# Cassville man federally indicted on child sex charges

A Cassville man who was arrested for attempting to pick up a 12-year old girl for sex last month has been indicted on three counts as determined by a federal grand jury on Tuesday, November 4. The new charges replace the initial criminal complaint filed by Barry County Prosecuting Attorney Johnnie Cox against Norman for attempted statutory rape in the 1st degree.

Chase Norman, 23, was initially arrested during a sting operation by the Southwest Missouri Cyber Crimes Task Force and the Purdy Police Department after the girl's mother approached the police department about inappropriate exchanges between Norman and her daughter.

The indictment charges that Norman used a minor to produce child pornography between September 21 and October 10, 2014, as well as two counts of using the Internet and a cell phone to induce

a minor to engage in illicit sexual activity.

Norman and the underage girl interacted through Facebook and a messaging app called Kik on the girl's iPod. After an investigation began, officers used her iPod as part of a sting operation to arrange a meeting between the victim and Norman. Norman believed he was meeting up with the girl to take her to

# National Guard Unit returns from Afghanistan

The 276th Engineering Company, a Missouri National Guard unit based in Pierce City and Springfield, has returned home from active duty. The unit, comprised of about 150 soldiers, including some 20 Barry-County residents, helped to prepare for America's withdrawal from Afghanistan. During their deployment, 10 Bronze Stars, 117 Army Commendation Medals, 27 Combat Action Badges and nine Driver/Mechanic Badges were awarded to the members of the 276th.

The company was welcomed home in a ceremony on Sunday, November 2, held at the Monett High School. Governor Jay Nixon and Missouri State Representative Scott Fitzpatrick spoke at the gathering, welcoming the soldiers back and thanking them for their service. The ceremony was kept brief so the members of the unit could be quickly reunited with their families.

According to Specialist Justin Speer, a Cassville resident who served with

the 276th during the deployment, the unit began training for their mission in January of this year at Camp Clark in Nevada. They continued their training at Ft. Bliss, Texas and then shipped out to Afghanistan in April.

The unit's job was to dismantle American military service bases in Afghanistan. "We were a materials recovery unit," Speer said. "We took down tents and structures in preparation for everybody to come home."

Because of the nature of their job, the unit was constantly on the move. Speer stated the company's work schedule varied from day to day, depending on what they were doing. "Some days, four hours, other days 10 hours," he said.

The 276th worked in hot, dusty conditions but did not have any encounters with any enemy forces and didn't suffer any casualties. All members of the unit returned home.


his apartment for a sexual encounter. Officers arrested him when he arrived at the meeting location.

When a disease like Ebola infects people inside of the United States, there is a lot of potential for misinformation to spread, making it hard to separate fact from fiction. On Thursday, October 20, a presentation on the Ebola virus, led by Major Eric Vought of the Lawrence County Sheriff's Auxilliary and sponsored by the Ozarks Property Rights Alliance, served to promote facts concerning the disease. The presentation was held in the conference room at Mercy Hospital and was attended by an audience


Before Vought made his presentation, the attendees heard from Garvin Anfinson, a health enthusiast. Anfinson told the attendees about natural remedies that had been used to treat certain viruses and speculated that, since Ebola is also a virus, they might be effective against it as well. These remedies included alkalizing the body, raising the body's levels of Vitamins C, D and K, and increasing the body's oxygen levels.

After Anfinson had spoken, Vought began to talk to the audience about Ebola. He explained the specifics of the virus

He also stated the virus is fluid-borne. If a healthy person comes into contact with the blood, sweat or other fluids from an infected person, the healthy person runs a risk of becoming infected.

One fact that Vought stressed is that, though the disease has made its way into the United States and other developed countries, there is no need to fear a wide-spread outbreak of Ebola here. Unlike central and west Africa, where the outbreak is considered to be out of control, developed nations are better prepared to contain and isolate the disease. Also, North America has a colder climate than Africa, which seems to inhibit the spread of the vi-

Vought also pointed out there has only been one death in the United States due to Ebola, and three other people in the country who have been infected but have survived the disease. Beyond

them, there is no confirmed cases of Ebola in the U.S.

Throughout his presentation, Vought stressed the need for calm. He suggested that people might want to prepare themselves for a situation where they might need to remain in their homes in case of an emergency like Ebola, stating he himself has stocked provisions for such a

scenario.

However, he also urged his audience members not to be frightened, stating that there had been a lot of conflicting data on the disease. "Don't jump to conclusions and think the world is going to end," he said.


could see how public speaking is used in the real world," he said.





# "Run, Hide, Fight" seminar attended by 75



Officer Eric Schroeder, with the Springfield Police Department, led a seminar on what to do if there is an active shooter on Cassville' Crowder campus.

A Springfield police officer presented a seminar on the "Run, Hide, Fight" strategy at the community building on the Crowder Cassville Campus.. The three-hour seminar, attended by an audience of 75, took place on Friday, October 31, and was led by Officer Eric Schroeder, a member of the Springfield Police Department at Drury University.

Schroeder began the seminar by explaining what motivates active shooters. He stated that they are people who are "collectors of injustice." When someone does something mean or rude to them, they will brood on it, sometimes for years. Eventually they will act out, but their targets tend to be anyone within reach rather than the people they actually think wronged them.

Next, Schroeder spoke about the first step of the strategy, "run." He told the audience their first course of action in an active shooting should always be to flee. Whether going through a door or a window, they were to get out of the building and keep running until they were well away. "Treat the active shooter as a bomb about to go off, but you don't know how big it is," Schroeder said. "Keep moving away

The second step Schroder discussed was "Hide." He explained that this step was similar to the traditional lock-down strategy because it calls for locking the door, turning out the lights and hiding. However, the strategy also calls for building a barricade at the door with anything that is available:

desks, filing cabinets, chairs,

The third step Schroeder discussed was "fight," and this step is only to be done when escaping or hiding from the shooter is not possible. Schroeder told the audience an active active shooter will not expect opposition, so when confronting one, they should do something unexpected like throw objects in the air or shout forcefully at the shooter. This will create a three to five second window where the shooter will be on the defensive and vulnerable to attack.

Schroeder also emphasized the importance of mental toughness, positive thinking and committing to a course of action when fighting an active shooter. "Never give up," he said. "Decide you are going to make it home that night."

Schroeder concluded the seminar by telling the audience what to expect from police if they are fleeing an active shooter and how to conduct basic first-aid for someone who had been shot. He then answered audience members' questions.

The seminar was brought to the Crowder Cassville campus by Angela Seymour, the campus director. Seymour saw a shorter version of the seminar earlier in the year and felt it should be seen in Cassville. "I knew this was something we needed here," she said.

Seymour said her wish was that the information presented during the seminar may someday save lives. "I just hope that people are informed, and it allows them an opportunity to be safe and prepared," she said.


