Two Barry County Century Farm Families recognized

Since 1976, more than 8000 century farms have been recognized as a result of the Missouri Committee of Agriculture co-chaired by James B. Boilot, director of Missouri Department of Agriculture, and Elmer R. Kiehl, Dean of the College of Agriculture University of Missouri. The committee wanted to organize a celebration of the American Revolution Bicentennial and one activity was the Centennial Farm project, which awarded certificates to persons owning farms that had been in the same family at least 100 years. The College of Agriculture, Food and Natural Resources and the University of Missouri Extension planned a 10 year update in 1986 called Century Farm Program. This

program has been sustained as a yearly event with over 100 farms recognized each year.

This year, two Barry County farms were recognized: Shoal Creek Farms, owned by Deanna Burch, and Stumpff Farms, owned by Charlene Phillips. These farms met the requirements eligibility for recognition of Century Farms by having a minimum of 40 acres of the original farm that has been in the same family for at least 100 years and are still functioning as active farms.

A recognition celebration was given on September 1 at Edmonson Park hosted by the Barry County Extension representatives of the University of Missouri Extension including: Shon Bishop, a horticulturist from Lincoln

Driver in officer-involved shooting dies from injuries

An Aurora man who was shot by an Aurora Police Officer last Wednesday succumbed to his injuries yesterday, Tuesday, September 6, while in the hospital.

According to a Missouri State Highway Patrol release, Thomas E. Sekscinski, 38, of Aurora, was being pursued by an Aurora Police officer in the early hours of Wednesday, August 31, which continued

into Barry County. Sekscinski then allegedly turned down a private lane along Barry County Road 1156 near McDowell.

When the officer stopped and exited his vehicle, Sekscinski then turned around and drove toward the officer. The officer then discharged his weapon at Sekscinski, hitting him. The officer took him into custody and began administering first aid until medical

personnel arrived, according to the Highway Patrol press release.

Sekscinski was transported to Cox South Hospital in Springfield following the incident. He remained there until he passed away yesterday.

The investigation is ongoing by the Missouri State Highway Patrol Division of Drug and Crime Control

procedure, such as stitches or a pelvic exam, it'll cost an additional \$25, bringing that total up to \$100.

The urgent care hours are reserved for people needing sick treatment, not for people with chronic medical conditions, like hypertension or diabetes, etc.

Dr. Roark added, "It's just for sick visits. It's for those people who say, 'I'm sick, and I can't get in with my doctor."

Washburn man arrested for multiple area burglaries, firearm thefts

Multiple charges were pressed against a Washburn man after stolen firearms and other items were recovered. Levi Gene Slye, 34, is charged with three counts of receiving stolen property, two counts of burglary in the second degree and one count of theft of a firearm.

Slye's charges originate from three different incidents, one that involved the alleged theft of equipment from the Exeter Corn Maze.

According to affidavits of

probable cause, Slye was in possession of a stolen Heritage .22 caliber revolver from a residence in Seligman. The owner noticed the firearm was missing on August 3. Slye had pawned the revolver at a pawn shop.

Slye is also credited with another burglary at the Exeter Corn Maze. According to the affidavits of probable cause, Slye stole multiple chainsaws, sawsall, portable radios and other items worth more than \$500 from an outbuilding at the Exeter Corn

Then, on August 28, Slye allegedly broke into a residence in Barry County near Cassville on Farm Road 1090. The report indicated Slye stole a video camera, ammunition, archery equipment, a compound bow and other items. He also allegedly stole at least five firearms. When Slye was arrested on September 1, he was in possession of the stolen items.

Slye is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$55,000 bond.

Work begins on Mark Twain roads near Cassville

The work on Forest Service Road 187 will involve 1.03 miles of the road beginning on the west end and then proceeding on selected portions of approximately first two miles of the road. The road work will involve removing select hazard trees along the road, reconditioning the driving surface, ditches, outlets and culverts and in applying surface aggregate.

The road work on Forest Service Road 197 is similar in scope. It will involve 1.22 miles of the road beginning at Highway 112 and then proceeding on selected portions of approximately the first 1.5 miles of the

road. The road work will involve removing select hazard trees along the road, reconditioning the driving surface, ditches, outlets and culverts, and in applying surface aggregate. In addition on the 197 road, ledge rock will be removed from the driving surface and ditch lines as necessary and three culverts will be installed and/or replaced.

The reconditioning done on these roads will help

provide a safe and reliable transportation system for the public as well as benefiting the long term maintenance of these roads. Travelers on these roads might encounter delays and should plan accordingly. The work is scheduled to begin on Forest Service Road 187 on approximately September 7, 2016. Both projects are scheduled to be completed by late fall 2016.

Cassville downs East Newton, 42-16

The Cassville Wildcats won a 42-16 battle with East Newton on Friday night, but it was not the kind of victory that they expected. The Wildcats were efficient on offense but sluggish on defense, allowing four long, time-consuming drives and a pair of touchdowns.

Cloudless skies and cool temps combined to create perfect weather for the game at Wildcat Stadium. "Fat boy weather" Steve Reid called it. It was an ideal setting for a big home victory.

But after the emotional win over Reeds Spring in week 2, it just looked like Cassville took the win over East Newton for granted. To be honest, East Newton has not been competitive with the Wildcats - or anyone else -in a very long time.

Twenty wins in twelve years. Eight of those wins came in the only winning season in that span, leaving just a dozen wins for the other eleven years. The Patriots went 0-10 in both 2011 and 2012. The victory over McDonald County in week 6 of 2013 prevented a third consecutive winless season and ended a 32-game losing streak. A stirring overtime win over Diamond staved off another potential "ohfer" season in 2014, but then the Pats went 0-10 in 2015.

But even though the Patriots have started the 2016 season 0-3 against Lighthouse Christian, Lamar, and Cassville, there is an obvious difference between this team and its immediate predecessors. Head Coach Jamie LaSalle has East Newton pointed in the right direction. Physically stronger, mentally tougher, and intent on winning, these Patriots are primed to climb out of the cellar.

The Patriots could have folded early when Kyle Ruark blocked Jason Schriever's punt on the game's opening possession. The Wildcats scored in just five plays following the miscue, with River Phelps ducking behind Ruark for a 10-yard touchdown run. Cassville led 7-0 with 6:15 on the clock.

East Newton drove the field, moving the chains twice while advancing from their own 24 to the Cassville 30-yard line. But Chance Liveoak slipped down on a 4th and 3 carry to end the potential tying drive.

The Wildcats answered with a 67-yard scoring drive. On the fourth snap of the possession, Shannon Haney rifled a pass to Phelps, who surged down the field for a 29-yard gain to the East Newton 25-yard line. Phelps dove into the endzone from just inches away as the second quarter opened, and Cassville held a 14-0 lead.

A sense of urgency

There comes a point in every game when the coach of the losing team has to recteam to have a chance to win, the entire field becomes fourdown territory. Reeds Spring did not have that sense of urgency in the loss to Cassville. East Newton had it in spades on Friday night.

Trailing by two scores on the road in the second quarter, East Newton ground out a long game-changing scoring drive against the Wildcats. 70 yards. 14 plays. 7 minutes and 5 seconds off the clock. TWO fourth-down conversions. These Patriots looked like New Englanders on a very impressive posses-

> But Cassville regained control in a heartbeat. River Phelps cut back to avoid a traffic jam on a power sweep to the East Newton sideline, and won the sprint to the pylon to finish a 61-yard touchdown run. He added his third PAT of the night to boost the Cassville lead to 21-8 with 3:23 left in the half.

The Patriots sputtered on a three-and-out possession, and Phelps returned SchrieNewton 36-yard line. The Wildcats gained just four yards in three plays, and faced a 4th and 6 situation with the clock running out.

Another Phelps PAT pushed the lead to 35-8.

But East Newton would not go away.

The Patriots drove 73 yards against the Cassville defense. They converted two fourth downs along the way, and the 32-yard touchdown pass from Liveoak to Jordon came on a 4th and 14 play. East Newton went to a trick spread formation for the PAT and Liveoak ran in untouched to create a 35-16 score with 2:13 remaining on the third quarter clock.

The Wildcats finally put the game away with a drive

that finished the third quarter and consumed a third of the fourth quarter clock. An onside kick attempt failed to cover the required 10 yards, and Cassville started at the East Newton 49-yard line. A 51-yard drive, aided by a fourth down pass interference call in the red zone, ended with Ruark barreling into the end zone from two yards out. Another Phelps PAT created the final score of 42-16.

Lance Parnell was gracious in victory, praising the job that LaSalle is doing at East Newton.

"That is a much improved football team," he told the Wildcat huddle after the game. "We can't take anyone for granted. We must step on the field ready to play."

The Wildcats improved to 2-1 with the victory, and go on the road Friday night to play McDonald County at Anderson. Kickoff is set for 7 PM.


