Aurora driver airlifted after Monett wreck

An Aurora man had to be airlifted for serious injuries in a wreck near Monett. According to the Missouri State Highway Patrol crash report, a vehicle failed to yield at a stop sign.

On November 10, Austin L. McCann, 29, of Aurora, was driving a 2001 Mitsubishi Eclipse southbound on Farm Road 1100 two miles southeast of Monett. Lukes S. Dickens, 28, of

Galena, pulled out onto the road in a 2015 Chevrolet 2500 pickup pulling a trailer, failing to yield to McCann.

McCann struck the trailer, sustaining serious injuries. He was lifeflighted to Cox South Hospital in Springfield.

The Mitsubishi was totaled. The truck had no damage.

Barry County jury finds Lampe man guilty of sex crimes

A Barry County jury found a Lampe man guilty of sex crimes against a child. The case, which originated in Stone County, was moved to Barry County on a change of venue. The jury found the man, Carl Anthony Selph, 44, of Lampe, guilty of three counts of statutory sodomy in the first degree and one count of child molestation in the first degree. Selph originally had nine charges against him.

The jury trial lasted three days. It began on November 7 and ended November 9. The jury spent over five hours in deliberation before returning

According to the affidavits of probable cause, Selph committed the crimes around 2009 when the victim was under the age of 14. Acts included him forcing her touch him and also using sex acts as incentives/ behavioral punishments.

Sentencing for Selph has

not been established, however, the sentencing guidelines for each count of statutory sodomy in the state of Missouri is five years to life imprisonment. The molestation charge is a class A felony and carries a 10 to 30 years or life imprisonment sentence.

Selph has a sentencing hearing in front of Judge Robert George on January 29, 2018, in Barry County.

CWD checks go quickly for hunters

This weekend marked the opening of firearms season for deer hunters. However, it also marked a change for Barry County hunters. All deer taken during opening weekend were required to be checked for Chronic Wasting Disease. All in all, hunters had no problems with the mandate and were happy to comply.

Paul Parrigon, of Mt. Vernon and his brother John Parrigon, of Joplin, both shot deer in Mark Twain. They shared that their hunting each year is a family event and this wasn't the first time they'd come to Barry County to try their luck. They brought their deer to the Roaring River check station where about a dozen Missouri Department of Conservation employees were waiting.

While their deer were checked, they talked about the CWD. John said, "I'm glad they're doing this and checking. It's important."

Both men said that it was a quick process. Most hunters who checked their deer were in and out of the check station in about five minutes. John shared, "It was much faster than I expected." Paul added, "I was happy to do it. It's wasn't a big deal."

For some of the Missouri Conservation Department employees on site, they shared that a lot of the hunters enjoyed coming because it mimicked the "old days" when everyone had to physically bring their deer in to be accounted for. The check-in used to be at the old fire tower, but Missouri's TeleCheck system has done away with physical check-ins.

Across the state, hunters checked over 94,000 deer in the opening weekend. The Missouri Department of Conservation shared that preliminary data shows that deer hunters in Missouri harvested 94,977 deer during the opening weekend of the November portion of the fall firearms deer season. Of the 94,977 deer harvested, 54,027 were antlered bucks, 9,535 were button bucks, and 31,415 were does.

Barry County's totals were 959 total deer. Of those, 588 were antlered bucks, 99 were button bucks, and 272 were does. Of those, 518 were tested for CWD. The check station at the Purdy Community Center had 203 deer sampled, Roaring River State Park's station had 187, and the station at the Central Crossing Fire Department in Shell Knob had 128.

Across the state, 15,872 tissue samples were taken from harvested deer for CWD testing. Outside of opening weekend, 750 more samples have been taken for testing from road-killed deer. Of those 750 samples, no new cases have been found.

All CWD samples taken, which was the removal of

lymph nodes from harvested deer, are sent to an independent lab for testing. MDC expects results in 5 to 6 weeks. Samples were sent to Colorado State University, which is set up to do sample testing on a large-volume basis.

Results of testing, when available, will be posted at mdc.mo/gov/cwd.

Barry County Courts send 17 to prison in the month of October

• Jesse L. Armentrout, of Blue Eye, pled guilty to two counts of non-support with the total arrears in excess of 12 monthly payments. Armentrout received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years unsupervised probation.

As of September 30, 2014, Armentrout owed \$25,193 in back child support.

Armentrout is to serve probation until October 19,

• Michael Jack Beatty, of Golden, pled guilty to murder in the second degree and armed criminal action. Beatty was sentenced to 20

years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On June 9, 2015, Beatty shot Ed Smith, of Golden, in a trailer the men shared, and then piled clothing on the body and attempted to burn him. Officers found Beatty after he crashed the victim's

• Christopher J. L. Bills, of Crane, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance. Bills received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

On July 27, 2017, Bills was driving a car in Barry County. When officers approached, they found two bags of methamphetamine, a baggie of marijuana, and a methamphetamine pipe.

Bills is to serve probation until October 17, 2022.

• Sara Lavonne Birchfield, of Cassville, pled guilty to passing a bad check of less than \$500. Birchfield received a suspended imposition of sentencing, one year of unsupervised probation and had to pay restitution by the court

On January 6, 2016, Birchfield stole a check belonging to another person and wrote it to Walmart in Cassville for \$154.19. Then, on January 11, 2016, she wrote another check for \$316.61, also to Walmart in Cassville.

Birchfield is to serve probation until October 3, 2018.

Her probation on those charges has been revoked. Blay is to serve six years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On June 26, 2016, officers with the Monett Police Department searched residence on East Broadway. Officers located methamphetamine, prescription pills, distribution baggies, a digital scale and multiple cell phones. Blay was found to be selling methamphetamine out of the residence.

On July 26, 2016, Blay was detained for shoplifting at the Cassville Walmart. When officers arrived, they found her to have two rocks of methamphetamine in her pocket which weighed 0.2 grams. While in jail, Blay got additional charges for damaging jail property when she bent a piece of diamond plate covering toilet plumbing, gaining access to concrete and sharpening a piece of sheet metal. The sharpened sheet metal was used as a weapon to do self harm.

In December 2016, Blay was detained by officers for active warrants as she was leaving a store. She attempted to flee from officers. When she was arrested, she had hydrocodone pills, plastic baggies, a digital scale and hypodermic needles in her

On August 5, 2017, Blay had methamphetamine paraphernalia and Alprazolam (Xanax) pills.

• Tiffany Kaye Bowman, of Cassville, pled guilty to stealing of \$750 or more. Bowman received a suspended imposition of sentencing and three years unsupervised probation.

On January 12, 2017, Bowman was seen taking a black purse from a shopping cart at Walmart. She took the cash from the purse and then threw the purse itself away in a dumpster. There was \$157 in cash, a check, multiple credit cards and other items inside the purse.

Bowman is to serve probation until October 16,

• Kevin Dewayne Cannady, of Seligman, pled guilty to resisting arrest for a felony by creating a substantial risk of injury or death. Cannady was sentenced to five years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On July 20, 2017, Cannady attempted to flee from law enforcement in his vehicle. He continued driving into Arkansas, driving recklessly and refusing to stop because of active warrants. Eventually he ran out of gas in Seligman where officers apprehended

• Zachary P. Coleman-Cox, of Cassville, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance in 2013. His probation has since been revoked and he is to serve three years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On October 28, 2012, Coleman-Cox's residence was searched by law enforcement officers. They located items that field-tested positive for methamphetamine residue, a bong, synthetic cannabinoids and paraphernalia.

deputies, threw the stolen property out of the car window. Cox and one other person committed the burglary.

Later that day, Cox also held a woman at gunpoint when she interrupted a burglary at her home in Barry County, as well.

• Thomas Earle Crone, of Eagle Rock, pled guilty to domestic assault in the second degree and endangering the welfare of a child in the first degree with no sexual contact. Crone received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

On May 22, 2015, Crone attempted to kill or cause serious injury to his son, by firing a semiautomatic gun at him, grazing his leg. This shooting took place with a minor child present.

Crone is to serve probation until October 16, 2022.

• Eric Carthol Cypret pled guilty to two counts of harassment in the first degree. Cypret received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised proba-

On February 20, 2017, Cypret harassed a woman when he went to her residence after being told by officers not to go. Cypret returned before officers had been able to clear the scene and leave.

Then, on March 2, 2017, Cypret had continued to harass the woman multiple times. He banged on the door, trying to scare her.

Cypret is to serve probation until October 17, 2022.

• Jessica M. George, of Seligman, pled guilty to two counts of possession of a controlled substance in 2015. Her probation has since been revoked. She is to serve five years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On September 15, 2014, George and another person went into the Dollar General in Cassville and left without paying for items. When officers stopped them, they found a used syringe and a burnt metallic spoon.

On March 10, 2015, the Drug Task Force served a search warrant where George and multiple other people lived. 

identified as being the person to pawn them.

On January 13, 2016, Mahurin destroyed a stolen truck, as well as stole items from inside it.

On July 7, 2017, Mahurin was involved in a traffic stop. When officers pulled her over, she had methamphetamine, digital scales, a syringe, a glass pipe, and baggies on her.

• Thomas A. McHenry, of Mt. Vernon, pled guilty to property damage in the first degree and assault in the third degree on a special victim. McHenry received four years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On May 31, 2017, officers were called to a domestic incident involving McHenry. McHenry had run when he knew officers were on the way and hid. McHenry had taken the victim's cell phone so she could not call for help. He took a car and then crashed it into a building, as well. McHenry spit on officers when he was apprehended and continued to be combative, kicking officers and fighting them off. Officers had to seek medical treatment for their injuries.



• John David Weber, of Monett, pled guilty to two counts of unlawful possession of a firearm, driving while revoked/suspended, possession of a controlled substance and possession of burglary tools. Weber received four years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On October 3, 2012, Williams attempted to use someone else's urine in a drug screening.






