# Suspect arrested for Aug. 20 Monett shooting

The man wanted for questioning in the shooting of a Monett man last month is now in jail. Kyle Huse, 31, of Aurora, was identified as a person of interest by the Monett Police Department after a 50 year old man was shot on August 20. Huse was taken into custody by the Lawrence County Sheriff's Department on Sunday, September 8. Huse was arrested for unlawful possession of a firearm from the August 20 shooting as well as other unrelated charges.

# Eagle Rock man in jail after allegedly shooting at, grazing victim

An Eagle Rock man is in custody after allegedly shooting at another man and grazing his arm. The incident was reported to have taken place in the Eagle Rock Post Office parking lot late Wednesday night last week. Michael S. Corsby, Jr., 41, of Eagle Rock, is facing five charges from the incident.

According to the affidavits of probable cause by Barry County Sheriff's deputy Kayla Strahley, she was dispatched to the Eagle Rock Post Office on State Highway 86 around 9:20 p.m. on Wednesday, September 4. The initial call came in from an uninvolved party who lived across from the post office and claimed they heard gun shots and two vehicles drive off.

Another call came in reporting a man had been shot in the incident and was at the Roaring River Baptist Church.

According to the victims in the case, they were sitting in a truck at the post office when Crosby drove up and started a fight. The victims reported hearing Crosby tell another person to "grab me the gun." When the victim shifted his vehicle into drive to leave the parking lot, he heard gun shots as he was driving away northbound on Highway 86. The driver had a laceration on his left arm from a bullet grazing him.

The report states Crosby used a .40 caliber Glock 23 to fire four rounds at the victims.

Crosby is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$100,000 cash-only bond. He is charged with two counts of assault in the first degree, two counts of armed criminal action and one count of unlawful use of a weapon.

# Community comes together to support Bailey family

Small towns have a reputation for taking care of their own. In times of tragedy, many communities will crowd around a single individual or family to insulate them from the horrible curve balls thrown their way. The town of Cassville is no exception.

In this spirit, two events have been planned to benefit the family of Tonya Bailey, a former Eagle Rock resident and Freedom Bank employee. Bailey was diagnosed with brain and lung cancer at the beginning of this year, and passed away earlier this month. Bailey is survived by her husband, John, and her two children. The first of these events event to benefit the Bailey family will be on Saturday, September 14. Barry County Law Enforcement, EMS and Fire and Rescue will host a team softball game, with all proceeds going to help the Bailey family.

Law Enforcement, EMS and Fire will all have their own teams and will play against themselves and others in a double-elimination tournament. Citizens of Barry County are also welcome to assemble their own teams of at least 11 players and enter the tournament as well. Entry to the tournament costs \$5 per player.

Food will be served dur-

ing the tournament. For \$2 a plate, attendees will be treated to hamburgers, hotdogs, chips and a soft drink.

This event will also include a silent auction with items donated by the community up for grabs. Auction items include: a massage, purses and jewelry, an item donation by Lowe's Construction of Monett, a log-cabin bird feeder among





# Purdy man faces three counts after allegedly firing gun into home

A 25-year-old man from Purdy is facing multiple charges after allegedly firing a gun into a home in rural Purdy. Benjamin W. Paine, III, 25, of Purdy, is charged with possession of a controlled substance, unlawful use of a weapon and endangering the welfare of a child in the first degree.

According to the affidavits of probable cause by deputy Michael Stribling, the Barry County Sheriff's Department was dispatched to a residence in rural Purdy on Farm Road 1068 around 9:40 p.m. on Saturday, September 7. # Barry County still in CWD Management Zone for upcoming deer season

With deer hunting opening for archery season on Sept. 15 and firearms portions in the coming months, the Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) wants hunters, landowners and others to know key information about chronic wasting disease, or CWD. MDC is continuing its efforts this fall and winter to limit the spread of CWD in Missouri deer by finding new cases and slowing its spread to more deer or more areas.

CWD is a deadly, infectious disease in white-tailed deer and other members of the deer family that eventually kills all animals it infects. There is no vaccine or cure. CWD is spread from deer to deer and through the environment. MDC has found 116 cases of CWD in Missouri since 2012 out of more

than 100,000 deer sampled so the disease remains relatively rare in the state. Learn more at mdc.mo.gov/cwd under "CWD in Missouri."

There have been no reported cases of CWD infecting people, but the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) strongly recommends having deer tested for CWD if harvested in an area known to have the disease. The CDC also recommends not eating meat from animals that test positive for CWD. For more information, visit mdc.mo.gov/cwd under "Human Health Risks."

# Management

MDC has a CWD Management Zone of counties in or near where CWD has been found. The 29 counties of the CWD Management Zone for this season are: Adair, Barry, Cedar, Chariton, Christian, Crawford, Franklin, Gasconade, Hickory, Howell, Jefferson, Knox, Linn, Macon, Mercer, Oregon, Ozark, Perry, Polk, Putnam, St. Charles, St. Clair, St. Francois, Ste. Genevieve, Stone, Sullivan, Taney, Warren and Washington. See the included map image on 8B. Learn more at mdc.mo.gov/cwd.

#### Voluntary CWD sampling all season statewide

MDC is offering free voluntary CWD sampling and testing of deer harvested anywhere in Missouri throughout the entire deer hunting season (Sept. 15 through Jan. 15, 2020) at MDC regional offices during regular business hours and through participating taxidermists and meat processors within the CWD Management Zone. Get locations and more information at mdc.mo.gov/ cwd under "Voluntary Sampling."

Mandatory CWD Sam-

pling November 16 and 17

Hunters who harvest deer in any counties of the CWD Management Zone during the opening weekend of the November portion of the fall firearms deer season (Nov. 16 and 17) are required to take their harvested deer (or the head with at least six inches of neck attached) on the day of harvest to one of MDC's numerous CWD sampling stations throughout the zone. Sampling and test results are free. Hunters who harvest deer in counties no longer part of the zone are not required to participate in sampling. Learn more at mdc.mo.gov/cwd under "Mandatory CWD Sampling," or from MDC's "2019 Fall Deer & Turkey Hunting Regulations and Information" booklet, available where permits are sold and online at huntfish.mdc. mo.gov/sites/default/files/ downloads/2019FDT.pdf.

Before having deer sampled for CWD

Field dress and Telecheck deer before arrival at a sampling station.

Bring the carcass or just the head with at least six inches of the neck attached.

Capes may be removed in preparation for taxidermy before going to a sampling station.

The person who harvested the deer must be present.

The hunter's conservation number will be required, along with specific location of harvest.

If using a paper permit, have it detached from the deer for easy access.

If using the MO Hunting app, have permit and Telecheck information available.

Position deer in vehicles with heads and necks easily accessible.

#### **CWD Test results**

Get test results for CWDsampled deer online at mdc. mo.gov/CWDTestResults. Results are free and will be available within four weeks after the sampling date.

#### Carcass disposal

Carcasses or remains of CWD-infected deer can expose other deer to the disease. Process deer as close as possible to where harvested. Place remaining carcass parts in trash bags and properly dispose of them in the trash or a landfill. If necessary, bury or leave remains at the harvest site. Learn more at mdc.mo.gov/cwd under "Carcass Disposal."

#### **Share the Harvest**

Missouri's Share the Harvest program helps deer hunters donate venison to those in need. To participate, take harvested deer to an approved meat processor and let the processor know how much venison is to be donated. Learn more and find participating processors at mdc. mo.gov/share.

Deer harvested within the CWD Management Zone may only be donated to approved processors in the Share the Harvest CWD Testing Program located within or directly adjacent to the CWD Management Zone. Processors not participating in the Share the Harvest CWD Testing Program cannot accept deer from CWD Management Zone counties. Deer harvested outside of the CWD Management Zone

# **ERGM** Fire receives MDC grant



During July and August, matching funds grant checks for rural fire departments were distributed by the Missouri Department of Conservation forestry division staff. One hundred sixty-eight fire departments received checks for up to \$4,000 each to help with the purchase of personal protective gear, communications equipment and wildfire suppression equipment to help increase the fire departments' capacity to suppress wildfires safety and efficiently.

The total matching funds awarded to Missouri fire departments through the matching funds grant program this year was \$386,639.14. Fire departments are required to match 50 percent of the funds which are provided by the Missouri Department of Conservation and the US Forest Service volunteer fire assistance program. Throughout the last 30 years, over \$8 million has been distributed to rural fire departments to help them increase the safety of their firefighters and provide them with better firefighting equipment.

For deer sampled for CWD before being taken to an approved processor for donation, present the CWD barcode number provided at the sampling station to the processor as proof of sampling. If a sample has not been collected before donation, the processor will collect the sample or remove the head and submit it to MDC for sampling. Learn more at mdc.mo.gov/cwd under "Share the Harvest."

# Feeding ban in CWD-management zone

Feeding deer or placing minerals for deer unnaturally concentrates the animals and can help spread CWD. The Wildlife Code of Missouri prohibits the placement of grain, salt products, minerals, and other consumable natural and manufactured products used to attract deer year-round within counties of the CWD Management Zone. Exceptions are feed placed within 100 feet

Golden, MO

of any residence or occupied building, feed placed in such a manner to reasonably exclude access by deer, and feed and minerals present solely as a result of normal agricultural or forest management, or crop and wildlife food production practices. The feeding ban does not apply to food plots or other agricultural practices. The feeding ban no longer applies to counties removed from the CWD Management Zone.

#### **Antler-point restriction**

Counties within the CWD Management Zone do not have an antler-point restriction. Protecting young bucks from being harvested in areas where CWD has been found can increase the spread of the disease. The APR has been reinstated for some counties removed from the zone. 


# CWD Management Zone
