## Table Rock makes difference in assessed valuations

County Clerk Barry Gary Youngblood and Stone County Clerk Judy Berkstresser completed their aggregate assessed evaluations of all property in their respective counties. A public hearing was held in Barry County, and the Stone County Commission will hold its public hearing on Tuesday, September 16, according to the legal notices published in the August 28 issue of the Stone County Republican/ Crane Chronicle

To compare the two counties with the 857 miles of shoreline of Table Rock Lake (the dam is located at the east Stone County line just over in Taney County) we have obtained information on the effects of Barry and Stone County 2014 County tax col-

Roughly one-third of the lake is located in Barry County and two-thirds in Stone County.

For comparison, Barry County is comprised of 773 square miles. Stone County has 451 square miles. A state estimate for the 2013 population of Barry County is 35,597 and Stone County with 32,202.

Yet Stone County has a total assessed valuation of \$564,408,662 while Barry County has a total assessed valuation of \$442,984,371.

Each of the municipal subdivisions (such as ambulance districts, road districts, school districts and various subdivisions of the county government) sets their own levies which will be applied

## Southwest Schools advance technology use

To keep up with the demands of modern technology and learning, Southwest Schools implemented one-to-one technology for students at the middle school and high

school levels this year. The move, according to Superintendent Bob Walker, is to improve instruction.

The one-to-one technology initiative refers to each individual student having access to a tablet or notebook during school. Walker stated, "Technology has become so much more a part of our students' lives, it is only logical to assume when it is used correctly, it can enhance learning." High school students each have Chromebooks to use during their school day, and middle schoolers use Promethean Kuno tablets. A final decision is yet to be made on what will be provided for the K-4 students, according to Walker. Elementary students still have access to the computer lab and workstations set up in the individual classrooms, as well until the switch is made.

The total project cost the district approximately \$255,000 for the notebooks and tablets. The Chromebooks were \$320 each, and the Kuno tablets were \$500. Those prices also included the storage and charging carts. Currently, the policy for use is for high school classrooms to be equipped with the Chromebooks and students use them in each room. For the middle school students, they are each assigned a Kuno at the beginning of the day, then return it during final hour. As it stands, students are not allowed to take the technology home to use. Walker said that the cam-

### Drug bust yields marijuana plants in Seligman

An anonymous tip last week led to the arrest of one man after officers found eight marijuana plants growing outside his trailer in Seligman. Kenyon Ray Johnson, 60, was taken into custody on charges of possession of a controlled substance with intent to distribute and two counts of possession of a controlled substance. Johnson is currently held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of \$17,087 bond.

According to Sheriff Mick Epperly, Deputies Chris Hutson and Alvin Zabala were dispatched to assist Seligman Police Officer Ray Earnest to investigate a tip made regarding a drug operation. Epperly stated, "When they arrived on the property, Johnson had the marijuana plants just growing right there by the trailer." Officers confiscated eight plants that were each seven to nine feet tall during the search on Wednesday, August 27, around 10 p.m.

Once officers received consent to search the residence on Fair Street in Seligman, they also found several marijuana pipes in Johnson's

bedroom. He was found to be in possession of two glass pipes that field tested positive for the presence of methamphetamine, as well. Johnson has a previous criminal history.




### Teen seriously injured after run over by car in Wheaton



A two car wreck on Highway 37 near Purdy resulted in eight people injured on Thursday.





Healy racked up 151 yards on the ground on 28 attempts, including a 20-yard touchdown on the first play of the fourth quarter that put the game out of reach. He was deadly through the air too, completing seven of nine for 181 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

Mountain Grove controlled the line of scrimmage and the clock, finishing the night just three seconds short of doubling up Cassville in time of possession, 31:57 to 16:03.

The Wildcats, impressive in their initial outing against Aurora, played solid at times but lacked the consistency to stay with the Panthers. Gabe Kirk was brilliant in the first quarter but disappeared from the stat sheet in the second half following Mountain Grove's defensive adjustments. Chase Jackson was just a yard shy of the century mark, but 60 of his 99 yards came on one long touchdown run.

Throughout the game,

the Panthers came up big in critical situations, while the Wildcats failed to convert.

Turnovers, dropped passes, missed assignments, a safety, all of these factors combined equalled a long night for the Wildcat Nation.

With all the hype surrounding the first home game and being featured on KY3's Game of the Week broadcast, the Wildcats were pumped for the chance to prove themselves against the stateranked Panthers. Healy led Mountain Grove on a 9-play, 73-yard drive to open the scoring. On fourth-and-11 at the Cassville 34-yard line, he delivered a laser to a wideopen Seth Akers for a touchdown. The two-point conversion gave Mountain Grove an 8-0 lead with 7:05 left in the opening quarter.

The Panthers gambled with an onside kick attempt that gave Cassville possession on the Mountain Grove side of midfield. Gabe Kirk carried on three consecutive plays, gaining 15, 24, and then 7 yards to reach the end zone. Kendal Branham's kick pulled Cassville within a point at 8-7, with 6:25 on the clock.

After holding the Panthers to a rare punt on the following possession, Cassville took the lead.

Leigh Cox returned Blaine Halford's punt to midfield to set up Kirk and the offense. On third-and-4 at the 44, Kirk flipped a pass in the right flat to Cade Pendergraft. The senior wideout found a seam down the sideline, broke inside the hashmark and was finally brought down inside the 5-yard line. A penalty against the Panthers put the ball a yard shy of the goal line.

Running from the wishbone formation, Chase Jackson plunged in to score on second down to give the Wildcats the lead. Although the PAT failed, Cassville went in front with just 20 seconds left in the first quarter, 13-8.

But the second quarter left the Wildcats shaking their heads. Both teams wasted long drives to start the period. Healy fumbled deep in Cassville territory, and the Wildcats came up short on fourth-and-8 at the Mountain Grove 35-yard line.

Two plays later, Trystan Short shot off right tackle into the Cassville secondary and eluded the defense on a 60-yard scoring run. Healy scored on a successful two-point conversion, and the Panthers regained the lead, 14-13, with 4:24 left in the half.

The Wildcats fumbled the ball away on the ensuing kickoff, but the defense stopped Short on fourthand-1 at the Cassville 24-yard line to douse that fire. But Cassville failed to move the chains, and Kirk took a safety after a bad snap on the punt play, and Mountain Grove led 18-13 at halftime.

Jackson's 60-yard scoring sprint on the third play of the third quarter gave the Wildcats their last lead at 19-18.

The Panthers struck quickly to regain the lead. On the 10th play of a drive that

began at the Mountain Grove 25-yard line, Healy found Halford open on a hitch-and-go pattern. The glue-fingered senior hauled in the pass and raced into the end zone to complete the 38-yard scoring play. The PAT failed, but Mountain Grove had a 24-19 lead with 5:27 left in the quarter.

Cassville could not cross midfield on the next crucial possession, and Kirk's pooch-kick rolled dead at the Mountain Grove 11-yard line. Trailing by just one score, the Wildcats badly needed a stop. Instead, Healy raced 79 yards to the Cassville end zone on a second-and-13 play. A penalty erased the touchdown, but the Panthers still had a first down in Cassville territory. Four plays later, on the first snap of the fourth quarter, Healy ran 18 yards on a quarterback draw to create the final score of 30-19.

Mountain Grove's Panthers, with only 36 players in uniform, showed that they

really do belong in Class 3.

The loss left Cassville with some questions to answer with some tough games looming on the schedule.

"We did not execute to the same level or with the same intensity as last week," said Cassville's Lance Parnell after the game. "We weren't the most disciplined team on the field tonight."

Cassville (1-1) will host the McDonald County Mustangs (0-2) on Friday, September 5. Kickoff is set for 7 p.m. at Wildcat Stadium.

#### Southwest School track nears completion

Southwest Schools is in the final lap of completion on the school's new track. Located behind the high school, the project will allow the students there access to an actual regulation track oval, something they have never had at the school before.

Superintendent Walker stated, "Coaches have managed the best they could over the years, measuring off distances on difficult-tofind level areas for kids to train and practice. Beyond this, athletes would have to travel to Cassville to work out. Understandably, having the facility on campus will be much better. In addition to convenience, kids will have a greater chance of reaching

their potential as track ath-

The school secured funds for the project out of the general revenue building fund. To date, Walker said that the district has spent \$350,000 on the project. He stated, "We anticipate additional items such as fencing, a synthetic surface and security lighting, but we have not bid these out yet." The completed aspects of the project are land development, a drainage system, and the 400-meter oval and field event areas covered in asphalt. The district has also had the area dirt work completed and seeded.

Boys and girls track and field teams, cross country and physical education courses will all utilize the track on a regular basis. Walker stated, "In addition, the track will be available to the residents of our school district who desire to exercise, limited to talkers and joggers, of course."

Walker concluded, "There are several reasons for deciding to pursue this project. Obviously, our track kids have been at a big disadvantage in not having a workout facility. Physical education classes have had limited space for outside activities. Finally, transforming a piece of unsuitable property into a safe exercise area should be beneficial to the health of many others outside of our student body."
