\$75K bond for suspect in Monett truck stop attack

A Monett man is in custody after allegedly stealing fuel and attacking a fuel attendant at Herd's Truck Stop and Convenience Store on Monday morning.

According to a press release by the Monett Police Department, Matthew Elliott, 37, of Monett, went to the truck stop at 1100 South Lincoln Avenue around 9 a.m. The report indicated Elliott had stolen fuel and displayed an edged weapon to a fuel attendant. Officers state Elliott attacked the fuel attendance, causing injury, and then fled the scene. The victim had to be transported to an area hospital by ambulance for treatment and is in stable condition.

The Missouri State Highway Patrol found Elliott's vehicle at 9:09 a.m. about three miles outside of Monett at Farm Roads 2020 and 1100 in Barry County. The vehicle had crashed and was on fire when officers arrived. Elliott had fled on foot into a wooded area.

Officers from the Patrol Monett Police Department, Missouri Department of Conservation, Barry County Sheriff's Department and Lawrence County Sheriff's Department searched for the suspect. He was found around 35 minutes later.

Elliott was taken into custody by the Missouri State Highway Patrol at 9:50 a.m. on Monday, October 1. The Patrol listed charges pending as felony resisting arrest by fleeing in a vehicle, felony resisting arrest after committing a felony, felony leaving the scene of a motor vehicle crash,

Two teens implicated in Purdy vandalism

A 16 year old was charged in the streak of vandalism incidents throughout the city last week and charges are pending against a 17 year old. According to a post by the Purdy Police Department on its Facebook page, the two are responsible for the \$1,400 in damage to property from the spray paint vandalism on Monday, September 24.

The Purdy Police confirmed the 16 year old juvenile male is charged with felony property damage and the charge pending against the 17 year old is also felony property damage.

The vandalism was specific in some cases, but primarily centered around generic phrasing and shock and awe comments. The fire department's vandalism read 'Let It Burn' while the First Baptist Church was damaged with the words 'Praise God' on the recently renovated building. The Purdy Farm Center's trailer included 'Pigs Oink' along with other profanity. The word on the city

park's bench was misspelled, and it is unclear what the vandals were trying to convey.

Other vandalism included phrases like '420 weed' and expletives.

The Purdy Police Department credits members of the community for discovering the identities of the suspects. Their post stated, "The Purdy Police Department would like to thank those citizens that reached out with information that eventually led to the arrest of the two suspects."

The Wheaton Fire Protection District invites the public to join them for an open house at the new fire station in Wheaton on Saturday, October 6. The event is set to start at 1 p.m. and last through 4 p.m. Greg Carrell, Assistant Missouri State Fire Marshall, will present at 1:30 p.m. as the featured speaker. Refreshments will be provided at the open house.

The new fire station is named for longtime chief Bob Lombard who served the department for 62 years with 51 of those as chief.

When Lombard celebrated his 50th year as chief, he shared that he always had a new goal for the department to meet as time passed. The last one he mentioned was a new station for the department. A mere eight months after his passing, that dream became a real-

ity like so many other of his visions for the department over the decades.

Larry Prewitt, chairman of the Wheaton Fire Protection District Board, said the decision to name the station for Bob was unanimous for the five board members. He said, "It was Bob's dream. He had about four or five different drawings of what he would like to see [in the new station]. We knew we needed a new chapter in this fire department. He was the one who came up with this.

"We all wanted it to be his building."

Charges filed after two lbs. marijuana delivered via USPS

A collaboration between the Ozarks Drug Enforcement Team (ODET), the County Sheriff's Department and the Cassville Police Department vielded the discovery of two pounds of marijuana as well as other drugs and paraphernalia last week. Rachel Ellen Poe, 36, of Cassville, is charged with felony delivery of a controlled substance.

According to affidavits

of probable cause, officers executed a narcotics search warrant at Poe's residence on Gravel Street in Cassville on Wednesday, September 26. The search warrant was served after a USPS package delivery was made to the home. Officers observed Poe and the residence while the package was delivered and

Poe walked from the residence to a vehicle following the warrant deliver. Officers

reported approaching the residence about five minutes after Poe went back in the

When officers entered the residence, Poe was in the living room with the USPS package, according to affidavits of probable cause. When the package was secured and opened, officers found a vacuum sealed package of marijuana and what they identified as THC edibles.

As officers continued to search, they also found more marijuana, and unknown pills. Officers reported the marijuana to weigh 650 grams and the pills were unidentified. All evidence was sent to the Missouri State Highway Patrol Crime Lab for testing.

Poe is currently being held

in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$40,000 cash-only

Commander Chad Allison, with ODET, reported the investigation is ongoing.

Cassville woman accused of charging over \$3K on victim's credit card

A Cassville woman is charged with racking up over \$3,600 on a victim's credit and debit cards without permission. Elizabeth D. Inman, 32, is charged with two felony counts of fraudulent use of a credit/debit device and four misdemeanor counts of fraudulent use of a credit/debit device. paraphernalia Inman is currently being held in the Barry County Jail on a \$15,505 bond between the new charges and multiple counts of failures to appear.

> According to affidavits of probable cause, Inman was living with the victim at a residence on Claire Drive in Cassville. The

victim reported Inman used both his debit and credit cards to make PayPal purchases on Facebook between March and July 2018.

The victim reported the credit card was used to make \$3,354.52 in unauthorized purchases, and the debit card was used to make approximately \$374 worth of purchases. The victim had allowed Inman to use the card to make purchases prior to the fraudulent purchases.

Once in custody, Inman told officers she had the card numbers saved in her cell phone from the authorized purchases and did not know she was not allowed to use the

Cassville playground closed for resurfacing

The City of Cassville announced the playground next to the Cassville Aquatic Center will be closed until the end of October for a resurfacing project. The existing wood chip surface will be replaced with a poured rubberized play surface made from recycled tires.

The temporary closure was announced on September 24. The project is made possible by a \$30,000 grant awarded by the Missouri Department of Natural Resources Solid Waste Management Program. The grant is a means to divert scrap tires from ending up in landfills or being illegally dumped.

Barry County Courts sentence 14 to incarceration in August

• Sandra Anderson, of Galena, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance in October 2016. Her probation has since been revoked and she is to serve five years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On April 9, 2015, Anderson was picked up by law enforcement behind the Monett Library for an active warrant. When officers placed her under arrest, she was in possession of a black bag in her purse that contained two baggies of methamphetamine, a clear glass pipe, plastic straws and a metal

• Shane Michael Ayala, of Pierce City, pled guilty to two counts of distribution of a controlled substance in July 2016. Ayala's probation has since been revoked, and he is to serve 10 years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On May 7, 2012, Ayala sold an undercover police officer half a pound of marijuana for \$600 but never returned with the marijuana after the officer paid him the money.

• Alexander Duffy Barker, of Eagle Rock, pled guilty two counts of non-support with the total arrears in excess of 12 monthly payments. Barker received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years unsupervised probation.

As of November 22, 2017, Barker was in arrears \$13,150.03 in child support for one minor child.

Barker is to serve probation until August 20, 2023.

• Chantel Marie Baxter, of Monett, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance. Baxter received a suspended imposition of sentencing and three years supervised proba-

On April 21, 2017, Baxter was investigated for a domestic disturbance and taken to jail on an active warrant. When officers booked Baxter into jail, she was concealing a glass amphetamine pipe in her brassiere.

Baxter is to serve probation until August 21, 2021.

• Shane Marshall Beck, of Purdy, made an Alford plea to assault in the second degree. He was on probation after pleading guilty to possession of a controlled substance in May 2014. Beck was sentenced to five years incarceration with the Department of Corrections on his most recent charge. His probation was revoked on his possession charge for which he is to serve seven years incar-

On February 7, 2012, officers served a search warrant at a residence on Gravel Street in Cassville. In Beck's room, officers found a water bong, two propane torches, three distribution baggies with methamphetamine residue, a pair of hemostats, a digital scale, a glass pipe with burnt residue and cut straws. Officers found other drugs and paraphernalia in other areas of the home Beck shared with others.

On July 20, 2016, Beck was in a vehicle travelling on State Highway 86 in Golden. Beck almost hit another vehicle, and the other driver followed to get his license plate vehicle. When the victim stopped, Beck pulled into the parking lot, got out of his car and punched the victim in the face multiple times. Beck is a trained MMA fighter and the victim suffered a severe concussion and damage to his left eye retina.

• Kevin Joseph Buchanan pled guilty to domestic assault in the second degree. Buchanan received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

On July 20, 2016, Buchanan threatened his mother and another family member with a knife and level, chasing the victim down the driveway of a residence on Farm Road 1200 near Aurora. Buchanan had accused the other family member of stealing his prescription medication and threatened to kill him, chasing him with the knife and level. The victim said Buchanan hit him with the level and tried to stab him twice. The victim was reported to have lacerations on his leg and abrasions on his hands and

Buchanan is to serve probation until August 21, 2023.

• Randy Lee Cannady, of Washburn, pled guilty to two counts of stealing. Cannady received a suspended execution of a two years incarceration sentence in jail and two years unsupervised probation.

On February 16, 2018, the Barry County Sheriff's Department took a report of stealing from a residence on Farm Road 2290 in Seligman. Cannady and another suspect were seen stealing tree stands, animal

goods totalled more than \$750.

Cannady is to serve probation until August 20, 2020.

· Colten Benjamin Collins, of Purdy, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance. He was already on probation after he pled guilty to property damage in the second degree in October 2012. Collin's probation has since been revoked, and he is to serve 180 days incarceration in jail. On the possession charge, he received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

On August 20, 2011, officers with the Barry County Sheriff's Department took a report of a stolen tractor and damage done to the property with the stolen tractor. Collins and two other suspects took the tractor and drove it around the property, causing \$3,000 worth of damage to the property, including to a metal burn pit, a chicken house, a shed and ruts in the yard.

On January 22, 2018, the Monett Police Department was dispatched to the Monett Walmart for a suspicious person. Staff said Collins was asking for them to page his girlfriend and acted confused. When officers arrived, they found Collins to have slurred speech.

Collins was in possession of a prescription pill bottle with 18 Alprazolam (Xanax) and four Tramadol.

Collins is to serve probation until August 21, 2023.

· Timothy Paul Copeland, of Neosho, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance and driving while revoked/suspended as a first offense. Copeland received a suspended imposition of sentencing, a \$50 fine and five years supervised probation.

On November 19, 2017, Copeland was pulled over for careless and imprudent driving. Copeland was speeding and driving while intoxicated with a suspended license. Officers also found a glass pipe with ashy residue inside that smelled like marijuana.

Copeland also had a glass pipe with methamphetamine residue and a loaded .22 caliber handgun as well as a baggie of what appeared to be marijuana. Once at the jail, Copeland was found to have a small bag of what appeared to be methamphetamine in his wallet.

Copeland is to serve probation until August 20, 2023.

• James Robert Cummings, of Cassville, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance and escaping from custody while under arrest for a felony in April 2014. Cummings' probation has since been revoked, and he is to serve four years incarceration with the Department of Correc-

On February 26, 2013, Cassville. Officers recovered found property on Harold Street which contained change, substance abuse recovery coins, a prescription bottle containing Norco pills, a cell phone and a wallet belonging to Cum-

Officers found that Cummings had been staying with the person who owned the property inside the bag.

When Cummings was interviewed, he told officers he had planned to get the property later and use the pills inside. Norco is a narcotic schedule III

• Cody Ryan Dobyns, of Blue Eye, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance. Dobyns received a suspended execution of a seven year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections and five years supervised pro-

On July 1, 2016, Dobyns was in a vehicle sitting at the Stubblefield Conservation Area, extremely sweaty. When an officer with the Missouri Department of Conservation asked him what they were doing, Dobyns said hanging out. Dobyns then consented to

a search of the vehicle.

Officers found an Altoids can with methamphetamine inside, a cut straw and marijuana. Officers also found a marijuana pipe in the console cup holder and a methamphetamine pipe.

Dobyns is to serve probation until August 20, 2023.

• Dakota Ray Dunham, of Gerald, pled guilty to sexual misconduct with a child under the age 15 as a first offense in November 2015. Dunham's probation has since been revoked and he is to serve four years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On February 28, 2015, Dunham sent photos of his genitals to a 13 year old female victim through his cell phone.

 Christopher Shawn Fer**guson**, of Joplin, pled guilty to burglary in the second degree in April 2014. Ferguson's probation has since been revoked, and he is to serve 120 days of shock time with the Department of Corrections. His initial sentence was seven years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On June 28, 2013, Ferguson had broken into a garage on Main Street in Cassville with the intention of stealing.

• Christina Marie Gourd, of Joplin, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance, and two counts of delivery of a controlled substance. Gourd received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

On April 12, 2018, officers with the Ozarks Drug Enforcement Team were doing mobile surveillance on Gourd and two others. When officers followed the vehicle to Sunset Heights Road in Cassville, officers watched an exchange between occupants in the car and two other people.

Cassville Police officers then made contact with the vehicle. There were syringes in plain view when officers approached the vehicle.

A probable cause search yielded 56 hydrocodone pills, six fentanyl patches, 66 Diazepam, two sublingual and one morphine pill. Pills were packaged in baggies. There were also 7.6 grams of marijuana, .5 grams of methamphetamine, digital scales, syringes and rolling papers.

Gourd is to serve probation until August 20, 2023.

• Brittany Janelle Henry, of Rogers, Ark., pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance. Henry received a suspended imposition of sentencing and three years supervised probation.

On August 3, 2017, the Cassville Police Department was dispatched for a trespassing call on Old Exeter Road at Walmart.

Henry was on scene and was wanted for a warrant through the Barry County Sheriff's Office. When officers spoke with Henry, she gave them a baggie with two crystals of methamphetamine. She had also been texting a confidential informant regarding selling the substance for money.

Henry is to serve probation until August 20, 201.

• Sean T. Hooten, of Shell Knob, pled guilty to escape from confinement and two counts of harassment in the first degree. Hooten received a suspended execution of a four year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections and five years supervised probation.

In early July 2017, Hooten was arrested for sending inappropriate photos to a victim who had a restraining order out against him. He also sent several voice recordings to the victim, causing her to fear leaving her residence. Hooten sent multiple voice recordings and text messages to the victim as harassment. Hooten was also driving by the victim's residence and place of work in violation of the order of protection.

On July 10, 2017, Hooten attempted to escape from confinement while in the Barry County Jail. Hooten forced open his cell door and ran toward an open pod door. Hooten attempted to gain control of an officer's keys while fighting officers attempting to subdue him.

Two officers had to seek medical treatment for the injuries sustained while trying to gain control of Hooten.

Hooten is to serve probation until August 21, 2023.

· Bradley Max Hufford, **Jr.**, of Seligman, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance and forgery in August 2017. Hufford's probation has since been revoked and he was sentenced to a suspended execution of a seven year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections and five years supervised probation.

On September 19, 2014, Hufford was found to be in possession of dilaudid pills and a syringe of illegal substance.

On June 13, 2015, Hufford had returned merchandise to Tractor Supply in Cassville for a gift card. Hufford forged the name on the receipt as Jerimiah


Hufford is to serve probation until August 22, 2023.



On May 3, 2018, Jacobs took a 2006 Ford Explorer without permission, valued at \$5,100, from a residence on Packer Drive in Shell Knob.

• Lacy J. Jarrett, of Monett, pled guilty to driving while revoked/suspended. Jarrett received a suspended execution of a four year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections and five years supervised probation.

On June 28, 2016, Jarrett was found to be driving when her license was revoked.

Jarrett is to serve probation until August 6, 2023.



The timing of the flu season is often unpredictable, however, the CDC recommends that every person 6 months and older receive the flu vaccine before the end of October.



Rodriguez took the victim's iPhone 6, vehicle key and wallet, containing multiple cards and \$63 in cash.

Officers found Rodriguez to be in possession of the stolen items, but the cash was gone.

• Randall Leonard Roller, of Aurora, pled guilty to two counts of theft/stealing of less than \$500. Roller received a suspended imposition of sentencing and two years unsupervised probation.

On March 9, 2010, the victim filed a stolen cattle report. The victim said he gave Roller \$83,894.70 for cattle he allegedly purchased for him. When the victim went to inspect the cattle in the pasture, there were no cattle. There was a receipt for 318 head of mixed cattle, valued at \$83,894.70 that were never delivered.

On March 1, 2010, another victim filed a reported that Roller had been paid \$115,487.90 for cattle he'd allegedly purchased for him. The receipt showed 289 head of mixed cattle were never delivered. Roller's brother told the victim the cattle had never existed.

Roller is to serve probation until August 20, 2020.

• Tommy Eugene Thornton, of Schell City, pled guilty to property damage in the second degree. Thornton received a suspended imposition of sentencing and two years unsupervised probation.

On April 21, 2015, a burglary was reported at Mo-Ark Livestock Auction in Exeter. Thornton was identified as the one who broke in through security footage. The glass door between the auction ring and cafe had been broken.

Thornton is to serve probation until August 20, 2020.

• Sarena Justinleigh Tucker, of Shell Knob, pled guilty to burglary in the second degree and resisting arrest for a felony in March 2015. Her probation was revoked and she was sentenced to five years incarceration with the Department of Corrections with the execution of that sentence suspended and five years supervised probation.

On June 7, 2014, Tucker and another suspect broke into a residence on East 5th Street in Butterfield through a bedroom window. Once inside, Tucker stole clothing and a jewelry box filled with \$500 of jewelry.

• James Leroy Walls, III, of Eagle Rock, made an Alford plea to burglary in the first degree, three counts of endangering the welfare of a child in the first degree and two counts of abuse of a child. Walls was sentenced to seven years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On December 12, 2017, Walls was holding two women and a three year old child hostage at a residence on Farm Road 2260 in Eagle Rock. There was an order of protection out for the children of that residence, preventing Walls from being near them.

When officers spoke with the females inside, they told them Walls refused to let them leave. They also stated Walls regularly makes threats to one of the women and is abusive. He is also a registered sex offender.

Officers also discovered Walls was abusive to the children in the home by subjecting the children to physical and mental injury by domestic vio-

Officers found the home to be unsanitary with pet feces covering the bathtub, cats getting into food and pet feces smashed into the carpet. There was also no running water for














The children were interviewed and indicated that Walls had hit one of them on the wrists and across the legs with a golf club. He also hit them across the rear end with a belt. They also saw Walls choke their mother and hit her saying he would kill her. Walls also forced their mother to perform sex acts on him while at least one child watched.

• Joel L.M.W. Whisman, of Purdy, pled guilty to resisting arrest for a felony. He was

on probation for theft/stealing of \$500 to \$25,000 in value after pleading guilty in March 2013. Whisman's probation was revoked and he is to serve four years incarceration with the Department of Corrections for all charges.

On January 29, 2012, a report was made to the Barry County Sheriff's Office for a burglary, stealing and property damage. Several firearms and hunting equipment were stolen from a residence on State Highway VV in Verona. Whisman and another suspect were implicated. The guns were found in a storage unit on the south side of the Monett football field.

On February 23, 2018, Whisman fled on foot when officers tried to execute a felony warrant on him at a location on State Highway C in Purdy. Whisman fled on foot and then was eventually located in a vehicle after a short pursuit.

• Dennis Allen Wood, of Washburn, made an Alford plea to endangering the welfare of a child. Wood received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

Between January 1, 2017, and May 1, 2017, Wood duct taped five year old child's hands behind his back, saying that officers 'did not know how [the child] treats me.' There were also approximately 12 to 15 cats in the home and the home was unsanitary, including three litter boxes in the kitchen filled with feces and urine. One of the four minor children in the home had a serious medical condition and the condition put him at risk for an infection.

Wood is to serve probation until August 21, 2023.

• Nicholas Ryan Yokeley, of Monett, pled guilty to theft/ stealing of a credit or debit device and fraudulent use of a credit/debit device of \$500 or more. Yokeley received a suspended imposition of sentencing and three years supervised probation.

Between October 5, 2016, and November 20, 2017, Yokeley had been using the Aaron Rentals company credit card to make purchases. Yokeley had been employed with the company but was terminated in January 2017. Reissued cards were never found and Yokeley and his wife were identified on security footage using the cards for fuel. The fuel charges were \$3,638.63 in November 2017.

Yokeley is to serve probation until August 20, 2021.


City Park is a popular part of town where kids and parents go for an evening activity. The vandalisms on the Purdy community not only affected our school, but a larger part of our community.


Despite the slight humor found within the vandalism with misspelt words and messing up "420," the vandalism of the Purdy community was a huge slap in the face.




