Seligman Walmart moves closer to grand opening

Significant progress is being made on the upcoming Walmart to be located at the Highway 112 and Highway 37 intersection in Seligman.

So far, construction is on schedule and the tentative grand opening date is December 10, according to the newly hired store manager Tim Williams. The store is opening the internal hiring process to select five fulltime supervisors and 25-30 part-time employees. The store has already hired their pharmacist Andrew Au-


Williams and his family are from Bentonville, Ark., where they've lived since 2002. Williams and his wife, Sheryl, have been married 31 years and have three children and two grandchildren. Williams is retired from the Army National Guard and the Army Reserves after serving three combat tours in Iraq and Afghanistan. He started with Walmart in 2002. Williams said exciting news in his house recently is that his youngest son Mitchell will be playing football for the Airforce Academy after

he graduates in the spring. One big change since

the story broke in August will be the name. Originally, Walmart Corporate had the store labelled as a Walmart Express, a relatively new addition to the Walmart chain. However, now they've decided to do away with Express. Williams stated, "While the store was originally going to be an Express, now Walmart has decided that it'll be a Neighborhood Market. All that is changing is the branding." Williams said that all of the other details will be the same with the location boasting a gas station, grocery, dry goods, pharmacy and others. Williams said, "This is more than just a grocery store, we will have a big line of items, including 17,000 grocery

Even though the store will not offer a full line of items like a Supercenter, the store will offer Site to Store shipping, allowing customers to have anything available online shipped directly to the store for pick up.

Williams said that so far, the one thing he has heard most from community members is the excitement over the pharmacy. He stated, "Almost every person I've talked to is really excited about the



down that drive." The new job openings have also stimulated a lot of buzz. Williams said, "We've had a lot of interest in the employment aspect because so many people here commute. The jobs will mean that they don't have to drive so far from home."

Aside from the offerings

of the store, Williams also hopes to have a positive atmosphere for customers. He said, "Customer service will be a big emphasis at the store. We expect our associates to be friendly and talk to our customers. That's part of it here."

He continued, "We also want to make sure that our store is clean, our food is fresh and everything is in stock as it should be. We really think that our customers will be happy with the store."

As an added show of dedication to the community, Williams said the store is planning on making some donations to area groups during their grand opening. He said, "We've already heard from officials with the City of Seligman and the Chamber of Commerce, and we will be making some donations to them during our grand opening."

With the Walmart opening, there has been much talk about the benefit of extra revenue for Seligman from sales tax and additional traffic. When asked about how

over how the store will impact local commerce, most community response has been positive. Burgess, also a local business owner stated, "I think overall it will be positive as a whole for the town with the revenue that it'll bring in. As a small business owner myself, I am looking forward to the extra traffic it could bring to town, as well."

So far the City sees mostly advantages to Walmart coming in. Nichols stated, "An advantage is obviously the draw to the area and being at the main intersection in the city, it will be seen by almost everyone travelling in and through Seligman. I hear a lot of people talk about the pharmacy and saving them a trip to Cassville."

As far as disadvantages, some have been worried about the town's grocery store, Norm's, closing. However, the store has advantages that the new Walmart can't compete with. Nichols stated, "Norm's Grocery has a butcher on site that cuts excellent meat, and he has a



great selection of hardware that is most convenient."

There has been speculation that with Walmart might come other businesses, as well. Nichols stated, "We are hopeful. There seems to be a lot of desire for a Sonic or other fast food place to come to the city."

Once the Walmart Neighborhood Market opens, the hours will be Monday through Saturday from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. and Sunday from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. The Pharmacy hours will be Monday through Saturday from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. and Sunday 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.



Sheriff's office using Facebook tips to solve cases

In a move to more efficiently utilize technology and connect with the public, the Barry County Sheriff's Department has updated their website and is also turning to Facebook to get leads on different cases.

The switch to Facebook, according to Sheriff Mick Epperly, was a strategy to help the department and the community. He said, "We're using Facebook to build a better relationship with the community. We appreciate the public's input on solving cases and getting them involved, and we only have so many deputies. Maybe someone saw something that we didn't talk to."

On the Sheriff's Department's Facebook page, they've posted information about recent crimes asking for information to help them solve the case. Recently, the Department posted photos of a recovered horse stolen from Barry County and items stolen from a church in Monett. He said that they are careful about which cases they publish information about online.

Epperly said that tips from Facebook have already helped them solve a couple of crimes in the short time the page has been up. He stated, "Of course we stay on it monitoring

what people post, but so far, it's been really positive. We haven't really had any negative responses."

By using Facebook and their updated website, they are able to reach the community and keep them informed of happenings in the department. Epperly stated, "There are a lot of ways for us to get our messages out there to people with press releases and that sort of thing, and we hope that it gets the community involved." Press releases and notices are being posted both on Facebook and the department's website regularly.

Tipsters can remain anonymous when they call to make statements just as normal. Epperly stated, "We've already had a few cases made by tips we received through Facebook. So we hope that continues as we post more."

The Barry County Sheriff's Department has had an online website for awhile, Sheriff Epperly said that it was time for an update. So the department updated their website and created a Facebook all in one swoop. Epperly stated, "Our other website wasn't a narrow-formatted page, and there were some problems there. Now it is a lot easier to work with. It's more userfriendly."





The Golden Pioneer Museum, located near the intersection of Highways J and 86 in Golden, boasts a number of out-of-the-ordinary treasures, both natural and man-made. The Prier family travels the country looking for unusual and impressive collections of a variety of items. The museum is a gold mine for a small town, drawing in visitors from all over to see the unique collectibles offered.

Among the many items visitors to the museum can see include the world's largest turquoise carving, a huge collection of watches from different time periods, baseball cards, guns, Civil War artifacts, a gigantic crystal cluster that weighs over two tons and many

Owner Winfred Prier, who started the museum almost 25 years ago, stated his museum is unique in the midwest. "There is nothing like this in this part of the United States," he said. That statement couldn't be truer. The huge assortment has something that everyone can enjoy, from tin lunch boxes to Native American artifacts.

Since he began the museum, Prier has added to his collection of displays at every chance. To date, the museum has been added on to four times, and on Thursday, October 2, he will unveil the museum's fifth addition.

When asked what led him to start the museum, he said, "I've collected things since I was in grade school, so it went from there. I've been buying different collections for the last 50 or 60 years, boxing them up and sticking them in the attic. So, eventually I thought I'd better do something with

Prier went on to say that his acquisition of the artifacts from Trail of Tears Museum in Huntsville, Ark., 27 years ago was the biggest part of his decision to build the museum. When the owner of the Trail of Tears Museum passed away, he and his daughter both wanted Prier to have it. He said, "They wanted the collection to be kept together because of how much there was. It's really a lot to see."

According to Prier, the newest addition to the museum will add 2,700 square feet to the building and will house many new displays. "We've got the largest known collection of butter dishes, the largest collection of Alaskan Northwood glassware, a Red Wing pottery collection and thousands of Indian artifacts," he said. Also, the museum addition will also house a black-light room, a large cookie jar collection and much more, many of which Prier says are one-of-a-

Normally, the museum is open from April through October, but Prier said he plans to keep his museum open a little longer this year so that visitors can see the displays in the new addition. At this point, he's not certain how long that will be. "I'll keep it open as long as people keep coming," he stated.

The Golden Pioneer Museum is open Tuesday through Saturday, from 10:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. To reach the museum from Cassville, follow Highway 86 past Eagle Rock and into Golden. From Shell Knob, follow Highway 39 south to Highway 86, and then go west into Golden. The museum is across the road from Ball & Prier Tire.

Local business competes for grant

2G Transit Solutions, a software business based in Cassville, is competing with some other 35,000 businesses nationwide for one of 20 grants worth \$150,000. The grants are sponsored by Chase Bank and Google.

Ben Greene and his wife, Tracy, began 2G Transit Solutions three years ago and run the business out of their home. They have developed a software system called Transit Miner, designed to help bus systems operate more efficiently. Currently, the company serves 11 contracts across the country, nine of which are city bus systems, including Austin and Las Vegas.

Additionally, they have created an application for bus passengers called My Trips, which allows passengers waiting for a bus to use a device like an iPhone or tablet to see where their bus is and how long it will take for the bus to get to them.

It can also alert passengers when their ride is ten minutes away from reaching them. My Trips is available where Transit Miner is in use, and has a subscription fee of \$4.99 a year, or about \$.42 a month.

To be eligible to qualify for a grant, 2G Transit must have 250 votes via Facebook by October 17. At press time, the company had 60 votes

While he acknowledges 2G Transit will face stiff competition even if the company does qualify, Mr. Greene says he believes they have a strong chance of winning a grant as their work helps people with mobility issues, including the elderly and the physically challenged.

If they are awarded a grant, the Greenes plan to use the money to help develop their company. They will use a third of the grant for marketing their company. "We're competing against \$500 million-a-year international companies," Mr. Greene said.

Another third of the grant would be used to update the companies Cloud servers, and the remaining third will go to upgrading My Trips so that customers can see their personal trip histories, as well as additional alerts such as traffic and service disruptions. The


Southwest Lady Trojans to host annual Pink Out night





Riders compete in Southwest FFA Mule Jump

Nearly 150 spectators gathered to watch some 30 riders compete during the 6th Annual Mule Jump in Washburn on September, 27. The event, held on the softball and baseball fields at Southwest School, raised \$1,400 for the Southwest R-V FFA, which organizer Reeva Hayworth said would be used to help with the cost of FFA members attending the National Convention later this month.

There were nine contests in the Mule Jump, including pole bending, halter class and the flag race. Each contest was sponsored by a local business or individuals.

One of the more serious contests was the barrel race, during which each the riders would attempt to be the fastest to ride their horses or mules around three barrels in a pattern. This was not

a different direction than the way their riders wanted.

test was the balloon race, in which the riders would each have a balloon pinned on their backs. Each rider would balloons while attempting

to avoid having their own popped. Last rider with an unpopped balloon was the winner.

The final contest was the mule jump, in which a hurdle was placed in the middle of the field that each rider would attempt to have their horse or mule jump. After each rider had gone, the hurdle would be raised and the riders who successfully jumped the first time around would go again. The rider whose horse or mule jumped the highest was the winner.

In most contests, the riders competed in adult and youth divisions and the highest scoring ones were awarded prizes of \$25 for first place, \$15 for second, or \$10 for third. For the mule jump, first place was \$50, second was \$30, and \$20 was third. Some competitions had only one prize for first place or one division.





Oklahoma historical society members visit Bayless House

For years, the Barry County Genealogical and Historical Society (BCGHS) has been working to restore the Bayless-Salyer house on Townsend Street in Cassville. On Friday, September 26, society members were there to receive visitors from another historical society.

The visitors from Claremore, Cynthia McVicar, Christa Rice, both members of the RCHS and Julie Hughes, an interested friend, arrived at the house at noon. Upon arrival, McVicar presented Georgia Hart, editor and treasurer for the BC-GHS, with a history of John and Mary Bayless. Hart then showed the visitors the house.

They also visited the square and saw some of the buildings constructed by Bayless, including Hotel Barry in 1894, now Ellis, Ellis and Cupps Law Firm, and the Barry County Bank, now Commerce Bank. After they

visited for an hour, the group returned to Claremore.

John M. Bayless came to Barry County from Tennessee with his family in 1853 at the age of two. He grew up in Keetsville (now Washburn) and by 1880, he was engaged in merchandising. He would go on to build the Barry County Bank and the Hotel Barry in 1894 and a railroad that connected Cassville to Frisco Line running through Exeter, dedicated on July 4, 1896. He bought the lots at the corner of Townsend and 9th Streets in 1879 where he built his house.

Bayless would live there until he left in 1901 to pursue business opportunities in Claremore, Okla. He remained there until his death in 1907. The house that he built in Claremore, the Belvidere Mansion, is today kept by the Rogers County Historical Society (RCHS).

He and his brother, Keen Bayless, started a mercantile business in Keetsville (now Washburn) first and then came to Cassville. In the disastrous fire in April 1983, the fire destroyed virtually all of the Bayless buildings, including a lumber yard located east of the present Commerce Bank.

Bayless was a major player in Cassville commerce for twenty years, from 1880 to 1900.

Meanwhile, renovations continue on the Bayless-Salyer House, and Hart said the society hopes to move into the house by next spring. Renovations currently are possible due to a generous donation from Margie Pannell, a woman who died in St. Joseph, Mich., last year but had ties to Barry County through family who lived in the area. According to Hart, Panell left the Barry County Historical Society an unspecified amount of money in her will.

MSHP warns to watch for deer

Colonel Ron Replogle, superintendent of the Missouri State Highway Patrol, reminds drivers that deer are more active this time of year, and to please be especially vigilant during evening and early dawn hours. Deer behavior changes due to mating season, which may cause an increase in sightings and roadway crossings. Hunting and crop harvesting

may result in these animals being in places they aren't usually seen. Drivers are urged to remain alert.

Last year, drivers in Missouri experienced 3,498 traffic crashes where deer-vehicle strikes occurred. One deer strike occurred every 2.5 hours in the state. In these crashes, there were no fatalities, but 303 people were injured.

When you see deer, slow down and proceed with caution. Deer often travel in groups, stay on guard after a close call or when you see a single deer. Natural features also affect deer movement. In areas where there are streams or wooded corridors surrounded by farmland, look for more deer to cross roadways. Remember: Rural areas are not the only place where deer/vehi-

cle strikes occur. In 2013, 26.4 percent of the traffic crashes involving deer happened in urban areas.

The majority of deer strike crashes occur in October and November each year, with the largest number taking place in November. Most deer strikes occur between the hours of 5 p.m. and 6:59 a.m. The Missouri State Highway Patrol reminds drivers that an attempt to avoid striking a deer could result in a more serious crash involving oncoming traffic. Try to remain calm. Panicking and overreacting usually lead to more serious traffic crashes. Deer create hazards for Missouri motorists. Please stay alert, and make sure you and the occupants of your vehicle buckle up.
