Local Rep. Scott Fitzpatrick to be youngest state budget leader

Last week, local State Representative Scott Fitzpatrick (R-Shell Knob) became the youngest state budget leader in the United States at age 28. Speaker of the House Todd Richardson (R-Poplar Bluff) appointed Fitzpatrick to the be the next chairman of the House Budget Committee.

Richardson released a statement stating, "Scott has impressed me and his colleagues on both sides of the aisle with his understanding of the extremely complex budget process, and his willingness to stand up and fight for the fiscally responsible spending priorities of House members. In what was a difficult situation in the final days of budget negotiations, he proved he can get us across the finish line with a balanced budget that responsibly invests in the priorities shared by all Missourians without raising taxes."

Richardson continued, "Scott has already proven he can excel in this position and I am confident he will build on his success by working with a new governor and new legislators to protect and wisely invest our tax dollars."

Fitzpatrick is replacing former chairman Tom Flanigan (R-Carthage) who is not seeking re-election.

Richardson also appointed Representative Marsha Haefner to the committee.

Fitzpatrick said that budget concerns have been his focus since he was elected to his first term. "It's been my focus since I've been there. Constitutionally, it's the one task we have to complete no matter what else we do. We could do nothing else as long as we pass the budget. I think it's the most important thing we do each year, and it interested me most."

Fitzpatrick has served on the budget committee since his first term. He was vicechair his second term. He said, "Generally, people are only chairman of the committee in their last term, but I have a unique opportunity to serve in my third term."

As part of his budget duties, he hopes to fully fund the K-12 education foundation formula and pay off the state general obligation bonds. He said, "My goal is that before I leave the House of Representatives that I'll be able to accelerate the payment of the debt that we'll have zero balance of the general obligation bonds by the time I leave office."

He added that he also hoped to increase state employee pay to give Missouri a more competitive edge. "Missouri has the

Officer involved shooting in Barry County

One suspect is in the hospital after an officer involved shooting early this morning, August 31, in Barry County. According to Barry County Sheriff Mick Epperly, the pursuit began in Lawrence County and ended near McDowell.


CHS Wildcats win home opener, 27-6

South Barry County Ambulance District reduces property tax levy

CHAIR SAYS IS AN ACT OF "GOOD FAITH" TO VOTERS

The South Barry County Ambulance District (SBCAD) Board announced last week that they've voluntarily reduced the property tax levy on residents by more than 50 percent. According to board chairman Ken Cieslinski, the decision was an act of "good faith" to voters, who passed the ambulance district sales tax in April 2015.

The property lax levy that funded the SBCAD was 0.081 before the board voted to reduce it to 0.331. Cieslinski said, "We've rolled back as much as we could. Legally, we haven't brought in enough sales tax to abolish it, but we reduced it better than 50 percent." He said the board hopes to eliminate the property tax levy altogether in 2017.

After voters approved the 1/2-cent sales tax in the April 2015 election, the SBCAD planned to roll-back the property tax levy entirely. The district also put the district tup for ambulance provider bids, as well, resulting in Mercy taking over the contract in March 2016, saving \$94,500 annually

over what CoxHealth was being paid before.

Thanks to the additional funds, the district has replaced two of the ambulances, both of which had over 300,000 miles on them, as well as obtaining new life-saving equipment, such as cardio monitors and defibrillators. Cieslinski said if the finances hadn't changed, the district would have not been able to make the upgrades that needed to happen to keep the service running. He said, "It would have been insolvent by 2018."

However, now the financial picture has improved to allow the district to replace ambulances, equipment and also remodel the Shell Knob ambulance station. The District was able to obtain the building, which was owned by Central Crossing Fire Protection District, at no cost. Cieslisnki said, "We can't sell it or anything, but we acquired it and it cost us nothing."

The remodel included fixing bathrooms and garage doors and making it usable by staff.

HOW MUSIC MAY IMPROVE HEALTH

Plato said, "Music gives a soul to the universe, wings to the mind, flight to the imagination, and life to everything." Music often communicates messages that are not easily expressed, which is one reason why music is such an integral part of so many people's lives.

While many people love music for its entertainment value, there is growing evidence that music can be good for overall health as well. A study from researchers at the Cleveland Clinic focused on the use of music for brain surgery patients who must be awake during their procedures. Researchers found that music enabled the patients to manage anxiety, reduce pain and relax more fully during their procedures.

In a study titled, "The effect of music intervention in stress response to cardiac surgery in a randomized clinical trial," a team of Swedish researchers measured serum cortisol, heart rate, respiratory rate, mean arterial pressure, arterial oxygen tension, arterial oxygen saturation, and subjective pain and anxiety levels for patients who had undergone cardiothoracic surgery. Those who were allowed to listen to music during recuperation and bed rest had lower cortisol levels than those who rested without music.

Many doctors now play music while operating or enable patients to listen to music to calm their nerves during in-office procedures.

According to Caring Voice Coalition, an organization dedicated to improving the lives of patients with chronic illnesses, music has also been shown to enhance memory and stimulate both sides of the brain, which may help individuals recover from stroke or those suffering from cognitive impairments.

Music also can have a positive impact on mood. Neuroscientists have discovered that listening to music heightens positive emotions through the reward centers of the brain. Music stimulates the production of dopamine, creating positive feelings as a result.

Some researchers think that music may help improve immune response, promoting faster recovery from illness. Undergraduate students at Wilkes University measured the levels of IgA - an important antibody for the immune system's first line of defense against disease - from saliva. Levels were measured before and after 30 minutes of exposure to various sounds, including Macedonia Free Will Baptist presents award for perfect attendance



Labor Day is coming, don't drink and drive

One decision can change everything. Each day, lives are drastically changed or lost in preventable traffic crashes caused by someone's choice to drive while impaired. Drivers continue to choose to break the law by driving impaired, putting thousands of travelers at risk every day.

Holiday weekends bring a surge in impaired driving, so this year's Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over highvisibility operation will run August 19 through the Labor Day holiday on September 5.

Driving impaired isn't just about alcohol. A person could also be arrested for driving under the influence of illegal drugs such as cocaine, marijuana, other controlled substances or even prescription medication.

"Impaired driving continues to be a huge concern on Missouri roadways," said Colonel Bret Johnson, superintendent of the Missouri State Highway Patrol. "We will continue our yearround efforts of enforcing Missouri's DWI laws and, through this campaign, create public awareness to the dangers substance-impaired driving causes on our highways. Our goal is for all drivers to get home safe every day."

Statewide, law enforcement made 389 DWI arrests, 26 DUI drug arrests and 13 drug influence arrests during this campaign in August and September of 2015. Many

substance-impaired drivers are under the age of 21. From 2013-2015, there were 53 fatal crashes and 144 serious injury crashes involving a substance-impaired driver under the age of 21 in Missouri. There were 64 people killed and 202 seriously injured in these crashes.

Consider some of the consequences if you choose to drive impaired:

- If you cause a fatal crash while intoxicated, you can be charged with involuntary manslaughter a felony resulting in up to seven years of prison time, a \$5,000 fine or both.
- Your license can be suspended for 90 days on your first conviction. You could be fined up to \$500 and spend up to 6 months in jail.
- A second conviction results in a yearlong revocation of your license. You could be fined up to \$1,000 and spend up to one year in jail.
- Any person guilty of a second or subsequent intoxication-related traffic offense will be required to install an ignition interlock device on their car before reinstating driving privileges.
- Minors may additionally be subject to a Minor in Possession citation resulting in license suspension for 90 days for first offense. This is in addition to any suspension resulting from point assessment on an alcohol conviction.

Barry County Judicial Circuit recognized for excellence

On behalf of the 39th Judicial Circuit, Chief Juvenile Officer Jill Braden and Lawrence County Associate Circuit Judge Scott S. Sifferman accepted the Permanency Award from Supreme Court of Missouri Judge Mary R. Russell during a special ceremony Tuesday, August 30, at the Lawrence County Courthouse in Mt. Vernon. This is the fourth time the 39th circuit, which includes Barry, Lawrence and Stone counties, has received the Permanency Award.

The Permanency Award is given to circuits in recognition of excellence in service to children and families by achieving standards for timely hearings in fiscal 2015 in child abuse and neglect cases in which children removed from their homes are to be reunited

with their families or are to be placed in another permanent home as soon as possible.

"As public servants, we will be remembered by how we protect our citizens, including our children," Russell said in presenting the award. "It is disturbing how many thousands of children - through no fault of their own - find themselves as wards of the court because they have been abused or neglected and need to find a permanent home as quickly as possible.

"This award, now celebrating its 10th year, is a testament to the leadership and hard work of judges, juvenile officers, clerks, children's division workers, Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) and other support staff," Russell said. In the decade since the Court instituted the awards, the timeliness of hearings throughout the state has increased by an average of 5 percent. Of the nearly 51,000 required hearings held in fiscal 2015, 97 percent of them were held on time. The 39th Circuit was one of an increasing number of circuits that held all hearings on time.

The hearing time frames apply to six types of hearings and vary depending on the type of hearing. For example, when a child is taken into protective custody, an initial hearing must be held within three business days, the allegations must be proven within 60 days, and a disposition entered within 90 days.

If the child remains in protective custody, the court must hold periodic reviews until the child is

reunited with its natural parents, is adopted or another permanent placement is made. These time frames were developed based on recommendations from the Commission on Children's Justice.

In evaluating what circuits qualify for the permanency awards, the circuits first were placed in size classes based on the total number of hearings that were due to be held during a particular time period. A circuit then had to achieve either 100 percent timeliness each quarter or an average of 100 percent annually to qualify.

The 39th Circuit is one of 18 judicial circuits to receive the award for fiscal

Parks, Soils and Water Sales Tax -Let's Keep a Good Thing Going

More than 7,800 state parks are scattered throughout the United States. Missouri has 88 of them. They are all gems and some have been consistently recognized nationally. USA Today readers voted Ha Ha Tonka State Park one of the top 10 state parks in the U.S. in a 2015 poll. In 2014, Active Times listed three Missouri State Parks — Johnson Shut-ins, Katy Trail, Ha Ha Tonka — in their Top 36 Stunning State Parks. After visiting 100 state parks, Midwest Living put Ha Ha Tonka, the Katy Trail, Meramec and Sam A. Baker state parks in its list of 35 great Midwest state parks.

Our state has many natural wonders to show off, and keeping all of those trails and facilities in shape so people can enjoy them requires money. Much of the funding for Missouri state parks comes from a onetenth-of-one-percent sales tax implemented in 1984. The Parks, Soils and Water Sales Tax is up for renewal on November 8 and chances are good that, for the fourth time in 30 years, voters will vote to continue it. It's a nobrainer. A National Parks and Recreation poll found 92 percent of Americans say their communities benefit from local parks. Four in five people in the same poll agree local parks are worth the tax dollars spent on them.

Unlike in other state park systems, Missourians and tourists pay no entry fee to use our state parks. The sales tax ensures everyone has free and equal access. Another poll conducted for the Nature Conservancy shows Missourians take advantage of that free pass, with 44 percent saying they visit state parks a few times and year. Only 7 percent

never visit our parks.

There are many reasons to say "yes" to the onetenth-of-one-percent sales tax. Conserving soil, protecting our water, preserving natural habitats and honoring our cultural heritage are strong motives to continue the progress made over the last three decades. Perhaps the best reason is to create memories. John Moll of Hazelwood was found recently trout fishing at Bennett Spring State Park. Although he regularly camps at Missouri parks, he hadn't been fishing at

Bennett since he was 15, many years ago. Wearing his waders and fishing vest, Moll talked about wearing only deck shoes and shorts back then, and how cold the spring water was. He enjoyed sharing the memory like he enjoys our state

At campgrounds and hiking trails, on rivers and lakes, memories are created every second by those enjoying the beauty of Missouri state parks. Missouri has a good thing going with the Parks, Soils and Water Sales Tax. Let's keep it going.







The second stop at 3:30 p.m. will be south of Exeter off of MM. A & W Brooks Farm with Phillip and his children Audra and Will features 220 breeding females. The forage is primarily Kentucky 31 fescue with some

"The Brooks have followed their cattle in the feedlot, being sold on video auctions and sold direct off the farm. A key feature in the farmstead is a corral under roof with several fans to provide relief in hot weather. The farm's cattle records were developed with their banker's help," said Cole.

The final stop will be Schallert Brothers Farms, just west of Purdy on State Road B, then north on Farm Road 1055. Their operation embraces family and modern technology that works. It is a Century Farm with fescue and 900 to 1000 head of stocker cattle a year.

"The Schallerts pioneered the use of anhydrous ammonia to treat fescue stubble hay in southwest Missouri. They use row crops and small grains to convert Kentucky 31 fescue to novel varieties of fescue," said Cole.

Barry County native, Marissa Tucker, has accepted the offer to serve as Barry Co 4-H Youth Program Assistant for University of Missouri Exten-

Tucker, a 2012 alumni of Cassville High School, is eager to return home from Missouri State University where she studied general agriculture and agriculture communications. She earned a Bachelor of Science in July 2016 after returning from Australia's study abroad program.

"As a former 4-H member, I know the importance of this organization and the impact it has on the youth and community of our county," states Tucker. "I look forward to seeing the 4-H clubs grow and change in Barry County."

There are currently three 4-H clubs in Barry County: Exeter Trailblazers, Purdy Screeching Eagles and Wheaton Wranglers. Additionally, there is interest in creating new clubs and reviving an old

"There are many people in this area who remember growing up in 4-H," says Tucker. "4-H isn't just about livestock and foods anymore," she states. "It has grown to involve subjects like computers and programming, global education and robotics, which is fantastic. Often, kids don't know they're interested in a subject until they experience it for themselves, and 4-H gives them the opportunity to discover new subjects."

Tucker knows a little about the long-term effects of 4-H membership as well.

"Although I didn't really come out of my shell until my junior year of high school, 4-H really gave me the basics of expressing myself and motivated me to discover new things on my own. Sometimes I would find myself in a challenging situation in high school or at Missouri State. and I would remember that I had experienced something like it before in 4-H. Public speaking wasn't scary for me at all!"

Tucker is excited to see how Barry County 4-H will change in the future.

"4-H is about growth," she states. "If you don't grow, you never discover the great things you can accomplish. I don't think we have to worry about that with Barry County

At its Aug. 26 meeting in Co-

lumbia, the Missouri Conservation Commission gave initial approval of proposed regulation changes by the Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) related to smallmouth bass and rock bass, also called goggle-eye.

The proposed regulation changes create a standard 15-inch minimum length limit for smallmouth bass and a daily limit of one for all Smallmouth Bass Special Management areas. They also expand these areas on the Big Piney, Jacks Fork, Big, and Meramec

The existing minimum length limit for smallmouth bass of 12 inches and daily limit of six fish remain for Missouri streams other than those of Smallmouth Bass Special Management areas.

The proposed regulation changes also set a statewide length limit of seven inches for rock bass (also called goggleeye, warmouth, Ozark bass, and shadow bass) and remove the Osage Fork of the Gasconade River from the Rock Bass

Special Management areas.

The proposed regulation changes are based on extensive scientific research related to bass populations and harvest and consideration of public input received during nine public meetings held by the Department.

The next step in the process for these proposed regulation changes is a 30-day public comment period beginning in October after publication in the Missouri Register. Anyone may file a statement in



Succession gardens extend bounty to fall

Succession gardening gives gardeners a second harvest, often more flavorful than the first, savs University of Missouri Extension horticulture specialist David Trinklein.

Succession gardening simply means that as one crop is harvested and removed from the garden, a second is planted in the area vacated.

Gardeners are able to reap top rewards from valuable garden spots with a second crop. The process is relatively simple and holds the prospect of paying big dividends, according to Trinklein.

August is best time to start this process, Trinklein said. Unfortunately, as temperatures soar in late summer, interest in gardening plummets for many.

For those gardeners willing to brave the elements, a number of steps should be taken when practicing succession gardening.

First, pull spent plants and clean the garden bed of debris and weeds. This will help with insect and disease management. Disease management tends to be a bigger problem in fall gardens than in the spring.

For additional insect control, some gardeners use floating row cover to keep insects from being able to get to plants, Trinklein says. Row cover is a translucent and breathable polyester fabric. It is relatively inexpensive and available at most garden centers.

Next, work the soil lightly and add a general purpose, garden fertilizer such as 5-10-5 or 12-12-12. If the soil has been productive, the application of additional fertilizer might not be necessary.

The garden is now ready to be planted.

Some local greenhouses

carry fall vegetable plants but many do not. So you might need to start plants from seed in many cases. Choose varieties based upon days-to-maturity date. Look for vegetables that can withstand a light frost of about 26 degrees.

Consider lettuce, spinach, beet and other cool-season vegetables such as broccoli, cauliflower, kohlrabi, collards and kale. Remember, however, the greater the tolerance of a plant for cooler weather, the less affinity for heat, Trinklein says. Therefore, timing is extremely important.

Other choices include frost-tender plants that mature quickly. Green beans, summer squash and bush cucumber are examples of the latter.

Trinklein suggested these techniques:

• Plan a schedule. Review frost dates for your area. Read information on the back of seed packets or plant care tags for days-to-maturity informa-

- Choose the right crops. As the season advances and weather becomes cooler, crops tend to take longer to mature than during the summer. Choose disease-resistant varieties that mature quickly or crops that are frost hardy.
- Sow seeds deeper in the summer and keep garden soils moist. The sun's late summer heat dries out soil quickly. Lettuce is an exception and should not be covered.
- Water tender seedlings frequently until they become established.
- For frost protection in the fall, the aforementioned floating row cover can help to extend the growing season by several weeks.
- Scout often for insects and diseases. If present, practice IPM control measures.
