

Paschall found guilty of Washburn double murder

The man accused of killing the mother of his children and ex-girlfriend, Casey Brace, 29, and her grandfather, Herbert Townsend, 76, in a Washburn home on January 5, 2015, and then kidnapping his two year old daughter, was found guilty on all six charges against him on Thursday, September 28.

Christopher Paschall, 39, of Springdale, Ark., was convicted of two counts of first degree murder, three counts of armed criminal action and a single count of parental kidnapping.

The four-day jury trial took place in Newton County after a change of venue from Barry County. Paschall's murder charges carry mandatory life sentences. The state did not seek the death penalty against Paschall. Paschall's sentencing hearing will be

in Barry County on December 19, at 1 p.m. in the courtroom of Judge Jack Goodman.

According to initial statements of probable cause, Paschall showed up at Herbert Townsend's residence on Farm Road 1055 near 8th Street in Washburn on January 5, 2015, and shot his ex-girlfriend Casey Brace, 29, and her grandfather, Herbert Townsend, 76, before kidnapping his and Brace's daughter and taking her back to Springdale. The child was later found safe at Paschall's parents' home in Springdale where he was arrested without incident.

The Barry County Sheriff's Department received a call from the residence but the dispatchers could not understand what the male caller was saying. It is believed that Townsend placed the call.

Southwest hopes to 'Pack The Pit' for grand reopening of middle school gym

The much anticipated reopening of Southwest's Middle School gym, dubbed "The Pit" by alumni and students, is finally near, with the maiden basketball game this Friday evening. The first game for the gym post-repairs and upgrades will be on Friday, October 6, with the Southwest versus Exeter middle school game beginning at 4:30 p.m.

Southwest Middle School principal Christy Hermansen said, "Admission is free for everyone. We want you to come see our improvements and enjoy a great night of basketball."

She added, "Thank you, voters, for your support. We are so proud of our gym."

The biggest changes to the gym were an air conditioning system and new floors. Not as obvious to the eye of a spectator was the big change to one of the walls of the gym, which needed to have supports installed. Overall, the air conditioning, new insulation, fresh paint, new floors and lighting system makes the Pit look like a new gym. While echoes of the old gym are there, it looks basically new.



The Southwest Middle School gym is complete and the first basketball game to be held in it post-renovations and upgrades is this Friday, October 6, at 4:30 p.m.

Southwest Superintendent Tosha Tilford said, "It turned out better than I expected. It's fantastic. I think our community and students should be very proud of what we've done with that facility."

Repairs to the gym as well as multiple other building projects district-wide were possible thanks to voter approval of a \$1.3 million bond in April. Demo-

lition and construction began as soon as school was out for the year and most projects were complete prior to students returning for the 2017-18 school year. The last project, construction of new restrooms for the elementary, should be complete on October 15.

Southwest students began utilizing the completed gymnasiums on Wednesday, September 27.

Physical education courses as well as basketball practices began as soon as the repairs were complete. However, Friday will mark the first big opportunity for the community to come in and see the improvements and rehab for themselves.

Galena man charged for alleged knife assault

A Galena man was charged after allegedly

attacking his girlfriend with a knife. Owen Lee Essary, 19, of Galena, was charged with domestic assault in the second degree.

According to affidavits or probable cause, the Barry County Sheriff's Department was dispatched to a residence on State Highway 248 in Galena on the Barry County side on September 30.

The officer reported that Essary had physically assaulted the victim, striking her and leaving visible marks on her face, arms, should and back.

Essary also allegedly brandished a fixed blade knife toward the victim.

Essary is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$15,000 cash-only bond.

Monett man charged after attacking girlfriend, breaking into her home

A Monett man allegedly attacked his girlfriend and then kicked in the door to her home last week. Jonathan Eugene Brannan, 36, of Monett, is charged with domestic assault in the second degree and burglary in the first degree.

According to the affidavits of probable cause, the Monett Police Department was dispatched to a residence on Valley Street in Monett on September 28. Officers reported that Brannan got into a physical altercation with his girlfriend near the Pack and Go on Kyler Street in Monett.

Brannan allegedly scratched the victim and

bit her shoulder.

The victim then left Brannan and drove to her home. However, Brannan arrived on foot and forced his way into the residence by kicking in a side door. Officers reported that the door Brannan kicked in was boarded and had a freezer placed in front of it because of Brannan forcibly entering the home in the past. Brannan does not live at the residence.

Brannan is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$50,000 cash-only bond.

Brannan has a disposition hearing scheduled for October 19 at 8:30 a.m. in the courtroom of Judge Robert Foulke.

City of Cassville answers questions about building permits

The City of Cassville is reaching out to the community to answer questions after reported confusion regarding building permits. Cassville’s building inspector Keith Speer said, “Many residents are unaware of the building permit process within the Cassville City limits.”

The city’s building permit process has been long-standing and is based on industry standards. Projects that require a permit within city limits include: structural issues such as roof, decks, major remodels and new construction.

The city released the following statement: “The mayor and city council want to assure citizens of the city that the permit process is in place to protect them and not to hinder their efforts to build or remodel. The purpose of the permit is to allow the inspector to assure setbacks are maintained and utility interruptions are kept to a minimum.”

Building permits can be obtained at Cassville City Hall for a nominal fee. The city emphasized that building and remodeling is encouraged.

Speer added, “In cases where complications arise, we will work with the contractor and property owner to get the project completed in a safe and cost effective manner.”

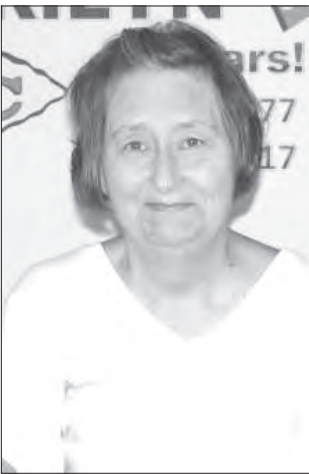



kins entered the home, he saw Brace on the floor but could not find her pulse. He heard Townsend moan from across the room. Townsend was holding a rifle but dropped the weapon when he saw Watkins.

When Watkins asked, “Who did this?,” Townsend told him it was Chris Paschall. Paschall and Brace had a tumultuous relationship, according to then-Barry County Sheriff Mick Epperly. He said that Paschall had been stalking Brace for months. He also confirmed that she had

taken out an order of protection against him but the stalking hadn’t stopped.

According to court records, Paschall had an order of protection filed against him for adult abuse stalking in October 2014 and was charged twice with violating that order since that time. Paschall was charged in October for violating the order and then again on December 15 of the same year.

Former sheriff Mick Epperly stated, “I had one of [Townsend’s] family members say that he was

a hero, and he absolutely was. He was shot four times and still was able to reach a phone and call 911. Even though he was suffering, he was able to pass along that information on what we needed. What a hero.” Law enforcement attributes Townsend for their ability to find the child safe.

An Amber Alert was issued for Alli around 4:38 p.m. on Monday afternoon but cancelled shortly after when Paschall was found at his parents’ home in Springdale, Ark. Law enforcement relied on a cell phone signal

from the immediate area of his parents’ residence, but his car was parked some distance from the home.

Townsend was taken to a hospital in Springfield for treatment, but succumbed to his injuries later that night.

Brace was the mother of three children, two of them with Paschall. The two older children were not in the home during the shooting because they were at school.

Paschall was held in the Washington County Jail in Fayetteville, Ark., fac-

ing possession of a firearm, possession of drug paraphernalia and theft by receiving in Washington County, Ark., Circuit Court before being extradited back to Barry County and subsequently Newton County for the trial.



Seneca defeats Cassville to reach 7-0

The Seneca Indians continued their Cinderella season on Friday night, extending their unbeaten skein to 7-0 with a 33-14 victory over the visiting Cassville Wildcats on the grass of Tom Hodge Field at Earl D. Campbell Stadium. The Indians scored on their first three possessions of the game, and the Seneca defense held Cassville's running game in check as the home team scored a decisive victory.

The Wildcats slipped to 4-3 overall, effectively ending any hopes of winning or sharing the Big 8 title.

The Indians took the opening kickoff and marched 67 yards in eight plays to take an early 7-0 lead. Monty Mailes keyed the drive with a 34-yard run to the Cassville 11-yard line, and then quarterback Gavin Clouse plowed into the end zone two plays later.

Two running plays resulted in two losses when Cassville started after the kickoff. On 3rd-and-14, Shannon Haney flipped a bubble screen to DJ White in the right flat, and the Wildcat receiver cut back across the field for a 24-yard gain and a first down at midfield.

A short pass to Anthony Tolbert netted 2 yards, but then Haney underthrew White on a deep out. Seneca intercepted and returned to the Cassville 47-yard line. The Indians scored in just 4 plays, with Clouse finding Max Roark open on a fade route for a 28-yard touchdown pass. The PAT gave the Indians a 14-0 lead with 4:41 left in the opening quarter.

That interception was the first of four Cassville turnovers, a costly statistic that the Wildcats could not overcome.

The Wildcats resorted to the last chapter of the play-book to get on the scoreboard. An adventure on offense saw Haney roughed while punting, resulting in a Cassville first down at their own 48-yard line. On the old double-reverse flea flicker, Ethan Hoppes threw a perfect strike to White behind the Seneca secondary. White outran the safety to the end zone to put the Wildcats on the scoreboard with just under three minutes on the first-quarter clock.

Drake Reese's PAT clipped the upright but caromed between the sticks to cut the lead to 14-7.

But the Seneca special team returned the kickoff to their own 43-yard line, setting up a short field for Clouse and company. The Indians scored in just 8 plays. Clouse broke off right tackle

for a 16-yard scoring run on the last play of the quarter. The PAT failed but Seneca held a commanding 20-7 lead after just 12 minutes of play.

In the second quarter, the Cassville offensive front finally made some headway against the big Seneca defense. Haney directed a drive deep into Indian territory, but a fumble in the red zone cost another great scoring opportunity.

The teams reached halftime with that same 20-7 score.

Hoppes brought the Wildcat Nation to full voice when he returned the second half kickoff all the way to the Seneca 10-yard line. Tolbert smashed the line for a 6-yard gain, then battered through the line to score on the next play. Reese nailed this PAT to pull Cassville within 20-14.

But the Cats would get no closer. Penalties, a doomed fake punt, and more turnovers scuttled the comeback effort.

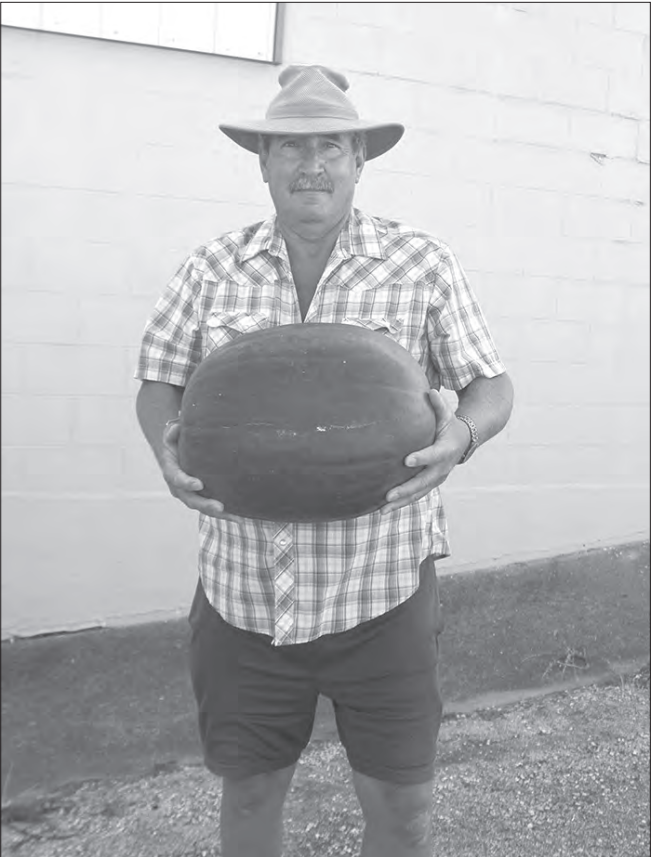
