The local American Legion Memorial Park was the recipient of some TLC over the weekend thanks to the Lowe's Heroes program. Volunteers worked tirelessly on Saturday to make repairs to the pavilion and general maintenance of the playground and fences.

American Legion Post 118 is located on MO-112

and has a building as well as grounds that include the Memorial Park. In recent years, the park's maintenance has suffered due to funding constraints. Since being selected by Lowe's Heroes for help, it puts the Legion grounds in a much better place in terms of upkeep.

Post Commander Michele Hovland, PC COL (Ret) US Army, said, "It's a huge help to be selected for the Heroes program. They fixed the wall inside the pavilion. They took down the rickety slide that was a huge liability and replaced the kids' swings as well as painted the whole set."

Members of the legion, volunteers from Lowes' Heroes, local Cub Scouts church members and a local chapter of the Vietnam Veterans of America showed

up Saturday to help with the project.

Hovland added, "They painted all of the fences. They also cut back all of the trees all around the park and carried all the brush off for us. They got us new trash cans and new lights for the gate entrance."

Rex Stumpff retires after 56 years as barber

To say Rex Stumpff is a man of many trades is an understatement. All of his life, he has been a successful entrepreneur. Through-

out the years, Stumpff has owned and operated two restaurants, served as the Barry County Clerk for 12 years, and has been the town barber at Stumpff's Barber Shop

in Cassville for 56 years. Recently, Stumpff decided it was time to retire from bar-

Stumpff graduated in May 1960 from Cassville High

School. After graduation, he moved to Kansas City where he graduated from Molar Barber College. Stumpff worked as a barber in Kansas City at the Country Club Plaza for two years before returning to Cassville.

Upon returning from Kansas City, Stumpff purchased the South Side Barber Shop in Cassville. In 1974, he opened Stumpff's Barber Shop on the square where it is located today. He also opened a barber shop in Shell

The Shell Knob shop is where Stumpff had his most memorable day of barbering. "It was a Monday, and I had 47 haircuts at \$1.50 each," said Stumpff. "It was a ten and a half hour day for me nonstop; it was the biggest day of barbering I ever had."

The very next night, Stumpff was back at the Shell Knob shop and had another 23 haircuts. "They just kept

Cassville R-IV continues to expand technology initiative

Beginning this year, first and second grade classrooms now have their own class sets of Google Chromebooks.



Cassville offers telemedicine for students through CoxHealth

Whether it's because of time or finances, sometimes it's a challenge for parents to connect ill children with proper healthcare. That's why, thanks to a grant from the Missouri Foundation for Health, CoxHealth is bringing no cost health care to the students.

Now, sick kids can be seen right at school via telemedicine for acute ailments such as sore throats, earaches, pink eye, strep, chronic coughs, rashes and the flu.

Over three-year period, CoxHealth will place mobile telehealth carts in six elementary schools - Cassville, Forsyth, Monett, Mountain Grove, Ozark and Reeds Spring across six counties in order to connect children with providers via telemedicine.

The providers include nurse practitioners aboard the CARE Mobile, a mobile pediatric clinic, sponsored by Children's Miracle Network Hospitals. Parents will be able to participate in the visit either in person, or by phone or video using a smartphone (or other video-enabled device) without having to leave work or home.

The service is voluntary and is completely no cost while this method of healthcare is piloted. If a diagnosis is made, prescriptions will be sent to each family's preferred pharmacy. Cox-Health has plans to partner with other agencies to provide financial support for medications for those that need it.

Students can be seen either by a referral from their school nurse or by a

parent/guardian calling in and requesting an appointment. The office hours for telemedicine are 7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Monday-Friday.

We have been able to

get students in very quickly with little to no wait time. Most appointments are taking 15-20 minutes to complete! Parents must have a permission slip on file for their student to be treated.

Cassville returns home on Friday night, hosting Big 8 rival Monett in the annual Barry County Brawl. Kickoff is set for 7 p.m.



Statewide campaign urges proper child safety restraints

Do you know if your child is in the right safety seat? While they may be old enough, they still may not weigh enough, or be tall enough to buckle up and skip the booster or car seat.

National Child Passenger Safety Week is Sept. 17-23. The Missouri Coalition for Roadway Safety wants to ensure all caregivers of young children know the importance of buckling children in an appropriate child restraint. Motorists can also expect increased enforcement of Missouri's child seat safety laws during this campaign.

In 2016, 18 children less than eight years of age were killed and 47 suffered injuries as occupants in motor vehicle crashes in Missouri. Twenty-nine percent of the children killed were not restrained in a car seat or safety belt.

Missouri law requires all children under eight to

be in an appropriate child safety seat or booster seat,

- They are at least 4'9"

While Missouri law only requires one of them, safety encourages all of them.

"All parents and caregivers need to understand the importance of booster seats. It's not just about following the law - booster seats help prevent serious injury and may even save your child's life," said Bill Whitfield, chair of the executive committee for the coalition.

Serious injuries can result from improperly fitted safety belts, particularly for children ages four through seven who are secured only in a regular safety belt during a crash. These injuries are commonly known as "seat belt syndrome," which are

often life-threatening or disabling injuries. Booster seats help prevent this syndrome from occurring by raising the child up so the lap and shoulder belt fits them properly.

Child safety seat technicians will provide education and car seat inspections at locations across the state during this campaign, and throughout the year. A list of car seat inspection stations and locations across the state can be found at seatcheck. org. Appointments may be necessary.

"We are urging everyone to get their child safety seats inspected," said Whitfield. "When it comes to the safety of a child, there is no room for mistakes."



MDC seeks help with Chronic Wasting Disease

The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) needs the help of deer hunters to keep the deadly deer disease called chronic wasting disease (CWD) from spreading to more deer in more areas of Missouri.

MDC will be conducting mandatory CWD sampling of harvested deer in 25 counties opening weekend of the fall firearms deer season, Nov. 11 and 12. Hunters who harvest deer in any of these select counties of MDC's CWD Management Zone during opening weekend MUST present their harvested deer at one

of the Department's 56 CWD sampling stations so staff can collect tissue samples to test the animals for CWD.

The 25 mandatory CWD sampling counties are: Adair, Barry, Benton, Cedar, Cole, Crawford, Dade, Franklin, Hickory, Jefferson, Knox, Linn, Macon, Moniteau, Ozark, Polk, St. Charles, St. Clair, St. Francois, Ste. Genevieve, Stone, Sullivan, Taney, Warren, and Washington.

The 25 mandatory sampling counties include ones recently added to the CWD Management Zone after cases of CWD were found there in 2016-2017, counties with previous CWD positives, and counties very near where cases of CWD have been found.

Deer must be presented by the hunter who harvested the

Hunters will be asked to identify the location within the county the deer was harvested.

Deer may be field dressed before being taken to a sampling station.

Hunters can also present just the deer head with about six inches of neck attached.

For bucks bound to a taxidermist, the cape may be removed prior to being taken to a sampling station as long as about six inches of the neck is left attached.

For bucks bound to a taxidermist, hunters may

also leave the deer intact and inform staff the deer is bound for a taxidermist. Staff will complete paperwork and inform the hunters about participating taxidermists taking CWD samples.

Hunters will be given information on getting free test results for their deer.

Emphasis on opening

Opening weekend of the firearms season is the most popular two hunting days for most deer hunters in Missouri. During those two days, hunters take about a third of the state's total annual deer harvest of about 275,000 animals.

"Focusing on this key weekend gives us the best opportunity to collect the most tissue samples during a very concentrated time period," explained MDC Wildlife Disease Coordinator Jasmine Batten. "Prior to conducting mandatory sampling for the first time last year, we collected about 7,600 tissue samples through voluntary sampling over the entire deer season. Thanks to deer hunters, last year we collected 19,200 samples during opening-weekend mandatory sampling."

Batten added the increased number of samples collected gives MDC scientists a much better understanding of the distribution and prevalence of the disease -- where it is and how many deer may have it. It can also help find new cases in new areas.



Washburn Fire receives MDC grant

During July and August, matching funds grant checks for rural fire departments were distributed by the Missouri Department of Conservation Forestry Division staff. One hundred sixtynine fire departments received checks for up to \$4,000 to help with the purchase of personal protective gear and fire fighting equipment for wildfire, as well as structure fire suppression efforts. The total funding awarded to Missouri fire departments through the matching funds grant program this year is \$361,564.30.

Fire departments are required to match 50 percent of the funds which are provided by the Missouri Department of Conservation and the US Forest Service, Volunteer Fire Assistance Program. Throughout the last 30 years, over \$8 million has been distributed to rural fire departments to help them increase the safety of their firefighters and provide them with better fire fighting equipment.

There were 158 Missouri traffic crashes involving farm equipment in 2016. In those crashes three people were killed and 62 were injured.

Farming plays a vital role in Missouri's economy, history, and identity. The following are reminders for safe travel during this busy time

Motorists

- Stay alert for slow moving farm equipment.
- When you come up behind a tractor or other farm machinery, please slow down and be patient. Wait to pass until you have a clear view of the road ahead and there is no oncoming traffic. Never pass on a hill or curve.
- Collisions commonly occur when a motorist tries to pass a left-turning farm vehicle. A tractor that appears to be pulling to the right side of the road to let motorists pass, instead may be preparing to make a wide left turn. Watch the farmer's hand and light signals closely.
- Pay close attention to farm equipment entering and leaving the highway from side roads and drive-
- Special attention must be paid when traveling at dawn or dusk when the sun makes it difficult for drivers to see.

Farmers

• Make sure any farm equipment being driven on Missouri roadways is properly marked with lights and

emblem.

Motorists, farmers:

- Drive as far to the right as possible.
- If traffic accumulates behind you on a road where it is difficult to make a safe pass, you should pull off onto the side of the road in a level area, so the vehicles
- If possible, never travel on roadways at dawn or dusk when it is more difficult for drivers of other vehicles to see. However, Missouri law allows agricultural machinery and implements to be operated on state highways between the hours of sunset and sunrise for agricultural purposes provided vehicles are equipped with the required lighting.
- Like other motor vehicles, most modern farm tractors have seat belts. Always use a seat belt when operating a tractor equipped with a roll-over protection struc-• Often, all-terrain vehi-
- cles are used for agricultural purposes. ATVs being used for farming can only travel on highways during daylight hours and must be equipped with lights, a bicycle flag, and "slow-moving vehicle" emblem. The law requires anyone under the age of 18 to wear a safety helmet when operating an ATV; the Patrol, however, recommends all operators to wear a safety helmet regardless of

Farmers are encouraged to review the regulations that pertain to farm vehicles and the transportation of goods. These regulations include, but are not limited to:

- If crossing state lines, farm vehicle drivers should be aware of the regulations for the jurisdictions in which they operate.
 - Farm vehicles operated

only within Missouri must display the farm name and its location if the vehicle bears a "local" license plate with the "F" tab.

- The driver of a farm vehicle must be at least 18 years of age if operating with Missouri; 21 years of age if crossing the state line.
- Those driving farm vehicles should familiarize themselves with the regulations regarding DOT physicals and commercial driver licenses when applicable.
- Permits must be obtained from MoDOT if you are traveling on an interstate and your vehicle or load is over the normal size and weight requirements.
- · Any vehicle or combination of vehicles hauling grain or grain co-products during times of harvest may be as much as, but not exceeding, 10 percent over the maximum weight limitation allowable while operating on highways other than the interstate highway system. The provisions of Section 304.180 RSMo. shall not apply to vehicles operated and operating on the inter-

Driving is a full-time job for everyone. Distracted drivers are dangerous drivers. Whether you're driving a vehicle or operating farm machinery, you must pay attention to the roadway, other drivers, and traffic signs. It's that simple.

The only 100 percent survivable traffic crash is the one that never happens. Make sure everyone in the vehicle is properly restrained in a seat belt or child restraint. Discover nature with MDC through fall color Verona Corn Maze opens this weekend

GET FALL-COLOR UPDATES FROM MDC ONLINE

As the heat of summer fades to the cool weather of fall, trees and shrubs around the Show-Me State transform from leaves of green to a fallfoliage color palette of golds, reds, oranges, and purples. The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) encourages people to discover nature through fall-color adventures.

"People can travel anywhere in Missouri and find a variety of trees that show off a fantastic array of color in the fall," said MDC Resource Forester Cory Gregg.

Gregg explained that leaves turn colors when two things happen.

"First, sugars produced by photosynthesis are trapped inside leaves by chilly - but not freezing - autumn nights," he said. "Those sugars are the building blocks for red, yellow, orange, and purple pigments. Cool nights simultaneously cause the breakdown of green pigments, allowing these other colors to show through."

A wide variety of trees around the state means Missourians have a fall-color season that can last four to six weeks. Sassafras, sumac, and Virginia creeper are some of the earliest foliage to change, beginning in mid-September. By late September, black gum, bittersweet, and dogwoods are turning.

The color change starts earliest in northern Missouri and moves southward across the state. The peak of fall color in Missouri is usually around mid-October. This is when maples, ashes, oaks, and hickories are at the height of their fall display. Normally by late October, the colors are fading and the leaves start to drop from the trees.

Viewing fall color

For spectacular vistas, MDC recommends routes along rivers with views of forested bluffs, and along ridges with sweeping scenes of forested landscapes. On a smaller scale, find fall color through drives on back roads, hikes, or float trips under a colorful forest canopy. Conservation areas and state parks are also great places to visit for fall color.

"Even treeless areas, such as prairies and roadsides, display beautiful shades of gold, purple, olive, and auburn with autumn wildflowers, shrubs, and grasses," Gregg said. "In cities and towns, enjoy places with mature trees, such as older neighborhoods, parks, and even cemeteries."

Weekly fall color updates

MDC offers weekly online fall-color updates from Department foresters all over the state. The updates include species of trees that are turning and recommendations for where to see them. Get fall color updates from MDC online at mdc.mo.gov/fall-


