

\$75K bond for suspect in Monett truck stop attack

ATTENDANT TRANSPORTED FOR TREATMENT

A Monett man is in custody after allegedly stealing fuel and attacking a fuel attendant at Herd's Truck Stop and Convenience Store on Monday morning.

According to a press release by the Monett Police Department, Matthew Elliott, 37, of Monett, went to the truck stop at 1100 South Lincoln Avenue around 9 a.m. The report indicated Elliott had stolen fuel and displayed an edged weapon to a fuel attendant. Officers state Elliott attacked the fuel attendance, causing injury, and then fled the scene. The victim had to be transported to an area hospital by ambulance for treatment and is in stable condition.

The Missouri State Highway Patrol found Elliott's vehicle at 9:09 a.m. about three miles outside of Monett at Farm Roads 2020 and 1100 in Barry County. The vehicle had crashed and was on fire when officers arrived. Elliott had fled on foot into a wooded area.

Officers from the Patrol Monett Police Department, Missouri Department of Conservation, Barry County Sheriff's Department and Lawrence County Sheriff's Department searched for the suspect. He was found around 35 minutes later.

Elliott was taken into custody by the Missouri State Highway Patrol at 9:50 a.m. on Monday, October 1. The Patrol listed charges pending as felony resisting arrest by fleeing in a vehicle, felony resisting arrest after committing a felony, felony leaving the scene of a motor vehicle crash,

Two teens implicated in Purdy vandalism

A 16 year old was charged in the streak of vandalism incidents throughout the city last week and charges are pending against a 17 year old. According to a post by the Purdy Police Department on its Facebook page, the two are responsible for the \$1,400 in damage to property from the spray paint vandalism on Monday, September 24.

The Purdy Police confirmed the 16 year old juvenile male is charged with felony property

damage and the charge pending against the 17 year old is also felony property damage.

The vandalism was specific in some cases, but primarily centered around generic phrasing and shock and awe comments. The fire department's vandalism read 'Let It Burn' while the First Baptist Church was damaged with the words 'Praise God' on the recently renovated building. The Purdy Farm Center's trailer included 'Pigs Oink' along with other profanity. The word on the city

park's bench was misspelled, and it is unclear what the vandals were trying to convey.

Other vandalism included phrases like '420 weed' and expletives.

The Purdy Police Department credits members of the community for discovering the identities of the suspects. Their post stated, "The Purdy Police Department would like to thank those citizens that reached out with information that eventually led to the arrest of the two suspects."

Wheaton Fire open house this Saturday, Oct. 6

The Wheaton Fire Protection District invites the public to join them for an open house at the new fire station in Wheaton on Saturday, October 6. The event is set to start at 1 p.m. and last through 4 p.m. Greg Carrell, Assistant Missouri State Fire Marshall, will present at 1:30 p.m. as the featured speaker. Refreshments will be provided at the open house.

The new fire station is named for longtime chief Bob Lombard who served the department for 62 years with 51 of those as chief.

When Lombard celebrated his 50th year as chief, he shared that he always had a new goal for the department to meet as time passed. The last one he mentioned was a new station for the department. A mere eight months after his passing, that dream became a real-

ity like so many other of his visions for the department over the decades.

Larry Prewitt, chairman of the Wheaton Fire Protection District Board, said the decision to name the station for Bob was unanimous for the five board members. He said, "It was Bob's dream. He had about four or five different drawings of what he would like to see [in the new station]. We knew we needed a new chapter in this fire department. He was the one who came up with this.

"We all wanted it to be his building."

The Bob Lombard Fire Station is located at 407 E. Hurlbut Road in Wheaton. All are welcome to attend the event on Saturday, October 6, from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. with the speaker at 1:30 p.m. The Wheaton Fire Protection District serves Barry, McDonald and Newton Counties.

Charges filed after two lbs. marijuana delivered via USPS

A collaboration between the Ozarks Drug Enforcement Team (ODET), the Barry County Sheriff's Department and the Cassville Police Department yielded the discovery of two pounds of marijuana as well as other drugs and paraphernalia last week. Rachel Ellen Poe, 36, of Cassville, is charged with felony delivery of a controlled substance.

According to affidavits

of probable cause, officers executed a narcotics search warrant at Poe's residence on Gravel Street in Cassville on Wednesday, September 26. The search warrant was served after a USPS package delivery was made to the home. Officers observed Poe and the residence while the package was delivered and after.

Poe walked from the residence to a vehicle following the warrant deliver. Officers

reported approaching the residence about five minutes after Poe went back in the home.

When officers entered the residence, Poe was in the living room with the USPS package, according to affidavits of probable cause. When the package was secured and opened, officers found a vacuum sealed package of marijuana and what they identified as THC edibles.

As officers continued to search, they also found more marijuana, paraphernalia and unknown pills. Officers reported the marijuana to weigh 650 grams and the pills were unidentified. All evidence was sent to the Mis-

souri State Highway Patrol Crime Lab for testing.

Poe is currently being held

in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$40,000 cash-only bond.

Commander Chad Allison, with ODET, reported the investigation is ongoing.

Cassville woman accused of charging over \$3K on victim's credit card

A Cassville woman is charged with racking up over \$3,600 on a victim's credit and debit cards without permission. Elizabeth D. Inman, 32, is charged with two felony counts of fraudulent use of a credit/debit device and four misdemeanor counts of fraudulent use of a credit/debit device. Inman is currently being held in the Barry County Jail on a \$15,505 bond between the new charges and multiple counts of failures to appear.

According to affidavits of probable cause, Inman was living with the victim at a residence on Claire Drive in Cassville. The

victim reported Inman used both his debit and credit cards to make PayPal purchases on Facebook between March and July 2018.

The victim reported the credit card was used to make \$3,354.52 in unauthorized purchases, and the debit card was used to make approximately \$374 worth of purchases. The victim had allowed Inman to use the card to make purchases prior to the fraudulent purchases.

Once in custody, Inman told officers she had the card numbers saved in her cell phone from the authorized purchases and did not know she was not allowed to use the victim's cards.

Cassville playground closed for resurfacing

The City of Cassville announced the playground next to the Cassville Aquatic Center will be closed until the end of October for a resurfacing project. The existing wood chip surface will be replaced with a poured rubberized play surface made from recycled tires.

The temporary closure was announced on September 24. The project is made possible by a \$30,000 grant

awarded by the Missouri Department of Natural Resources Solid Waste Management Program. The grant is a means to divert scrap tires from ending up in landfills or being illegally dumped.

Barry County Courts sentence 14 to incarceration in August

• **Sandra Anderson**, of Galena, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance in October 2016. Her probation has since been revoked and she is to serve five years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On April 9, 2015, Anderson was picked up by law enforcement behind the Monett Library for an active warrant. When officers placed her under arrest, she was in possession of a black bag in her purse that contained two baggies of methamphetamine, a clear glass pipe, plastic straws and a metal spoon.

• **Shane Michael Ayala**, of Pierce City, pled guilty to two counts of distribution of a controlled substance in July 2016. Ayala's probation has since been revoked, and he is to serve 10 years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On May 7, 2012, Ayala sold an undercover police officer half a pound of marijuana for \$600 but never returned with the marijuana after the officer paid him the money.

• **Alexander Duffy Barker**, of Eagle Rock, pled guilty two counts of non-support with the total arrears in excess of 12 monthly payments. Barker received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years unsupervised probation.

As of November 22, 2017, Barker was in arrears \$13,150.03 in child support for one minor child.

Barker is to serve probation until August 20, 2023.

• **Chantel Marie Baxter**, of Monett, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance. Baxter received a suspended imposition of sentencing and three years supervised probation.

On April 21, 2017, Baxter was investigated for a domestic disturbance and taken to jail on an active warrant. When officers booked Baxter into jail, she was concealing a glass amphetamine pipe in her brassiere.

Baxter is to serve probation until August 21, 2021.

• **Shane Marshall Beck**, of Purdy, made an Alford plea to assault in the second degree. He was on probation after pleading guilty to possession of a controlled substance in May 2014. Beck was sentenced to five years incarceration with the Department of Corrections on his most recent charge. His probation was revoked on his possession charge for which he is to serve seven years incarceration.

On February 7, 2012, officers served a search warrant at a residence on Gravel Street in Cassville. In Beck's room, officers found a water bong, two propane torches, three distribution baggies with methamphetamine residue, a pair of hemostats, a digital scale, a glass pipe with burnt residue and cut straws. Officers found other drugs and paraphernalia in other areas of the home Beck shared with others.

On July 20, 2016, Beck was in a vehicle travelling on State Highway 86 in Golden. Beck almost hit another vehicle, and the other driver followed to get his license plate vehicle. When the victim stopped, Beck pulled into the parking lot, got out of his car and punched the victim in the face multiple times. Beck is a trained MMA fighter and the victim suffered a severe concussion and damage to his left eye retina.

• **Kevin Joseph Buchanan** pled guilty to domestic assault in the second degree. Buchanan received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

On July 20, 2016, Buchanan threatened his mother and another family member with a knife and level, chasing the victim down the driveway of a residence on Farm Road 1200 near Aurora. Buchanan had accused the other family member of stealing his prescription medication and threatened to kill him, chasing him with the knife and level. The victim said Buchanan hit him with the level and tried to stab him twice. The victim was reported to have lacerations on his leg and abrasions on his hands and back.

Buchanan is to serve probation until August 21, 2023.

• **Randy Lee Cannady**, of Washburn, pled guilty to two counts of stealing. Cannady received a suspended execution of a two years incarceration sentence in jail and two years unsupervised probation.

On February 16, 2018, the Barry County Sheriff's Department took a report of stealing from a residence on Farm Road 2290 in Seligman. Cannady and another suspect were seen stealing tree stands, animal traps and cameras. When Cannady was interviewed, he told officers that if he sees something he wants and it's nice, he just takes it. In all, the stolen

goods totalled more than \$750.

Cannady is to serve probation until August 20, 2020.

• **Colten Benjamin Collins**, of Purdy, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance. He was already on probation after he pled guilty to property damage in the second degree in October 2012. Collins' probation has since been revoked, and he is to serve 180 days incarceration in jail. On the possession charge, he received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

On August 20, 2011, officers with the Barry County Sheriff's Department took a report of a stolen tractor and damage done to the property with the stolen tractor. Collins and two other suspects took the tractor and drove it around the property, causing \$3,000 worth of damage to the property, including to a metal burn pit, a chicken house, a shed and ruts in the yard.

On January 22, 2018, the Monett Police Department was dispatched to the Monett Walmart for a suspicious person. Staff said Collins was asking for them to page his girlfriend and acted confused. When officers arrived, they found Collins to have slurred speech.

Collins was in possession of a prescription pill bottle with 18 Alprazolam (Xanax) and four Tramadol.

Collins is to serve probation until August 21, 2023.

• **Timothy Paul Copeland**, of Neosho, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance and driving while revoked/suspended as a first offense. Copeland received a suspended imposition of sentencing, a \$50 fine and five years supervised probation.

On November 19, 2017, Copeland was pulled over for careless and imprudent driving. Copeland was speeding and driving while intoxicated with a suspended license. Officers also found a glass pipe with ashy residue inside that smelled like marijuana.

Copeland also had a glass pipe with methamphetamine residue and a loaded .22 caliber handgun as well as a baggie of what appeared to be marijuana. Once at the jail, Copeland was found to have a small bag of what appeared to be methamphetamine in his wallet.

Copeland is to serve probation until August 20, 2023.

• **James Robert Cummings**, of Cassville, pled guilty to possession of a controlled

substance and escaping from custody while under arrest for a felony in April 2014. Cummings' probation has since been revoked, and he is to serve four years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

tions.

On February 26, 2013, Cassville. Officers recovered found property on Harold Street which contained change, substance abuse recovery coins, a prescription bottle containing Norco pills, a cell phone and a wallet belonging to Cummings.

Officers found that Cummings had been staying with the person who owned the property inside the bag.

When Cummings was interviewed, he told officers he had planned to get the property later and use the pills inside. Norco is a narcotic schedule III drug.

- **Cody Ryan Dobyns**, of Blue Eye, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance. Dobyns received a suspended execution of a seven year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections and five years supervised probation.

On July 1, 2016, Dobyns was in a vehicle sitting at the Stubblefield Conservation Area, extremely sweaty. When an officer with the Missouri Department of Conservation asked him what they were doing, Dobyns said hanging out. Dobyns then consented to

a search of the vehicle.

Officers found an Altoids can with methamphetamine inside, a cut straw and marijuana. Officers also found a marijuana pipe in the console cup holder and a methamphetamine pipe.

Dobyns is to serve probation until August 20, 2023.

- **Dakota Ray Dunham**, of Gerald, pled guilty to sexual misconduct with a child under the age 15 as a first offense in November 2015. Dunham's probation has since been revoked and he is to serve four years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On February 28, 2015, Dunham sent photos of his genitals to a 13 year old female victim through his cell phone.

- **Christopher Shawn Ferguson**, of Joplin, pled guilty to burglary in the second degree in April 2014. Ferguson's probation has since been revoked, and he is to serve 120 days of shock time with the Department of Corrections. His initial sentence was seven years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On June 28, 2013, Ferguson had broken into a garage on Main Street in Cassville with the intention of stealing.

- **Christina Marie Gourd**, of Joplin, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance, and two counts of delivery of a controlled substance. Gourd received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

On April 12, 2018, officers with the Ozarks Drug Enforcement Team were doing mobile surveillance on Gourd and two others. When officers followed the vehicle to Sunset Heights Road in Cassville, officers watched an exchange between occupants in the car and two other people.

Cassville Police officers then made contact with the vehicle. There were syringes in plain view when officers approached the vehicle.

A probable cause search yielded 56 hydrocodone pills, six fentanyl patches, 66 Diazepam, two sublingual and one morphine pill. Pills were packaged in baggies. There were also 7.6 grams of marijuana, .5 grams of methamphetamine, digital scales, syringes and rolling papers.

Gourd is to serve probation until August 20, 2023.

- **Brittany Janelle Henry**, of Rogers, Ark., pled guilty to possession of a controlled sub-

stance. Henry received a suspended imposition of sentencing and three years supervised probation.

On August 3, 2017, the Cassville Police Department was dispatched for a trespassing call on Old Exeter Road at Walmart.

Henry was on scene and was wanted for a warrant through the Barry County Sheriff's Office. When officers spoke with Henry, she gave them a baggie with two crystals of methamphetamine. She had also been texting a confidential informant regarding selling the substance for money.

Henry is to serve probation until August 20, 201.

- **Sean T. Hooten**, of Shell Knob, pled guilty to escape from confinement and two counts of harassment in the first degree. Hooten received a suspended execution of a four year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections and five years supervised probation.

In early July 2017, Hooten was arrested for sending inappropriate photos to a victim who had a restraining order out against him. He also sent several voice recordings to the victim, causing her to fear leav-

ing her residence. Hooten sent multiple voice recordings and text messages to the victim as harassment. Hooten was also driving by the victim's residence and place of work in violation of the order of protection.

On July 10, 2017, Hooten attempted to escape from confinement while in the Barry County Jail. Hooten forced open his cell door and ran toward an open pod door. Hooten attempted to gain control of an officer's keys while fighting officers attempting to subdue him.

Two officers had to seek medical treatment for the injuries sustained while trying to gain control of Hooten.

Hooten is to serve probation until August 21, 2023.

- **Bradley Max Hufford, Jr.**, of Seligman, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance and forgery in August 2017. Hufford's probation has since been revoked and he was sentenced to a suspended execution of a seven year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections and five years supervised probation.

On September 19, 2014, Hufford was found to be in possession of dilaudid pills and a syringe of illegal substance.

On June 13, 2015, Hufford had returned merchandise to Tractor Supply in Cassville for a gift card. Hufford forged the name on the receipt as Jeremiah Jones.

Hufford is to serve probation until August 22, 2023.

- **Joshua Eldon Jacobs**, of Bentonville, Ark., pled guilty to two counts of possession of a controlled substance and one count of stealing \$750 or more, and made an Alford plea to one count of tampering with a motor vehicle in the first degree. Jacobs was sentenced to four years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On November 23, 2016, the Cassville Police Department was serving a narcotics search warrant at a residence on 11th Street. Officers found drug paraphernalia including three used syringes, a prescription bottle with Adderall capsules as well as Clonazepam, a glass pipe that field tested positive for marijuana and a one hitter that tested positive for marijuana.

On June 26, 2017, a Cub Cadet lawn mower and a stand up tool chest were reported stolen from a residence on Farm Road 1197 in Cassville. A

friend reported seeing an older green Dodge truck at the victim's home. On June 28, 2017, officers spoke with Jacobs who admitted to stealing the mower and tool box with two other people.

On May 3, 2018, Jacobs took a 2006 Ford Explorer without permission, valued at \$5,100, from a residence on Packer Drive in Shell Knob.

• **Lacy J. Jarrett**, of Monett, pled guilty to driving while revoked/suspended. Jarrett received a suspended execution of a four year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections and five years supervised probation.

On June 28, 2016, Jarrett was found to be driving when her license was revoked.

Jarrett is to serve probation until August 6, 2023.

• **Rodrigo Martinez-Hinojosa**, of Seligman, pled guilty to DWI as a persistent offender.

Martinez-Hinojosa received a suspended execution of a four year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections, must complete 480 hours of community service and five years supervised probation.

On February 10, 2017, Martinez-Hinjosa was pulled over for driving off the roadway. He was obviously intoxicated when officers made contact with him. He admitted to having seven beers and would fail the breath test if he took it.

Martinez-Hinjosa had to be physically restrained because he fought the officer placing him under arrest, attempting to flee.

On July 22, 2017, Martinez-Hinjosa was pulled over for crossing the roadway center four times in half a mile. When an officer made contact, he was clearly intoxicated. His blood alcohol content was 0.246 percent.

cent.

Martinez-Hinojosa is to serve probation until August 24, 2023.

• **Bret Mayes**, of St. Joseph, pled guilty to non-support in each of six individual months within any 12 month period with the excess of arrears at least \$5,000. Mayes received a suspended execution of a four year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections and five years supervised probation.

As of September 9, 2008, Mayes was in arrears of \$9,254.82 for three minor children.

Mayes is to serve probation until August 20, 2023.

• **Brett Daniel McClain**, of Cassville, pled guilty to domestic assault in the second degree. McClain received a suspended execution of a ten year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections and five years supervised probation.

On May 12, 2018, McClain kidnapped the victim by throwing her in his car and driving around for about an hour,

inflicting contusions on the victim's arm from grabbing her and forcing her to stay in the vehicle. McClain then refused to let her leave until the next morning. He grabbed her and choked her, making her gasp until she almost blacked out. He would then left go and slap her in the face to wake her up. He hit her in the face, grabbed her arm, body slammed her, stomped on her and pulled her hair.

McClain is to serve probation until August 20, 2023.

• **Russell Kent McKee**, of Monett, pled guilty to non-support with the total arrears in excess of 12 monthly payments in September 2015. McKee's probation has since been revoked and he is to serve 120 days shock time with the Department of Corrections as part of his original three year incarceration sentence.

As of January 22, 2013, McKee was in total arrears of \$31,849 in child support for two children.

• **Dakota Leevi Morgan**, of Mt. Vernon, pled guilty to two counts of possession of a

controlled substance and one count of resisting arrest by fleeing by creating a substantial risk of injury/death to any other person in November 2017 and May 2018. Morgan's probation was revoked and he was sentenced to five years incarceration with the Department of Corrections with the execution of that sentence suspended and five years supervised probation.

On May 11, 2017, officers were trying to determine the owner of an abandoned vehicle. Inside the clip board in the vehicle was two clear plastic straws that had white residue.

While officers were searching the vehicle, Morgan approached and admitted that the vehicle was his.

On February 26, 2018, officers attempted to pull Morgan over while driving. Morgan proceeded through stop signs and travelled at a high rate of sped. At one point, Morgan's vehicle became airborne.

When the vehicle stopped, Morgan and a passenger fled on foot. Morgan gave an item to a woman standing outside. When officers subdued him, they found Morgan had given a baggie of 0.2 grams of methamphetamine to the woman.

Morgan is to serve probation until September 18, 2023.

• **Brandon Lee Ramos**, of

Monett, pled guilty to unlawful use of a weapon and assault in the third degree in December 2017. Ramos' probation has since been revoked, and he is to serve three years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On July 30, 2017, Ramos was at Memories night club in Monett. He and another person pulled up in a car and Ramos had an altercation with another person in the parking lot. Ramos pulled out a pistol and put it in the victim's face before hitting him with it. Eventually, Ramos fired the gun into the ground multiple times after physically hitting the victim.

• **Jason Wayne Rayburn**, of Cassville, pled guilty to forgery. Rayburn received a suspended imposition of sentencing and three years supervised probation.

On December 6, 2017, officers were dispatched to Cassville Walmart for theft. Rayburn misidentified himself to police, giving a different name. Rayburn had signed multiple documents at Walmart with the wrong name.

Rayburn is to serve probation until August 20, 2021.

• **Joseph James Rodriguez**, of Monett, pled guilty to stealing in February 2018. Rodriguez's probation has since been revoked, and he is to serve three years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

Rodriguez took the victim's iPhone 6, vehicle key and wallet, containing multiple cards and \$63 in cash.

Officers found Rodriguez to be in possession of the stolen items, but the cash was gone.

- **Randall Leonard Roller**, of Aurora, pled guilty to two counts of theft/stealing of less than \$500. Roller received a suspended imposition of sentencing and two years unsupervised probation.

On March 9, 2010, the victim filed a stolen cattle report. The victim said he gave Roller \$83,894.70 for cattle he allegedly purchased for him. When the victim went to inspect the cattle in the pasture, there were no cattle. There was a receipt for 318 head of mixed cattle,

Thornton is to serve probation until August 20, 2020.

- **Sarena Justinleigh Tucker**, of Shell Knob, pled guilty to burglary in the second degree and resisting arrest for a felony in March 2015. Her probation was revoked and she was sentenced to five years incarceration with the Department of Corrections with the execution of that sentence suspended and five years supervised probation.

On June 7, 2014, Tucker and another suspect broke into a residence on East 5th Street in

Butterfield through a bedroom window. Once inside, Tucker stole clothing and a jewelry box filled with \$500 of jewelry.

On July 24, 2014, Tucker resisted arrest for a felony warrant by fleeing when deputies arrived to arrest her.

Tucker is to serve probation until September 26, 2023.

- **Ricky Lee Wallace**, of Cassville, pled guilty to non-support in six months within a 12 month period with the amount owed over \$5,000. Wallace received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

As of January 27, 2009, Wallace was in total arrears of \$6,321.26 in child support for one minor child.

Wallace is to serve probation until August 20, 2023.

- **James Leroy Walls, III**, of Eagle Rock, made an Alford plea to burglary in the first degree, three counts of endangering the welfare of a child in the first degree and two counts of abuse of a child. Walls was sentenced to seven years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On December 12, 2017, Walls was holding two women and a three year old child hostage at a residence on Farm Road 2260 in Eagle Rock. There was an order of protection out for the children of that residence, preventing Walls from being near them.

When officers spoke with the females inside, they told them Walls refused to let them leave. They also stated Walls regularly makes threats to one of the women and is abusive. He is also a registered sex offender.

Officers also discovered Walls was abusive to the children in the home by subjecting the children to physical and mental injury by domestic violence.

Officers found the home to be unsanitary with pet feces covering the bathtub, cats getting into food and pet feces smashed into the carpet. There was also no running water for

Wildcats ace homecoming test, remain undefeated

The Cassville Wildcats survived a slugfest first quarter, and then ran away from McDonald County for a 37-6 Homecoming victory at Wildcat Stadium on Friday night, Sept. 28. Anthony Tolbert scored two touchdowns in a pivotal second quarter to give the Wildcats a 21-6 halftime lead, and the Cassville defense throttled the Mustangs in the second half.

The state-ranked Wildcats improved to 6-0 with the win, avenging the loss to McDonald County last

season.

Lance Parnell's team went old school for this Homecoming game, donning the traditional black-on-black uniforms. "Old school" was a good description of the first quarter, too. Most of the quarter was consumed by lengthy scoring drives by both teams.

Cassville drove 71 yards in 11 plays for the game's first points with Bowen Preddy taking a toss sweep into the end zone from 10 yards out. Drake Reese added the PAT for a 7-0 score.

Mac County answered with an 8-play, 80-yard adventure with junior quarterback Ben Mora finding the end zone from 8 yards out. But the Mustangs missed the PAT try, and Cassville held a 7-6 lead with just 37 seconds left in the opening quarter.

In their week 5 game against Nevada, the Mustangs relied heavily on senior tailback Oakley Roessler. He ripped through the Tigers for 279 yards on 39 carries to help McDonald County earn a 42-20 victory. But the Cassville defense keyed on Roessler and limited him to just 51 yards rushing.

McDonald County, with a big and talented offen-

sive line, only managed 160 yards on the ground against the Wildcats. In the first five games, Roessler alone was averaging 220 yards per game.

But the game turned on a rare Shannon Haney punt early in the second quarter. Haney's kick sailed inside the Mac 5-yard line where Logan Carlin's diving save killed the ball at the one-yard line. The Mustangs could not move the chains, and their punt sailed out of bounds just six yards away from the McDonald County red zone.

Cassville took advantage of the gift field position scoring in just four plays. Tolbert burst off left tackle out of the wishbone for a

2-yard touchdown, and a second Reese conversion gave the Cats a 14-6 lead with 7:08 to play in the half.

The teams traded turnovers, and then the Mustangs punted to the Cassville 22-yard line with less than a minute on the clock.

Lightning strikes twice

On first down, Preddy found open field on a skinny reverse and raced 78 yards for an apparent score. But a holding call nullified the long run, and the Wildcats regrouped at their own 10-yard line.

Pinned deep with just seconds on the clock, many teams would have genuflected and taken the lead to the dressing room. Instead, Tolbert bounced outside the right tackle box, cut inside to the hash mark behind downfield blocking and raced 90 yards to the end zone. It was a highlight reel moment for Cassville and a demoralizing blow to the Mustangs. Reese tacked on another conversion for a 21-6 halftime lead.

Cassville then put the game away with a 5-play, 65-yard drive to open the third quarter. Zack Coenan scored on a 2-yard plunge from his fullback spot, and the Wildcats built a 27-6 lead.

48-yard short field. Haney converted on 4th-and-3 to give Cassville a first down at the 24-yard line. Three plays later, DJ White hauled in a center screen, raced into the secondary and pinned off defensive backs to complete a 23-yard scoring play. Reese banged another kick through the uprights for a 34-6 lead with just over four minutes remaining in the quarter.

Reese completed the scoring, nailing a 33-yard field goal for the 37-6 score with 2:53 left in the game.

An elite kicker is a valuable weapon in high school football. But most high school coaches don't really trust their field goal specialists with the game on the line. Those long three pointers almost always occur when a team is either up or down considerably on the scoreboard. Wildcat fans recall that fateful Saturday in Richmond when David Large left his all-state kicker on the sideline and opted to go for 4th-and-3 deep in Richmond territory. The second guessing continues to this day.

Anthony Tolbert led the Wildcats in this game rushing 14 times for 164 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

Cassville had a couple of scares when both Preddy and Johnny Medina left the game with dings. But both returned to action none the worse for wear.

The undefeated Wildcats now face two games on the road before hosting Lamar to finish the regular season. Cassville's first road test comes on Friday at Nevada against the 1-5 Tigers. Kick-off is set for 7 p.m..

felony no drivers license, a stop sign violation and no seat belt. The Patrol stated Elliott was turned over to the Monett Police Department on a robbery investigation.

The Monett Police Department then took Elliott to the Monett Justice Center. In Barry County, Elliott is charged with robbery in the first degree, armed criminal action and assault in the third degree. Elliott is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$75,000 cash-only bond.

The children were interviewed and indicated that Walls had hit one of them on the wrists and across the legs with a golf club. He also hit them across the rear end with a belt. They also saw Walls choke their mother and hit her saying he would kill her. Walls also forced their mother to perform sex acts on him while at least one child watched.

on probation for theft/stealing of \$500 to \$25,000 in value after pleading guilty in March 2013. Whisman's probation was revoked and he is to serve four years incarceration with the Department of Corrections for all charges.

On January 29, 2012, a report was made to the Barry County Sheriff's Office for a burglary, stealing and property damage. Several firearms and hunting equipment were stolen from a residence on State Highway VV in Verona. Whisman and another suspect were implicated. The guns were found in a storage unit on the south side of the Monett football field.

On February 23, 2018, Whisman fled on foot when officers tried to execute a felony warrant on him at a location on State Highway C in Purdy. Whisman fled on foot and then was eventually located in a vehicle after a short pursuit.

• **Dennis Allen Wood**, of Washburn, made an Alford plea to endangering the welfare of a child. Wood received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

Between January 1, 2017, and May 1, 2017, Wood duct taped five year old child's hands behind his back, saying that officers 'did not know how [the child] treats me.' There were also approximately 12 to 15 cats in the home and the home was unsanitary, including three litter boxes in the kitchen filled with feces and urine. One of the four minor children in the home had a serious medical condition and the condition put him at risk for an infection.

Wood is to serve probation until August 21, 2023.

• **Nicholas Ryan Yokeley**, of Monett, pled guilty to theft/stealing of a credit or debit device and fraudulent use of a credit/debit device of \$500 or more. Yokeley received a suspended imposition of sentencing and three years supervised probation.

Between October 5, 2016, and November 20, 2017, Yokeley had been using the Aaron Rentals company credit card to make purchases. Yokeley had been employed with the company but was terminated in January 2017. Reissued cards were never found and Yokeley and his wife were identified on security footage using the cards for fuel. The fuel charges were \$3,638.63 in November 2017.

Yokeley is to serve probation until August 20, 2021.

MDC offers free CWD testing statewide all season

The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) wants deer hunters to know that it is offering free chronic-wasting-disease (CWD) sampling and testing of deer harvested anywhere in the state throughout the entire deer hunting season – Sept. 15 through Jan. 15, 2019. The sampling is voluntary and hunters can also get free test results for their deer.

Hunters can have their deer sampled at 11 select MDC offices around the state. Hunters can also take their deer to 64 participating taxidermists and meat processors located in the 48 counties of MDC's CWD Management Zone. (See map for CWD Management Zone counties.)

Find locations and more information on voluntary CWD sampling at mdc.mo.gov/cwd under "Voluntary CWD Sampling All Season."

MDC asks hunters to Tel-e-check their deer before taking them to a CWD sampling location. Hunters can bring the entire deer -- preferably field dressed -- or the head with at least 6 inches of the neck in place. Heads that have the cape removed for taxidermy can also be sampled.

CWD test results can take up to four weeks from the time of sample submission. Hunters can get test results for their CWD-sampled deer online at mdc.mo.gov/CWDTestResults.

Mandatory CWD Sampling Nov. 10 and 11 in 31 counties

MDC will again conduct mandatory CWD sampling in 31 of the 48 counties of its

CWD Management Zone during the opening weekend of the fall firearms deer season, Nov. 10 and 11. The counties include new ones added to the CWD Management Zone, counties with previous CWD positives, and counties very near previous positives.

The 31 counties for mandatory CWD sampling are: Adair, Barry, Bollinger, Cape Girardeau, Cedar, Cole, Crawford, Franklin, Grundy, Hickory, Jefferson, Knox, Linn, Macon, Madison, McDonald, Mercer, Moniteau, Ozark, Perry, Polk, Putnam, St. Charles, St. Clair, St. Francois,

Ste. Genevieve, Stone, Sullivan, Taney, Warren, and Washington.

Hunters who harvest deer from these counties Nov. 10 or 11 must take their deer -- or the head with at least 6 inches of the neck in place -- on the day of harvest to one of 61 MDC CWD mandatory sampling stations. Deer may be presented at any mandatory sampling station.
