Wildcats dominate Cubs in Barry County Brawl

The Cassville Wildcats demolished the Monett Cubs 21-0 at Wildcat Stadium. Shannon Haney and DJ White hooked up for two long touchdown passes and the Wildcat defense stifled the Cubs as Lance Parnell's team improved to 4-2 on the season.

Last year, Monett came from behind to claim the brawling trophy, 21-20, at Burl Fowler Stadium, then claimed a 35-21 playoff win over the young Wildcats. But on Friday night, the roles were reversed as Cassville answered the bell. The 21-0 score doesn't begin to tell the domination that the Wildcats enjoyed in this game.

Wildcat miscues kept the game scoreless until late in the first quarter. Shannon Haney was sacked by the Monett defense to kill Cassville's first possession. Then, after forcing a three-and-out punt from Monett, a Wildcat defender inadvertently touched the ball and the Cubs recovered at the Cassville 34-yard line.

Monett drove into the red zone, but Caleb Hilton's 35-yard field goal attempt sailed wide right.

On the second play of this drive, Haney rifled a slant to DJ White on the left hash. White never broke stride, outrunning the Monett secondary for an 80-yard touchdown. Drake Reese pounded the PAT through the uprights, and Cassville claimed a 7-0 lead with 2:29 on the clock.

Cassville's FEMA flood damage money delayed FEMA SAYS HURRICANE RELIEF TAKES PRIORITY

The money Cassville requested from FEMA for repairs related to the April 28 flooding has been delayed due to Hurricane Harvey and Irma. Steve Walensky, city administrator, made the announcement that the time frame for the city to receive that money is unknown while FEMA works out details of more severe dam-

age in Texas and Florida.

According to Walenksy, the City of Cassville reported approximately \$45,000 in damage related to the flooding on April 28 that took several days to subside.

Walenksy said the damage sustained included the park system, the Greenway Trail, as well as drainage issues on Gravel Street and other basic street repairs. The

Cassville Police Department also lost a police cruiser to the flooding, which was replaced through an insurance claim.

Walensky said, "When you look at the park system and Greenway, those are some of the most obvious recovery issues that you can see. Since some of our sewer crossings got washed out, those are some of the things

High speed chase ends in two arrests

CAMPERS FIND GUN ALLEGEDLY THROWN FROM VEHICLE

Two have been charged and another is wanted for questioning in a home invasion and assault in Washburn on Saturday. Darrell Glen Delong, 34, of Troy, and Amber Dawn Bullock, 31, of Springfield, are both charged in connection with the crime and are being held in the Barry County

According to the affidavits of probable cause, Deputy Chris Hutson, with the Barry County Sheriff's Department, was dispatched for a burglary and assault on Saturday, September 23, in Washburn. Hutson went to the residence where the victim said Delong and Bullock broke into his home and Delong assaulted him. Delong allegedly had a handgun at the time of the assault.

Bullock then drove the two men present away from the scene in an SUV which was later found on Berry Avenue in Seligman.

When officers found the SUV, they engaged in a pursuit, which went through Roaring River State Park.

According to Major Leonard Collins, Chief Deputy, "When Deputy Hutson attempted to stop the vehicle, they fled. He chased them and went throughout Roaring River to the back of the hatchery where they turned around and then drove at officer Hutson and left the park."

Collins continued, "They ditched the weapon and the pursuit continued. They turned up Highway 112 and turned onto Farm Road 2218 where they ditched the car and fled on foot. During the pursuit, the only reason Deputy Hutson lost them is he blew a tire."

The affidavit explained that Delong was located and apprehended on State Highway 37 near the road side park north of Purdy.

Bullock, who also fled, was found near State Highway 37 and State Highway 76/86

After the pursuit, the gun which was allegedly thrown from the vehicle was found by campers at Roaring River.

A mother and daughter camping at Roaring River found a handgun when they returning from a hike at the park on Saturday evening. Laura and Arielle Droddy, of Oakdale, Louisiana, were walking along the road between the two access points of the Devil's Kitchen Trail at the park when they saw the gun in the grass. Arielle said, "We were walking and looked down and it was just right there in the grass beside the

"I was really surprised, so I pointed it out to my mom."

The pair took the gun, wrapped in a bandanna, to the park office.

Laura said, "They called the park ranger, and he told us there had been a chase, and it was thrown from a car."

Delong is charged with burglary in the first degree, armed criminal action and resisting arrest. Delong is being held on a \$75,000 cash only bond in the Barry County Jail.

Bullock is charged with burglary in the first degree. Bullock is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$50,000 cash-only bond.

The name of the third suspect still at large has not been released at this time.



are putting into play with this money. We need drainage repair on various storm water and streets. We'll also be correcting some of the bigger items in the park."

The way to submit FEMA claims for this flood was different than when the city applied for previous flooding incidents. Walensky said, "The government rolled out a totally new automated system that allows us to input all of the project work ourselves. Before, we had an assigned project manager to help us. But they have streamlined it and given us one person to deal with. We were responsible for all of the data input and collection and it put us on a very short time frame. Once they said go, we only had a small time frame to finish it

He said the city finished submitting paperwork to FEMA in early August. They were notified September 1 that the hurricane relief was taking priority over other flooding incidents.

Verona woman killed, two injured in Monett crash

A Verona woman was a killed in a crash involving a box truck on Wednesday morning near Monett. According to the Missouri State Highway Patrol crash report, Beatriz Juarez, 27, was killed and two others, including a one year old baby, were injured.

On Wednesday, September 20, around 6:48 a.m., a box truck turned in front of Ford Explorer that Juarez was a passenger in. The 2017 Freightliner box truck, driven by Daniel R. Gulley, 46, of Springfield, was headed west on US 60 and turning onto Farm Road 1100. He drove in front of the Explorer, driven by Marvin J. Flores-Casimiro, 24, hitting the vehicle.

Juarez and the baby* were life flighted. Juarez was taken to Cox South Hospital in Springfield where she was pronounced deceased by Dr.

Kevin Christian at 5:43 p.m. The baby suffered moderate injuries and was taken to Mercy Hospital in Springfield. Both were passengers in the Explorer and were not wearing seat belts.

Gulley, who was wearing a seat belt, took private transport to Cox Hospital in Monett for minor injuries. Flores-Casimiro, who was also wearing a seatbelt, had no reported injuries at the time of the crash.

The Explorer was totaled, and the box truck sustained moderate damage. They were both towed from the scene by Thomas Towing, of Monett.

This is the fourth fatality for the month and 80th for the year for Troop D.


New group for single moms


Cassville man charged with sex with child

A Cassville man was charged with having sexual intercourse with a victim under the age of 16 between 40 and 50 times over the last two years. Phillip Daniel Meshell, Jr., 39, of Cassville, is charged with statutory rape in the second degree, statutory sodomy in the second degree, endangering the welfare of a child in the first degree as a first offense with sexual contact and child molestation in the second degree.

According to the affidavits of probable cause, the victim was interviewed at the Child Advocacy Center on September 18 after an officer received reports that the Meshell had been having sexual intercourse with the child. It was reported that Meshell had engaged in sexual intercourse and other sexual acts with the child for two years.

Meshell was released on \$25,000 bond which was reduced from a \$50,000 cashonly bond.

A Bourbon man has been charged with the murder of a former Cassville resident last year. According to the affidavit of probable cause by the Crawford County prosecuting attorney, Deacon J. Zelch, of Bourbon, shot Edward Hillhouse, formerly of Cassville, on April 27 of last year.

According to the affidavit, a confidential informant led officers to Zelch's property as being where Hillhouse was shot. The informant allegedly told officers that they were at Zelch's house on April 27 shortly after Hillhouse had disappeared and Hillhouse had been shot and his body was on Zelch's couch.

The informant also said that Zelch admitted to shooting Hillhouse with a .22 in the head and used a backhoe to bury the couch and evidence of the murder.

Officers with the Crawford County Sheriff's Department received consent to search the property on September 20 and discovered a body with the couch. The body was identified as Hillhouse. A medical examiner determined the cause of death was a single gunshot wound to the head.

Zelch is charged with first degree murder and armed criminal action. Zelch is currently being held in jail on a \$1.145 million cash-only

Barry County courts incarcerate 14 in August

• Zachery Daniel Blay pled guilty to non-support with the total arrears in excess of 12 monthly payments. He was on probation after pleading guilty to three charges in February 2016. Those charges were tampering with a motor vehicle in the first degree and two counts of possession of a controlled substance. Blay's probation was revoked and he is to serve 120 days of shock time as part of his initial seven year incarceration sentence. On the non-support charge, Blay received a suspended imposition of sentencing and is to serve five years unsupervised probation.

On February 23, 2015, Blay was in a vehicle as a passenger when the driver went to check on a sick friend. While the driver checked on the friend, deciding to take him to the hospital. Blay took the vehicle without permission and left while the driver was attempting to get the sick individual to the car. When asked, Blay said he had "more important things to do."

On February 27, 2015, Blay was a passenger in a car that pulled over while driving just after midnight on Farm Road 1095 that had been reported to have been involved in suspicious activity. In the seat where Blay was sitting, officers found two baggies with methamphetamine residue in them. On December 25, 2015, officers with the Cassville Police Department found Blay hiding in the back seat of a vehicle. When officers approached the car, they saw a loaded syringe above the visor, which Blay admitted was his.

Finally, Blay was in arrears on child support for \$23,565. He was over 12 months in arrears on child support for one child.

• Dylan Bowlin, of Purdy, pled guilty to unlawful use of drug paraphernalia for methamphetamine and distribution of not more than five grams of marijuana in February 2015. His probation has since been revoked, and he is to serve four years incarceration from his original sentencing.

On August 27, 2014,

the Barry County Sheriff's officers found a bag on the northwest side of the jail that contained marijuana and tobacco. When officers replaced the contraband with duplicate packages and set up a game camera, they identified Bowlin as one of the men involved in the

• Charles Orville Bowman, of Cassville, pled guilty to domestic assault in the second degree. Bowman received a suspended execution of a five year incarceration sentence and five years supervised probation.

On February 20, 2017, Bowman assaulted his girl-friend by pushing her to the ground causing her to break the head of her femur and causing abrasions to her right arm and left knuckles. The victim had to go to the hospital for her injuries. Bowman admitted to shoving the victim to the ground.

Bowman is to serve probation until August 11, 2022

• Marsha L. Branham, of Monett, pled guilty to unlawful use of drug paraphernalia. Branham received a suspended imposition of sentencing and two years unsupervised probation.

On March 31, 2016, Barry County Sheriff's Department detectives executed a search warrant on Branham's residence. Branham was attempting to hide or destroy drug evidence after slamming a door on officers when they arrived. Officers found paraphernalia and drugs in the home. She admitted to using methamphetamine.

Branham is to serve probation until August 22,

• Joseph Derek Cramer, of Anderson, pled guilty to two counts of unlawful use of a weapon by possession a weapon and a felony controlled substance, three counts of possession of a controlled substance and delivery of a controlled substance. Cramer received a suspended execution of a four year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections and five years supervised probation.

On January 3, 2017, the Barry County Sheriff's Department responded to an apartment on State Highway 112 for a child well being check. Once there, deputies suspected there was methamphetamine use occurring. Cramer was in the residence at the time of the investigation.

Officers found methamphetamine as well as distribution baggies, drug paraphernalia, hydrocodone and alprazolam. Cramer also had a magnum revolver in his waistband. Cramer's vehicle was used to transport the methamphetamine to the residence where a one year old child lived.

Then, on February 28, 2017, officers with the

Monett Police Department were dispatched to the Super 8 Motel on Hess Drive in Monett. Cramer said he had taken something and was "freaking out" and was in the lobby of the hotel. When officers arrived, he said he was looking for his girlfriend and that someone had held him in his room for hours.

When officers looked in the room, they found drug paraphernalia as well as a handgun and methamphetamine.

Cramer is to serve probation until August 21,

• Scottie L. Crow, of Monett, pled guilty to resisting arrest for a felony. Crow received suspended execution of a three year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections and five years supervised probation.

On June 4, 2016, the Monett Police Department was investigating an assault that occurred in the Walmart parking lot. The victim had followed the attacker and Monett PD tried to pull the assailant over. Crow did not stop for officers and made a sudden stop a few blocks later and ran from his vehicle on foot. A passenger in the vehicle said Crow had an active warrant, which is why he ran.

Crow is to serve probation until August 22, 2022.

• Rebecca Rae Dempsey, of Kimberling City, pled guilty to assault in the first degree with serious injuries on a special victim and endangering the welfare of a child in the first degree as a first offense with no sexual content. Dempsey received a suspended execution of a ten year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections on the assault charge and seven years on the endangerment charge and five years supervised probation.

On February 20, 2016, Dempsey, 30, wrecked her car on purpose and her baby flew out of the vehicle onto the road. A Missouri State Highway Patrol



trooper interviewed witnesses at the scene who said that Dempsey was not caring for the child when they arrived or at any point after the crash. The witnesses on the scene picked the baby up off the ground and wrapped her in a coat to keep her warm.

When Trooper Coffey interviewed Dempsey, she claimed that she had "lost her mind." The wreck had been intentional and Dempsey told Coffey, "I wanted to die and I was like aggravated I didn't die." Upon inspection, the speedometer's needle was stuck at 92 miles per hour after the crash, indicating that Dempsey was going 92 miles per hour in a 55 mile per hour zone at the time of the crash.

When Coffey informed Dempsey that she might not be able to have further contact with her baby, Dempsey seemed to be indifferent.

The baby was transported to Mercy Hospital in

Rogers, Ark., by ambulance before being flown to Mercy Hospital in Springfield. The baby suffered from two lateral skull fractures.

Following the wreck, Dempsey was placed on a 96-hour psychiatric hold by Mercy Hospital in Rogers, Ark. Dempsey was not intoxicated at the time of the crash, and she said that she was on medication for being bipolar at the scene.

In an interview with Dempsey's father, he told Coffey that she had some "mental" problems and that she had never wanted the child. According to her father, she had been impregnated as a result of rape but had to keep the child and not have an abortion in order to continue to live at her mother's house. According to the report, "Rebecca decided to keep the baby in exchange for a place to live."

Dempsey's baby was to be placed in alternative care according to her Barry County case worker.

Dempsey is to serve probation until August 22,

• Jared I. Dodge, of Cassville, pled guilty to two counts of possession of a controlled substance and failure to wear a seatbelt. Dodge received a suspended imposition of sentencing, five years supervised probation and a \$10 fine.

On November 26, 2016, Dodge was pulled over by the Cassville Police Department. Once given permission to search the vehicle, officers located a bag of drug paraphernalia, three used syringes and a metal spoon. They field testing positive for the presence of methamphetamine. Dodge tried to run from officer while they were searching his vehicle.

On December 10, 2016, the Missouri State Highway Patrol initiated a traffic stop with Dodge. Dodge gave permission for them to search his vehicle where they found ten white, round pills which they identified as a schedule 2 narcotic. He also failed to wear his seat belt.

Dodge is to serve proba-

tion until August 22, 2022.

• Dalton Ross Evans pled guilty to theft/stealing of \$500 to \$25,000 in value. Evans received a suspended execution of a five years incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections and five years supervised probation.

On November 23, 2015, Evans forced entry into a residence on Farm Road 1090 in Seligman. While inside, he stole a 60 inch flat screen TV, valued at \$2,309.76. He also damaged the door upon entry. The damage was estimated at \$150. The TV was in Evan's house in Gateway, Ark.

Evans is to serve probation until August 23, 2022.

· James Lee Flanigan, of Hollister, pled guilty to theft/stealing of less than \$500. Flanigan was on probation after pleading guilty to four counts of forgery in June 2016. On the theft charge, Flanigan received 180 days of incarceration in jail. Flanigan's probation was also revoked and he is to serve seven years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On June 3, 2015, the Cassville Police Depart-

ment responded to a theft at the Walmart. Asset protection alerted officers that Flanigan had scanned 30 items in self-checkout and used three different cards, but they were all denied. When the cashier left to help another customer, Flanigan pushed his cart out without paying for it. It was \$882.23 in value. Flanigan was bragging at his job (George's) that he had stolen from Walmart. Flanigan was apprehended at a Springfield Walmart while

In October and November, 2015, Flanigan went into Fastrip and Casey's, both in Cassville, and wrote checks in someone else's name. The account had been closed since 2009. Checks were written for \$43.25, \$53.90, \$64.17 and \$150.80.

wearing the same clothes.

· Randall Scott Ford, of Springfield, pled guilty to tampering with a motor vehicle in the first degree. Ford received a suspended execution of a six year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections and five years supervised probation.

On May 31, 2017, Monett Police officers responded to the Kum & Go on US Highway 60. While in the store, the victim's car was stolen from the parking lot. Video surveillance showed that a man in long sleeves walked up to the car and took it. The vehicle was found in Green County. Ford's involvement was discovered when his employee name badge was found in the car. The photo on the badge also matched the man in the surveillance

Ford is to serve probation until August 21, 2022.

· Kyle Lee Friend, of Cassville, pled guilty to DWI-combined alcohol and drug intoxication as a persistent offender. Friend received a suspended execution of a four year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections and five years supervised probation.

On February 2, 2016, Friend was arrested by the Missouri State Highway Patrol after being found to be driving while intoxicated. Friend was found at a crash scene on MO-76 north of MO-112 in Cassville. It was a single vehicle crash. Friend complained of injuries. His breath tested positive for alcohol above the legal limit and he also smelled of intoxicants.

Friend is to serve probation until August 22, 2022.

· Carla Lee Gautney, of Cassville, pled guilty to four counts of forgery, possession of a controlled substance, and fraudulently attempting to obtain a controlled substance. Gautney received a suspended execution of a seven year incarceration sentence and five years supervised probation.

On June 17, 2016, the Cassville Police Department took a report of a forged check used at Kwik-T's in Cassville. Gautney was the person who wrote the check in the amount of \$60 and signed the victim's



Then, on October 17, 2016, Gautney altered a check she had received from Yarnall Walnut. She changed the amount from \$53.10 to \$153.10. She cashed the check at Fasttrip. When she was at the police station, she requested to go to her vehicle to retrieve her cell phone. An officer escorted her out and she attempted to block his view of her purse. When she gave permission for her purse to be search, officers found methamphetamine inside a

On October 29, 2016, Gautney attempted to fill a prescription for her boyfriend for oxycodone which was forged.

On October 14, 2016, Gautney cashed a check for \$1,430.20 at Payless Rentals from Capital Bank. The check was not a real check.

Gautney is to serve probation until August 22,

• Michael Gerster, of Garfield, Ark., pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance. Gerster received a suspended imposition of sentencing and four years supervised probation.

On November 29, 2016, Gerster was pulled over for speeding in Washburn by the Missouri State Highway Patrol. Gerster told officers he had smoked marijuana before he left work. Officers also found hydrocodones in his vehicle.

Gerster is to serve probation until August 22, 2021.

· Ashley Brooke Grif**fin**, of Aurora, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance at a jail. She was on probation after pleading guilty to distribution of a controlled substance and possession of a controlled substance in 2016. Griffin was sentenced to five years incarceration with the Department of Corrections on the jail possession charge. She is to serve 12 years incarceration with the Department of Corrections on the initial charges she was on probation for.

On December 19, 2015, Griffin was involved in a pursuit with the Missouri State Highway Patrol. Griffin was not displaying license plates at the time. While in the chase, Griffin exceeded the speed limit by 25 miles per hour, failed to stay on the right half of the roadway and threw out contraband on two different occasions. • Justin Micah Guilkey, of Cassville, pled guilty to assault in the second degree. Guilkey was on probation after pleading guilty to possession of a controlled substance in 2014. Guiley received a suspended execution of a six year incarceration sentence and five years supervised probation.

On February 16, 2014, Guilkey was in possession of a clear glass pipe with a white residue that field tested positive for methamphetamine. He also had a hypodermic needle in his possession.

On July 12, 2016, the Monett Police Department was dispatched to investigate a domestic assault in an apartment on Pleasant. The victim claimed that Hedrick removed knives and placed them on a table in front of the victim and said he was going to kill her. Then he threatened suicide with a knife to his own throat if she left him. The victim was able to call a friend to pick her up, and as she tried to leave, Hedrick stabbed the hood of the vehicle with a

• Joel Curtis Hollister, of Verona, pled guilty to tampering with a motor vehicle in the first degree in 2016. His probation has since been revoked, and he is to serve four years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On December 11, 2015, Hollister borrowed a pickup truck from a friend so he could move his belongings. The owner agreed under the condition that he brought it back by the next day.

Hollister never returned the truck, and it was later found in Great Bend, Kan. Hollister was being held by the Great Bend, Kan., Police Department for receiving stolen property.

· Bradley Mas Hufford, Jr., of Seligman, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance and forgery. Hufford received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

ment found Hufford to be in possession of dilaudid pills as well as a reddish liquid he admitted was an illegal substance.







marijuana and endangering the welfare of a child creating substantial risk in the first degree. Shoemaker received a suspended imposition of sentencing and three years supervised probation.

On December 16, 2016, Shoemaker gave a 16 year old girl marijuana to consume. He was also in possession of a handgun, a scale with green residue on it, marijuana cigarettes and a scale.

Shoemaker is to serve probation until August 22, 2020.

• Trevis Monroe Sizemore, of Washburn, pled guilty to unlawful possession of a firearm and possession of a controlled substance. Sizemore received six years incarceration with the Department of Corrections of which he will serve 120 days of shock time.

On August 5, 2017, Sizemore was pulled over for a traffic stop. He had two guns in his possession even though he is a convicted felon. He also had a baggie of methamphetamine.

Smith is to serve probation until August 22, 2020.

• Laane Michael Sneed, of Monett, pled guilty to two counts of receiving stolen property and two counts of burglary in the second degree in 2016. His probation has since been revoked and he is to serve seven years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On August 11, 2016, a woman reported a stolen television and air conditioner from her home on Kyler in Monett. Sneed sold a stolen television and was still in possession of the air

conditioner.

On June 6, 2016, Sneed was implicated in other thefts as well, selling some power tools to Monett Pawn and Gun.

On October 28, 2016, Sneed stole an XBox 360 and PS4 from someone he had stayed the night with.

• Robert Joseph Stanphill, of Seligman, pled guilty to theft/stealing with the value less than \$500. Stanphill received a suspended execution of a one year jail incarceration sentence and one year of unsupervised probation.

On October 4, 2011, Stanphill stole a 2006 Peterbilt and a 2005 Transcraft trailer valued at \$68,356.

Stanphill is to serve probation until August 22, 2018

• Mark Allan Stevens, of Exeter, pled guilty to burglary in the second degree. Stevens received a suspended execution of a five year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections and five years supervised probation.

Between December 18 and 19, 2015, Stevens stole a Lincoln Mig welder and a DeWalt drill set from a residence on Farm Road 1090 in Cassville. Fingerprints implicated Stevens in the theft.

Stevens is to serve probation until August 21, 2022.

• Joseph Wayne Thurman, of Stella, pled guilty to tampering with a motor vehicle in the first degree. Thurman received a suspended execution of a five year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections.

On August 16, 2016, Thurman stole a car from Monett. The car was found wrecked in Newton County.

Thurman is to serve probation until August 21,

2022.

• Shad J. Turner, of Cassville, pled guilty to abuse of a child. Turner received a suspended imposition of sentencing and three years supervised probation.

On June 29, 2016, Turner was arrested by the Missouri State Highway Patrol after responding to a domestic assault. Turner's stepson had called 911 but could not speak. Turner forced the child into the car even though he was intoxicated. Officers found his blood alcohol level to be over three times the legal limit. The child had been hit below the eye and cut as well as on his shoulder.

Turner is to serve probation until August 21, 2020.

• Daniel Dean Wells pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance. Wells received a suspended imposition of sentencing and two years supervised probation.

On March 8, 2017, Wells gave consent for officers to search his vehicle. Inside there was a handgun, ammunition, a digital scale and sandwich bags. On Wells' person there were baggies of methamphetamine and a cut straw.

Wells is to serve probation until August 21, 2019.

• Shawn Norris Wheeler, of Gravette, Ark., pled guilty to 12 counts of passing a bad check of \$500 or more. Wheeler received a suspended imposition of sentencing and three years supervised probation.

Wheeler passed multiple bad checks in 2016 to various businesses.

Wheeler is to serve probation until August 21,

• Derek Andrew White, of Cassville, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance in 2016. White's probation has since been revoked, and he is to serve four years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On February 17, 2016, White was in possession of a spoon and pipe that field tested positive for methamphetamine.

• Kevin Lee Whittington, of Aurora, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance and assault in the first degree with serious physical injury on a special victim in 2016. Whittington's probation has since been revoked, and he is to serve ten years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On September 18, 2015, Whittington was pulled over by the Monett Police Department. Whittington fled on foot. Once he was apprehended, officers found a pipe, syringe, clonazepam and a baggie and spoon.

On September 29, 2015, Whittington and two other men attacked another inmate in the jail, causing serious pysical injury. They used a mop handle to seri-

ously injure him as well as striking his head by fists and knees once he was unable to defend himself. They broke his jaw.

• Christopher L. Zar-houni, of Lebanon, pled guilty to stealing leased or rented property in 2015. Zarhouni's probation has since been revoked, and he is to serve 120 days of shock time with the Department of Corrections as part of a seven year sentence.

On December 4, 2014, Zarhouni and another man entered into an agreement with Payless Rental in Monett. They rented an XBox One, television, PS4, Mickey Mouse recliner, rug and washer and dryer. No payments were ever received nor was the property returned.

MDC reminds people to "Be Bear Aware" by not feeding bears

As summer turns to fall, Missouri's estimated 350 native black bears enter a phase called hyperphagiain which they eat heavily, accumulating a layer of fat that results in a 30 percent weight gain preparing them for hibernation. In preparation for hibernation, bears eat a wide variety of food including grasses and forbs, berries, ants, bees and wasps, beetles, crickets, fish, frogs, small rodents and other small animals. The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) reminds people to "Be Bear Aware" by not feeding bears and providing potential sources of food.

"A fed bear is a dead bear," said MDC Wildlife Management Coordinator Alan Leary. "Feeding bears makes them comfortable around people and the places they associate with food from people, such as campsites, yards, and trash containers. When bears lose their fear of people by being fed, they may defend these food sources or territory. This can make them dangerous. When this happens, the bear has to be destroyed."

Leary added a fed bear that becomes a problem in one place cannot be relocated to another.

"Once a bear associates people with food, its life is ruined," Leary said. "Even if it is relocated, it will go in search of other places to get food from people, such as homes, residential areas, farms, and campsites. Common temptations include pet food or trash left outdoors, dirty grills or smokers, birdseed or other food at wildlife feeders, food at campsites, and gardens and orchards."

Avoid Attracting Black Bears

MDC offers these tips to avoid attracting black bears to possible food sources:

Don't leave pet food sitting outside. Feed pets a portion they'll eat at each meal and remove the empty containers.

Store garbage, recyclables, and compost inside a secure building or in a bear-proof container until the day of trash pick-up.

Keep grills and smokers clean and store them inside.

When camping be sure to keep cooking and cleaning areas separate from sleeping areas.

Only use birdfeeders in bear country (which is primarily south of the Missouri River) when bears are typically hibernating -- from early December through early March -- or hang them at least 10 feet high and four feet away from any structure.

Use electric fencing to keep bears away from beehives, chicken coops, vegetable gardens, orchards, and other potential food cources

Keep campsites clean and store all food, toiletries and trash in a secure vehicle or strung high between two trees. Do not burn or bury garbage or food waste.

Avoid Encounters and React Right

While close encounters with bears are uncommon in Missouri, MDC offers this advice when outdoors in black-bear country:

Make noise while walking or hiking to prevent surprising a bear. Clap, sing, or talk loudly.

Travel in a group if possible.

Pay attention to the surroundings and watch for bear sign, such as tracks or claw or bite marks on trees.

> Keep dogs leashed. Leave a bear alone! Do

not approach it. Make sure it has an escape route.

If encountering a bear up close, back away slowly with arms raised to look larger. Speak in a calm, loud voice. Do not turn away from the bear. Back away slowly. Do not run.

When Hunting and Fishing

A native of Missouri, black bears were abundant throughout the state until the late 1800s when they were nearly wiped out from unregulated killing and from habitat loss when Ozark forests were logged. MDC research shows that a small number of native black bears survived and others from Arkansas moved north into Missouri. Over time, their numbers increased and continue to do so. Results of ongoing black-bear research by MDC staff and others show that the animals have been sighted in about half the counties in Missouri, primarily south of the Missouri River, with most bears located in the southern third of the state in the Missouri Ozarks.

Dahlia puts on dazzling color show as nights begin to cool

When many garden flowers show the ravages of a long and sometimes brutal summer, dahlias are most spectacular, said University of Missouri Extension horticulturist David Trinklein.

Fall's warm days and cool nights cause dahlias to produce more flowers with intense, dazzling color, said Trinklein. If you do not already grow them, start planning now for dahlias in your garden next spring.

Dahlia, a member of the aster family, is native to Mexico, where it is the national flower. The Aztecs were growing it when Spanish conquistadors arrived in the 16th century. Spanish botanists brought dahlia and other plants back to Spain.

Early dahlias imported into Europe were of the single-flower type. Hybridization produced the first fully double-flowered forms along with new color combinations. Today, dahlia boasts one of the largest arrays of flower forms, colors and sizes of any cultivated plant. To date, more than 50,000 cultivars have been named and registered.

When most people think of dahlia, the tall types propagated from tuberous roots each year come to mind. "They are popular for the cutting garden or the back-drop of borders," said Trinklein. But because of their tall stature and large flowers, this type of dahlia requires staking or some other form of support.

Dwarf or bedding dahlias propagated from seed have gained popularity in recent years. Bedding dahlias produce large numbers of small flowers on bushy plants. This makes them ideal for annual beds or the fronts of borders. Although these dahlias also form tuberous storage roots, most gardeners do not save them from year to year because of the ready availability of inexpensive plants each spring, Trinklein said.

Plant dahlias in an airy location where they receive at least six to eight hours of direct sun and protection from high winds. Plant tuberous roots of large types of dahlias about 14 days before the frost-free date for the area. Dahlias can't endure freezing temperatures, so do not set out plants started indoors until the danger of frost has passed.

Dahlias grow well in fertile, well-drained garden soils high in organic matter. If soil lacks organic matter, add up to 4 inches of wellrotted manure, compost or other forms of organic matter before planting.

Prepare soil by incorporating about one-half cup of a garden fertilizer high in phosphorus and potassium but low in nitrogen (such as 5-10-10) in a 2-foot circle where each plant is to be located. Top-dress with an equal amount of fertilizer in July. Dahlias grow rapidly and need large amounts of water. Keep soil moist but not wet.

Dahlias benefit from pruning. The amount of pruning depends upon the flower's intended use. Prune exhibition-type flowers to one main stem. Pinch plants for lavish garden display after first growth in the spring reaches a height of about a foot. A second pinch after emerging shoots achieve a length of 1 foot delays flowering but makes for a more spectacular display late in the growing season.

Botrytis (gray mold) and powdery mildew are two foliage diseases that affect dahlia. Avoid these diseases by strict sanitation, proper site selection and keeping foliage dry. Fungicides containing thiophanate-methyl also provide effective disease prevention.

Since most gardeners save dahlia's tuberous roots from year to year, viral diseases such as dahlia mosaic virus can occur. Sanitation, insect control and selection of tolerant cultivars control these.

Dig roots and store them each fall after the tops have died back. After digging, wash off remaining soil and allow the roots to dry. Do not dry them in direct sunlight. Separate tuberous roots in the fall by cutting them from the main stem. Allow the portion of the stem attached to the part containing the eyes to remain. Dust cut ends with a fungicide to discourage storage diseases.

You can also leave the whole root system intact and separate the next growing season. Pack the roots in moist peat moss, sawdust or other inert organic material and place in a wooden or cardboard box. Ideal temperature for storing roots is 40-45 F.
