After the Cassville Chamber of Commerce announced the superhero theme for this year's famous Chili Cook-Chamber Director Mindi Artherton decided to reach out to the schools for a logo design for their promotional materials and event t-shirts. After Cassville High School students had time to complete their designs, the Chili Cook Off committee voted and selected the design created by senior Kelsey Roney.

Artherton originally approached the business teachers at Cassville High, Chelsea Powers and Shelley Henderson, to see if they had students who would be interested in doing the design. Henderson felt that their Advanced Computer Applications would be the best fit. Henderson stated, "We do this kind of thing anyway in this class, but we moved it up to fit with their schedule. The students had ten days to work to submit their final designs."

# Purdy Council considers body cameras, sidewalks

The Purdy City Council had its regular monthly meeting on Monday, September 8. After a call to order and roll call of council members, the council quickly moved to approve the minutes of the August meeting and voted to pay the city's current bills.

The Council then heard the city's department reports. Ted McIntire gave the report for the Public Works Department. He told the council the city's water efficiency was at 76 percent for August and also spoke to the council regarding the fact that the sidewalks on the side of Highway C end before reaching the railroad crossing on either side. The council voted to extend the sidewalks to the railroad crossing.

The council also heard from Police Chief Jackie Hendrix, who discussed the possible mandate of Purdy Police to wear body cameras as a result of the events in Ferguson. He told the council he would look into

securing grant money to cover the expense, and that the expense would need to be figured into the department's budget. Hendrix said he would hold off on purchasing the cameras until they were mandated.

In addition to the cameras, Hendrix discussed with council some altercations that had occurred in August, including an arrest for the theft of transmissions, an intoxicated driver who resisted arrest, and a juvenile who left school without permission and was taken back to school. He also discussed how juvenile cases were handled as opposed to cases involving adults.

The council discussed taking bids on painting the plane in the Purdy City Park, and voted to hold off on having it painted.

The council then went in to executive session to speak with Chris Erisman from Allgeier Martin and Associates regarding the city's sewer system. After executive session, the council adjourned.

### **Cassville Council debates insurance issues**

At Monday night's Cassville City Council meeting, health insurance premiums were a hot topic with the City's policy up for renewal. Other important topics included changes at the Cassville Municipal Airport and community concern over the city Police Department's sovereign citizen training.

Council members heard from Shawn Mayr, of Connell Insurance, regarding changes for the city's policies. Health insurance is expected to go up significantly because of changes to health requirements. insurance Mayr said that it is possible that this is the last year that the City will be able to stay with their current plan with Anthem Blue Cross because of changing requirements. Mayr stated, "This could be the last year to continue with Anthem, but we won't know until next year when the new regulations come out."

Alderman Terry Heinz was concerned about accepting the insurance quote because he didn't feel the City had gone out for bids properly. Heinz stated, "It's a violation of our policies. We are excluding any insurance agent in Cassville or anyone else from bidding."

Council member Ann Hennigan stated, "This resolution is not related to the insurance agent, it is just whether or not to accept Anthem." After an initial tied vote with Hennigan and Jan Anthony voting in favor of accepting the insurance bid and Heinz and Jerry Marple

in opposition, Mayor Bill Shiveley broke the tie with a nay vote.

City Clerk Darelyn Coo-

per and Deputy City Clerk Jennifer Evans brought it to the council's attention that if they did not accept the bid for insurance, it would cause the employees' insurance to lapse and would require them to pay a double premium from their checks in November. At that point, Heinz made a motion to approve the resolution to accept the insurance bid with an amendment to seek a Request for Qualification from various insurance agencies in the future. The amendment passed with yea votes from Heinz and Marple and nays form Hennigan and Anthony with Shiveley breaking the tie. Finally, the council approved the health insurance resolution with Heinz's amendment.

Two other guests addressed the council members after being introduced by Steve Walkensky, Director of Public Works. Danny Hendricks and Doug Rands of Southwest Missouri Aviation, wanted to meet the council and discuss their plans at the City Airport.

The two men have a flight school as well as a the beginnings of a flight club. Hendricks stated, "A flight club is basically a partnership between 15 people who share two airplanes. They fly at cost and everyone shares in the expenses. It's so much more affordable than owning a plane." The men currently rent a hangar for mainte-

nance at the airport with plans to expand in the fu-

Rands stated, "We want to grow our business as the need is there." Hendricks added, "We like Cassville. That's why we're here. We want a slow, small growth. We're not here to change anything, just a slow, incremental growth for people who want to fly. We want to retire here."

The plans to bring the flight club will bring new interest to aviation in Cassville. In the last month, the fuel sales at the airport have nearly doubled, according to Walensky.

Hendricks concluded, "You're about to see a lot of interest come to the airport. We wanted you to know who we are before any rumors start about our plans here."

Finally, the council heard from Tracy Lannum, of Cassville, questioning the decision to host training by the Police Department on sovereign citizens. Lannum began by asking the council how much the city paid for the training. The training event was just over \$600, according to Police Chief Dana Kammerlohr.

Lannum stated, "It's a political belief, just like Republicans, Democrats, Socialists... It isn't against the law to have a political belief. I'm a sovereign, are you going to arrest me?"

Lannum went on to comment about the nature of the trainer, former West Mem-

The personnel at SW School were very friendly, and greeted the children by first name- a wonderful thing that says they are personally interested in their education and well being.

We were not expecting a full fledged breakfast, knowing it was more of a social event. The lunchroom staff were great and enjoyed their interaction with the children and grandparents. The breakfast was well served, a good choice of drinks-juices, milk of several varieties, and cleanliness of the lunchroom.

The teacher of our grandchild was courteous and friendly, showing a genuine interest in her students. The classroom was neat, well organized, and the children were extremely well behaved, also very courteous.

What really brought us to tears was what our grand-child said when we were being served the meal. As we all know, an eight-year old child will speak what they are thinking. As we entered the serving area our grandchild commented "WOW, they are serving the really good food this morning." If what we were served was the really good food I would not like to see the regular food.

The food was good, just not plentiful or filled with the energy foods a child needs. It met the guidelines of the requirements the school is forced to serve. There was a small slice of watermelon-sweet and tasty, a few pieces of cantaloupe - also good. There was also a fresh glazed, donut. The juices and milk selections were fresh and cold.


I can say with some certainty that the multi-millionaires that set the policies in

This year's superherothemed Chilli and Salsa Cook Off will be held on Saturday, October 25.





### Two Barry County families earn Century Farm Family awards

Two Barry County families earned the distinction of Century Farm Families this year in a ceremony by the Missouri Farm Bureau University of Missouri Extension Office and University of Missouri College of Agriculture, Food and Natural Resources. Two families, the Kaisers and the Washicks, were honored on Thursday night at the Memorial Park pavilion in Cassville.

Each family had 80 qualifying acres of the original land purchased by their fam-

ily at least 100 years ago. For the Kaisers, of Purdy, their 80 acres were originally purchased by great-grandparents John D. and Aguste Bucholz, German immigrants, on June 3, 1914. Duane and his wife Colleen still run the farm today after hitting the 100 year qualifying mark.

The Washick family, of Pierce City, have 130 years of ownership of the same property. Mike and Jean still use the property for cattle and chicken houses. Mike's great grandfather, John Washick, purchased the land on December 6, 1884. Washick said, "We still have the original log cabin on the farm. I hope some day to give the land to my son John."

Schnakenberg, Agronomy Specialist, Stone County and interim County Program Director for Barry County, said during the opening ceremony, "It's such an accomplishment to have farms with 100 plus years of ownership in the same family. We are honored to have them with us today." According to Schnakenberg, the Extension has kept

records of Century Farm Families since 1976, and approximately 8,000 families have been awarded the title since then. This year, the Washicks and Kaisers are part of 232 families accepted by the program for 2014.

To qualify for the distinction, a single family must have owned a farm of at least 40 acres for 100 consecutive years and the land has to be part of the original acquisition and still make a financial contribution to the overall farm income. The line of ownership must come from an original settlers or buyer through children, grandchildren, siblings, and nieces or nephews, including through marriage or adoption.



### Iceman fires up Cassville students at assembly

"I believe no one is born a winner or a loser. I believe everyone is born a chooser." J. D. Anderson, also known as "The Iceman" for his world record in breaking ice blocks, told the students from Cassville Middle and High Schools during an assembly on Friday.

A native of Noel, Anderson was a contestant on the show "America's Got Talent," where he reached the quarterfinals before being eliminated. He has since appeared on "The Tonight Show with Jay Leno," "Red or Black" and "The Daily Show with John Stewart." At the assembly, he spoke about the students' power to determine the course of their lives through the choices they make.

Anderson's presentation was a combination of feats of physical strength, humor and positive thinking. He began by calling down a student volunteer, who checked several of the items Anderson would either break or rip apart. Once the student had verified that none of the items were weakened or rigged in any way, Anderson went to work. He demonstrated his strength in several ways, including ripping a license plate in half with his teeth, bending a steel rod, rolling up a frying pan and breaking a Louisville slugger.

After completing the demonstrations, Anderson spoke to the students about making choices and the







consequences they could have. He encouraged students to avoid drugs and alcohol, saying, "The coolest students aren't the ones who get drunk or high. The coolest students are the ones who don't drink or do drugs." He told them about a 14 year-old who died of alcohol poisoning after drinking a half-bottle of whiskey over a \$5 bet, a young man who signed with the NBA, only to die immediately after snorting cocaine for the first time, and a boy who chose to drive home drunk while transporting two passengers, only to wind up in an accident which killed him and one of the passengers and broke the other passenger's back.

He also reminded the students that they always have value, no matter what they have done or been through in life. To illustrate this point, he borrowed a \$20 bill from a student. He then stomped on it, crumpled it, wiped it under his armpit, and sat on it before returning it to the student.

Each time he abused the bill, he pointed out to the students it had lost none of its worth; it was still a \$20 bill. After finishing the presentation, Anderson signed autographs for the students.

Students had high praise for Anderson's presentation. Jessica Haney, a junior, said, "I thought he was really cool and I liked what he had to say." Gabe Kirk, a senior, said "I liked the way he pumped up the crowd and got everyone involved. When he crumpled up the \$20 bill and it still had the same value, it showed everyone else in the crowed no matter what people say to you or do to you, you're still the same."

For his part, Anderson said he enjoys speaking to students. "I just love motivating the kids," he said, "and I see the impact the message can have on the kids. I've gotten tons of letters from kids on Facebook and tons of handwritten letters and thousands of emails saying 'Hey, thanks for coming. You've inspired



### Wildcats blank Mustangs 35-0

The Cassville Wildcats scored on their first two possessions and went on to claim a 35-0 shutout victory over McDonald County on Friday night at Wildcat Stadium. Gabe Kirk, the double-threat quarterback, ran for 133 yards and two touchdowns, and threw for 128 more and a pair of scores as the Wildcats improved to 2-1 on the season.

The Mustangs failed to score against the Wildcat defense for the second time in three years. Friday's 35-0 score was preceded by routs of 45-0 and 45-7 in 2012 and

Lance Parnell's team controlled the line of scrimmage in the first half and played a "bend but don't break" style to protect the shutout in the second half. A running clock helped limit the Mustangs to just four snaps in the final quarter of play.

three and out on the game's opening possession, and then Chase Jackson punished the Mustangs with a 32-yard scoring dash on Cassville's first play. With Kendal Branham gone due to a soccer conflict, River Phelps kicked the PAT to give the Wildcats a 7-0 lead with 10:26 on the first-quarter clock.

On the ensuing Mac County possession, a Jake Wood to Damien Monsalvo connection turned into a 36yard gain to the Cassville 39yard line. But the Mustangs fumbled the ball on the very next play, and Dylan Klewer returned the gift to the Mc-Donald County 31-yard line.


Five plays later, Kirk burst off right tackle to score from 14 yards out on a fourthand-6 play. Phelps was wide right with the PAT attempt, but Cassville held a 13-0 lead with 7:01 still remaining in the first quarter.

That score remained until McDonald County went midway through the second quarter. Phelps fair caught a Monsalvo punt at his own 28-yard line, and the Cassville offense went back to work. Five plays later, Kirk underthrew Cade Pendergraft on a fly route, but the senior wideout won a jump ball with the Mustang corner, and then broke away to complete a 56-yard scoring play. Phelps nailed the PAT and the Cassville lead grew to 20-0 with 6:08 left before halftime.

The teams traded possessions, and then the Mustangs pinned inside their own 20vard line, frantically tried to run out the clock before halftime. But Lance Parnell had guarded his timeouts like a dragon hoards gold, and his careful clock management allowed the Wildcats to take possession just short of midfield with 48 seconds left in

TD catch set up a successful 2-point conversion, and the Wildcats adjourned at halftime with a 28-0 lead.

The Mustangs came to life in the third quarter. The Mc-Donald County defense stiffened and denied a long Cassville possession, recovering a fumble in the shadow of the goal posts. Wood then led the visitors on a long drive from his own 4-yard line inside the Cassville red zone. But the Mustangs came up empty on fourth-and-4 at the 13-yard line, as the Wildcat defense protected the shutout.

Kirk then marched the Cassville offense 87 yards in spin for the touchdown that pushed the score within a point of the running clock. Phelps split the uprights again to reach the 35-point level with 6:56 to play.

"We talked about being physical, about playing wtih an attitude," Parnell told his circle of players after the contest. "This is the reward for all the hard work you put in."

The renewed emphasis on physicality showed in the game stats. Cassville running backs combined for 221 yards on 44 carries, and Kirk added 128 yards passing with his 6-of-9, no interceptions, throwing performance.

McDonald County gained 159 yards on 40 carries, and Wood was limited to 3-for-9 passing for 58 yards.

### Torjans baseball benefits from fall program

Fall baseball is back at Southwest. For the third time in school history, the school district has added fall baseball to provide student athletes the opportunity to hone their skills during the off sea-

Fall baseball first appeared on the Southwest campus back in 2001, when then-coach Jason Cole pushed to get it added to help revitalize a lagging baseball program. But Cole moved on to Exeter and interest waned.

"My first year here was 2003-04 and we did not have fall baseball," said Southwest Athletic Director and baseball coach Kenny Ferguson. "It was added back for two years in '08-'09 and '09-'10. In those two years we won our first conference title and played in two district championships, winning one which was also our first ever district title in baseball. It was then cut due to budget issues."

But Ferguson and a persistent parent base soldiered on, and eventually the district gained some traction

financially and saw fit to reinstitute the fall program.

Ferguson is very pleased with the turn of events.

"The reasons it was added back are really two fold; the budget is in a lot better shape and it evens out our competitive balance a little bit. Most all of our conference and district opponents have fall ball and that really puts us behind competitively. Playing fifteen or so fall games doesn't seem like much but when you add it up over an athlete's four year career, if someone is playing sixty or so more games than you, they have an advantage. I didn't ask for a raise in my stipend or anything if they would just add fall ball back."

Of the other schools in the Ozark 7 Conference, Exeter, Wheaton, and Purdy all play fall baseball. Verona just added baseball and may play next fall, and McAuley plays football.

While not a requirement, Ferguson expects his players to take advantage of the fall opportunity.

"I expect them to play both," said Ferguson. "We use the fall to try things like who can play where, who can pitch, etc. to prepare for our conference and district races in the spring."

While the games don't count toward a team's record in the spring, the coaches from the participating schools still place emphasis on winning those games.

"The games do not count in the conference race and, technically, they aren't supposed to count in district seeding, but they always get brought up when a better team get knocked off in the fall. It's hard to ignore a win," Ferguson pointed out.

The Southwest players have seized the opportunity.

"They are excited, we have wanted this for some time now. The boys really



### Goat, Sheep Grazing Academy Sept. 12-13

The 2014 Southwest Missouri Goat and Sheep Browsing and Grazing Academy will be held at the Crowder College Agriculture Department in Neosho on September 12 and 13. The conference starts at 2 p.m. on Friday and ends at 4 p.m. on Saturday.

"This workshop is for both beginning and experienced sheep and goat producers that want to use browse or management intensive grazing on their farm or ranch," Dr. Jodie Pennington, small ruminant educator with Lincoln University Extension. "Attendees will receive handson training in allocation of browse and forages for feeding and methods to maintain a healthy, sustainable group of animals."

Topics to be covered at the academy include fencing, waterers, calculation and allocation of sheep and goats to a specific amount of land, soil fertility, management intensive grazing, brush nutrition and supplementation, herd health management, business planning, contract grazing forages, livestock guardian dogs, browsing plans, and FAMACHA and body condition scoring.

Featured speakers include Dr. Steve Hart from Langston University, Langston, Okla., along with speakers from Lincoln University Cooperative Extension, Crowder College, University of Missouri Extension, NRCS, and a panel of area producers.

The cost for the workshop is \$45 per person and includes two meals, a manual of browsing and grazing materials, a FAMACHA card, and numerous educational handouts.

Preregistration payment is required by Sept. 9 and checks or money orders should be made payable to Lincoln University Cooperative Extension or LUCE.



### Barry County courts send 10 to prison in the month of August

• Damon T. Bennett, Monett, pled guilty to DWI-Alcohol as a persistent offender. He was sentenced to three years incarceration in the Department of Corrections with the execution of that sentence suspended.

The Monett Police Department stopped Bennett on April 20, 2013, for going 43 mph in a 25 mph zone where they found him to be intoxicated. His blood alcohol level was .0215 and also had two prior driving while intoxicated convictions on his record.

Bennett is to serve supervised probation until August 18, 2018.

• Sara Lavonne Birch-field made an Alford plea for forgery and theft/stealing of a credit/debit device. Birch-field was sentenced to four years incarceration with the execution of that sentence suspended and supervised probation for four years.

The Cassville Police Department investigated a stolen credit/child support card from a victim in Cassville. Officers found the card was used at Walmart in Cassville, as well as Ramey, Casey's, McDonald's, Sonic and Murphy USA between March 3 and March 28, 2013. Birchfield was identified on security footage by the victim who had been staying with Birchfield the weekend of March 1.

Birchfield is to serve probation until August 19, 2019.

• Christopher Cape Ford, Cassville, pled guilty to assault in the 2nd degree. He was given a suspended imposition of sentence, five years supervised probation, 100 hours of community service to be complete by August 18, 2016, and restitution.

On July 4, 2013, around 5 p.m., a man was beaten by Cope, Steven Hunter and Herman Thomas Tilford at the Washburn Prairie Cemetery, according to the affidavit of probable cause. The man was hit, kicked and stomped multiple times until he was incoherent and to the point of blacking out.

Ford is to serve probation until August 18, 2019.

• Cody Wayne Cherry, Purdy, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance on March 18, 2014. His probation has since been revoked and he is ordered to serve 120 days shock incarceration.

On January 4, 2014, the Cassville Police Department was assisted by the Southwest Missouri Drug Task Force to investigate a methamphetamine laboratory on Wayne Drive in Cassville. Cherry was at the residence with a gray backpack. Officers found tin foil with residue and cut straws in the bag. Cherry also had a marijuana pipe, methamphetamine pipe and a bag of methamphetamine on his person.

• Zackariah Walter Costlow pled guilty to damaging jail property from an incident stemming from 2010. Costlow was sentenced to 365 days in jail with credit for time served.

After being placed in jail for 12 hours for intoxication on December 8, 2010, Costlow, upset that he was in jail, climbed on the sink the broke the water sprinkler head off of the sprinkler system causing the Barry County Jail to flood.

• Lawrence Douglas Crabtree, Mt. Vernon, pled guilty to passing a bad check of \$500 or more. He was given a suspended imposition of sentencing and three years supervised probation.

Between the dates of May 25 and 27, 2013, Crabtree wrote checks to H and W Oil Co. knowing that they would not be paid. The checks totaled \$591.37.

Crabtree is to serve probation until August 19, 2017.

• Scottie L. Crow, Monett, pled guilty to possession of burglary tools, tampering with a motor vehicle in the 1st degree, possession of a controlled substance, and resisting arrest by fleeing. Crow was sentenced to four years incarceration on the possession of burglary tools charge from 2010, three years on the tampering charge from 2013, and four years for the possession of a controlled substance and resisting arrest charge, also from 2013.

Crow's initial arrest from February 20, 2012, Crow was found to have wire cutters and various tools in his Jeep along with a bag of copper wire. Officers found other bags of copper wire near Kelly Creek where the Jeep was parked.

On July 22, 2011, March 23, 2013, and March 29, 2012, officers found three different vehicle with screwdrivers in the ignitions. DNA evidence matched to Crow's.

On October 23, 2013, The Monett Police Department investigated Wellbaum Storage Units on Shaller Lane where Crow and another man were. Crow had a methamphetamine pipe in his hand, as well as methamphetamine, marijuana, alprazolam, 12 syringes, scales, and a variety of items that field-tested positive for the presence of methamphetamine. Crow fled on foot when questioned.

• Dakotah Gene Crown, Springfield, pled guilty to 2nd degree assault and DWI-Alcohol as a persistent offender and received an execution of sentence suspension on four years incarceration. He is to serve supervised probation for five years.

On March 31, 2013, Crown kneed the victim numerous times at the Farm Road 1165 Campground in McDowell. Then on February 9, 2014, the Missouri State Highway Patrol pulled him over for expired license plates and found that his blood alcohol level was 0.080 percent. He had prior convictions for DWI.

Crown is to serve probation until August 16, 2019.

• Aaron B. Dalton, Eagle Rock, pled guilty to nonsupport in excess of \$5,000. He received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years unsupervised probation.



### Exeter principal takes pies in the face for reading


