Cassville man arrested for allegedly

choking wife

A Cassville man was arrested over the weekend for allegedly choking his wife and pulling his four-year old out of a car. Anthony Frank Ramos, 30, of Cassville, was charged with domestic assault in the second degree.

According to affidavits of probable cause, Ramos was arrested after an incident on Monday, September 11, in which officers responded to a domestic assault. Accord-

Exeter man wanted for alleged assault arrested after wreck

An Exeter man, Steven Carl Thomas, 54, was arrested for an alleged assault after a Missouri State Trooper found him in a wrecked truck. According to the affidavits of probable cause, Thomas attacked a woman and her husband, causing her to fear for her

On Saturday, September 10, the Missouri State Highway Patrol responded to a call regarding a domestic assault on Missouri 76 in Barry County. The woman claimed Thomas had physically assaulted her and cut her chest with a knife as well as choking her husband. When the Patrol searched the area, the trooper found Thomas' truck wrecked along the side of the roadway with smoke coming out from under it.

According to the report, the trooper believed Thomas drove off the wrong side of the roadway


on a curve, overcorrected and then ended up in the ditch on the opposite lane. Thomas was still in his truck when the trooper

The trooper noted that Thomas was visibly intoxicated by his smell, speech and bloodshot eyes. Once Thomas consented to a breath test, it was determined that his blood alcohol level was 0.136 percent. According to the report, Thomas had multiple prior DWI convictions.

The victim of the alleged assault stated she would need to move because Thomas said he would come back and kill her. He also threatened to find the arresting officer's family.

Thomas is currently being held in the Barry County Jail on a \$40,000 bond. Thomas is charged with domestic assault in the first degree and DWI-Alcohol as a persistent offender.

Cassville Wildcats hang on to tame McDonald County Mustangs, 33-22

The Cassville Wildcats saw a two-touchdown lead dwindle to a scant 27-22 advantage before salting away their game against McDonald County with a late fourth quarter touchdown. River Phelps ran wild in the first half for the Wildcats, scoring three touchdowns in the opening quarter of play. But the Mustangs fought back and had a chance to take the lead late before the Cassville defense made a crucial stop.

With the exodus of Carl Junction, McDonald County is the only remaining Class 4 team in the Big 8 Conference. The Mustangs are the perennial enigma of southwest Missouri football, pairing rare wins with an embarrasing participation rate. Even East Newton has more players in uniform than Mac. The lack of depth cost the Mustangs against Cassville.

On a hot and muggy night, both teams saw players suffering from the heat throughout the contest. For all his first half heroics, Phelps spent most of the second half sidelined with apparent cramps.

The Mustangs took a quick 6-0 lead on the game's opening possession. A 43-yard hook and lateral ended with Shiloh Jackson racing down the left sideline untouched for the early

The Wildcats answered with an 8-play, 55-yard drive capped by a 17-yard Phelps sweep around left end for a 7-6 Cassville lead. Phelps scored on runs of 42 yards and 35 yards to boost the Wildcats to a 21-6 lead with two minutes left in the first quarter.

The Wildcats seemed to be in complete control as halftime loomed, but a disastrous shanked punt gave the Mustangs the ball at the Cassville 24-yard line.

Peyton Barton found Jake Will for a first down on a 4th-and-4 pass play to keep the drive alive, and then connected with Cole Delossantos on a short flag route for a 10-yard touchdown. The successful 2-point conversion cut the lead to 21-14 at half.

Cassville took the second half kickoff and drove the field, covering 52 yards in 8 plays to reestablish a doubledigit lead. Garrett Knight finished the drive with a three yard burst and Phelps added the PAT to give the Wildcats a 27-14 lead.

But the Mustangs were not finished. While Cassville owned the ground, rushing for over 300 yards in the game, McDonald County punished the Wildcats with a precision passing attack. Mac's big offensive line gave Barton plenty of protection

on a 17-play scoring drive that cut the Cassville lead to 27-22 with 8:39 remaining in the game.

Cassville's offense could not move the chains on the following possession, and the Mustangs took the field at their own 18-yard line with a chance to claim the lead following a Troy Rose punt.

The Mustangs moved the chains in two plays, but then the beleaguered Cassville defense made a stand. Barton was hurried on three straight incompletions and then was held to just 3 yards on a 4thdown scramble with 5:36 to play.

The Wildcats took advantage of a personal foul penalty to cover the short field. Shannon Haney sneaked into the end zone for the breathing-room touchdown, and Cassville escaped with the 33-22 victory.

Lance Parnell's team improved to 3-1 overall and 2-1 in the conference with the road win. McDonald County slipped to 0-4 overall. Cassville will host St. James in a non-conference game on Friday. Kickoff is set for 7 PM.





Howard is charged with possession of a controlled substance and is being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$10,000 bond.







A trip to remember

Every year, the Electric Cooperations of America sends two kids from every Cooperation on an all-expense paid trip to Washington D.C. The theme the year I went was "Freedom is Not Free." The first day in Washington, we met the other representatives for all 50 states.

There were over 2,000 juniors learning the lesson of life from the other side. While I was in Washington, I went to Arlington Cemetery where I learned first hand how many people gave the ultimate sacrifice so not only I, along with society, could do the things we take for granted. At Arlington, I found out that over 250,000 graves are there and over half are unknown. When I was told that, I cried for the families who don't know what happened to their relatives.

The next day we went to the Vietnam Memorial. The memorial was set up as a V rising from the ground. At the point of the V was the first and last names of soldiers met to signify the start and stop of the war. The first name was on the top left, then the following names went down and left. When the names got to the end, they rounded to the other side so that the first and last names touched at the middle.

While there, we met Mr. Adrian Lavallee, a Vietnam veteran who was touring the memorial for the first time. Mr. Lavallee went on the Honor Flight so he could see it. I asked for a picture with him and his friends and for their addresses. Mrs. Lavallee took the picture for me, and I promised them I would send the pictures I took.

One of the most interesting facts that I found out while in Washington was the ultimate sacrifice is not always death but living with the choices you have to made and the consequences of what other's think. While talking to Vietnam veterans, I asked them how their homecoming was after the war. What the told me broke my heart. They told me that when they stepped off the plane they were immediately called baby killers. This is one example of the consequences

of other's thinking.

I asked one last question of the veterans before I had to leave and that question was, "Do you regret fighting for America after your homecoming?" They looked at me shocked and answered me honestly when they said, "No, I was defending the defenseless and my family." The truest heroes are the ones that go do the work that most do not want to do and ask for nothing in return.

The next day, we went to the President Memorials where we heard about the sacrifices presidents face every day to help make America great. Franklin Roosevelt was a prime example of a great president for extreme sacrifices. He hid his disability because back when he was president people with disabilities were viewed as no good to society.

He was President through the Great Depression and instilled hope for a better future by having a weekly talk on the radio telling America what was going on and how he would fix the problem. He was a voice of reason and light during a dark time. The best part of visiting the Memorials of Mr.

Lincoln, Mr. Jefferson, Mr. Washington, Mr. Roosevelt, Mr. Grant and Mr. Eisenhower was seeing how much they influenced America and saw firsthand the effect they had on inspiring the hearts of America. Each Memorial was different, but I get the sense that it fit the owner's personality.

One of the tours we went on was to Monticello, the home of Thomas Jefferson. Mr. Jefferson had an extensive library that was only partially complete due to the fact that he donated to the Library of Congress for the simple fact that America needed the knowledge that his books contained. One of the greatest things about Mr. Jefferson's house was that in every room there were pictures of his whole family. There was also a copy of the Constitution in his library. My favorite fact about Mr. Jefferson was when he was dying, he would wake up just enough to ask if it was July 4th. He and John Adams died on the same day just three hours apart. How extraordinary is it that the second and third president died on the same day, hundreds of miles apart and just three hours apart.

On our final day before we went home, we had a list of people from around our area and had to find them on the memorial. I had two people from Rogers, Ark., as that was the closest veterans to Eagle Rock. One of the men I had to find was MIA; they have never found his body. The second person was a MIA that was later found. The soldiers I found were from the Vietnam War. When a person is considered MIA in the Vietnam War, they make a cross. When they are found, the cross becomes a star. If a soldier is not MIA, they get a star by their name to remember the sacrifice they endured.

When I got home from my Washington D.C. trip, I got started spreading the word. The locals have a potluck each month for the Eagle Rock people. I asked to speak to them about my experience and how the soldiers I met changed my life. I have heard from every veteran but Mr. Adrian Lavallee. I have tried to reach him to check on him, but I have not got a response as of yet.

In conclusion, freedom is not free. Someone has to pay for it whether in death or in living with what they had to do. This has been one of the hardest lessons I have learned. I know I didn't do much of that selfless character for those veterans, but I hope I gave them a little hope and respect that they truly deserve. This is my story of a wonderful trip and an eye opening experience. I hope you learned a little bit of the lesson as I have though this hard and unforgettable trip.


