# Drug trafficking charge for Purdy man allegedly receiving meth deliveries

# OFFICERS SAY BOXED MAILED VIA USPS CONTAINED OVER A POUND OF METH

A Purdy man was charged with drug trafficking after a search warrant yielded over a pound of methamphetamine delivered to his home on Farm Road 1095. Guadalupe Urbina Rodriguez, 71, is charged with trafficking drugs in the second degree - over statutory amount.

According to the affidavits of probable cause, Rodriguez was the subject of a narcotics warrant served at his Purdy home. Officers with the Ozarks Drug Enforcement Team (ODET) and the Barry County Sheriff's Department worked with the United States Postal Service (USPS) on a package delivery that coincided with the search warrant execution on Friday, August 31.

An inspector with the USPS delivered a package to Rodriguez's residence. The package was addressed to Jose Nunez. When asked, Rodriguez identified himself as Nunez and accepted the package.

Officers with ODET and the Barry County Sheriff's Department listened to the exchange between Rodriguez and the USPS inspector via a cellphone in the inspector's pocket. After delivering the package, the inspector left and Rodriguez sat under a tree with the package, according to officers.

When they made contact with Rodriguez, he was sitting with a loaded .22 caliber rifle. Inside the package, officers found 478 grams of crystal methamphetamine. When interviewed, Rodriguez told officers he had received multiple packages for Nunez but would not say when or where Nunez picked them up. He also allegedly told officers he is paid in cash on the 20th of each month for no reason.

Rodriguez's wife was also interviewed. She allegedly told officers she did not know of anyone named Jose but that two women met with her husband after packages were delivered.

When the inspector looked up a historical check on Rodriguez's address, he showed 12 packages delivered since April 2018. Six were over a pound and six were just under a pound.

Commander Chad Allison, with ODET, said the methamphetamine found by officers was worth approximately \$47,000. The Cassville Police Department's K-9 unit assisted with the investigation.

Rodriguez is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$100,000 cash-only bond.

# \$25K donation to Butterfield Fire means new equipment

A generous donation made to the Butterfield Fire-fighters Auxiliary means the fire department will have new life-saving equipment. First State Bank made a donation of \$25,000 to the auxiliary, and that money will go to purchasing new extrication equipment for firefighters to use in vehicle crashes.

According to auxiliary member Staci Dilbeck, they were surprised about the donation. She said, "We received it out of the blue. We are planning on using the funds for extrication equipment. That's what we are in dire need for."

Butterfield fire chief Donnie Privett said the extrication equipment will be a huge asset to the department. He said, "This is a monumental purchase for the department. This is huge for us. The purchase of the extrication equipment was one of my main goals when I became chief in January."

Dilbeck said the auxiliary's main function is to support the firefighters within the department. Usually that means on-scene support through meals, water and Gatorade when they are on a long fire call. This year, both the department and auxiliary have been extremely busy, and a large donation makes that equipment attainable.

Privett said, "We're already at 122 calls so far this year. Normally, we do 75 to 80 all year."

Dilbeck said the auxiliary is excited about the new equipment which has already been purchased and should

be delivered in mid-October. "They have not had any new equipment in years," she said.

Privett said, "We have a combination tool right now. We've never had a full set of actual extrication equipment. Without it, we're waiting an extra 20 or 30 minutes to cut someone out of a car. We are waiting on Cassville, Purdy or Wheaton to bring it."

All of the 26 Butterfield volunteers will be trained on the equipment by the company before it is delivered. Privett said, "The company will offer training. The trainer will sign off that everyone in the department knows how

to use them before we receive them. Most of us are already certified on extrication and vehicle rescues. But he'll go through each individual volunteer and give training on these specific tools."

The auxiliary was excited to make the purchase. Dilbeck said, "We are there to support them."

Dilbeck has been a member of the auxiliary since 2014 and they currently have nine active members. She said, "It takes all of us working together to support the fire department."

The auxiliary also hosts a chili dinner in March and

a country breakfast in June. She said, "We do that for the community and let them see the improvements we've made to the fire department in the last year like the loft, a place for storage, rescue truck, etc.; things to serve the community better."

First State Bank did not have a specific reason for the donation to the auxiliary. Landon Fletcher, bank vice president, said the founder of the bank was originally from Butterfield and they wanted to give back to the community.

# Exeter man charged with gun threat

An Exeter man is in jail after allegedly pointing a semi-automatic handgun at a relative. Andy Allen Breeden, 41, of Exeter, is charged with domestic assault in the third degree and unlawful use of a weapon.

On Tuesday afternoon, August 28, the Barry County Sheriff's Department was dispatched to a residence on Front Street in Exeter for a victim who feared Breeden would kill her. When officers arrived, the victim said Breeden, a relative, pointed a gun at her and said "get out or I'll kill you," according to the affidavits of probable cause. The gun was a Ruger SR45 .45mm semi-auto-

Officers described Breeden as acting in an angry and intoxicated manner, and that the victim feared for her life. The victim told officers, while shaking and crying, that if something was not done, Breeden would kill her.

Breeden is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$25,000 cash-only bond.

The Community Pantry, located at Cassville United Methodist Church, serves as a rural partner affiliate and distribution site of the Diaper Bank of the Ozarks based in Springfield. are a basic necessity that many households go without. Diaper need occurs when a family does not have enough of a supply of diapers on hand to adequately keep their babies and toddlers clothed in clean and dry diapers. Although government programs such as WIC and SNAP are in place to help low income families with other needs, they do not cover or assist with the essential need of diaper supply.

One in three of our Barry County children live in a home earning less than 100 percent of federal poverty level. This means one in three children you encounter every day are potentially part of a household struggling with diaper needs. Many parents of infants and toddlers cannot afford to buy enough diapers to secure their babies' healthy growth, cleanliness and wellbeing.

In order to participate in the workforce, parents of young children are required to supply a childcare provider with diapers. If parents are unable to handle the supply required by the childcare site, this missing resource will prevent them from working or attending school. The environment of a household without enough diapers suffers on many levels

resulting from crying and discomfort, and health risks for babies. How well can the adult members of a household manage when their babies cannot sleep through the night due to soiled and dirty diapers? The disruption in the home from lack of sleep and the resulting health risks for everyone can trickle down to create other adverse consequences in the family environment.

Help the Cassville Community Food Pantry keep Cassville babies healthy and happy by supporting its diaper outreach.



a.m. Both Keeney and his


passenger, Judith E. Kenney,



# Cassville preys on Springfield Catholic, 34-7

The Cassville Wildcats "came home and took care of business" on Friday night, in the words of head coach Lance Parnell. Cassville played a near-flawless game while handing a 34-7 defeat to Springfield Catholic at Wildcat Stadium. Shannon Haney ran for over a hundred yards and two touchdowns, and the Cassville defense stymied Tyson Riley and the Fighting Irish offense in the Big 8 Conference match.

After Catholic outdueled Seneca 50-42 in week one, the Springfield media quickly anointed the contest at Cassville as the game of the week. Things were a little crowded on the sideline with camera crews and talking heads competing for space and sto-

But the Wildcats took all the hype and scrutiny in stride, and methodically

beat the Irish in every phase. After a turnover fest against Aurora, Cassville did not gift the ball to Catholic on Friday night. A week ago, Aurora was effective returning kicks against Cassville. Catholic's special teams had few opportunities as Drake Reese drove four of his six kickoffs into the end zone for touchbacks.

But the Wildcat defense was the story of this game. Highly recruited Irish quarterback Tyson Riley could not replicate the magic he created against Seneca. Riley had 19 carries for 268 yards and three touchdowns against the Indians but totalled less than half that yardage and did not score against the Cats.

Seneca is not Cassville.

Prior to the contest, the alumni from the 1998 district championship were introduced at midfield. The Wildcat marching band performed the national anthem

while the flag flew at half mast in honor of the late Senator John McCain.

The Wildcats took the field with a startling new look: gold uniform pants paired with the new black jerseys. It is a vivid contrast to the traditional old-school black-on-black.

The teams sparred cautiously, trading punts on their opening possessions. Chase Wieberg creased the line for a 25-yard gain to give the Irish a first down at their own 48-yard line. But Riley fumbled on the next play and the Wildcats recovered at midfield.

#### Bombs away

On the first play after the turnover, wideout Ethan Hoppes took a reverse pitch from Haney, pulled up in the backfield and launched a bomb down the Wildcat sideline for a wide open DJ White. White had to wait for

the pass, but still had time to easily race into the endzone for the game's first score. Reese drilled the PAT, and Cassville led 7-0 with 6:05 left in the quarter.

The Wildcats scored again on their next possession. Bowen Preddy took a 48-yard screen down the Irish sideline to cap a fourplay, 83-yard drive. Reese's kick was no good, but Cassville's big-play offense had built a 13-0 lead with 2:23 on the clock.

Then, Catholic's Zach Gebhard fumbled in the final minute of the first quarter, and the Wildcats recovered at the Irish 24-yard line.

Anthony Tolbert took over at tailback and crashed the line for 5 yards and then 10 on his first two carries. The Catholic defense stiffened and denied Logan Carlin the goal line on third and goal. With a full backfield behind him in the wishbone set, Haney drove behind his line for the third Cassville touchdown. Reese converted the PAT, and the Wildcats owned a 20-0 lead at halftime.

Irish score, Wildcats answer

The Wildcats struggled through a three-and-out to open the third quarter, and then Riley led the Irish on a 54-yard scoring drive to pull the visitors within 20-7 at the 4:08 mark.

But Cassville answered quickly. Haney broke containment on a quarterback draw and raced 54 yards to paydirt. Another Reese PAT pushed the lead to 27-7 with 2:38 on the clock.

#### Moment of truth

Reese's deep kickoff was returned but only to the 16-yard line. Facing a 4th and 5 at the 25-yard line, the Irish had to make a hard decision.

When a team is trailing big, there comes a point in the game when they must score to have any hope of winning. Facing a big deficit and a relentless clock, punting almost becomes the same as surrender. While a successful drive doesn't guarantee a win, it is the first step in climbing a steeply curved

But Springfield Catholic punted.

#### The drive

The Wildcats started the next possession at their own 32-yard line after the Irish punt with less than a minute remaining in the third quarter. Haney authored a 16-play, 68-yard drive that burned 9:55 off the game clock. When Tolbert bulled into the end zone from a yard out, only 4:43 remained to be played in the fourth quarter.



# Barry Electric team places in Lineman's Rodeo, raises funds for international program

The Association of Missouri Electric Cooperatives hosted its Second Annual Lineman's Rodeo Aug. 28-29 at the association's headquarters in Jefferson City. The event — designed to let linemen show off the skills they use on the job — also raised funds for future projects that send Missouri linemen to developing nations to build power lines for people living without the benefits of electricity.

Gov. Mike Parson visited the event Wednesday morning and spoke with the linemen on the importance of their work abroad.

"It truly does make a difference," said Gov. Parson, who is a member of Southwest Electric Cooperative. "When you hear those stories, it makes you proud to know that we are doing things for a higher cause than just those of us back home. We're trying to help other people across the country who don't have the utilities that we take for granted every

The governor also commented on workforce development, an initiative he plans to make central to his administration. He told the linemen there is a critical need for more workers to fill a growing number of technical jobs in Mis-

The two-day event consists of team and individual competitions in the apprentice and journeyman divisions. Some of the challenges include the Hurt-Man Rescue and Modified Pole Climb. Linemen were also faced with a 100-question knowledge test and mystery events they had little time to prepare for, such as changing out transformer arrestors. Competitors are judged on how safely they complete each challenge. Individual times are only used in the case of a tiebreaker.

"Safety is always the first concern for co-op crews when they head out to work," said AMEC's Craig Moeller, who organized the event and also leads Missouri's International Program. "The Lineman's Rodeo is a great opportunity for them to practice the challenges they face every day and reinforce the training they need to get home safely."

The AMEC Lineman's Rodeo is a fundraiser for inter-



Supplies of type O positive, O negative and A positive blood are at less than normal

CBCO strives for area blood reserves to be at around a three-day supply for all blood types. At the time of this release, the blood center reserves show a less than two-

# Cash rental rates change little in 2018 MU survey

Cash rental rates for Missouri cropland changed little, according to a newly released survey from University of Missouri Extension. Pastureland rental prices ticked upward

The survey helps landowners and farmers find trends in rental rates for cropland, pastureland, grain bins, farm buildings and fee hunting. The survey covered criteria such as location of land, yield potential of land, storage facilities, fencing and types of roads leading to land.

Survey results were for 48,000 acres of cropland, a small portion of Missouri's 9.8 million acres of rented agricultural land, according to MU Extension economist Ray Massey. USDA reports that 35 percent of Missouri farm-

MU conducts the survey every three years. This was the first year that MU administered the survey electronically.

Massey says the rent survey is "one piece of information that landowners and farmers can use to determine fair rates." Other factors include supply of and demand for land in a locale, productivity of land, and market prices.

"The MU guide is simply that," he adds. "It's a guide. Both sides in negotiations can see the rate for which farmers are renting land. It's a starting point and should not be the sole basis for determining your rent."

Rent for row-crop land averaged \$146.81 per acre with a low of \$50 and a high of \$305. Irrigated row-crop land rented for about \$50 per acre more than dry cropland an average of \$196.43. Good pastureland netted \$40.74 per acre, with rents ranging from \$12 to \$100 per acre. Rent for timber pasture was the lowest, averaging \$28.13 per acre.

# Missouri high schools challenged to drive safely and buckle up

Calling all Missouri high schools to compete in the 2018 "It Only Takes One" campaign for an opportunity to win prizes for your school while educating young drivers about safe driving habits and safety belt use.

It's important that teen drivers realize it only takes ONE text, ONE drink, ONE call, ONE reach, ONE distraction to cause ONE fatal moment but that ONE clicked seat belt could be the difference between life or death in a car crash.

"Nearly seven out of 10 young drivers and passengers killed in 2017 Missouri vehicle traffic crashes weren't buckled up," said Jon Nelson, executive committee chair for the Missouri Coalition for Roadway Safety. "Through education, competition and fun, the 'It Only Takes One' campaign can make a difference with young Missourians and save lives."

Traffic crashes are the leading cause of death for people 15-20 years old. Research indicates that driver distractions are the primary cause of fatal collisions. In addition, one of the greatest risk factors faced by teens is

the number of passengers in the vehicle. Studies have confirmed that with the presence of just one passenger, teens are twice as likely to be involved in a fatal crash.

The program consists of two surprise safety belt checks at each high school to measure student safety belt usage and also includes creative educational campaigns that promote safe driving throughout the school year. In addition, schools have the opportunity to submit a 30-second video spot aimed at encouraging their peers to buckle up and drive safely.

Grant funding prizes are awarded to schools with the most creative and impactful educational campaigns and public service announcement. The grant funding will be used to further educate the students on the importance of safety belt use and safe driving habits. Statewide recognition will be awarded with a banner to schools with the highest safety belt usage






