One arrested for pharmacy armed robbery

One man is being held in the Barry County Jail after allegedly committing an armed robbery of the pharmacy in Shell Knob. Chance Henson, 18, of Cassville, was arrested Monday morning shortly after the robbery.

On Monday, October 6, around 10:30 a.m. Henson entered the Shell Knob

Pharmacy on State Highway 39 in the plaza with a pistol, according to an affidavit of probable cause. He demanded narcotics at the pharmacist's counter. Henson got away with an unknown quantity of medications.

According to Chief Deputy Major Leonard Collins, Henson walked into the pharmacy wearing a jacket, sunglasses, a knit cap and a bandana covering his face. Officers with the Barry County Sheriff's Department apprehended Henson when he returned to the pharmacy around 30 minutes later with others to pick up prescriptions. Collins stated, "We found him in front of the pharmacy. He's left and then come back. I guess he didn't think he would be recognized."

Deputies found the cap and jacket that Henson had been wearing at the time of the time in the vehicle he rode back to the pharmacy

Collins said that the Sheriff's Department has not located the pistol that Henson was carrying. He stated, "He claimed that it wasn't a real gun, but we don't know for sure." The pharmacist will be running an inventory check to see how many and what kinds of medications Henson got away with for the investiga-

Henson has a criminal history and had just been released from unsupervised probation prior to this arrest. He pled guilty to excessive blood alcohol content, a misdemeanor, and DWI-Alcohol, a felony, in March of this year from charges stemming form 2012 and 2013.

Henson is charged with Robbery in the first degree and armed criminal action and is being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$75,000 cash-only bond.

Area churches plan 2nd Kindess in Action Day

For the second year, area churches are coming together to do good in the community in the name of Jesus. Congregations of at least six area churches will be working together to do community betterment projects this Sunday.

This year's event will take place on Sunday, October 12, with people meeting between 11 a.m. and 1 p.m. to be assigned their projects. Everyone will work until they get back together between 4:30 and 5 p.m. at Emmanuel Baptist in Cass-

The idea for Kindness in Action Day was inspired by Pastor James Weaver's, of First Baptist of Cassville, experiences in Oklahoma where they did something similar. When he approached the Cassville Ministerial Alliance with the idea to try it here, most churches were enthusiastic about participating.

Last year, around 400 church goers got together to do projects around the community. This year, the churches hope for about the same. Pastor James Weaver, of First Baptist Church of Cassville, stated, "For our church, we use the theme, 'the church has left the building."

This year's projects will have a lot of focus on getting the downtown area ready for the Chili Cook-Off later this month. Weaver said, "We are really focusing on trying to get the City ready for the Chili Cook-Off. We want to spruce up the downtown area by raking gravel and edging the sidewalks and cleaning up. We've got company coming to Cassville, and we want to make sure we look our best."

Other projects will include painting curbs and fire hydrants for the city, painting bleachers at the soccer fields, doing yard work for individuals who need help, and hosting a free car wash at Arvest Bank. This year, some members will even be helping people get their cars ready for winter by testing antifreeze and other things. Weaver said, "If people need to get their cars ready for winter, we will do that." The winterization area will be in the 500 block between West and Townsend.

"We want to get out there and show that Christianity is others-oriented," he said.

Weaver went on to explain the importance of events like Kindness in Action Day. "We do this type of event for two reasons. One, is that we want to demonstrate that Christians can cooperate and work together across denominational lines even when a natural disaster isn't involved."


Weaver went on, "Two, we are demonstrating the love of Jesus Christ in practical ways for free with no strings attached."

First Christian Church Pastor Tom Thomas noted, "What I like about the day is that it is taking the church out of the building to come out and represent Christ through action which is what we are called to do anyway. We are called to represent Christ in a positive, physical way. Instead of people coming out in a judgmental way, we are doing things positively and I think that's a great thing."

Weaver noted that members of the community should know that anyone participating in Kindness in Action Day will be doing work free of charge. Weaver said, "If someone shows up on Sunday wanting to do work and charge you, it is not us. We are not charging one cent for anything we do."


After the event, church members will gather at the Emmanuel Baptist Church to have a cook-out, praise service and share testimonials of the day.

Jaclyn Dees, communication specialist for Dollar General, said the company chose to build a store in Wheaton because the store will meet the needs of many of the people living there. deliver and are honored to be recognized by the March of Dimes for this effort."

This achievement was recognized through a banner from the March of Dimes and Missouri Hospital Association (MHA). The banner, which was recently presented to Cox Monett's Labor and Delivery Department, is displayed on the hospital's first floor.

Cox Medical Center South in Springfield and Cox Medical Center Branson have also both been honored for their efforts to reduce the number of early elective inductions and Cesarean deliveries. Across the CoxHealth system, the number of early elective deliveries is 0%.

A total of 68 birthing hospitals in Missouri were eligible to apply for the honor, according to Trina Ragain, state director of program services, advocacy and government affairs, March of Dimes Missouri Chapter. Ragain said 25 hospitals applied and met the criteria and out of those 25, 19 had an early elective delivery rate of 0%. CoxHealth is the only hospital system in the state to be recognized at all of its birthing hospitals.

CoxHealth has approximately 4,900 births each year at its facilities in Springfield, Branson and Monett.

Babies born just a few weeks early have higher rates of hospitalization and illness

than full-term infants. Recent research by the March of Dimes, the National Institutes of Health and the U.S. Food and Drug Administration found that although the overall threat is small, the risk of death more than doubles for infants born at 37 weeks of pregnancy when compared to babies born at 40 weeks, for all races and ethnicities.

"The last weeks of pregnancy are extremely important. Babies aren't just putting on weight. They are undergoing important development of the brain, lungs and other vital organs," Ragain said. "The March of Dimes commends Cox Monett Hospital for being a champion for babies with their quality improvement ef-

Additionally, of the 46 hospitals, 87 percent now have a "hard stop" policy in place which establishes strict medical guidelines for when a physician may schedule a delivery. Only 35 percent had a hard stop policy in place before the MHA/March of Dimes collaboration began. The policy prohibits doctors from scheduling a delivery - either by induction or cesarean section - before the baby is at a confirmed 39 weeks gestation. The policy applies to non-medically indicated (elective) deliveries only.





Phelps leads Cassville comeback in Homecoming victory

If a movie was made about Cassville's stirring Homecoming victory over Mt. Vernon, it would surely be titled "A River Runs Through It." Sophomore tailback River Phelps led the way with a pair of touchdowns from scrimmage, 116-yards rushing, and a score on a kickoff return as Cassville survived a scare from the one-win Mountaineers on Friday night at Wildcat Stadium.

Leigh Cox, who teamed with Phelps in the backfield, turned in a "Best Supporting Actor" performance with his 114 yards and a touchdown.

Cassville spotted Mt. Vernon an early 6-0 lead when the Mountaineers drove a short field and scored after the Wildcats fumbled in the first minute of play.

Another fumble on the first snap following that touchdown gave the Mountaineers the ball on Cassville's side of midfield, but the visitors coughed up a turnover on second down as the Wildcats dodged an early

It was Cassville's turn to start at midfield, and Gabe Kirk directed an eight-play drive that ended with Phelps bulling into the endzone from four yards out. Kendal Branham's conversion gave the Wildcats a 7-6 lead with 4:44 left on the first-quarter

Mt. Vernon responded with an 80-yard, 15-play drive to retake the lead. A failed two-point conversion left the score at 12-7 in favor of the Mountaineers with 10:09 left in the second quarter, and that score hung on the board as the teams adjourned at halftime.

Cassville kicked off to start the secoxnd half, and then held Mt. Vernon to a

After Ty Boswell's punt died at the Cassville 24-yard line, Gabe Kirk threw long for Cade Pendergraft on second down. The pass hung and fell short, but Pendergraft adjusted and made a remarkable grab for a 44-yard gain to the Mt. Vernon 29yard line.

On second down, Phelps took a quick toss from Kirk and motored through the secondary for a 27-yard score as Cassville regained the lead at 14-12.

Late in the third quarter, the Wildcats appeared to have control when Phelps scored on a 65-yard punt return, but a piece of yellow laundry negated the play. Then on the second play of the fourth quarter, Kirk was intercepted by Mt. Vernon's Payton Oehlschlager.

A one-play drive followed. Garrett Hadlock

threw to Clay Eldridge, and the junior receiver completed a 43-yard catch-and-run to regain the lead for Mt. Vernon at 20-14.

The Mountaineers could not sustain a drive, and Cassville answered with a 56-yard scoring drive. Cox darted off left tackle for a 15-yard score and Cassville's lead grew to 28-20. Then Mt. Vernon fumbled the ensuing kickoff, leading directly to a 23-yard touchdown run by Kirk.

The Wildcat held one more time, and then ran out the clock to preserve the 35-

New Golden Museum addition opened


Walking into the Golden Museum, at any age, or at any time, no matter how many times you've been is exciting. As owner Wilfred Prier says it best, "If you like anything at all, you'll find something you like in here."

The existing museum located at Highway 86 and J in Golden was an impressive sight, especially for a history buff. Now, with the unveiling of the newest 2,700 square foot addition to the building, a bigger treasure chest awaits. The fifth room added to the museum was completed by Tim Kendrick, who took the temporary door off to reveal the newest room of treasures last week. Inside, you'll see collections ranging from Native American artifacts, to the world's largest collection of butter dishes, to fluorescent glassware.

One of the first exhibits when you walks into room number five is a display of bones. Upon closer inspection, you'll notice that the bones are anything but ordinary. Imbedded in each one is an arrowhead. Prier said, "The man who found these spent a lifetime walking the plains of Montana looking for them." Arrowheads struck the animals in nonlethal positions, staying there for years before the animal died.

Continuing through the exhibit, you'll find mineral collections, knives, iron trivets, hammers and more. Among the Native American artifacts that Prier recently acquired from a man in Kansas is one of the most extensive arrowhead collections known. Prier said that he hadn't counted them, but gestured to a box and estimated just the one to be around 10,000. The most recent Native collection was started by the man's grandfather from 1880 to the 1900s. His father added to it until the 1940s or 1950s before he continued the tradition after his father. Prier said, "It's just unbelievable how much they collected over the years."

Prier said the most unique display is also housed in the newest part of the museum. "Our must unusual

display is over 1,300 butter dishes." Prier said that he met the owner of the collection around 20 years ago. Before the men parted ways, Prier said that he would go see the butter dishes if he was ever in the area. Around eight years ago, while visiting the Kansas City area, Prier called him to see the collection, It wasn't until the man passed away in the last couple years that he bought the collection. Prier said, "He told his son that he wanted the butter dishes to go into the museum. The only requirement was that they all had to be displayed, so I told him that we were adding on to the museum and that he could have a whole wall, and that's what we did."

Over the years, many people have parted with their treasures to make their new home the Golden Museum. While some of that is probably part due to the vast displays and uniqueness of the museum, it is also because of the energetic way Prier appreciates each and every item housed in the museum's walls. Every collection has a story, and every piece has history attached to it. Many collectors and their children have shed a tear of joy seeing their prized possessions out

Local Boy Scout honored for saving a boy in danger

Boy Scouts are usually known for their courage, valor and integrity, but occasionally, a boy scout stands out beyond those basic qualities to be truly selfless and brave in an extraordinary way. That is the case with 14 year-old Michael Bernsen, of Shell Knob, who was awarded Medal of Merit Saturday for his quick thinking when another scout was in danger.

Last summer, Bernsen attended Camp Arrowhead in Marshfield with many other scouts. While he was walking on July 11, he noticed another boy who looked ill. Even though he had never met the boy, he sensed something was seriously wrong. Bernsen said, "First, I wanted to know if he was really hurt. When I realized that he was in trouble, I tried to get some of the other kids to help, but when they wouldn't, I knew I had to do something." What happened next landed Bernsen a special award and a lot of gratitude from the boy's troop.

Initially, Bernsen walked with the boy up the hill to get him to help, but things went south quickly. He said, "About half way up the hill, he just hit the ground. So I picked him up and carried him the rest of the way." Bernsen put the boy on his back and trekked up the last of the steep hill to find

adults who could help.

Bernsen's quick response to a fellow scout in danger was crucial to the boy's health. The other scout ended up being transported to the Emergency Room for treatment for severe dehydration and respiratory distress.

When asked, Bernsen said that he did it because it was the right thing to do. "He needed help, and when no one else would listen, I just did what I could."

Bernsen was honored at a ceremony on Saturday, October 4, at Crowder College in Cassville. Debbie Cash, the District Advancement Chair, presented Bernsen with a Medal of Merit in front of many other district scout troops and his parents. At camp, Bernsen was also awarded the Scouting Excellence Award for his quick actions.

Michael's mother, Kathy, stated, "We're extremely proud of him. I wasn't surprised about what he'd done because he's a really compassionate person. It's just in his nature to do something like that."

His father, Jerry, said

that Michael comes from a long line of scouts and that the values they instill are important to their family. "His grandfather had the highest honor that a scout can have."

Bernsen is the senior patrol leader for Troop 185 which is sponsored by the First Baptist Church of Cassville. This is Bernsen's seventh year as a boy scout, and he has no plans on leaving the scouts any time soon.

Cassville City clean-up next week

The City of Cassville's annual fall clean-up will be held October 13 through 17. Republic Services will accept additional household waste and large items on regular collection days.

The following items will be accepted at the curb: barbecue grills; patio furniture; outdoor furniture; sofas; dressers; loveseats; recliners; desks; televisions; bundled guttering; beds, including hide-a-beds, mattresses and box springs; wood pallets; waste from small remodeling or wood projects, materials must be cut into four-foot sections and stacked; sinks; toilets; cabinets; vanities; carpet that is cut into four-foot lengths and bundled; fencing that is cut into four-foot lengths; and bicycles.

Republic Services will not accept tires, yard waste, large quantities of ash, dead animals, raw sewage, waste oil, hazardous materials, wet paint containers, chemicals, flammable substances, lead or acid batteries or waste from large remodeling or construction projects.

They are again offering this year for Cassville residents who want to dis-

pose of large appliances and metal.

One option will be to take only metal or large appliances to a dumpster located at 503 Mill Street. This is across the street from the Barry County Sheriff's Office. This option is free.

The other option will be to have Cassville residents set at their curb side large appliances for Republic Services to collect. There is a \$15 fee. Residents must pay the fee to Republic Services in order to schedule the pick-up of the appliance. The following large appliances will be accepted after the \$15 fee has been paid: dishwashers; washing machines; dryers; hot water heaters; and stoves. Republic Services will also accept refrigerators, freezers and air conditioners that display a tag from a licensed technician proving that all freon has been removed from the item.

Yard waste will be accepted as normal at the yard waste facility behind the Cassville Aquatic Park.

Delicious, all-natural cooking found at Nonna's Nummies

Nonna's Nummies is found on top of a hill in a cheerful yellow building that could almost resemble the gingerbread house from "Hansel and Gretel." Here, Kelly Prohaska whips up deliciously different meals for customers seeking an extraordinary eating experience. She takes pride in the fact that almost all of the food she serves is homemade.

Prohaska, 25, who owns Nonna's Nummies along with her mother, Donna Lombreglia, started her restaurant in March 2012 after graduating from college with a degree in special education. Lombreglia had retired to Shell Knob, so Prohaska decided to follow her. However, according to Prohaska, there was little need for her degree in the area, so they decided to start the restaurant together.

The decision to open a restaurant was not one made lightly. Lombreglia at one time had owned her own gift shop, and Prohaska grew up helping her with it, an experience she said she enjoyed. "I remember working with her from the time I was little and loving it," Prohaska said.

Additionally, Prohaska had a background in running a business from when she had her own baby sit-

ting service and also held a number of jobs that trained her in leadership. "I've held a lot of management positions in places that I've worked," she said.

So why is the restaurant called Nonna's Nummies? Prohaska says the name is a tribute to her mother. "She always had the nickname Nonna, which is Italian for 'grandmother.' And my brother and I, when we were younger, couldn't say 'yummies,' we said 'nummies."

Prohaska and Lombreglia are a team, with Prohaska handling the cooking while Lombreglia bakes a variety of cakes, cookie cakes and other treats. "I'm a great cook," Prohaska said, "but I'm a terrible baker, and she's a phenomenal baker."

For lunch, the restaurant has a variety of hot and cold sandwiches, burgers, pizzas, soups, chili and salads. For dessert, there are ice cream, smoothies, baked goods

and sundaes. They also have a special take on the banana split called "The Banana Boat." This decadent treat includes hot fudge, caramel, butterscotch, Butterfingers, Oreos, M&Ms, peanuts, strawberry topping and sprinkles.

On Friday and Saturday evenings, Nonna's Nummies has entrees, which Prohaksa says changes each week. "We feature different dinner entrees every weekend. Our specialty is our traditional Italian, however, we do mix it up with Mexican and Americana cuisines that are just as delicious." Prohaska announces what her weekend entrees will be each week, usually by Thursday, via Facebook. The restaurant also serves breakfast on Sunday morn-

While Prohaska and Lombreglia strive to create tasty food, they also try to make it as healthy as possible. For instance, they only use unprocessed meat in their food, and Lombreglia doesn't use shortening or margarine in her baked goods, only butter. Also, they make their own ice cream using milk, cream and fresh fruits that contain no preservatives. Said Prohaska, "We're a more allnatural approach."

Nonna's Nummies is in its third season, and Prohaska still loves it. "I take a lot of pride in what I do here," she said. "I'm always so excited to share my cooking with whomever is willing to stop on by. I think it's time for people to taste the difference that homemade makes."

Nonna's Nummies is lo-

cated in Shell Knob at the corner of Highway 39 and Lake Road 39.5, on the west side of the highway. Currently, the restaurant's hours are Thursday through Saturday, 11 a.m. to 9 p.m. and

Barry County Courts send 11 to prison in September

• Keith A. Antle, of Washburn, had his probation revoked for seven different charges ranging from 2007 to 2014. He was charged with possession of a chemical with the intent to manufacture a controlled substance in 2007, operating a motor vehicle while his license was revoked in 2011, resisting arrest for a felony in 2012, theft/stealing of \$500 to \$25,000 in 2012, assault in the 2nd degree in 2012, burglary in the 1st degree in 2014, and tampering with a motor vehicle in the 1st degree in 2014. He was sentenced to five years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

Antle's original possession charge stemmed from December 2010 when he was found purchasing Drano, coffee filters, lithium batteries and heat packs at the Walmart in Cassville. He was then found driving with his license suspended in January 2011.

While officers with the Barry County Sheriff's Department were investigating a crime in Washburn, Antle gave his brother's name to try to conceal his identity. Then he fought with deputies and had to be physically restrained to be taken into custody.

On June 6, 2012, Antle was confronted while at Walmart in Cassville when he tried to leave the store with a TV and several DVDs without paying for them. After a struggle, he released the TV but left with 15 DVDs. Officers tracked down the license plate number of the car. He pled guilty to all of the aforementioned charges in November 2012, and he was placed on probation.

On October 23, 2012, Antle attacked another inmate while in the Barry County Jail, breaking the victim's jaw where he needed corrective surgery. The attack was unprovoked. Antle pled guilty to that crime in June 2013.

In January 2013, Antle entered into a building in Washburn to steal car keys to a 2009 Honda that did not belong to him. Antle pled guilty to that crime on September 16, 2014.

• Maria L. Barrientos, Monett, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance. She was given a suspended imposition of sentencing and is to serve 100 hours of community service by September 15, 2016, and will serve five years supervised probation.

During a narcotics investigation on November 21, 2013, officers with the Monett Police Department went to Barrientos' residence on North Kyler regarding possible drugs on the premises. During the search, officers found a digital scale, glass pipes, methamphetamine and hydrocodone in her home where she lived with three children.

Barrientos will serve probation until September 15,

• Robert Charles Boyd, III, Cassville, pled guilty to DWI-Alcohol as a persistent offender. He was given a suspended execution of a three year sentence and is to serve 480 hours of community service on or before September 14, 2017, and supervised probation for five years.

On March 29, 2014, officers with the Cassville Police Department pulled Boyd over for suspicion of driving while intoxicated. When Boyd exited the car, he fell to the ground. He refused to take a field sobriety test, but consented to a breathalyzer test. Boyd's blood alcohol level was 0.200 percent. He also had three prior DWIs in 2012 and 2013 as well as multiple traffic violations.

Boyd is to serve probation until September 15, 2019.

• Douglas Wayne Brattin, Cassville, pled guilty to unlawful use of a weapon. He was given a suspended execution of a four year incarceration

sentence and supervised probation for five years.

Brattin was originally arrested on May 2, 2011, when officers with the Barry County Sheriff's Department were dispatched to Purdy for a drunk driver with a gun. Brattin told the victim that he was going to kill him and aimed a .22 caliber rifle out of his vehicle. Brattin had a blood alcohol content of 0.138 percent when officers arrived.

Brattin is to serve probation until September 15, 2019.

• Ronald Wayne Breland II, of Lowell, Ark., made an Alford plea to assault in the 2nd degree. Breland was given a suspended imposition of sentence, 100 hours of community service to be completed before September 15, 2015, and three years supervised probation.

Breland admitted to having sexual intercourse with a 16 year-old girl twice when he was 22 years-old.

Breland is to serve probation until September 15, 2017.

• Dakotah Gene Crown, Springfield, pled guilty to sexual assault. He was given a suspended execution of a seven year incarceration sentence with five years supervised probation and he must comply with all standards and conditions for sexual offenders.

Crown is to serve supervised probation until September 29, 2019.

• Jeremy Michael Danzer, Cassville, pled guilty to one count of theft/stealing of \$500 to \$25,000 and made an Alford plea to a separate theft/ stealing of \$500 to \$25,000 charge. Danzer was originally sentenced to probation on each charge in 2013 and 2014 respectively. His probation has since been revoked. He is to serve three years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

Danzer's original theft charge stemmed from a chain saw stolen from the Monett Police Department. Officers with Monett were investigating the incident when they found the chain saw in the car Danzer was riding in with three other people. They had stolen it as a group.

On December 27, 2013, officers were investigating ste-



reo equipment stolen from a storage area on Cleveland in Monett. Officers found the stereo equipment at a residence on Woodland Ridge. Danzer traded the stereo for a 1989 Nissan truck.

• Stoney Wayne Fair, Seligman, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance and possession of a chemical with the intent to manufacture a controlled substance. He received a suspended imposition of a sentence, 100 hours of community service by September 15, 2015, and five years supervised probation.

On April 7, 2014, Fair was found to have a plastic syringe, spoon, and many small baggies that field-tested positive for methamphetamine. He also had lithium batteries, a coffee filter and aluminum foil.

- Davie A. Gallion, Harrison, Ark., pled guilty in 2011 to a sexual assault charge from 2007. He is to serve supervised probation until September 24, 2019.
- Larry S. Gilbert, Monett, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance in 2013. His probation has since been revoked and he is to serve 120 days shock incarceration.

Gilbert was originally arrested when he was found to be in possession of Fentanyl patches and syringes on December 21, 2010. He admitted to cutting the patches with apple juice and injecting them.

• Jason Henry, Berryville, Ark., pled guilty to possession of a chemical with the intent to manufacture a controlled substance. He received two years incarceration.

On July 28, 2014, Henry and others were in a vehicle at Walmart in Cassville engaging

in suspicious behavior. Henry walked into a field where officers lost sight of him. They found a bag of lithium batteries near Henry in the field. The other people in the vehicle had pseudoephedrine and other precursors for manufacturing methamphetamine.

• Ashley Hilburn, Pierce City, pled guilty to theft/stealing of \$500 or 25,000, and possession of a controlled substance. She was given a suspended imposition of sentence, 100 hours of community service, restitution, and supervised probation for five years.

Hilburn forged multiple checks on bank accounts in October and November 2013. Then, on February 2, 2014, it was reported that personal checks, cash, jewelry and a credit card were missing from the victim's home in Exeter. One of his checks was found in Hilburn's vehicle along with pills and a Fentanyl patch.

She is to serve probation until September 15, 2019.

• Troy Lynn Hinkle, Cassville, made an Alford plea for shooting a firearm from a motor vehicle as a 1st offense. He received a suspended execution of a six year incarceration sentence and he is to serve supervised probation for five vears

On August 26, 2013, Hinkle was in a vehicle in Monett with three other men. He fired a handgun from the car at children playing in their backyard and then at a jogger on the road. Hinkle was found to have a blood alcohol level of 0.15 percent.

Hinkle is to serve probation until September 15, 2019.

• Lonny J. Hopkins, Exeter, pled guilty to three counts of theft/stealing of \$500 to \$25,000. He received a suspended imposition of sentencing, 100 hours of community service by September 15, 2015, restitution of \$265 and supervised probation for five years.

On December 16, 2013, Hopkins stole a two piece wedding ring set from his step grandparents' residence. The rings were valued at \$750.

Hopkins is to serve probation until September 15, 2019.

• Steven Bradley Hunter, Cassville, pled guilty to assault in the 2nd degree. He was given a suspended execution of a three year incarceration sentence, five years supervised probation and was ordered to pay restitution.

On July 4, 2013, Hunter and two other men stopped someone at the Washburn Prairie Cemetery. The victim was punched, kicked and stomped before blacking out.

Hunter is to serve probation until September 15, 2019.

• John Frederick Johnson, Springfield, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance and was give a suspended imposition of sentencing with 100 hours of community service by September 14, 2016, and supervised probation for five years.

On February 11, 2014, Washburn Officer Terry Burgess stopped a vehicle on Highway 37. Johnson was taken into custody for having a warrant out of Polk County. Johnson had two baggies of methamphetamine in his shirt pocket.

Johnson is to serve probation until September 15, 2019.

• Samantha Ray Johnson, Monett, pled guilty to resisting arrest for a felony and possession of a controlled substance. Johnson was sentence to three years incarceration.

On June 24, 1014, Johnson was found acting suspiciously near Bond and 2nd Street in Monett. When asked, Johnson gave a fake name. When officers located her in the records system, she was found to have several active warrants for her arrest. Johnson ran from offi-

cers. When she was arrested, she had three syringes as well as methamphetamine.

• Preston Levi Kovanda, Exeter, pled guilty to burglary in the 1st degree and theft/ stealing of \$500 to \$25,000. He was sentenced to eights years incarceration on those charges. He was also charged with five counts of forgery for which he was sentenced to seven years incarceration.

On February 2, 2014, Kovanda and Megan Homewood forced entry into a home on Farm Road 1085 in Exeter. They stole several items from the garage including food and tools. The two left the home when the homeowner drew a gun on them. On February 18, the residence of Homewood and Kovanda was searched and the items from the victim's home were found.

On February 15, 2014, Kovanda and Homewood passed three stolen checks at Walmart in Monett and another written to Kovanda. The checks had been drawn on Homewood's mother who was incapacitated and undergoing cancer treatments at the time.

Red Rose Healthcare changes ownership, name

Red Rose Healthcare and Rehab Services of Cassville is under new ownership. As of October 1, the 30-year old facility officially came under the ownership of Health Mark Services of Van Buren, Ark., and is now Roaring River Healthcare and Rehab (RRHR).

According to Russ Newby, the facility's administrator, the new ownership will mean a lot of positive changes for residents. "It's a new beginning," he said. "There will be more staff, the building will be remodeled, and there will be new landscaping out front."

Melissa Inman, dietary manager, says residents will also see a change in the meal choices available to them, including a menu service that will be geared more to individual tastes. "This is their home," she said, "and when you are at home, you eat what you want."

Newby said that RRHR will continue to hold the activities that were hosted by Red Rose, including the Easter Egg Hunt, the Pig Kissing Contest, and the upcoming Trail of Treats at Halloween. "It's a tradition for us," he said.

Erin Newton, activities director, added that residents will continue to participate in activities outside of the building. "We're going to the corn maze this month," she said.

Newby also mentioned that RRHR will continue to provide all the services previously offered by Red Rose. "We are still a skilled nursing facility," he said.


