Two life sentences plus 177 years for Washburn double-homicide **MURDERER'S SENTENCES DENY POSSIBILITY OF PAROLE**

The Arkansas man convicted of murdering a Washburn woman and her grandfather three and a half years ago was handed two life sentences without parole plus an additional 177 years incarceration last week. Christopher Paschall, 41, of Springdale, Ark., was found guilty by jury of two counts of murder in the first degree, three counts of armed criminal action and one count of parental kidnapping on September 28, 2017.

Paschall was sentenced by the honorable judge Jack Al Goodman in a Newton County courtroom on Thursday, September 6, with his sentence to start immediately. Paschall was transferred out of the Barry County Jail to a Department of Corrections facility the next day, on Friday, September 7, at 8:27 a.m., according to jail records.

Paschall's victims were Casey Brace, 29, and her grandfather, Herbert Townsend, 76. Paschall gunned the victims down in Townsend's Washburn home on Farm Road 1055 on January 5, 2015. Brace was already deceased when officers arrived. However, Townsend managed to call 911 and identified the shooter as Paschall when officers arrived. Townsend succumbed to his injuries in a Springfield hospital later the same day.

Brace had a restraining order against Paschall prior to the incident. Townsend and Brace shared a daughter, two years old at the time, and Paschall kidnapped her following the shooting. She was found safe later that day at Paschall's parents' residence in Springdale. He was arrested at that residence without incident.

Paschall was originally charged in Barry County; however, the case was tried in Newton County after a change of venue was requested. Barry County Prosecuting Attorney Amy Boxx was joined by multiple other attorneys in on record on the case, including assistant attorney generals Darrell Moore and Joshua Harrel and special prosecutors.

Paschall's jury trial lasted four days, and jurors eventually returned guilty verdicts on the six different charges. Paschall's sentencing was initially slated for December 19, 2017, however, Paschall's attorney filed multiple appeals on his behalf, delaying the sentencing until this month. The state announced fairly early on that it would not be seeking the death penalty

Paschall received life without the possibility of parole sentences for each of the two murder in the first degree charges for the deaths of Brace and Townsend. For the three armed criminal action charges, he received 90 years, 60 years and 20 years. He received an additional seven years for the parental kidnapping charge.

Paschall's attorney filed an appeal on Friday.

Driver dies after head-on collision with bus

A Crane man was killed after a collision with a Galena School bus on Highway 248 on Tuesday afternoon. According to the Missouri State Highway Patrol crash report, the man's truck hit the school bus head-on around 4:20 p.m.

Kelly P. Vaught, 47, of Crane, was driving a 2004 Ford F150 eastbound on Highway 248 about five miles southwest of Crane when the crash occurred. The truck hit a 2001 International IC school bus headed west, driven by Paul E. Schlis, 57, of Galena, head-on.

Vaught was pronounced deceased by Barry County coroner Jim Fohn at 5 p.m. He was transported to Fohn's Funeral Home in Cassville.

There were no reported injuries from the school bus.

Schlis was wearing a seat belt at the time of the crash. Vaught was not wearing a seat belt.

This was Troop D's 87th fatality for the year. The Missouri State Highway Patrol was assisted by the Barry County Sheriff's Offfice on scene.

Elephants on parade at Barry County Museum

The newest display at Cassville's Barry County Museum is a collection of elephant figurines and political mugs donated by the widow of Cassville graduate and former Barry County Assessor Glen Dale Nicoll. His collection spans decades, and the elephant mugs at the heart of the collection are the brainchild of Oklahoma artist, John Frank, the first commercial potter in Oklahoma history.

Frank, who had studied at the Chicago School of Art, was invited in 1927 by Dr. Oscar Jacobson to head the new ceramics department at the University of Oklahoma. He had planned to start up his own business in addition to teaching, and in 1933 he established Frank Potteries

in Norman, Okla., operating with little more than a small kiln, a butter churn for mixing clay, and jars to hold his

His goal was to create beautiful everyday dinnerware that would be affordable for most families during the Great Depression, a concept that went over well. Renaming his enterprise Frankoma Pottery in 1934 by combining his last name with that of his state, he continued to teach until choosing to work fulltime in his business in 1936.

Frank utilized the knowledge of various Oklahoma geologists when searching for the right regional clay to use in his pottery. He located and experimented with different clays throughout the state until he found a favorable clay in Ada, Okla. When he moved his operation west of Tulsa to Sapulpa, Okla. in 1938, he continued to haul clay from Ada, which required a threeday trip. It wasn't until 1945 that he discovered clay near Sapulpa that would work well for his pieces.

The change in clay altered the overall effect of the glazes once they were fired in the kiln. Frank had experimented with different glaze formulas and eventually chose to use rutile, a mineral containing titanium dioxide which allows the color of the clay to partially show through the glaze.

Ada clay was light beige when fired, and when he changed to the red, brick-colored clay of Sapulpa, the final coloring of each piece changed with it when the darker clay showed through the glaze. As an added touch, he often gave his glazes nature-based names such as White Sand, Desert Gold, Prairie Green and Dusty Rose.

Frankoma Pottery was known in its early decades for producing utilitarian and decorative kitchenwares, figurines and flowerpots, as well as limited edition and commemorative pieces. The

elephant mugs, which were molded from the red Sapulpa clay, came into being when Frank was approached by the National Republican Women's Club to create a mug to use as a fundraiser. He came up with a suitable design, and the first 5 oz. mugs rolled out in 1968.

Each mug was glazed in a single color annually, and all of the political mugs were embossed with the year and GOP. If released during an

inaugural year, they also bore the last names of the President and Vice President. The elephant mugs went over so well that the design was added to the company's production line the following year, turning it into another collector series.

Frank's youngest daughter, Joniece Frank, followed her father's footsteps and worked by his side, becoming an artist herself and designing many pieces. She inherited her father's company after his death in 1973 and released a Democrat donkey mug in 1975 to complement the Republican elephant line.

Despite two fires that destroyed the plant in 1938 and 1983, Frankoma Pottery remained in operation for many years. Both elephant and donkey political mugs were made and released until 2005 when the plant seemed to close permanently, but in recent years it has been revived and a limited number of pieces are hitting the market, including 2012-2018 political mugs.



Barry Electric awarded \$6.1 Mil. to expand internet service in Barry County

The Federal Communications Commission has announced the winners of the CAF II Auction. The CAF II (Connect America Fund) auction was held to award \$1.5 billion in grant monies to subsidize the cost of building broadband internet to underserved and unserved areas. Barry Electric Co-op was awarded \$6,103,454.20 to be distributed over a ten-year period. Barry Electric Co-op is the only winner in Southwest Missouri committed to provide gigabit service and is one of the thirty-three rural electric cooperatives across the nation winning grants. A considerable number of rural areas across the nation will continue to go underserved or unserved because entities bidding in those areas dropped out of the auction in the later rounds of lower bidding.

The grant funds were awarded using a reverse auction process. The competing entities that won were the ones that committed to deploy broadband by accepting the lowest level of government support. In this way

the FCC will distribute the available money in the most efficient method. The auction utilized a weighted system of bidding that gave the entities who pledged to provide higher speeds and lower latency preferential treatment in the bidding process. Barry Electric Co-op is able to meet these requirements with its fiber to the home design, giving their bids the most favorable weighting.

Barry Electric Co-op is currently building reliable and high speed internet service to portions of Barry County served by the electric cooperative. Their wholly owned subsidiary doing business as goBEC Fiber Network is now providing internet, phone and TV services to some of Barry Electric Co-op's members. goBEC's fiber construction is ahead of schedule to the members














Iowa man injured in motorcycle crash

Wildcats KO Cubs in brawl, 49-12

The Cassville Wildcats turned the Barry County Brawl into a backyard beat down Friday night, reigning 49-12 running clock on Monett at Burl Fowler Stadium. In the first game after Monett's football program was selected as a Missouri Sports Hall of Fame inductee, the Wildcats rained all over the Cubs' parade.

Rain it did. Tropical torrents fell during the game, but the turf field allowed for a near normal contest.

With Monett entering the game at 0-2, this was more than the usual rivalry game for the Cubs. The outcome would either be remembered as the revival of Monett's football fortune or the acceptance of another rebuilding project. With a week 4 game scheduled at Lamar, Monett needed this game badly.

Likewise, Cassville faced a pivotal challenge, trying to start 3-0 for the first time since 2012.

The Cubs came out swinging.

Monett's Karter Brink broke loose for a 39-yard run on the game's second offensive snap, but fumbled and DJ White recovered for the Wildcats at the Cassville 29-yard line. Three plays later, Bowen Preddy took an option pitch and raced down the sideline for a 60-yard touchdown run. The Drake Reese PAT gave Cassville a 7-0 lead with 10:15 left in the

Monett answered immediately, with Jamie Guinn racing 83 yards for a track meet touchdown. But the Cubs PAT failed and Cassville still led, 7-6.

opening quarter.

The Cassville offense showed its superiority on the ensuing drive. The Cats chewed up 65 yards in 12 plays and drained 8:18 off the clock as Preddy scored from four yards out. Another Reese kick stretched the lead to 14-6.

Then Cassville held Monett to a three-and-out, and replicated the previous scoring drive. With Anthony Tolbert tearing through the line, the Wildcats marched 61 yards in just six plays. Tolbert blasted into the end zone from five yards out to give the Wildcats a 20-6 lead with 9:11 left in the half.

Monett would not fold early. Guinn torched the Cassville defense with another rocket launch, racing 68 yards for his second score. Two carries, 151 yards, and a pair of touchdowns earned Guinn a bullseye from the Cassville defense for the remainder of the game.

The five-play, 82-yard drive brought Monett within 20-12.

The Wildcats badly needed a statement drive, and certainly did not want to give Guinn and company the ball back with just a one score lead. But Preddy was held to no gain on first down at the Cassville 29-yard line, and then Haney threw incomplete on second down.

On a critical third down play, Preddy burst through the line on a sprint draw and moved the chains with a 14-yard gain.

The drive bogged down again, but Preddy plowed for two yards on a fourth down call. On the very next play, Shannon Haney ran through a tiring Monett defense

for a 46-yard touchdown. The two-point conversion attempt failed, but Cassville had opened a 26-12 lead with exactly three minutes left in the half.

Cassville's defense forced a three-and-out punt, and

the Cats hurried to squeeze one more score out of the first half. Haney completed clutch passed to White and Ethan Hoppes to set up Reese for a 25-yard field goal and a 29-12 lead as the clock ran The second half was all Cassville.

Zack Coenen scored twice in the third quarter, sandwiching a short Shannon Haney touchdown run as the Wildcats spun the scoreboard to 49-12.

Last spring, Chantly Yarnall and Alexis Mann played for the Cassville boys' golf team, and this year they joined other Lady Wildcats to form the first girls' golf team at Cassville High School.

"The boys' team made it more challenging because I was always trying to play better than them, which has helped my golf game," reported Yarnall, "but I like girls' golf because it feels more equal."

After adding girls' soccer to the Cassville athletics program last year, the conversation about adding golf to the Lady Wildcats roster came up, mainly due to Yarnall and Mann having already joined the boys' team. During the spring, meetings were held to determine if there was enough interest to justify having a girls' team. "The response was favorable," said golf coach Jay Rogers, "so the matter went to the school board."

June, the board

approved starting a junior varsity girls' golf program for the fall season with plans to initiate a varsity program in the fall of 2019 if there are an adequate number of participants in the inaugural season. Currently, the team boasts seven members, which is a good sign for a start-up program. The team is slated to compete against a variety of schools this year, from small school districts up through Class 4 and 5 schools.

Over half of the girls on the team had never played golf before this year and have found the sport both challenging and rewarding. When hot weather, late summer rainstorms and dual sports practices limit time on the course, several girls participate in weight-lifting classes to keep in shape. In addition to golf-specific preparation, all of the girls get in plenty of walking time on the course and focus on hydration, something vital to both their health and performance.

Rogers also discusses the mental aspects of golf to help them sharpen their skills, and considers it a privilege to coach the inaugural team."I'm honored to be a part of this new program and hope that I can help the girls achieve their goals. My expectations for this season are simply to work to improve at a very difficult game, learn the rules, keep a positive attitude and have fun."

Mann, a junior dual sport athlete, has found golf to be unlike any other sport she's participated in. "You depend a lot on yourself, and that's something I'm not used to." Yarnall, sophomore teammate and dual sport athlete, agreed. "I have learned that you are really playing against yourself and always trying to beat your last score."

"Golf truly is a game for everyone. Body size and shape really aren't a factor in one's ability to compete," Rogers said. "Hopefully, girls' golf has a bright future. I'd love to see girls interested in
