CCC lodge renovation among big news for Roaring River

Some big changes are coming to Roaring River State Park, according to announcements made by the director of Missouri State Parks Bill Bryan. Among those changes will be a total renovation of the CCC lodge and a more publicized opening day of trout season in 2015.

The annual informational meeting at Roaring River was held on Wednesday, September 17, at the Emory Melton Inn and Conference Center. The meeting was open to the public and featured speakers from the Missouri Department of Conservation, Roaring River and Bryan. The exciting announcement about the conversion of the CCC lodge into guest rooms will open a part of history to park-goers, according to Bryan.

He stated, “I’m paying attention to what people are saying about the park. We’re doing the right things for the park, and it will all pay off in the end.”

The initial plans for the project show the lodge to contain 10 guest rooms, some of which will feature the existing fireplaces located along either end of the building. Each of the rooms will have a kitchenette, bed-

room and bathroom along with a Murphy’s bed for extra sleeping. The design within the rooms will incorporate a historic interior design and a common room on the bottom floor.

The renovations aren’t expected to be completed anytime soon, Bryan explained. “We have set directives that we have to follow regarding the bidding process and so on, but I’m hopeful that it will be ready for Opening Day 2016,” he said. As far as a budget or idea of the cost, Bryan said that all is still up in the air. The current construction budget is \$1.25 million. Missouri State Parks expects to put the project up for bid in coming weeks and go from there.

This special project is funded by an allocation of General Revenue from the State. The Missouri General Assembly approved a budget item for a \$20 million allocation for the Department of Natural Resources for state park and historic site maintenance, repair, renovation and construction projects. However, around 3/4 of the standard funding for Missouri State Parks comes from a constitutional 1/10 cent tax for parks, soils and water. Use fees from the parks also goes into provid-

ing the funds necessary to keep the parks system running.

Bryan stated, “Our first project goal is to have the construction contract signed by the end of the fiscal year which will be in June 2015. While I hope it is sooner than that, but that is our goal.” Like the other facilities in the park, the CCC rooms will be managed by Missouri Parks, Incorporated, locally run by general manager David Waugh.

Another announcement made during the informa-

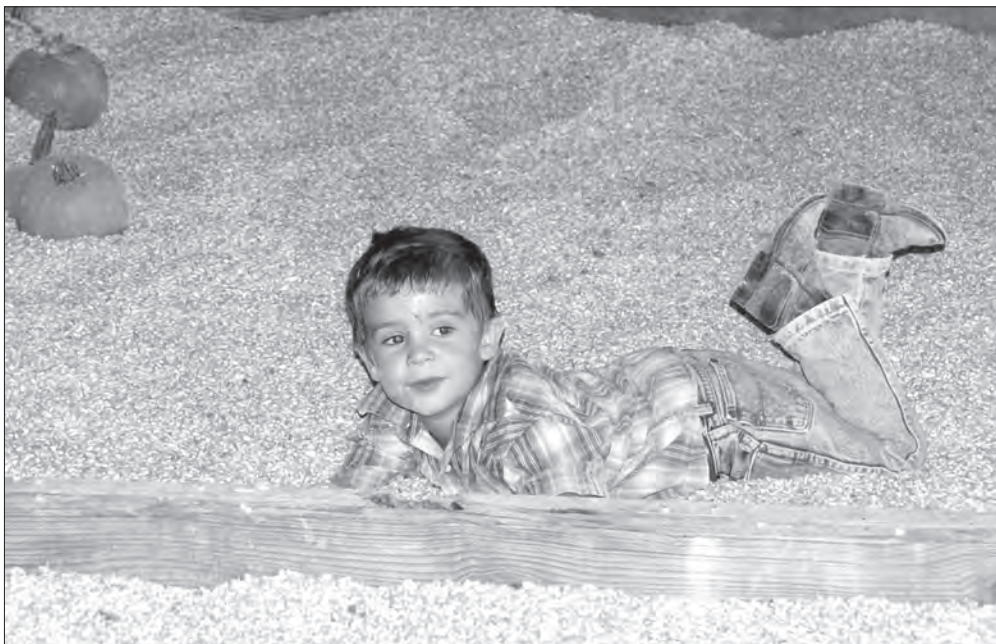
tional meeting was exciting news for the park. Opening Day 2015 at Roaring River will be the site of a taping of a nationally televised fishing show. While Bryan was mostly quiet about the details until everything can be confirmed, he did say that the show normally features bass fishing, so they will probably take the crew to Table Rock Lake as well as Roaring River.

The show will be taped on Opening Day and shown at a later date on the Outdoor Network. Bryan said, “This

specific show is on weekly and is sponsored by a major national organization. It has regular viewership, and this is a tremendous opportunity for us to share Roaring River with others all over the country.”

Bryan also stated, “I’ve been to all of the trout parks on Opening Day. They’re all great, but there’s something special about the connection down here with Cassville and the park. It’s something people don’t forget.”

BC E9-1-1 Center moves to handle all local calls for county

Emergency medical dispatches in south Barry County could be handled by the E9-1-1 Center in Cassville by the beginning of 2015, according to a proposal by Director Mike Phillips. Currently, when someone calls 9-1-1 in south Barry County for a medical emergency, such as a heart attack, that call is transferred to Cox Hospitals in Springfield, where an operator stays on the line with the caller and provides instructions for medical care until paramedics arrive.

At a meeting of the E9-1-1 Emergency Services Board on Monday, Sept. 22, Phillips stated he believed the time had come for the Barry County E9-1-1 Center, which already handles emergency medical dispatch for the northern part of the county, to begin handling e fo the southern part. “It’s the right thing to do for

Barry County,” he said.

According to Phillips, Cox Hospitals handles emergency medical dispatch for south Barry County because, before 9-1-1 first came into the area, there was no one trained to handle emergency dispatch calls. Now, however, Phillips says the E9-1-1 center has enough trained personnel to meet all of the needs. “We’re in a place now where, with our staffing levels and experienced dispatchers, we can take on that duty,” he said.

Currently, the Center employs 16 dispatchers, with at least two dispatchers at each shift and three at peak periods. After January, that number will increase to a minimum of three per shift, with four at peak periods.

Phillips says the handling of emergency medical dispatch at the local level will provide a superior level

of service for county residents because the dispatchers in the Barry County E9-1-1 Center are much more familiar with Barry County than those employed by Cox Hospitals in Springfield. "My dispatchers are more familiar with the area, and we are able to maintain quality assurance on a local level," he said. Phillips also said that localizing the emergency medical dispatches would have no financial impact.

The Emergency Services Board plans to meet with the chairman of the Barry County South Ambulance Board within the next 30 days to further discuss the matter. Phillips said that while the Ambulance Board does have a contract with Cox Hospitals, the contract does not mention emergency medical dispatches. In other business, Mike Bennett was sworn in as the board's newest member. He replaces former board member Leslie Smith. Upon being sworn in, Bennett was also appointed as board secretary. The board next meets on Dec. 16.

Cassville veteran chosen for Honor Flight

Since 2005, Honor Flight, Inc. has been showing appreciation to American veterans by flying them for free to the nation's capitol. To date, almost 118,000 veterans have made this flight. Recently, Cassville resident Brad Ruggles joined their ranks.

Ruggles joined the United States Marine Corps in 1952

and served two years as a helicopter mechanic in the Marine Air Wing before being honorably discharged in 1954. After leaving the Marines, Ruggles and his family lived in Kansas City and Colorado Springs before moving to Cassville around 1995, when his youngest son, Robert Ruggles, became police chief.

To be part of the honor

flight, Ruggles filled out an application. He said he received a response from them about four weeks later, informing him he had been selected to take part.

On Sept. 9, Ruggles made his honor flight with 74 other veterans from the Springfield Airport. It was an early start. Those making the honor flight had to be at the airport at 4:20 a.m.

Because many veterans making the flight have mobility issues due to age and/or wartime injuries, each volunteer was partnered up with a guardian, who acted as personal assistants to the veterans. Most guardians were volunteers. In Ruggles case, he brought his son, Ron.

According to Ruggles, after he and the other veterans arrived in Washington, they

were placed on buses that took them to the capitol city's downtown area. There, they had the chance to tour the World War II Memorial, the Korean War Memorial, the Vietnam Wall and the Marine Corps War Memorial. Later, they toured Arlington Cemetery.

Ruggles said he was particularly taken by the Korean War memorial, which consists of the statues of soldiers in a garden meant to resemble the terrain in Korea. "If you were to go up there in the fog, and run into them," he said, "it would give you a fright, because they're so life-like."

After leaving Arlington, the veterans were taken back to Dulles Airport for their return trip home. Ruggles said the veterans were treated like VIPs while traveling to and from the airport, with a police

escort halting all other traffic for them. "They stopped all traffic both ways," he said.

The return flight had the veterans back in Springfield by 9:45 p.m., where Ruggles said another surprise was waiting for them.

A crowd of well-wishers, estimated by Ruggles to be about 2,000 strong, had gathered at the airport to greet the veterans on their return. Many of them had gifts for the veterans. Ruggles himself was given a quilt made by the Ladies Auxiliary from the Elk Lodge

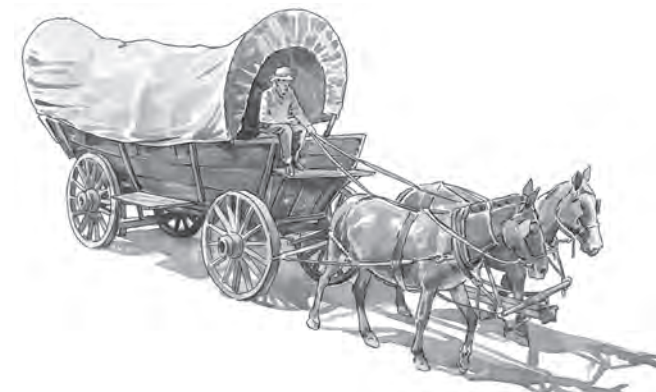

The Missouri Reunion had over 75 participants including state and national leadership from the Annie’s Project. The two day reunion included topics such as grain and livestock market outlook, 2014 Farm Bill changes and transferring the family farm to heirs. Speakers included attorneys and professors from the University of Missouri and Iowa State University.

Bull breeding soundness clinic in Barry County Oct. 1

A word of advice to area cattle producers: it is time to evaluate your bulls for readiness to breed cows in November and December.

“Whether you have one bull or 25 bulls, they need checked at least once a year before turnout time. Some cattlemen even check bulls

twice a year,” said Eldon Cole, livestock specialist with University of Missouri Extension.

Cole says a routine check again this fall is important if you’ve noticed cows coming back in heat, if bulls have been injured this summer, or if bulls are showing their age and have poor body condition scores.

“Under these conditions the breeding soundness exam (BSE) serves as an insurance policy for having a uniform calf crop in the fall of 2015,” said Cole.

During the exam, bulls will be treated for internal and external parasites and given their booster vaccinations if desired.

Four clinics are scheduled as follows: Oct. 1, Barry County Veterinary Services, Cassville; Oct. 14, Animal Clinic of Diamond, Diamond; Oct. 15, Dake Veterinary Clinic, Miller and Oct. 17, Countryside Animal Clinic, Aurora.

It is necessary to make an appointment through these veterinary offices or your own veterinarian.

“It’s important to learn if you have a bull problem well in advance of turnout time. There are a number of bull sales in late September and October in case you need to shop for a replacement or two,” said Cole.

The clinics are cooperative efforts between the veterinarians, Zoetis and University of Missouri Extension.

Bulls will be checked for structural soundness, semen quality, body condition, scrotal size and given a test for trichomoniasis if desired by the owner. The trich test is recommended for older bulls that may have visited a neighbor’s pasture or had a bull or cow form a neighbor

visit their pasture. More and more breeders test for trich in yearling bulls that should be virgins, just to be on the safe side.

Zoetis offers their High Density - 50 K genomic test at each location. This test gives an enhancement to the bull’s expected progeny difference (EPD) accuracy which is especially helpful for young bulls that may be offered for sale.

Cole will be on hand to answer questions regarding EPD usage, bull sales and management. He says the clinics in March saw 170 bulls and 13.5 percent did not pass the BSE.

“Some of the bulls that didn’t pass were close and could have bred a few cows but were not equipped to breed and settle 30 or 40 females in a 60 day season,” said Cole.

Mercy works to break senior depression stigma

Both young and old can suffer from depression. Studies have found that about seven million Americans over the age of 65 suffer from depression and anxiety. "Up to 90 percent of people who suffer from depression later in life do not receive adequate care with 78 percent receiving no treatment at all" (Kerr, Micheal 2012).

Mental health professionals feel, that stigma (fear of the unknown) has been keeping people 65 and older from receiving the appropriate support they deserve. Depression and anxiety are treatable illness, and Senior Life Solutions is dedicated in their mission to improve the mental health of people 65 and older.

One could ask why there is stigma surrounding mental health when it has been clearly documented throughout history. Perhaps the most obvious is in biblical references. Grieving in sac-cloth and refusing food is mentioned several times. Job is perhaps most famous for this. At other points Jesus healed a man in the graveyard from whom others

However, willingness is needed. The man in the cemetery had to allow Jesus to heal him and accept the gift Jesus offered him, to his benefit he did. Encouraging loved ones in difficult times to do the same today or taking that step ourselves to call is opening a door to allow healing in.

Depression is a condition in which a person may

feel discouraged, sad, hopeless, lonely, unmotivated, or disinterested in life. Anxiety is described by many as not being at peace, feeling restless, fearing disasters, a sense of not being in control, or unwanted negative thoughts. Persons having some or all of the mentioned symptoms may find is difficult to carry out activities of normal daily living.
