• Why do you feel you are the best candidate for Sheriff?

I have worked in the Judicial Center as security for the courts, and I have worked in the jail. Each position is important in its own way and requires different types of performance.

The letter, which seems to be legitimate and professional upon reading it, claims the recipient is a contest winner of \$2.5M, and the check is to pay for processing fees. In the letter, it warns not to give out banking details to anyone, and to protect from theft, lending to its supposed legitimacy. All money exchanged is said to be done through a courier service.

In order to "activate" the fake check, people are told to call a number. Burgess confirmed that the bank account is not valid and the company was out for gains against innocent people.

He said, "People need to be careful, because these companies are out there, and some of them seem believable. If you receive a check in the mail you aren't expecting, approach the situation carefully."

The other scam recently

involved an online loan company. Burgess said, "They were looking for a loan, which they were approved for, but it was a phishing scam. This company asked for processing payments through iTunes gift cards."

He added, "A legitimate business does not do business through iTunes gift cards, unless, of course, you're buying from iTunes."

Epperly posted a warning on Facebook that locals are receiving phone calls from a company claiming to be their utility provider and their electricity will be shut



off unless they wire money from Walmart. He said to ensure a company is legitimate before sending any funds.

# Two wrecks back-to-back on Hwy. 248 Tuesday evening



Two wrecks occurred back-to-back on Highway 248, four miles east of Cassville Tuesday evening, October 4. According to the Missouri State Highway Patrol crash report, Charli J. Epperly, 39, of Cassville, was driving westbound in a 2013 Volkswagen Passat when she turned in the path of a truck headed east.

## DID YOU KNOW?

The origins of Oktoberfest can be traced to a wedding that took place in Munich, Germany, on October 12, 1810. To celebrate the marriage of Bavarian Crown Prince Ludwig to Princess Therese of Saxe-Hildburghausen, the citizens of Munich were invited to the festivities, which were held on the fields in front of the city gates. The public fields were renamed "Theresienwiese" in honor of the new bride, and that name has withstood the test of time, even though locals now refer to the fields as "Wies'n." In honor of the Prince and his newly minted Princess, horse races were held on October 17, and historians are still uncertain as to who initially proposed the idea to include horse races in the festivities. One of the people suspected of proposing the races, Franz Baumgartner, eventually saw his horse end up in the winner's circle, where the steed was cheered by the roughly 40,000 spectators on hand to witness the events. The festivities, including the horse race, were repeated a year later, giving birth to the annual tradition of Oktoberfest. While 40,000 spectators might have seemed like a lot of people in 1810, attendance at modern-day Oktoberfest festivities dwarfs that number, as Oktoberfestbeerfestivals.com notes that more than six million people attended the festivities in 2013. In 2015, festival workers served 7.3 million liters of





problem in Barry County. I will submit the necessary paperwork to join HIDTA. HIDTA can provide additional monies for drug investigations. I will assign two detectives full time to nothing but drug investigations. I will assign a Deputy to the Ozark Drug Enforcement Team. I realize this reduces the number of patrol officers, but an expenditure of resources on our number one problem cannot be wrong. I plan to enlist the eves and ears of the 36,000+ residents of Barry County in reporting suspected drug activity and create an intelligence data base that will allow us to build cases against the major dealers in the county.

The other major issue is funding. I will seek to increase funding by joining and seeking grants from entities such as the High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area (HIDTA) program. This HIDTA program provides money for equipment and overtime costs associated with specific drug investigative activities. I will research and present well formulated proposals to the County Commissioners for their consideration for funding. Additionally, a thorough review of all facets of the Sheriff's office should reveal areas that can be operated at a cost savings freeing up additional funds.

Ruark: Well, there are a

lot of issues in the county but the most pressing issue is the drugs. There is a drug problem in Barry County, there is simply no denying this. The drug problem also leads into a multitude of other issues such as theft, burglaries, assaults and the list goes on. If elected, I want to be able to attack this problem and have a staff who also wants to make a difference. This is going to take more than just brute force, we need to reduce illicit drugs not just by enforcement efforts but also with education and rehabilitation. We need better coordination between agencies and increased information sharing.

• Do you feel that the current training opportunities and procedures are sufficient or do changes need to be made?

Davis: Training is one area where I plan on doing a total in-depth review to determine if what we are getting is, in addition to what POST requires, what we need. Again, funding is a key issue. The 2016 budget for the Sheriff's office con-

training and the Jail budget contained zero dollars for training. With the deputies and Jail personnel totaling 39 budgeted positions, that is approximately \$77 per employee for training. The deputies do receive POST training at no cost, some of which is taught in-house by certified trainers. Other POST courses require travel to the class location and therefore cause an expense to the Sheriff's office. All classes require a loss of investigative time. Each POST certified employee is required by Missouri State Statute to obtain 24 hours of POST training each year. For budget years 2012 through 2016, there is no line item in the Sheriff's office budget for ammunition. I do not know how the Sheriff's Office is funding ammunition for the mandatory qualifications for the deputies and reserves. That said I do not plan on recommending or making any changes until I have con-

tained \$3,000 in funds for

Ruark: When it comes to training, I believe one can never be trained enough. The need for different types of training evolves as our society does. One would have never thought fifty years ago we would have a need for an active shooter in a school drill, although it is sadly a necessity in today's world. Training for today's ever-changing environment is a must, and if I am elected sheriff I will seek out new and different opportunities to ensure justice and protec-

ducted my review.

tion for every citizen, and those who pass through our great county.

• How do you feel about the change to Missouri's concealed carry policy?

Davis: First, let me state that I fully support the 2nd amendment to the U.S. Constitution.

The changes to the concealed carry policy are of concern only from the standpoint of officer safety. Deputies already have a safety first approach toward all persons they interact with. This law only raises the risk factor in that all individuals may now carry concealed with no training and no background checks. They may purchase a weapon from a friend, neighbor or at an auction and no check will be run. Those individuals who were denied a conceal carry permit for no reason will now be able to carry. Citizens also need to be aware that the new law does not cross state lines. If you carry concealed and go to, for example, Arkansas, and get stopped you can be arrested for carrying concealed without a permit.

I do believe the law should have contained some type of training requirement. We do not let our children or young adults get a hunting permit until they pass a hunter safety course, but if they are over 21, they can, after January 1, 2017, carry concealed without any training.

Ruark: I am a strong supporter of the second amendment and would defend the right to bear arms for the citizens. I strongly encourage people to train and to seek their CCW due to the fact not all states recognize constitutional carry. That being said, I can see the new policy might cause certain changes that will need to be adjusted in the office.

• Do you feel there are significant changes that need to be made to staffing or budget allocations?

Davis: In a perfect world, there would need to be changes to the budget to increase staffing, training and equipment. We do not live in a perfect world. The citizens of Barry County have set the level of taxes that they are willing to pay for law enforcement and until they decide that this issue needs to be revisited, it is a moot question.

A case can be made to revisit the question based on a number of issues.

- 1. Barry County Deputies have a starting salary of \$25,725. The Federal Poverty Level for a family of four is \$24,230. We ask our Deputies to put their lives on the line for us for what is not really a living wage. Monett starts new officers at \$33,000.
- 2. There are currently, on a fully staffed week, only 12 Deputies to patrol all of Barry County on a 24/7 basis. This low staffing level leads to long response times and is an Officer safety issue, as there is often no other deputy on duty to assist if necessary. The current staffing level is approximately one deputy per 1,750 people,



or approximately six tenths (0.6) of a deputy per 1,000.

The Bureau of Justice Statistics (BJS), within the Office of Justice Programs (OJP), within the United States Department of Justice (DOJ) publishes Local Police Departments report every three to four years. This report contains excellent and highly reliable data on state and local police personnel throughout the U.S. One aspect of this report is the average ratio of full time officers per 1,000 residents. The most recent BJS data on this topic (2003), by size of population served follows:

Population Served, Full Time Officers Per 1,000 Resi-

> 250,000 or more: 2.5 100,000 to 249,999: 1.9 50,000 to 99,999: 1.8 25,000 to 49,999: 1.8 10,000 to 24,999: 2.0 2,500 to 9,999: 2.2 1,000 to 2,499: 2.6 All Sizes: 2.5

As this chart shows Barry County with a population of approximately 21,000 in the unincorporated areas probably needs a ratio of two (2) deputies per 1,000 population. Finding a way to get to 1.2, double what we have now would have a tremendous impact. Let me state again, only the citizens of Barry County can make the decision to do this.

Ruark: Having a new

sheriff is already a big change to the current staff. Trying to make changes at the very start of a new administration is putting the cart before the horse so to speak. The current staff will be evaluated on past and present performance, if changes need to be made it will be determined after this has taken place. I have worked most of the current staff for the last 6 years and have know some longer than this so I know how the staff is capable of perform-

#### • What is your primary goal if you are elected?

Davis: The number one responsibility is the safety and security of Barry County citizens and visitors. The number one issue is drugs and the crime resulting from their manufacture and use. We must have a well-trained, well equipped Sheriff's Department, with officers who are paid a living wage. If we are not secure in our homes and places of business none of the other county services matter.

A total review of all functions of the Sheriff's office. This will include all policies and procedures. I want to

Always be looking for funding sources with minimal strings attached. Increased training

In addition it is another goal of mine, if elected sheriff, that the citizens will see a county patrol from Wheaton



# Cassville routs Seneca with second half surge

With a black moon turning its back on Wildcat Stadium on Friday night, a little of John Fogerty's "Bad Moon Rising" might have been a better choice for the pregame music than "Enter Sandman," The moon was darkest over the Seneca stands, where the tribe fans watched a close 21-14 halftime dream become a 59-26 nightmare by game's end.

The Cassville Wildcats pounded Seneca into submission with a juggernaut ground game, unofficially gaining 440 yards on the turf with 54 rushing attempts. Add a 4-7 passing night by Shannon Haney for another 36 yards to that offensive effort.

The clouds may have obscured the lunar show, but the stars on the field provided plenty of highlights for the Cassville crowd.

River Phelps ran through and around the Indians for a 256-yard performance, scoring six touchdowns. Six touchdowns. That's a career for a lot of good running backs.

Troy Rose spearheaded the Wildcats on defense, intercepting Seneca's Gavin Clouse three times. Three interceptions. That's a career for a lot of good defensive backs.

Kyle Ruark ran for 71 yards and a touchdown. Anthony Tolbert gained 27 yards on seven consecutive carries late in the fourth

quarter. Then when the Seneca defense finally keyed on Tolbert, Steven Hunter blasted into the end zone from 6 yards out with his only carry of the game.

The Wildcats needed those scoring highlights because the Indians had some offensive success too. Seneca rebounded from a 14-0 hole to trail by only 21-14 at half. Then after two more Phelps touchdowns pushed the lead to 35-14, Clouse won a footrace down the east sideline for one score. After Ruark's bull rush into the end zone, Clouse added a quarterback sneak to open the fourth quarter to keep the Indians within striking distance at 43-26.

But Phelps punctuated his stats on the next series, jetting 74 yards through the Seneca secondary as Cassville claimed a 50-26 lead. Hunter's score finished an 8-play drive for a 57-26 advantage with just 3:38 left

Cassville improved to 5-2 with the victory and are 4-0 at home. Seneca fell to 3-4 with the loss.






