# **Barry County has 36** percent of voters turn out

According to unofficial figures from Barry County Clerk Gary Youngblood's office, 35.87 percent of the county's voters turned out in Tuesday's General Election. Of the 20,319 registered voters in the county, 7,288 cards were cast.

While the election for local races was determined by the Primary in April with no local officials facing opponents, state-wide issues drew the focus for voters. Barry County voters sided with the statewide opinion on all four Constitutional Amendments presented on the ballot.

In Barry County, voters supported Amendment 2, which allows previous crimes to be admissible in court in child sexual crime cases, with a large majority of 77.96 percent favoring the initiative.

For Amendment No. 3, Barry County had 74.82 percent vote no. Amendment No. 3 proposed that teachers salaries and tenure be dependent on state-wide assessment standards of their students and was heavily opposed by schools and school boards.

On Constitutional Amendment No. 6, voters turned down the proposal with 75.38 percent of voters casting no votes Tuesday. Amendment No. 6 would have opened an early voting period for Missouri elections.

Amendment No. 10 was supported with 65.44 percent of Barry County voters in favor. This amendment prevents the governor from estimating revenues for the budget taking into account pending legislation and prevents withholding revenue from education and other state services.

Local voters also supported Tom Sweich (R.) as State Auditor and incumbent Billy Long (R.) as U.S. 7th District Congressman.

After an investigation by the Barry County Sheriff's Department, three were arrested in connection with area thefts. The department recovered approximately \$40,000 in stolen property, including two trailers, a diagnostic box, lawn mowers, equipment and various tools.

Amanda Shelby, James Kramer and Jason Kramer were all arrested as suspects of the crimes and have each been charged in connection with the crimes. According to the affidavit of probable cause, Shelby admitted that the items were stolen from both Lawrence and Barry Counties from vehicles and inside and outside residences. All owners of the property have not yet been identified.

Shelby and Jason currently face charges in both Barry and Lawrence Counties related to the various thefts. James faces charges

in Barry County. The Barry and Lawrence County Sheriff's Departments are working together to identify victims that the property was stolen from.

Shelby and Jason Kramer both face additional child endangerment charges because they took Shelby's juvenile child to commit the crimes, and officers found mouse feces in the child's bedroom on the dresser and

# Three arrested in area drug busts

Three people suspected of manufacturing methamphetamine were arrested on Wednesday, October 22, during a collaborative effort between the Barry County Sheriff's Department, the Missouri Drug Task Force, and the Wheaton Police Department. Four methamphetamine labs were also

Two of the methamphetamine labs were found in Wheaton. One of them was in the apartment of Jason Clark. According to a probable cause statement, a search of the apartment uncovered two jars of a liquid and a small bag of a crystalline substance, all of which tested positive for methamphetamine, a small amount of marijuana, and items from the

Clark, 27, was arrested and charged with manufacturing of a controlled substance near a school, possession of a controlled substance, and three counts of child endangerment, as three children living in the apartment are under 17.

The other lab was found in an apartment occupied by Tony Ray Intessimone and Carrie Lee Intessimone and their oneyear old child. According to a probable cause statement, an officer spoke to Carrie and told her he had been informed there could be a methamphetamine lab inside the apartment. She gave him permission to search the apartment and the couple's

The search uncovered a liquid that tested positive for methamphetamine and a number of items used to produce methamphetamine. Tony Ray, 39, and Carrie Lee, 26, were both arrested and each charged with possession of a controlled substance, manufacturing of a controlled substance and endangering the welfare of a child. The Intessimones are currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of \$100,000 bonds. Clark already posted bond.

In addition to the labs in Wheaton, two more were seized at a trailer park in Seligman. According to a statement from the Sheriff's office, one lab was found to have hazardous waste and residue scattered throughout the trailer park. The other lab consisted of a backpack holding four shakeand-bake bottles containing hazardous residue. It was found in the woods behind the trailer

No arrests have been made yet in connection to the labs found in Seligman, but officers are pursuing leads. Anyone with information can phone in anonymous tips by calling the Southwest Missouri Drug Task Force at (417) 847-5010.

# Cassville's season ends in district semi's

CAPITALIZATION. No, not that one.

"Capitalization": the art or process of capitalizing; taking advantage of opportunities, etc.

The Monett Cubs blew a 14-0 lead, then capitalized on turnovers, field position, and raw speed to hand Cassville a 47-20 defeat in district semifinal action at Burl Fowler Field on Friday night. Quincy Jackson ran for 150 yards on just 8 carries and scored 3 touchdowns to lead the Cubs past the Wildcats and into the district championship game at Reeds Spring.

This contest had more storylines than a Game of Thrones highlight reel. Don't let the final score fool you. This was a tough battle, and Cassville was still within reach until Zack Hammond's 15-yard scoring run gave Monett a 34-14 lead with two minutes left in the third quarter.

One of the bigger themes unfolded before the game. Cassville's River Phelps, suffering from illness, could not make the trip. While

the Wildcats missed his spark on offense, it was the defense that struggled most without Phelps. The redheaded sophomore was one of few Wildcats who could run stride for stride with Monett's sprint crew. Without him, Monett's hands players found more space whenever they could turn the edge or break into the second level.

Without Phelps in the split backfield, Monett's tough, gambling defense targeted Gabe Kirk and Leigh Cox on every play. With 8 and 9 defensive players in the box, running yards were a tough commodity for the Wildcats to find. Cox was held to just 69 yards on 25 carries, and Kirk gained just 31 yards on 14 attempts. Steven Hunter picked up 27 yards on 5 carries late in the final quarter when the 'Cats drove for their final score.

Turnovers, always a key variable in a football game, bit the Wildcats right away when Monett recovered a fumble on the opening kickoff. That miscue led directly to an early 7-0 lead for the Cubs when Hammond sneaked in from a yard out at the 9:48 mark of the first quarter.

The Cassville offense went three-and-out on its first two possessions, and Gabe Kirk's punt pinned Monett deep. On second down, Jackson turned the toss sweep into an 85-yard sprint up the east sideline to give the Cubs a 14-0 lead with 2:03 on the first-quarter clock.

Kirk ran the ensuing kickoff out to the 35yard line to open the next Cassville drive. Leigh Cox earned the first first down of the game for the Wildcats, reaching the 47-yard line with a third-and-3 carry. Then Kirk launched a rainbow for Cade Pendergraft, and he won a jump ball against the shorter Monett defensive back. The defender slipped down and Pendergraft raced into the end zone to complete the 53-yard pass play as the Wildcats pulled within 14-7 as the quarter ended.

The Cubs were flagged on the kickoff and Hammond directed the offense from the shadow of the goal posts. On second-and-6 from the 12-yard line, the Wildcats recovered an er-

rant pitch to set up a firstand-goal at the 5-yard line. Kirk bulled in to score on third down to tie the score at 14-14 with 10:44 left in the half.

Although Monett failed to score on the next possession, the Cubs flipped the field with a punt that rolled to the Cassville 6-yard line. The Wildcats punched the ball out to the 28-yard line in 7 plays, but the Monett defense forced a turnover. The Cubs capitalized on the turnover and marched 22 yards in 4 plays, with Jordan Hall scoring from 4 yards out to give Monett a 21-14 halftime lead.

The Wildcats gambled with an onside kick to open the third quarter, but the Cubs recovered at their own 48-yard line. Monett capitalized with the short-field gift, covering the 52 yards in just 5 plays. Jackson ran past and over the Cassville defenders on a 14-yard scoring sweep to extend the lead to 27-14.

The Wildcats forced to punt, but the Cubs gave the ball back on a fumble on the next snap.

Then a double-reverse gadget play saw Alex Dyer throw a strike to Pendergraft for a 28-yard gain to the Monett 10-yard line. But the next four plays defined the outcome of the game. Cassville could not capitalize against the stingy Monett defense, and the Cubs took over on downs after Kirk was tackled at the 5-yard line on fourth down.

Monett 95-yards in 9 plays to take a 34-14 lead at the 2:00 mark of the third quarter. Six of those nine plays were toss sweeps or off-tackle veer handoffs as the Cubs capitalized on their superior team speed.

That speed led to two more long scores as Jackson hauled in a pass from Hammond for a 52-yard touchdown on the first play of the final quarter, and then Witt burst through the line for a 48-yard scoring run with 8:42 remaining.

Cassville managed a late touchdown when Kirk capped a 66-yard drive with a 2-yard plunge to create the 47-20 final score.

"It got away from us in the second half," said Cassville's Lance Parnell. "I was super proud of the way our kids competed tonight."

The Wildcats end their season with the loss, falling to 6-5. Monett improves to 9-2 and will play at Reeds Spring on Friday in the district championship contest.











### Youth check 18,091 deer in early hunt

The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) announced that young hunters ages 6 through 15 checked 18,091 deer during Missouri's early youth portion of deer hunting seasons on Nov. 1 and 2. Top counties for the early youth hunt were Osage with 448, Franklin with 393, and Howell with 376 deer checked. Last year's harvest total for the early youth hunt was 18,676.

Antlered bucks accounted for 11,481 of deer harvested, or about 63 percent. Button bucks accounted for 1,728, or almost 10 percent. Does accounted for 4,882, or about 27 percent.

Up next for deer hunting in Missouri is the November portion of firearms deer season running Nov. 15 through 25. This portion normally accounts for about 80 percent of the state's firearms deer







# Barry County Courts send 9 to prison in the month of October

• Samuel D. Aston, Marionville, pled guilty to theft/ stealing of \$500 to \$25,000. Aston received a suspended execution of a three year incarceration sentence, four years supervised probation, and he must complete Lawrence County CRISP.

In September 2012, Aston was found to have a stolen trailer that was taken from Verona. When the Barry County Sheriff's Department recovered the trailer, the truck it was connected to was in possession of Aston.

Aston is to serve probation until October 1, 2018.

• Herbert Omar Bonilla II, Monett, pled guilty to theft/stealing of property less than \$500. Bonilla received a suspended imposition of sentence and two years unsupervised probation.

In March 2013, officers with the Monett Police Department were dispatched for a robbery where a car CD player, tools, battery and charger, and drill were stolen from a carport. The stolen items were found at a pawn shop and security footage

sold them.

Bonilla is to serve probation until October 21, 2016.

• Curtis Dwayne Daniels, Carthage, pled guilty to possession of a chemical with the intent to manufacture and possession of a controlled substance from charges in 2010. His probation has since been revoked, and he is to serve three years incarcera-

In May 2010, the Southwest Missouri Drug Task Force conducted a narcotics investigation at Ceder and 7th Street in Butterfield. During the investigation, officers found multiple chemicals used to manufacture methamphetamine, as well as a container of methamphetamine that Daniels had thrown on the ground when officers approached.

• Bryan Mack Davis, Seligman, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance, theft/stealing of \$500 to \$25,000, and three counts of theft/stealing a firearm. Davis was given a suspended imposition of sentence and

showed Bonilla as having five years supervised proba-

On April 19, 2014, Officer Ray Earnest with the Seligman Police Department found Davis to be in possession of methamphetamine

In September 2014, officer with the Barry County Sheriff's Department went to investigate a stolen saddle at Davis's house. According to the victim, he had taken the saddle to Davis's house to ride horses two weeks before, and Davis was not returning his calls. The saddle was pawned by Davis at a pawn shop in Bentonville, Ark.

In October 2014, another victim made a report that he had loaned some firearms to Davis, and then Davis pawned them at various pawn shops.

Davis is to serve probation until October 21, 2019.

• Travis L. Day, Cameron, pled guilty to three counts of burglary in the 2nd degree, two counts of stealing a motor vehicle, two counts of tampering with a motor vehicle in the 1st degree, theft/ stealing of \$500 to \$25,000, and one count of possession of a chemical with the intent to manufacture a controlled substance. Day was sentenced to seven years incarceration.

In September 2011, an ATV, ramps and a water hose were stolen. The ATV was found at Day's residence.

In December 2011, a report was filed that someone had stolen bar stools, a letter jacket, pool table, kitchen table, TV, dog pen and clothing. Day admitted to stealing items in another case, and when deputies searched his home, they found those stolen items, as well.

In February 2012, Day and a woman purchased ammonium sulfate from Race Brothers in Monett, later they went to Walmart to purchase pseudoephedrine. When officers stopped them, they had lye and Coleman fuel, all precursors to manufacture methamphetamine. also had wire cutters and burglary tools.

In September 2012, Day and another person took a stolen vehicle to Triple P Recycling and sold it

• Jody B. Douglas, Cassville pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance and was given a suspended execution of a seven year incarceration sentence, five years supervised probation, and must complete Barry County

On August 23, 2014, Officer Ray Earnest with the Seligman Police Department found Douglas to be in possession of methamphetamine with a glass pipe, needles and baggies in the White Oak parking lot.

Douglas is to serve probation until October 10, 2019.

• Thomas John Duley, Pierce City, pled guilty to theft/stealing of \$500 to \$25,000 and was sentenced to two years incarceration.

On August 8, 2013, Detective Martinson of the Monett Police Department was investigating a load of scrap aluminum and steel stolen from Agricultural Systems, Inc. Employees identified former employee Duley as being the person who stole the scrap metal.

• Joseph N. Eaton, Monett, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance and received a suspended imposition of sentence and five years supervised probation.

On February 13, 2014, the Missouri State Highway Patrol stopped Eaton on U.S. 60 for windows that were too dark. Eaton and his passenger appeared nervous, but allowed the trooper to search his vehicle. Eaton was found to have a baggie of methamphetamine in his sock.

Eaton is to serve probation until October 21, 2019.

• Eric Elliott, Springfield, pled guilty to theft/stealing of \$500 to \$25,000 and received a suspended execution of a six year incarceration sentence and supervised probation for five years.

On March 13, 2013, Elliott went into the Cassville Walmart and put a Vizio computer, table and a Wii into the cart., Elliott left the store with the cart without paying for any of the items. Officers stopped him and found the items in the car.

Elliott is to serve probation until October 20, 2019.

• Matthew Thomas Gatewood, Monett, pled guilty to theft/stealing \$500 to \$25,000, four counts of burglary in the 2nd degree, and possession of a controlled substance and was sentenced to four years incarceration and restitution.

On January 21, 2014, the Missouri State Highway Patrol found Gatewood to have rolling papers, a metal ladle, two smoking devices with marijuana residue and baggies and spoon with methamphetamine residue.

On January 31, 2014, the Monett Walmart had \$666.27 worth of goods taken from the store. Gatewood was identified as the thief.

On March 22, 2014, Gatewood broke into Seconds 2nd Hand Store in Monett and stole electronics. He was identified by security footage.

On March 18, 2014, Monett Farm Supply had copper wiring and conduit stolen. Gatewood admitted to stealing the wire and then selling it under someone else's name.






