p.m. But the Tigers shook off all distractions and took care of business against a greatly improved

Last year, Lamar hung 50-0 embarrassment on Cassville, the most lopsided score in the now seven-year win streak against the Wildcats. That skein of games includes five shutouts. But despite not scoring, Lance Parnell's team displayed marked improvement from last year, something that should give the other Big 8 and Class 3 teams pause.

Cassville's only losses last year were to Lamar and Monett, both State Champions in their respective classes.

"You know I don't believe in moral victories," Parnell told his team huddle after the game, reciting a favorite

It was no victory, but it

should serve as a confidence builder for this Cassville team as they prepare to play at Reeds Spring.

Lamar's reputation and success is built on size, speed and execution. Their sheer physicality overwhelms most opponents. Cassville, noticeably bigger and stronger than in the last few seasons, held its own in the trenches throughout the game.

A year ago, Lamar sprinted to a 44-0 lead at halftime and played the entire second half with reserves. Friday night's game wasn't comfortably over until Cooper Lucas broke free on a power sweep for a 69-yard scoring run late in the fourth quarter. The mud-soaked uniforms of both teams evidenced the intensity of the fight.

Although unable to turn the game into a track meet, the Lamar offense controlled the contest. The Tigers only punted once and converted on three fourth down plays, two of them for touchdowns.

After Lamar received the opening kickoff, Lucas opened the scoring with a one-yard plunge with 5:51 on the first-quarter clock. Stuart

McKarus ran in for the twopoint conversion to create an 8-0 score.

Shannon Haney broke loose on Cassville's first offensiveplay for a 37-yard run, but the gain was negated by a momentum-killing penalty. A pass interference call moved the ball to midfield, but Haney punted away on 4th-and-10.

The Tigers manufactured a 16-play, 90-yard scoring drive to claim a 14-0 lead at the 8:31 mark of the second quarter. TW Ayers dove into the endzone on 4th-and-goal from the one-yard line to extend the Lamar lead.

The second half saw more of the same. The Wildcats slowed but could not stop Lamar's offensive juggernaut, nor could they score against the Tigers.

Cassville managed one first down with the initial possession of the third quarter before Haney launched a 59-yard punt that would outperform any North Korean missile. The Wildcats covered the ball at the Lamar one-yard line.

But the Tigers covered the length of the field in just seven plays. Lucas started the drive with runs of 12 and 43 yards to reach Cassville's 44-yard line. Speedster Trevor Medlin finished the drive with a dazzling 39-yard run, cutting back against the Cassville secondary on his way to the end zone. McKarus ran in for the PATx2 to give Lamar a 22-0 lead with 7:06 left in the quarter.


Cassville's last real hope to get back in the game died when Haney was stopped on a fake punt that fooled absolutely no one. The Tigers took over at their own 47-yard





In partnership with the Mercy, Cassville Clinic, the Cassville R-IV School district will offer an on-site open health clinic for students, staff and families Monday through Friday from 7 a.m. to 8:30 a.m. The clinic will be located in the main health services and nursing office location within Eunice Thomas Elementary and may be accessed by using the circle drive entrance next to the Eunice Thomas Elementary and Middle School cafeteria.

Longtime Mercy nurse practitioner Amanda Winfrey will see patients for a variety of reasons. These services will include such things as sports physicals, sore throats, urinary tract infections, bug bites and more.

"The school based clinic has been an idea we have been exploring for the last couple of years," said Winfrey. "I am beyond excited Mercy and the school have made this dream a reality and I have been chosen to provide this service to the students, faculty and fami-

The school based clinic will open on Tuesday, September 5. An appointment is not needed, however, parents/guardians will be contacted prior to a student being treated.

The outreach clinic is not a free service and the patient's insurance will be charged

according to the insurance plan they have in place and all copay requirements will apply.

Cassville R-IV School District Superintendent Dr. Richard Asbill said having a health clinic onsite for students, staff and families will provide a convenient alternative for non-emergency healthcare needs.

"Our number one focus is the safety and well-being of our students and staff. The fact is, if you are not feeling well, it is hard to make learning a priority in the classroom," said Asbill. "The onsite clinic is a team effort between Cassville R-IV and Mercy and we are excited to make this a reality for our district. We believe the clinic will ensure our school family has access to quality healthcare in a timely manner, allowing them to focus on learning and providing a quality educa-

The Mercy outreach clinic will be offered in addition to the DirectConnect Telemedicine service that is currently available for students and staff at Cassville Schools through a collaboration effort with Cox Health. - Minors may additionally be subject to a Minor in Possession citation resulting in license suspension for 90 days for first offense. This is in addition to any suspension resulting from point assessment on an alcohol conviction.

The Southwest R-V Board of Education meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. on August 17, 2017. During the opening, the meeting was called to order, there was a roll call of the board members, and the meeting agenda was approved.

The annual Tax Rate Hearing was the first thing on the agenda. The assessed value of the Southwest R-V School District, \$39,256,844, was presented by the superintendent. The school district's assessed valuation increased by \$2,433,195 from 2016-2017. This will increase the Fund I revenues by \$66,913 for Fund I for the 2017-2018 school year. Of this amount, \$8,108 is from new construction and improvements while \$58,805 is because of the reassessment.

After the presentation of the Tax Rate information by Superintendent Tosha Tilford, the public was given an opportunity to make comments. The board voted to set the Fund I or Operating Levy at \$2.75. The suggested tax rate was \$0.08548, but the board also approved the roll back of \$0.0048 and set the Fund III or Debt Service Levy

The board adjourned from the Tax Rate Hearing and the regular meeting was called to order.

The consent agenda was approved by the board. This included the approval of the minutes from the July meeting, approval of the bills, and approval of resignations, reassignments and new hires. Pertaining to personnel, Byron Stephens was approved to be a substitute teacher, Georgiann Hendrix was approved to be a substitute custodian, and Sue McNabb was approved to be a substitute cook. Since Sara Ledgerwood resigned her position, Taylor Mettlach has been reassigned from substitute teacher to a middle school para-professional. In addition, Tyler Ferguson resigned as assistant baseball coach, and Jeff Dickson was approved to fill that opening.

Related to old business, the board of education approved the amended 2017-2018 budget. New Business included the annual approval of the Report of Special Education Department regarding IDEA Assurance Statement, Special Education Compliance Plan, and Proportionate Share Plan. As part of the Special Education Compliance Plan, the board approved the acceptance of Young Child with Developmental Delay (YCDD) as an eligibility category for children ages

Tom Lawrence's monthly maintenance report was reviewed, and the superintendent report was presented.

Tosha Tilford's monthly superintendent report included:

- Beginning of School Year: The Southwest R-5 School District has had a smooth start to the 2017-2018 school year. Classes began on August 9 and have been going well. Busing has gone well. Cafeterias are running smoothly. The building principals appreciate Mr. Ferguson doing the bus discipline. He has instituted bus rules, assigned seats and routines for the drivers to follow when they have a bus referral for a student.
- Back-to-School Dinner: On August 7, the board of education sponsored a Back-To-School Family Dinner. The teacher and families have expressed their thanks for the dinner, and how much they enjoyed that time together after open house.
- Building Project: The middle school gym is on schedule to be turned over to the district the beginning of September and possibly the end of August. Junior high girls' basketball is practicing at the high school gym in the mornings before school and junior high boys' basketball is practicing at the high school gym of the evening.
- Van Purchase: The district has received two quotes for vans. One is from Les Jacob's Ford in Cassville and the other one is from Fletcher Dodge in Joplin. The board of edu-

cation approved the purchase of the Ford 2018 Transit Passenger Wagon XL: 10 Passenger Van from Les Jacobs.

• Parents As Teachers: Samantha Coupland is our current PAT coordinator. She services nine families with 12 children.

Required to hold 12 group meetings as well as the home visits. The requirement is four home visits per child with more required depending on special needs. Each meeting is one hour long. Sam is a full-time teacher, and this is the maximum number she can service with her teaching duties. The board determined that a second PAT facilitator was needed. The position will be posted in-house first. If there is no interest, it will be open for public applications from qualified individuals.

- Billy Schell Donation: It was part of Billy Schell's estate plan that the school district receive half of the sale of his vehicle (\$6,750) and half of the sale of his camper (\$7,500). This donation totaled \$14,250. Once the funds are allocated, there will be an article in the newspaper. Tosha Tilford, Superintendent, has already personally called Anne Schell Ennis to express our extreme thanks and appreciation.
- Solar Eclipse: The district has purchased 1,000 pair of the CE certified viewing glasses so that all students and adults can have them to view the solar eclipse. These glasses are certified and have been delivered. A permission sheet was sent home with the elementary students. If it is cloudy, we will not go outside. If a student refuses to wear the glasses, they will be required to stay or go inside.
- Bread: Harps grocery store in Seligman has given the district an excellent price on bread. The district has been able to stop the contract with Bimbo Bakery. The prices from Harps are excellent and could save the district around \$100 per week on bread costs. In addition, we are keeping district funds local.
- Additional Bus Route (Reinstatement of the Short Route): Transportation Director, Keith Hendrix, has moved students and has adjusted the routes, but with the addition of the pre-school on the bus plus some larger boys, some of our buses may not be at capacity by numbers but are by students in seats. The board agreed that the reinstatement of the short route was needed. There will be between 45-50 students on each bus if we re-instate this route. Right now, this is considered a temporary route that Josie Stubblefield will be driving. Data will be collected so a decision on making this a permanent route can be made in the future.
- Southwest R-V Endowment Fund: The Southwest R-V Board of Education agreed with the Community Foundation of the Ozarks establishing the Southwest R-V Educational Endowment Fund. Programs funded by the Education Fund could make a difference in students' lives by providing opportunities that otherwise might be unavailable to them. This need is especially great considering the effect of the national economic crisis on public school funding. Private funding has become even more important to our school district as state funding has declined.
- Certified Staff Handbook: The board was informed that a certified staff handbook has been implemented for the 2017-2018 School Year. It was reviewed at the beginning of the school year. The purpose is for certified personnel to know the district expectations, policies, etc. so that there is more consistency throughout the district.

There was a closed session to discuss personnel.

The meeting adjourned at 8:16 p.m. The next regular board of education meeting is September 14, 2017, at 7 p.m. in the Southwest High School Library.

Bourbon virus and other tick-borne diseases in Missouri

The Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS) has been notified by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) that a Missouri resident has tested positive for Bourbon virus infection. The case did not involve any travel outside of the state, indicating that exposure occurred in Missouri. The Bourbon virus belongs to a group of viruses called Thogotoviruses. Based on genetic similarities to other Thogotoviruses, there is a possibility Bourbon virus is transmitted by ticks.

Not much is known about the virus since it was first discovered in 2014 in Bourbon County, KS. DHSS staff, including local public health authorities, and the CDC are currently collecting ticks in Missouri for Bourbon virus testing. This will help to determine what the health risk is to people who are bitten by ticks. The CDC, with help from Missouri, Kansas and other states, is looking for additional patients who may be infected with the Bourbon virus. The investigation also involves laboratory scientists who are working to develop a test for the virus that can be used by doctors and laboratories.

Known symptoms of Bourbon virus include fever, headache, body aches, rash and fatigue. Most people have a full recovery from tick-borne disease. However, DHSS statistics indicate that people over age 50 and those with chronic health problems are more likely to develop a serious illness that can lead to complications.

Avoiding exposure to ticks is critical to the prevention of tick-borne disease. Beyond staying away from brushy areas and long grass where ticks hunt, the best practice to avoid tick bites is to use a repellent with a minimum of 20% DEET. Keeping lawns cut short and trimming shrubs and trees to increase sunlight can help make these areas less hospitable for ticks. People with outdoor pets should talk with their veterinarian about

using an effective parasite prevention treatment.

In addition to preventing bites, prompt removal of ticks can help prevent disease:

- · Using tweezers, grasp tick near its mouth and as close to your skin as possible.
- Pull tick firmly, straight out, away from skin. Do not jerk or twist the tick.
- Do NOT use alcohol, matches, liquid soap, or petroleum jelly to remove a tick.
- Wash your hands and the bite site with soap and water after the tick is removed. Apply an antiseptic to the bite site.

Bourbon virus testing is only available from CDC in certain circumstances and is still in the beginning stages of development. This means that testing must be approved by CDC, and other health conditions must be ruled out first. Providers with questions about Bourbon virus testing can contact DHSS at (573) 526-4780 or (800) 392-0272(24/7).
