

Youth Advisory Board to bring family fun with fall carnival

This weekend marks the first fall carnival that will partner Cassville School Clubs with the community for a fun afternoon. The fall carnival is sponsored by the Youth Advisory Board, but many different clubs at Cassville High School are participating.

The fall carnival will include many different activities for kids of all ages. There will also be food at the event, including a chili supper, hot dogs and chips, drinks and homemade cookies. Activity booths will take tickets, which families can buy for \$0.25 each at one of three ticket booths at the event.

Elaine Boles, one of the Youth Advisory Board's sponsors, said, "We've invited all of the clubs at the high school to participate, which will help fund what they want to do for the year, as well."

Different clubs will be running different activities. Planned activities include balloon pops, duck matching, digging for dinosaurs and more. There will also be opportunities to win goldfish with ping pong balls and a bounce house. Each of the activities will have club sponsorship and the proceeds will help to support their activities.

Boles talked about what the Youth Advisory Board plans to do with their funding from the fall carnival. The board plans to go to a conference in Jefferson City called Speak Hard. She said, "We get to go talk to our state representative and senator about bills they are voting on that affect youth in our community. Then they learn to empower our youth here in Cassville in a more positive direction."

Boles said other than the conference, they will be doing some projects locally, as well. She said, "We're looking at some beautification at the parks and to be able to host some activities for the youth to get them out of the destructive decision way and give them a safe place to be."

The Youth Advisory Board is a group of 21 high school students along with the club's sponsors, Elaine Boles, of Cassville Schools, and Dana Kammerlohr, Cassville Chief of Police. When asked, Boles explained the mission of the board. She said, "The best way to describe the youth advisory board is they are a student council for the community. They are bridging the youth and the community."

She continued, "They want to clean up Cassville, and right now they are focusing on the park. They want to make it to where families feel more comfortable going to the parks and making Cassville a safer place for families and help bring in new business. They want to make Cassville a better place to live."

The board meets at the Cassville City Hall, and they try to partner with the community and business leaders. The goal is

Sampling required for all deer shot opening weekend

CONCERNS OVER CHRONIC WASTING DISEASE PROMPTS MANDATORY SAMPLING NOV. 11-12

For the first time, Barry County hunters will be required to have all of their deer shot during opening weekend of firearms season checked for Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD). The decision to make testing mandatory came after CWD was found within 25 miles of the Missouri border.

Warren Rose, outreach and education regional supervisor for the Missouri Department of Conservation, said, "The Department of Conservation is doing mandatory sampling in four southern counties that border Arkansas because we haven't found Chronic Wasting Disease in Missouri, but Arkansas has seen it within

25 miles of our state line. Our protocol is to do mandatory sampling to see if we have it, and if so, how prevalent it might be."

All deer taken from Barry County during that first weekend, November 11 and 12, will be required to take their deer to one of three mandatory check stations. The check stations will be located at :

- Roaring River State Park, Cassville
- Purdy Community Building, Purdy
- Central Crossing Fire Station #1, Shell Knob.

Once hunters arrive, MDC staff will be present to take tissue samples and send samples to independent labs to check each of the deer for CWD. The

process is done quickly. Staff will cut along the deer's neck, remove the lymph nodes, and hunters can then be on their way. Barry County is one of four counties that borders Arkansas that is included in the mandatory testing protocol. Stone, Taney and Ozark Counties are also included, along with 21 Missouri counties farther north in the state.

Rose said, "It's been in the northern part of the state for awhile. Northern and around St. Louis. It's been found in Missouri but not in southwest Missouri. It was also found in St. Clair County this past season."

Through mandatory sampling, MDC will be able to make an evaluation as to whether CWD has spread into more counties in Missouri and how to work with landowners to stop the spread if it is present.

CWD is a highly contagious neurological disease. It causes brain deterioration that leads to abnormal behavior, emaciation, loss of bodily function and eventually death. Because of deer's social habits, once it is in an area, it spreads rapidly given the right circumstances.

Rose said,

"This is a disease spread from deer-to-deer from them licking each other or socializing, as they do. The chance of the disease spreading is high."

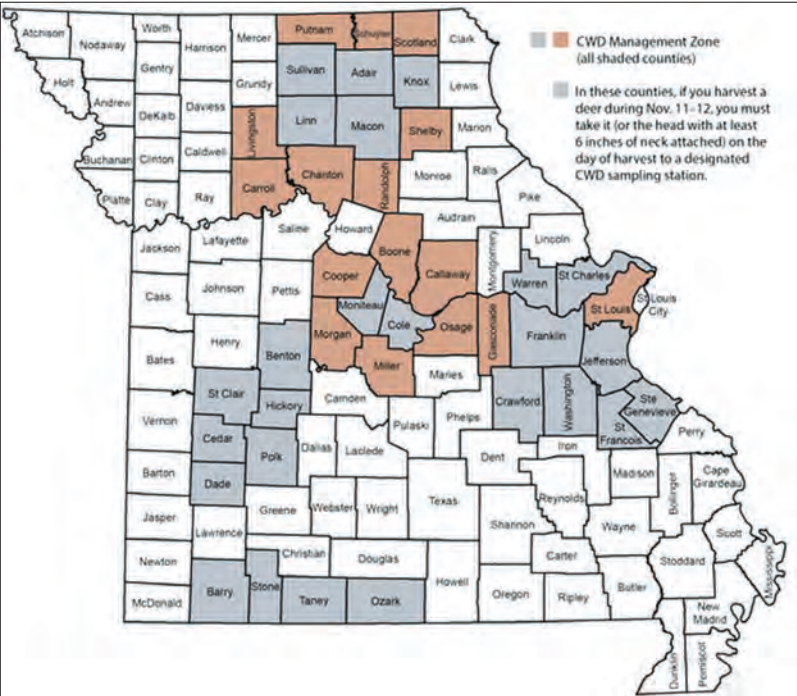
While there is no known risk to humans, the disease is devastating to the deer population. Because CWD was found in Arkansas, Barry County and other counties have been under feeding bans to help reduce the chance of it becoming prevalent in Missouri.

Rose said, "That is why landowners need to follow regulations. Barry County and Stone County are both where you cannot feed or put out mineral blocks. It's against the law." Drawing multiple deer to a single location, while good for hunting chances, is dangerous for deer in areas that are at risk for CWD.

Rose said the process to get deer checked should be fairly quick, but he recommends coming earlier in the day if possible. He stated, "Try not to wait until the end of the day. If they harvest a deer in the middle of the afternoon, we'll be slow and can process them much faster. All of the hunters show up at the end of the day. The lines tend to back up."

To make the process go more quickly, hunters are asked to bring deer with their heads easily accessible in the back of a truck or vehicle.

He said, "This is new, people aren't used to this, so we want to make sure everyone is well-informed. If they have questions, just ask one of the staff members there working.

That’s what we are here for.”

Rose added, “They have to telecheck their deer first and have the permit and that information available, and also be able to point out on a county map the township range and section where they were harvested.” Staff will make note of where the deer was shot so that if CWD is found, they have an idea as to where the more prevalent areas are.

Only deer harvested within county will need to be checked.

The 25 mandatory CWD sampling counties are: Adair, Barry, Benton, Cedar, Cole, Crawford, Dade, Franklin, Hickory, Jefferson, Knox, Linn, Macon, Moniteau, Ozark, Polk, St. Charles, St. Clair, St. Francois, Ste. Genevieve, Stone, Sullivan, Taney, Warren and Washington.

So, what if CWD is found in Barry County? Rose said it would be handled as it is being handled in northern counties where they have found the disease. “In the future, the department will do more selective harvesting and sampling. We have a CWD action plan in place, and we are using those in the northern counties already. We would work with

landowners and hunters to see where the deer were harvested and sample around there to see how prevalent the disease is.”

Selective removal is part of the plan should CWD be found. Rose said, “Intense harvesting of deer in those areas and testing is the main thing. Everything would be done only with landowner consent.”

However, for now, Barry County, among 24 other counties, are just in a sampling phase.

If you take a deer during the opening weekend of November firearms season, remember:

- Sampling locations will be open from 7:30 a.m. until at least 8 p.m. on Nov. 11 and 12.
- Deer must be presented by the hunter who harvested the animal.
- Hunters be asked to identify the location within the county the deer was harvested.

• Deer may be field dressed before being taken to a sampling station.

• Hunters have the option of presenting just the deer head with about six inches of neck attached.

• For bucks bound to a taxidermist, the cape may be removed prior to being taken to a sampling station as long as about six inches of the neck is left attached.

If you take a deer during any other part of the season, you can voluntarily have the deer tested, as well. Voluntary sampling stations in Barry County are Scott’s Taxidermy, in Exeter, and Reflections Taxidermy, in Monett. Alternately, you can have them sampled at the Southwest Regional MDC Office in Springfield during normal business hours.

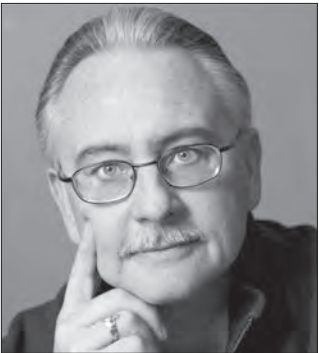

Randy G. Ennis, 61, formerly of Cassville, passed away at his home in Feeding Hills, Mass., after a two-year battle with bile duct cancer. Randy was born on January 29, 1956, in Cassville, to Marvin and Helen (Mattingly) Ennis. A jack of all trades, Randy worked in his all-too-brief life as a carpenter, retail store manager, photographer, and computer programmer. If he didn't know how to do something (which was rare), he would figure it out. Randy was the go-to guy for car repair, computer problems, photography advice, and nearly any other topics under the sun. He worked for Mass-Mutual for 29 years before he retired. In his spare time, he had great passions for photography and music. His photography won multiple local awards, was regularly featured in the Agawam Advertiser, and appeared in the Mass-Mutual Credit Union calendar on multiple occasions. He enjoyed spending time in local parks and at waterfalls taking amazing pictures. He also loved going for rides on roads he'd never traveled to discover photographic subjects, old cemeteries being a favorite. The last vacation taken before his illness was traveling to South Dakota with his wife to visit Rapid City, Mount Rushmore, Custer State Park, Devil's Tower, Crazy Horse Memorial, Deadwood and Badlands National Park. He was in his joy there with his camera. Randy played guitar and ukulele and sang beautifully. He had a generous heart and often donated his

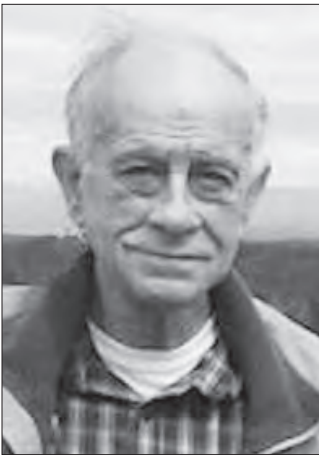

Paul Harvey, Jr. to visit Branson Toy Museum

You loved listening to him on the radio for years. Now you can meet the son of the man responsible for those cherished memories at the World's Largest Toy Museum Complex's "Meet the Author Series." That's according to owners Tom and Wendy Beck.

Paul Harvey's son Paul Harvey Jr. will be sharing memories of his father and holding a book signing at the museum November 3 and 4, 2017. He'll sign his book, A Child Is Reborn -A Remembering, which may be purchased at the Museum Gift Shop. It details the story of Angel and Paul Harvey's family through the years their son was born—and reborn. Paul Harvey Jr. is an award-winning journalist, author, playwright, pianist, composer and broadcaster called "America's Storyteller". He is the creator, producer, and writer of the longest-running and most popular series in radio history, The Rest Of The Story. He is the only child of Paul and Angel Harvey.

In November 2016, Paul Harvey Jr. established "Growing Up in the 1950s" the Paul Harvey Jr. Museum at the World's Largest Toy Museum Complex. "Somehow my

Wolves spring 42-7 upset in district semifinal

The Reeds Spring Wolves crushed Cassville's playoff hopes with a 42-7 upset at Wildcat Stadium on Friday night. Senior running back Kelly Newton led the uprising, rushing for 210 yards on 11 carries while scoring three touchdowns.

The Wildcats turned the ball over four times in the contest, and incurred penalties in critical situations. But for the most part, the blowout loss was due to Cassville's inability to match Reeds Spring in size, physicality, or speed.

Newton's Law for this game was pretty simple: a running back in motion will remain in motion until he is tackled. The Wildcats could not contain the star running back, who was obviously the fastest player on the field. Newton's night included scoring runs of 54, 69, and 24 yards. He surpassed the 200-yard mark after sitting out the last five minutes of the second quarter and the first ten minutes of the third after suffering an ankle injury.

The Reeds Spring defense was much improved from the unit that allowed 39 points in a loss to Cassville back in week 2 of the regular season. The Wolves have not lost since that meeting, holding six regular season opponents to 7 points or less. Bolivar fell to Reeds Spring, 36-16, and Rogersville

lost a 53-14 woodshed game. Whatever changes the Wolves made after the Cassville loss worked.

The first quarter was filled with fireworks. Bowen Preddy returned the opening kickoff out to the 44-yard line before Cameron Essick made a touch-down-saving tackle on the Cassville sideline. On second down, Shannon Haney found DJ White open down the middle. White raced for the goal line, but a safety tipped the ball away. Reeds Spring recovered inside the 10-yard line.

The Wolves marched 92 yards in a time-consuming, 16-play drive to take a 7-0 lead. The Wildcats made a stand in the red zone, but a pass interference penalty on 4th-and-9 at the 14-yard line kept the drive alive. Austin Staugaard scored three plays later as Reeds Spring claimed an early lead with 5:40 left in the opening quarter.

The Wildcats countered with another aerial assault. Haney bombed away to Preddy on a 3rd-and-11 play for a 72-yard touchdown. A Drake Reese PAT tied the game with 3:59 on the clock. Cassville had tied the game despite only running five offensive plays to that point.

But the game changed on the next possession, and especially on one critical play. The Wolves started the drive

at their own 26-yard line. A motion penalty and three running plays netted nine yards, and Reeds lined up to punt. The ball sailed into Cassville territory, hitting a kicking-team coverage player. A flag flew. The officials marched the ball back to the Cassville 13-yard line, then huddled for further discussion.

It was finally decided that Cassville would be penalized for illegal participation, which usually means there were 12 or more men on the field. The ball was awarded to the Wolves back at the Reeds Spring 40-yard line with a new set of downs.

Three plays later, Newton exploded off right tackle for a 54-yard scoring sprint, and Reeds Spring took a 14-7 lead.

The Wildcats drove across midfield as the quarter ended, a drive that ended when Anthony Tolbert had the ball stripped while fighting for extra yardage. The Wolves recovered at their own 31-yard line.

On the very next play, Newton broke through the line, cut right to the Cassville sideline, and then shot back across the field. A map of Newton's run would have resembled an elongated "S", and would have ended in the Cassville end zone. The 69-yard touchdown and accompanying 21-7 score shocked the Cassville team

and silenced the Cassville crowd. The score stood at 21-7 at halftime. It could have been worse.

With just under three minutes left in the half, Blake Gronvold dropped back and hit Logen Plumb in full stride in the Cassville secondary. But Preddy managed to run Plumb down and jarred the ball loose. The fumble rolled to the back of the end zone where the Wildcats smothered it for a touchback, averting another Reeds Spring score.

The Wildcats held the Wolves on downs to open the third quarter, but sput-

tered on offense. An intentional grounding call set up an impossible 3rd-and-24 at the Cassville 21-yard line. Tolbert improved the punting position with a third-down gain, and then Haney's boot rolled to the Reeds Spring 34-yard line.

Gronvold picked his way through the Cassville defense for 6 yards on first down, then fired deep for Seth Stamps on the next play. Stamps hauled in the long throw and raced 60 yards to the house to give the Wolves a 28-7 lead with 5:37 on the clock.

Dagger. Then, after pinning the

Wildcats deep with a punt, the Wolves intercepted Haney for the second time in the half, this one giving Reeds Spring a first down at the Cassville 12-yard line. Two plays later, Gronvold kept for a one-yard TD run, and the Wildcats looked up at a 35-7 score with just 8:52 left in their season.

Newton capped his brilliant night with a 43-yard touchdown to establish a running clock at the 5:02 mark.

The game ended with no further drama, 42-7, Reeds Spring.

MDC releases youth deer season opening numbers

Preliminary data from the Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) shows that young hunters ages 6 through 15 harvested 17,309 deer during Missouri's early youth portion of the 2017 deer hunting season, which ran Oct. 28-29. Top counties for the early

youth portion were Osage with 380, Howell with 377, and Franklin with 354 deer checked. Last year's harvest total for the early youth portion was 11,171.

Barry County's totals were: 82 antlered bucks, 11 button bucks, and 48 does, for a total

of 141.

"The increase in harvest during the early youth portion compared to last year is likely due to the excellent weather over the weekend, which was favorable for deer movement," MDC Deer Biologist Barb Keller said. "Weather during

early youth season last year was particularly poor, with highs in the 80s throughout much of the state."

Archery deer hunting con-

tinues through Nov. 10 and again from Nov. 22 through Jan. 15, 2018. Up next for deer hunting in Missouri is the November portion of firearms deer season, which runs Nov. 11-21. That will be followed by the late youth portion of firearms deer season on Nov.

24-26. The antlerless portion of firearms deer season runs Dec. 1-3. Lastly, the alternative methods portion will run Dec. 23- Jan. 2, 2018.
