## Davis to be Barry County's Sheriff in 2017

It was smiles and handshakes between opposing Barry County Sheriff candidates Gary Davis and Justin "Dave" Ruark after the votes were read on the courthouse steps last night. Both congratulated each other and Ruark took the time to introduce each of his children to Davis, a refreshing take on elections.

Davis took the Barry County Sheriff's with race 70.68 percent of the vote. Ruark earned 29.02 percent of the vote, and less than a percent going to write in votes. Overall, Davis had 10,218 votes and Ruark took 4,195.

Davis ran his campaign on the platform of reform

and reevaluation of the current way the Sheriff's Office operates. Ruark ran on the platform of experience in the department itself and his background in Barry County. Both looked to tackle drug problems as their main objective if elected. Davis also carried with him an impressive background of service in the FBI that dominated his campaign.

After his win, Davis said he is going to take down campaign signs and clean up today, but the rest of the week, he is taking off. He said, "Next week, I'm going down there [the Sheriff's Department] and seeing what I've got, see what I've won department-wise. I

already have a memo put up on the bulletin board that says if you're doing your job, you've got a job. I don't want anyone worrying that they've got a new sheriff and now they're going to lose their job.

"There has been concerns about that throughout the election. I've tried to send the word about that."

Davis continued, "I think the thing that excited me the most is it was a pretty substantial win. It encouraged me that the people of Barry County bought into what I was saying we need to do with law enforcement in Barry County. They're ready to move forward. It's not going to happen overnight."

## Wheaton Fire's Bob Lombard honored for 50 years as chief

This weekend, Wheaton and the surrounding communities got together to celebrate the accomplishments of a prolific figurehead for the Wheaton Fire Department. This year, Chief Bob Lombard marks his 50th year as chief of the district and 60th year fighting fires for the

department.

Bob said, "I decided to join when I was 18, just out of high school and I joined the fire department. Then, ten years of that and the last 50, I've been chief." Lombard graduated in 1957 from Wheaton High School.

To those who know Bob, whether they volunteer with the department or just know him through the community, he is an awe-inspiring man, always leading, just as a chief should do. His son Lindy Lombard said he stepped in to volunteer because of seeing his

dad in that role. He said, "I watched my dad volunteer all of his time and service to the community. It was what I saw in my dad and others around town, and I thought, I want to continue this myself. I grew up watching him and hope to continue until the day I die."

When Bob began with the department, the district was run by dues paid by members in the community. Over time, that changed. Citizens voted to change to a protection district, funded by tax dollars. While it's easier to get the training and equipment Bob insists his volunteers have, it's still not simple.

Larry Prewitt, a volunteer with the department from 1981 to 1996 and current chairman of the fire protection board, said training was always paramount to Bob's vision and operation. He said, "He stresses training, training, training, and there are hundreds of classes out there to go to and now that I'm on the board, I'm following his footsteps. I want the guys to do the training and learn the trucks and the equipment so it's second hand to do it."

When the department operated through dues paid, it was more of a challenge, but Bob never let people's

## Barry County voter turnout over 70 percent

Barry County voters turned out in record numbers on Tuesday to the polls. This year, over 70 percent of registered voters in Barry County cast their ballots in the November 8 General Election. In total, 14,830 cards were cast in this election, with 20,445 registered voters in all.

Voters in Barry County continued to support conservative, Republican candidates and conservative ballot initiatives. In the Presidential race, Barry County voters heavily favored Donald Trump with 77.67 percent of the vote. Hillary Clinton earned 18.42 percent of the vote and each of the third parties on the ballot earned less than one percent each. Overall, Missouri's split was approximately 57 percent Trump and 38 percent Clinton.

In every state-wide race, voters supported the Republican candidates running in those positions. Missouri, as a whole, supported Republican candidates, favoring incumbents U.S. Representative Billy Long and Senator Roy Blunt, as well as new governor Eric Greitens. Barry County voters sided with those candidates, as well as all other Republicans running for office.

In the Amendments and propositions, Barry County's voters continued to side with the state.

### Amendment 1

Local voters favored Amendment 1, the continuation of the Missouri State Parks sales tax, with a 78 percent favor. Statewide, approximately 80 percent of voters opted to keep the sales tax to fund State Parks.

### Amendment 2

State-wide and local voters also voted in favor of Amendment 2. Barry County's voters leaned 66 percent in favor of the measure which establishes limits on campaign contributions for candidates running for state or judicial positions, as well as prohibiting intentionally concealing the source of contributions. Missouri voters favored Amendment 2 with a 70 percent majority.

### Amendment 3

Voters turned down Amendment 3, which would have increased sales tax on certain brands of cigarettes to raise funds for a new Early Childhood Health and Education Trust Fund. Barry County voters opposed the amendment with a 66 percent majority. State-wide, voters turned it down with 59 percent.

## Wheaton man charged with assault after alleged violent outburst

A Wheaton man is in custody charged with endangering the welfare of a child in the first degree and domestic assault in the first degree after a violent outburst. According to affidavits of probable cause, Thomas Goodin Wade, 49, of Wheaton, attacked a victim while intoxicated, striking her in the face with a shotgun.

The Barry County Sheriff's Department responded to a residence on Davidson in Wheaton on Saturday, November 5. Deputy Kerry Headrick reported that Wade destroyed several items in the home and chased an 11 year old child through the yard until he hid at a neighbor's residence in fear.

Then, Wade allegedly struck another victim in the face with the stock of a shotgun, causing her mouth to bleed. He also reportedly forced the victim onto their bed and onto broken glass, causing a laceration on her thigh.

The victim also claimed Wade kicked the front door in, hitting her, pulled her up by her hair and hit her in the head with a piece of door frame before she blacked out. Wade had been drinking for approximately seven hours when this all occurred, according to the probable cause.

Wade is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$75,000 cash-only bond. Headrick reported he has a prior criminal history.

### SHERIFF from FRONT

After the win, Davis and Ruark spoke candidly and kindly to one another. Davis said, "He asked me if he still had a job, and I looked him in the eye and asked if he was doing his job. He said yes and I said, then you've got a job."

Ruark congratulated Davis on his win. In a Facebook post, he added, "I may have lost this battle but I am still in the war. I still plan on doing what I have said all summer long about attacking the drug problem we face. I am not going to let this slow me down. If anything I will try harder to show those who doubt me."

He added that he plans to run again in four years.

Davis will replace Barry County Sheriff Mick Epperly as of January 1, 2017. Epperly has served as Sheriff for five terms, which equates to 20 years as Sheriff and 28 total years in law enforcement.



If you have an appliance needing hook-up, or a bed which needs assembly, we charge an additional \$29.00 for same. Oh! and by the way, we deliver to Springfield for \$69.00.





**Amendment 4**

Amendment 4 passed across the state with a 57 percent majority. Barry County voters favored it with 62 percent supporting it. Amendment 4 prohibits new sales taxes being established on goods or services that was not subjected to sales tax before.

**Amendment 6**

Voters across the state threw favor for Amendment 6, which will require photo IDs to vote in future elections. It also states the State of Missouri will pay for citizens to acquire photo IDs if

they do not have them. Barry County voters were 74 percent in favor. Missouri voters, as a whole, supported it with 63 percent majority.

**Proposition A**

Finally, voters across the state also struck down Proposition A, which was another cigarette tax. Local voters turned that vote down with 63 percent against, and state voters were at 55 percent.

As far as stepping down from his post? Bob said he isn't there yet. He said, "There is still a lot to do. I would like to see a new station before that."

Bob's son Lindy, both of his grandsons, Stuart and Taylor, all work in the service field, helping people.

The giving heart of service was passed on through the generations. Lindy has been volunteering with Wheaton Fire Department for 40 years, Stuart for 17 years and Taylor for 7 years.

Stuart is also a dispatcher with Barry County E9-1-1 and a reserve deputy with the Barry County Sheriff's Department. Taylor is a Barry County Sheriff's Deputy.

Lindy said that spirit from his father has passed down through himself and his sons. He said, "He is definitely my hero."

# Cassville School Board approves bond refunding saving \$1M

At the October meeting of the Cassville R-IV School District Board of Education on October 13, 2016, a Refunding Bond Resolution was approved that established a final terms committee consisting of John Sullivan, Board President Jon Horner, Board Treasurer; Dr. Richard Asbill, Superintendent of Schools; and Larry J. Hart, President and CEO of L.J. Hart & Company, for the purpose of setting the interest rates on the refunding bonds once the Standard & Poor's Corporation rating became

available.

On October 25, 2016, the final terms committee was able to lock in the interest rates to "refinance" the 2014 bonds; the \$4,000,000 General Obligation Refunding Bonds achieved an average of about 2.47%, compared to the remaining Series 2014 Bonds which carry an average interest rate of approximately 4.33%.

The District was able to move quickly when the very strong municipal bond market became enhanced by "Brexit," which is the acronym describing the

vote of the United Kingdom to withdraw from the European Common Market. The District reduces the future interest expense by about \$1,000,892 and shortens the final repayment period by two full years from the original Series 2014 Bonds. Dr. Asbill expressed enthusiasm and support for the refunding option selected by the Board of Education. "This plan achieves good savings, and provides an opportunity for the District to plan and meet the future fiscal needs of the District. In addition, the strategic planning allows the Cassville School District to be in a better situation to present no tax increase building proposals when needed to our patrons," Dr. Asbill remarked.

The Board President, Mr. Sullivan, pointed out that the \$1,000,892 of interest savings for the Series 2016 refunding is not all the District may realize due to

the Series 2016 Refunding Bonds having a call feature in March 1, 2021, at no penalty. "If interest rates are lower in 2021 or later, we can take advantage of that. Meanwhile, we are locking in these levels that are almost two percent (1.86%) lower than they were in 2014," stated Mr. Sullivan. L.J. Hart & Company of St. Louis prepared the refunding proposal and Brad M. Wegman, Vice President of the firm, explained how it can fit into the long range plans of the District. Mr. Wegman mentioned that the three significant factors making the Series 2016 refunding possible were the lower interest rates than in 2014, the fact that the entire \$4,000,000 of the Series 2014 Bonds are subject to prepayment on March 1, 2019, and prepay the callable Series 2014 Bonds on March 1, 2019. The Series 2016 Refunding Bonds were underwritten by L.J. Hart & Company. The Security Bank of Southwest Missouri acquired \$360,000, First State Bank of Purdy purchased \$1,380,000, and UMB Bank, N.A. bought \$445,000 of the bonds to support the District,

it possible for the District to receive an "AA+" rating from Standard & Poor's Corporation on the refunding bonds. Mr. Wegman complimented Dr. Asbill for his prompt and thorough preparations to supply the data necessary for the rating application and official statement, as well as the Board of Education for their foresight in making the Series 2014 callable in five years.

The Proceeds from the Series 2016 Refunding Bonds will be placed in an escrow account with the UMB Bank, N.A. and reinvested in U.S. Treasury Securities. The earnings from this escrow account meet the interest payments on the Series 2016 Refunding Bonds through March 1, 2019, and prepay the callable Series 2014 Bonds on March 1, 2019. The Series 2016 Refunding Bonds were underwritten by L.J. Hart & Company. The Security Bank of Southwest Missouri acquired \$360,000, First State Bank of Purdy purchased \$1,380,000, and UMB Bank, N.A. bought \$445,000 of the bonds to support the District, according to L.J. Hart & Company. The closing for the Series 2016 Refunding Bond issue is to occur on November 30, 2016.

Dr. Asbill commended the board of education members and L.J. Hart & Company for acting on the local patrons behalf and approving the attractive refunding plan. "Our Board of Education members are committed to making sure that Cassville School District continues to be progressive and strategic in meeting the needs of our teachers, students, and patrons," said Dr. Asbill. "It is nice to be able to save our local patrons just over one million dollars (\$1,000,892) of our taxpayers' money for the Series 2016 Bonds and shorten the length of the financing by two full years, while also receiving strong local support from the community banks," commented Becky Henningson, Vice President of the Board of Education. The legal documents to complete the issuance of the bonds were prepared by Lori Lea Shelley, Esq. of Mickes O'Toole LLC in its role as bond counsel for the District.

## USATF 15K National Masters Championships & the Bass Pro Outdoor Fitness Festival

I have always been interested in the Tulsa Run. A longtime midwest classic road race, this 15K winds throughout metro Tulsa on a flat and fast course, but punishes runners with a long uphill finish into the heart of the downtown district. But, for one reason or another, I never entered the race.

Late last summer, I learned that the USATF 15K National Masters Championships would be held in conjunction with the Tulsa race on October 29. I was immediately intrigued, not with any ideas of winning or even placing, I know my limitations. But just one time, I wanted to line up and rub elbows with the very best of

the American masters scene. I entered.

I have accumulated a variety of single-age state records over the years, none of them worthy of a high national ranking. My 50-mile record is pretty safe, but only because most folks over 55 don't willingly pursue near-death experiences.

At Tulsa, I would be running - er, starting - with the legends of the game, defending national champions, national record holders, and just all-around studs. These are guys and gals who appear on the covers of Runners World and Sports Illustrated. I occasionally get a line in an article in this newspaper, but only if I write it myself. I was just hoping for a per-

sonal best for my current age-group, but the hills, and especially that hill at the end, put even that conservative goal in doubt.

The field included Brian Pilcher, who recently set a national 60-64 age-group marathon record with a 2:42 and change at Chicago. Pilcher is the rock star of the older masters division. He doesn't look 60 and he runs faster than most 20-somethings. When he was a 20-something, he ran a 14-minute 5K and has never let up. This guy is the perfect combination of genetics, training, and a superior mindset.

He is my age.

I tried not to be intimidated during warmups, even though I had the slow-

est seeded time in my division. The problem was the weather. It was warm. Too warm for late October. The runners from New York were in shock. When they flew out of Syracuse on Friday, it was snowing.

A bigger problem was the persistent wind. A strong southerly breeze was punctuated by gusts of 25-30 mph. Several of the long straightaways on the race course would lead us into the teeth of that wind and some of them were uphill.

The gun fired and we headed south off the hill that is downtown Tulsa. The first mile was fast, too fast. Miles 2 through 7 all featured significant hills and long inclines, wearing on the wind-embattled runners. The

eighth mile, the only runner-friendly mile since the opening charge, led us west across the river, north on Southwest Boulevard, and east back across the water.

The killer hill awaited, 1.3 miles of hell. At Drury, I finished that 15K with a sub-7 minute mile. But climbing up 12th Street and then Boston was a different task. My last mile registered on my Garmin as 7:59.

I finished 9th in my division, running 1:08:13.

Pilcher struggled on the hills too, falling over a minute short of his national record goal.

The hero of the day? Libby James of Fort Collins, CO. At age 80, James smashed the national age-group record by almost four minutes, finishing in 1:25:09.

You don't realize the meaning of "national class" or "world class" until you actually compete against those gifted athletes. It gives you a greater respect for them and the sport, and lets you know exactly where you fit in the big picture.

Bass Pro Outdoor Fitness Festival

This annual gathering at Springfield saw over 2500 runners competing at the 5K, half marathon, and marathon distances. Held on Sunday, November 6, this monumental undertaking requires an army of volunteers and police officers to close down city streets, regulate traffic, and provide necessary services to runners and spectators.

A number of area runners competed in the various races.

The Newsleader 5K had 987 finishers.

Brian Walsh of Cassville won the men's 65-69 age group and finished 21st overall with an excellent time of 21:21. Using the USATF age-graded tables, Walsh's time graded out at 80.04%, meeting the "nationally ranked" level of performance.

Josie Stubblefield placed 2nd in the women's 50-54 group with her 27:26 performance.

The Cohick Half Marathon boasted the largest field of runners, with 1219 finishers.

Lee Stubblefield finished 29th overall, and won the men's 60-64 age group in 1:34:18.

Trenton and Allison Patton finished together in 1:51:31 and 1:51:32.

Daron Evans finished 17th in the men's 45-49 division in 1:53:31.

Amanda Winfrey, Mercy's running doctor, was 25th in the women's 30-34 group, running 1:57:27.

Charles Bishop of Washburn placed 54th in the men's 35-39 division, clocking 2:23:25.

Max and Emily Akers finished together in 2:38:33.

Carmen Stehlík did not wait for Brice. She finished in 2:56:13. He ran 2:59:19.

Jill and Victoria LeCompte finished together in 3:37:12.

The Conservation Marathon had 319 finishers.

David Giles of Aurora won the men's 60-64 division and placed 45th overall, posting a time of 3:41:50 over the 26.2 mile single-loop course.

# Barry County FSA acreage reporting dates for 2017

Barry County USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA) Executive Director Brian Blount announced that producers who file accurate and timely reports for all crops and land uses, including failed acreage, can prevent the potential loss of FSA program benefits. Please pay close attention to the acreage reporting dates below for 2017.

"In order to comply with FSA program eligibility requirements, all producers are encouraged to visit the Barry County FSA office to file an accurate crop certification report by the applicable deadline," said Blount.

The following acreage reporting dates are applicable for Barry County:

November 15, 2016: grass certification  
December 15, 2016: fall barley, fall wheat & all other fall-seeded small grains

January 15, 2017: apples, grapes & peaches

May 15, 2017: spring oats & potatoes

July 15, 2017: CRP, burley tobacco, corn, cotton, grain sorghum, hybrid corn seed, popcorn, rice, soybeans and all other crops.

The following exceptions apply to the

above acreage reporting dates:

If the crop has not been planted by the above acreage reporting date, then the acreage must be reported no later than 15 calendar days after planting is completed.

If a producer acquires additional acreage after the above acreage reporting date, then the acreage must be reported no later than 40 calendar days after purchase or acquiring the lease. Appropriate documentation must be provided to the county office.

If a perennial forage crop is reported with the intended use of "cover only," "green manure," "left standing," or "seed" then the acreage must be reported by July 15th.

According to Blount, Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program (NAP) policy holders should note that the acreage reporting date for NAP covered crops is the earlier of the dates listed above or 15 calendar days before grazing or harvesting of the crop begins.

# IRS releases W-2, 1099 change

The Internal Revenue Service reminded employers and small businesses of a new Jan. 31 filing deadline for Forms W-2. The IRS must also hold some refunds until Feb. 15.

A new federal law, aimed at making it easier for the IRS to detect and prevent refund fraud, will accelerate the W-2 filing deadline for employers to Jan. 31. For similar reasons, the new law also requires the IRS to hold refunds involving two key refundable tax credits until at least Feb. 15. Here are details on each of these key dates.

## New Jan. 31 Deadline for Employers

The Protecting Americans from Tax Hikes (PATH) Act, enacted last December, includes a new requirement for employers. They are now required to file their copies of Form W-2, submitted to the Social Security Administration, by Jan. 31. The new Jan. 31 filing deadline also applies to certain Forms 1099-MISC reporting non-employee compensation such as payments to independent contractors.

In the past, employers typically had until the end of February, if filing on paper, or the end of March,

if filing electronically, to submit their copies of these forms. In addition, there are changes in requesting an extension to file the Form W-2. Only one 30-day extension to file Form W-2 is available and this extension is not automatic. If an extension is necessary, a Form 8809 Application for Extension of Time to File Information Returns must be completed as soon as you know an extension is necessary, but by January 31. Please carefully review the instructions for Form 8809, for more information.

"As tax season approaches, the IRS wants to be sure employers, especially smaller businesses, are aware of these new deadlines," said IRS Commissioner John Koskinen. "We are working with the payroll community and other partners to share this information widely."

The new accelerated deadline will help the IRS improve its efforts to spot errors on returns filed by taxpayers. Having these W-2s and 1099s earlier will make it easier for the IRS to verify the legitimacy of tax returns and properly issue refunds to taxpayers eligible to receive them. In many instances, this will

enable the IRS to release tax refunds more quickly than in the past.

The Jan. 31 deadline has long applied to employers furnishing copies of these forms to their employees and that date remains unchanged.

## Some Refunds Delayed Until at Least Feb. 15

Due to the PATH Act change, some people will get their refunds a little later. The new law requires the IRS to hold the refund for any tax return claiming either the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) or Additional Child Tax Credit (ACTC) until Feb. 15. By law, the IRS must hold the entire refund, not just the portion related to the EITC or ACTC.

Even with this change, taxpayers should file their returns as they normally do. Whether or not claiming the EITC or ACTC, the IRS cautions taxpayers not to count on getting a refund by a certain date, especially when making major purchases or paying other financial obligations. Though the IRS issues more than nine out of 10 refunds in less than 21 days, some returns are held for further review.


