# State to not seek death penalty in Washburn murders

Assistant attorney general Darrell Lee Moore filed a notice of intent to seek like imprisonment against Christopher Paschall, the man accused of murdering two people in Washburn last year. Moore filed the intent to waive the death penalty on Monday, September 19, in preparation of the pending trial set for March 27, 2017, in Judge Jack Aaron Louis Goodman's Barry County courtroom.

Paschall, 39, of Springdale, Ark., is currently being held in the Barry County Jail without bond on multiple charges until the trial concludes. Paschall was arrested in Arkansas where he was held on unrelated charges before being extradited back to Barry County in late February of this year.

Paschall is charged with two counts of

murder in the first degree, three counts of armed criminal action and one count of parental kidnapping for the shooting deaths of ex-girlfriend Casie Brace, 29, and her grandfather Herbert Townsend, 76, in his Washburn home on January 5, 2015. Paschall then allegedly kidnapped the two-year old daughter, Alli, Brace and Paschall shared.

On January 5, Barry County Sheriff's deputies were dispatched to Towsend's home in Washburn after a 911 call was placed, according to the affidavits of probable cause. When officers entered the home, they reported to find Townsend shot and bleeding while holding a gun in his living room. When asked, Townsend pointed blame to Paschall for the shooting. Brace was dead in the home, and Townsend succumbed to his injuries shortly

## Cassville hires public works director as new city administrator

For the first time since 2012, the City of Cassville will have a city administrator to bring cohesive approach projects city and functionality. Current Cassville public works director Steve

Walensky was selected by the city council members, and he will be transitioning over to his new role as the city administrator.

Walensky got the call that he would be filling the new position on Monday night after the Cassville's council went into closed

session following the regular monthly meeting. Walenwho been public works director for almost six years, said that he inter-

ested in the position, but it wasn't until recently that he met the requirements.

He explained, "Before, there was a residency requirement that made me ineligible. I live about a mile outside of the Cassville City limits." However, the city opted to waive the

residency requirement, which made Walensky a prime candidate.

He approached his employees in the public works department about his switch to the new position and was met with positive feedback. He said, "They were all very supportive. I was humbled. Just everyone, all the city staff, the mayor and the council were supportive on this."

An exact date for Walensky's transition is to be determined. He said, "I need to put together the requirements for my replacement before we post it." After the job is posted, Walensky will be able to work with the new director to make sure everything is on track. Since the city has

not have an administrator for a number of years, the absence won't be as notice-

He said, "This will allow for a smooth transition."

He is definitely excited and optimistic regarding the move. There has already been conversations about the opportunities for the city with the position filled again.

Walensky said, "One thing we've talked about is a more strategic plan for the city and public works. Right now, we've got plans for transportation, sewer and water, but there are other things. We will have a broader perspective to envelope all of these elements." He said he hopes to focus his efforts on economic development.

# State poverty rates drop, Barry County rates continue to rise

Last week, United States Census Bureau's American Community report was released, revealing that the state of Missouri's poverty rates fell by nearly 0.7 percent between 2014 and 2015. However, preliminary data shows that Barry County's rates actually increased by 0.2 percent.

Currently, the poverty rate, or the number of people living at or below the federal poverty level for their family size, sits at 14.8 percent, a drop from 2014's number of 15.5 percent. Barry County's current rate is 20.2 percent, which is a slight increase over 2014's 20.0 percent. For Barry County residents, that means more than 1 in 5 people is living in poverty.

For a family of four, the federal poverty level is \$24,250. Anyone living at or below that line is considered to be living in poverty. For comparison, the median income for Missouri in 2015 is \$50,238, which is up from 2014's \$48,363. In Barry County,

# Cassville airport repaving project underway

PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR SAYS ON TIME AND ON BUDGET

The Cassville Municipal Airport will be a much smoother ride for planes taxiing to the runway with recent renovation to the taxi lanes outside of the hangars. The City of Cassville signed a contract and work began on the new taxi lanes in August, and the project should be complete by mid-October.


ville public works director Steve Walensky, the project is both on time and on budget.

according to aviation standards and requirements was \$240,254.90.

The work on the pavements is being done by Couch Construction, and Walensky said it has gone smoothly. He said, "The whole thing's come together really well. Couch Excavation has been excellent to work with throughout the project."

The actual design of the reconstruction was completed by Lochner, an airport consultant company the city has used before. All elements of the project have to be closely considered, even the grass used to reseed once the project is completed. Two companies submitted bids to complete the project to Lochner's specifications, and Couch came in with the lower of the two bids. Walensky said they've also enlisted the

services of Hutchens Construction for parts, keeping the project local. He added that the city was unable to do the work with their employees because of requirements for aviation projects. He said, "The specificity to do work on an airport is beyond what we can do."

As it stands, Walensky rated the repaving project at about 60 percent complete. When they initially began, the project had a two-month estimate, which crews have kept to. The contract with Couch was signed on August 1, 2016, with work beginning in mid-August. Walensky said he fully expects work to be completed by mid-October as they initially planned.

While the construction has been underway, hangars have been unavailable, and some airplanes have been tarped near the runway. Currently, the hangars are still unavailable to pilots while the construction project con-

#### **Education required for firearm hunting permits**

of Conservation (MDC) reminds hunters they must show proof of their Hunter Education certification number to buy firearms hunting permits if their certification number is not already in the Department's permits system.

A hunter education course is required for hunters born on or after Jan. 1, 1967, who hunt with firearms. Proof of certification from any state is acceptable.

Hunters can find their "Hunter Ed #" on the front of their Missouri Conservation Heritage Card or on their temporary Hunter Education certificate.

If hunters do not have one of these, they can call the Missouri Department of Conservation's Hunter Education or Permit Services staff at (573) 751-4115.

Missouri hunters and anglers also need their Conservation ID number, their Social Security number, or their driver's license

The Missouri Department number to buy hunting and fishing permits. They must also provide their date of birth. The Conservation ID number can be found on the back of their Missouri Conservation Heritage Card along the bar code, or on any current or expired permit.

that median income is significantly less, according to the Census Bureau's report. Families in Barry County's median household income was \$38,789 in 2014. While all of the specific estimates for Barry County are not available for 2015, 2014's numbers should be comparable since there wasn't a significant change.

The sobering remains that while over 1 in 5 people live in poverty, Barry County is also one of Missouri's counties in which over 25 percent of children live in poverty. Missouri is in the bottom ten in the United States in regard to food security, or the availability of food for all people at all times for a healthy lifestyle.

While there are multiple outreach problems for those struggling financially in

Barry County, only 15 percent of those living under the federal poverty level seek state benefits, such as SNAP, to aid them in food purchases. Other options include local food pantries.

Perhaps one of the most startling aspects of the recently released statistics is that 49.3 percent of Barry County single mothers live below the poverty level.

"We can and should do

better for Missouri," Kurt Brewer, Missouri Community Action Network executive director said."Many Missourians still struggle in an economy that is not working for them. We can take steps to help. Missouri can adopt proven anti-poverty policy interventions like Medicaid expansion and a state-earned income tax credit."

# Cassville survives St. James challenge, 21-12

The Cassville Wildcats shook off the myriad of distractions and a possible trap game disaster on Friday night at Wildcat Stadium, defeating St. James, 21-12.

- Homecoming
- Abysmal field and weather conditions prior to the game
- A peek ahead at the Monett game
- A non-conference game against an unknown, unranked and lightlyregarded opponent

They all added up to a night of concern for the Cassville coaches, as the Wildcats struggled to put away a stubborn team of Tigers.

Cassville wasn't the only Big 8 team struggling on Friday night. The Seneca Indians backed into the Saturday morning headlines, losing at East Newton in a shocker.

In a Brian Jackson sports article, Florida Gators coach Jim McElwain summed up the dreaded trap game from a coach's perspective.

But the energy and the way you prepare to go out against anybody, it doesn't matter. It shouldn't matter if it's football or if it's tiddlywinks, or if it's going to the ice cream truck really fast," said McElwain.

After a three-hour bus ride through some rough weather, St. James hit the field running. The Tigers scored on the second offensive play of the game. Senior running back Dawson Lynch finished a simple screen play with a dazzling 74-yard sprint to give St. James a 6-0 lead less than a minute into the contest.


It was a short-lived lead. Cassville did what Cassville does. After the kickoff sailed out of bounds, the Wildcats pounded out a 10-play, 65-yard drive in a four and a half minute span to take a 7-6 lead. River Phelps dove in from a yard out for the score and then added the PAT to give Cassville the lead.

Tentative play and conservative play-calling led to a "No one's ever perfect. long scoring drought on the soggy field for both squads. But the Wildcats fashioned another long scoring drive to end the half. Cassville's offense drove 74 yards in 11 plays to extend the lead to 14-6 with 2:42 on the clock. On third-and-six from the St. James 8-yard line, Shannon Haney rifled a pass over the middle. Collin Pearman made an Odell Beckham Jr. circus catch and glided across the goal line in a highlight reel moment.

The Wildcats were lucky to have that lead at the break. Shortly after Pearman's score, Carter Keeney came open behind the Cassville secondary. Wide open and pulling away from the Wildcats, Keeney dropped a long pass from Ryan Harlan that could have been an 84-yard touchdown.

It was a rocky first half, but the Wildcats seemed to have the game under control. Cassville ran for over 130 yards in the first half, and Haney's passing was effective in building the 14-6 lead. St. James, on the other hand, finished the half with negative rushing yards. Ryan Harlan did throw for 115 yards in the first half, but most of those came on the long screen pass.

Cassville executed the coach's dream to start the third quarter. After earning the last score of the first half, the Wildcats took the thirdquarter kickoff and drove 58

yards in 12 plays to take a 21-6 lead. Haney navigated the final 13 yards of the drive with a keeper around right end for the score.

That is why teams defer to the second half when they win the coin toss. That Holy Grail of "last score of the first half and first score of the last half" almost always translates into victory in high school football.

The Wildcats then held the Tigers on downs, but fumbled away a golden opportunity in the red zone when they could have blown the game open.

Unable to run against the Wildcats, the Tigers became a one-dimensional offense as the game progressed. That necessity exposed a weak Cassville secondary and St. James suddenly looked very formidable. Those who expected the Tigers to fold like a cheap tent were shocked and concerned when the St. James aerial show finally took flight.

The Tigers fashioned a 15-play, 89-yard drive to pull within 21-12 on the strength of Harlan's strong left arm. But the two-point conversion failed, and Cassville

only had to run 44 seconds off the clock to secure the 21-12 win.

The St. James coaches were likely second guessing their decision to punt on fourth down with just nine minutes remaining in the game. That one possession turned out to be the difference in the game.






## **Volleyfest Tournament** set for Saturday at SWHS

# Barry County Extension member election opens in October

"Serving on a county extension council can be fun. It is also a great way to represent your community, serve your county, and help create educational opportunities for your neighbors," said David Burton, civic communication specialist for University of Missouri Extension. "In Barry County, we need dedicated council members willing to help market extension locally and know the needs of the community as to what may be needed as educational programs in the county."

Every county in Missouri has an Extension Council made up of elected (and appointed) members who represent the broad educational needs and backgrounds of people in that county. Council candidates must be at least 18 years old and reside in Barry County.

Missouri statutes create County Extension Councils to work with MU Extension specialists. Council members assist in planning and carrying out MU Extension programs, providing local Extension governance and representing the diversity of the county's changing population.

Barry County Council election will be held week of January 9-13 in accordance with state law (Chapter 262.550-262.620 R.S. Mo. 1969).







A great way to immediately cut feed costs is to produce high quality forages at home, according to Reagan Bluel, Dairy Specialist with University of Missouri Extension.

High quality forage is what was submitted to the 2016 Missouri State Fair hay contest from Southwest Missouri. The top placing hays from SWMO reflect hard work and commitment from growers in Barry, Lawrence and Christian Coun-

Excellent quality hay goes a long way in covering the nutrient requirements of both dairy and beef cattle. Local producers faired well with alfalfa, alfalfa mix, wheatlage, fescue and fescue

"When working with dairymen to develop a diet or ration for the herd, it all begins with quality forages. If we have a great hay to start with, my job immediately becomes easier," said

Grand champion and reserve grand champion both originated in Lawrence county. Glen Obermann and Charles Krueger, separated by only a few miles near Friestatt, were awarded Grand and Reserve Grand, respectively, with their late season alfalfa which tested 215 and 205 relative feed value.

In the balage grass class, Karl Wilke, also of Friestatt, was awarded first with his wheatlage. Champion and reserve overall balage were both awarded to Earl Dotson, of Marionville.

Marcia Moreland, of Crane, was awarded top in the grasses class with her fescue hay for the second consecutive year. Top of the mixed grass division and champion of the grasses class is long-time hay producer and dairyman John Staiger, of Billings, with his alfalfa-orchardgrass mix.

Congratulations growers on an outstanding showing that the 2016 Missouri State



# Purdy FFA has success at competition, shows









# Cassville Middle School starts new, innovative programs

In the spirit of 19th Century Westward Expansion that started when Thomas Jefferson orchestrated the Louisiana Purchase to improve the nation's health. Cassville Middle School started this school year following in the footsteps of the earliest American pioneers by offering several innovative courses to keep the school moving forward—and staying healthy.

Much like Jefferson believed the success of the republic "depended on an independent, virtuous citizenry for its survival", CMS Administration and Staff believe that their success depends on providing opportunities for students to grow their skills to meet the changing, evermore competitive demands of an interconnected world. Where Jefferson saw opportunity for the young country to flourish through land ownership and independence, the staff at CMS are pushing students to take ownership

of their learning through courses that promote creativity, analytical thought, problem solving, and a better understanding of citizenship in a digital world.

#### **Project Lead The Way**

This summer, CMS joined Project Lead The Way (PLTW), an Indianabased non-profit organization dedicated to providing curriculum and services in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) education. With 48 counties represented in Missouri offering programs PLTW, CMS through becomes the first facility in Barry County to teach this project-based curriculum. Courses in Design and Modeling, Vex Robotics, and Intro to Computer Science are offered to current 7th and 8th grade students as electives. A brief description of each is below:

#### Design Models (DM)

Students apply the design process to solve problems and understand

the influence of creativity and innovation in their lives. They work in teams to design a playground and furniture, capturing research and ideas in their engineering notebooks. Using Autodesk® design software, students create a virtual image of their designs and produce a portfolio to showcase their innovative solutions.

#### **Automation Robotics** (AR)

Students trace the history, development, and influence of automation and robotics as they learn about mechanical systems, energy transfer, machine automation, and computer control systems. Students use the VEX Robotics® platform to design, build, and program real-world objects such as traffic lights, toll booths, and robotic arms.


#### Introduction to Computer Science 1 (ICS-1)

Studies show that by 2018, 1.4 million job openings will be available for computer specialists. In this unit, students discover the principles of this fastgrowing field by focusing on creativity and an iterative design process as they create their own basic apps using MIT App Inventor.

#### Introduction to Computer Science 2 (ICS-2)

Students continue to explore the fundamentals of the stimulating career path of computer science. They venture into text programming through Python and, in the final problem, develop an app to crowdsource and analyze data on a topic of their interest.

To teach just one of the courses above, teachers are put through weeklong "boot camps" of instruction at various locations throughout the state. CMS Industrial Tech teacher, Robbie Artherton, attended two such sessions this summer at Rolla S & T to become certified in both DM and AR instruction. CMS Technology teacher, Jake Forste, traveled to UCM's Lee's Summit cam-

Teachers are instructed to provide the guidance and resources to students, then to step back and monitor progress, teamwork skills, and guide students. Kids have vivid imaginations and are prone to think outside the box when presented problems with no real solutions and only the result in mind. Teachers find themselves learning right along with kids over time. There

are currently 70 students enrolled in these courses first semester. CMS hopes to expand offerings in the future to include the biomedical field and forensic science.

#### **Computer Literacy**

Another "pioneering" offering this year at CMS is the inclusion of Computer Literacy classes for all 6th grade students. It took some creative scheduling to maintain ideal numbers in core classes, but all 6th graders will receive a

semester of computer literacy with a targeted focus on digital citizenship. As younger and younger children have internet capable technology at their fingertips on a daily basis, the need for helping them understand a digital footprint and its effect on human life is vital. Topics covered in the class taught by CMS Social Studies teacher, Chris Seymour, will include cyber-bullying, digital footprint, written communication forms, reputable resources, and social media.

#### **Study Skills**

CMS Communication arts teacher Shari Rhea will be teaching 6th grade students how to organize their life as they transition into middle school and the added inherent responsibilities. While the topic is not new, it is to CMS. With no curriculum to guide her, Shari will use her experience and expertise to help students understand how to summarize notes, maintain a calendar, prioritize information, even how to prepare both mentally and physically for assessments. Research consistently shows that effective communication skills are a top factor in post-high school success and lifetime wages earned. The goal is to promote good habits that will have lasting positive effects throughout their education and career.

#### **Publications**

Most people think of Publications as the typical high school yearbook course. CMS Library Media Specialist Becky Haynes is taking the premise of that course and expanding it greatly this year. Typically, CMS has used enrichment periods to have students learn cameras, take pictures, and edit articles for the annual yearbook. This process greatly limited both participant numbers and the quality of the product, given it was only open to academically strong students and the time was 30 minutes a couple days per week. A class was added to the schedule this year that will open the class to more students for an entire period on a daily basis. Twenty-four students are currently enrolled in the class. The Library Media Center has several resources for students to use, including a green screen with movie production software for ipads. Students will certainly be using the latest in digital photography equipment to snap awesome shots for the yearbook, but they will also be learning to produce and edit short films and build websites. These students will also get to hone their acting skills as they produce instructional videos on the CMS Positive Behavior System (Wildcat Expectations).

#### **Summary**

Each of the courses outlined above focus hard on helping CMS not only meet Goal 1 (21st Century Learning) and Goal 2 (Math and Literacy) of the District level expectations, but they make sense for today's world. The staff at CMS hope to prepare students for a future that, in many cases, hasn't even been invented yet. A survey of CMS students last spring showed that 72% of our students have either strongly




CMS eighth grade student Tristan White is working on constructing a windmill in Coach Artherton's robotics class.

With the amount of highly skilled technical and engineering jobs available in the area, we hope to build an interest in our students that would start them on a path to come back here and compete for those high paying positions. Even if students decide to leave the area, we hope to have given them the tools and drive




