## South Barry County ambulance service to switch from Cox to Mercy in 2016

In a controversial decision last Tuesday night, the South Barry County Ambulance District (SBCAD) opted to change the Ambulance Service Provider (ASP) contract for southern Barry County from CoxHealth to Mercy after 27 years. The switch, which will happen March 1, 2016, was a hard one to make, according to the Board, and it's left 17 employees currently working the district through Cox-Health with a sense of unease about their futures.

Board President Ken Cielinski said, "Our largest concern through all of this has been the employees. We wanted to make sure that they weren't thrown to the curb." He added that the decision to put out a Request for Proposal (RFP) to both CoxHealth and Mercy for the service was made after receiving input from the

community.

Cielinski said, "The voters asked for this, and that's what we're doing. The constituents of the county asked for us to put the contract out for bid when we asked for our sales tax, and we were doing what they asked for." The SBCAD Board put a property tax levy rollback and institution of a 1/2-cent sales tax measure on the April ballot, which voters passed.

In light of new funds available, Cielinski said their constituents requested that the district's ASP contract be put up for bid to better utilize county funds. CoxHealth's contract was for a \$94,500 annual stipend to aid the health service in funding the ambulance service. When Mercy and CoxHealth put in their proposals, both offered to run the service for \$0.

Cielinski said, "We were happy with the service that we got from Cox. As far as

the service goes, we've never had a problem. We know what we have with Cox, but we needed to see what the other options were."

When the RFP was sent

Watson

to both CoxHealth and Mercy by the Board, both bid the contract without a stipend, saving the district that large chunk of their annual budget. Both Mercy and

CoxHealth claimed that no stipend was necessary due to federal funds being made available to help subsidize

## Southwest superintendent Walker resigns, principal Watson to replace him

After seven years with the Southwest District, superintendent Dr. Bob Walker announced at the November school board meeting is stepping down from his position and current high school principal Tosha Watson will be taking his place as of July 1, 2016.

Walker said the decision to leave was just feeling that it was time. He said, "My stepping down as superintendent is simply a matter of my feeling that it is time. I think one of the responsibilities of a superintendent is to be able to look down the road and make decisions that are in the best interest of a district's future, and that includes examining your own situation. And having someone with the skill set of Mrs. Watson available really makes my decision much easier, because I know how much she cares about Southwest." He said he is unsure if he will be pursuing employment elsewhere.

Watson, a 1990 Southwest High School graduate, has been employed with the district as the high school principal for five years. She said, "It has been my professional goal to be a superintendent since I finished by specialist of education degree. I am looking for-

ward to continuing with the district initiatives with Mr. Walker and the board of education have set plus guiding the district toward new and exciting endeavors."

Watson said that she plans to continue taking the school in the same direction laid out by the board and Walker. However, she said leaving the high school will be a change.

"I will miss most about leading the high school principal position is the staff and the students. We have a strong, caring environment. I have always said that the best job in the district is being the high school principal. I will miss this honor tremendously, but look forward to the new challenges of being the superintendent and giving

Ferrell was traveling northbound on MO-37 one mile north of Washburn in a 1996 Toyota Tacoma on Monday, November 16, around 11:20 a.m. He lost control, went off the right side of the roadway and overturned. Ferrell, who was not wearing a safety belt, was ejected from the truck.

Barry County Deputy Coroner Charlie McManus pronounced Ferrell deceased at the scene at 11:20 a.m.

This was Missouri State Highway Patrol Troop D's 113th fatality crash for 2015.

## Two arrested for stolen property, bomb

Two people were arrested after the Barry County Sheriff's Department executed a search warrant at a property on Longview outside of Seligman. Cody Foster Lowe, 25, of Seligman, and Terri Lynn Jones, 43, of Seligman, were each charged related to thefts and an IED found in a barn.

According to a press release by the sheriff's department, detectives were searching for both stolen property form multiple Seligman burglaries and illegal drugs. Once at the property they found multiple boxes of stolen military items that belonged to Spc. Christopher Stark, who was killed in action in Afghanistan. According to the press release, the items had been stolen from a storage unit in Monett in the last two months. Spc. Stark's dog tags were also found hanging in the home from a nail on the wall.

According to an affidavit or probable cause by Detective Doug Henry with the Barry County's Sheriff's Office, he conducted an interview on November 11 at the Benton County, Ark., Jail regarding a theft from a residence near Seligman. The man, Duel Walker, had said that Jones had shown him the residence where items were stolen from.

Once at Jones' property, items were found from recent burglaries, including power tools, a car and home decor. Det. Henry also found an IED in the barn on the property that was a pipe filled with gun powder, bullets and other pieces of metal. The bomb was made safe by the Bentonville Bomb Squad.

Lowe is also charged with a car theft on in early

November. The owner of a 1998 Honda Accord reported that it had been stolen from her home in the Seligman area. When detectives executed the search warrant, they found the vehicle parked in the driveway with Lowe's driver's license in the console. When questioned, Lowe claimed that he had purchased the car from someone else.

Lowe is charged with tampering with a motor vehicle in the first degree. He has not been charged in connection with the bur-

On Tuesday, Nov. 10th, 2015 the South Barry County Ambulance District Board voted to end their contract with *Cox Health effective March 1st,* 2016 and awarded the contract to Mercy Hospital.

Under the leadership of South Barry County Ambulance District President, Ken Cielinski, a decision was made to "open" the contract up for bid in recent weeks. ### Wheaton R-III saves \$86K in bond refunding

At a regular meeting of the Wheaton R-III School District Board of Education on October 20, a refunding bond resolution was approved. It authorized the sale of \$935,000 General Obligation Refunding Bonds at an average rate of 2.33 percent, compared to Series 2007 bonds which carry an average interest rate of 4.2 percent.

The district reduces the future interest expense by \$86,423. This \$86,423 plus the approximate savings of \$100,070 from the Series 2012 refunding and \$5625 prepayment of the Series 2012 bonds means that the District has saved \$192,118 during the past three years.

The Superintendent of School Dr. Lance Massey expressed enthusiasm and support for the refunding option selected by the Board of Education. "This plan achieves good savings, and provides an opportunity for the District to take advantage of low interest rates while maintaining flexibility for future no tax increase proposals" Dr. Massey remarked.

According to Brad M. Wegman, Assistant Vice President of L. J. Hart and Company the Security Bank of Southwest Missouri purchased \$290,000 of the bonds, which was helpful to the success if the financing.

The Superintendent of Schools Dr. Lance Massey, mentioned that he was pleased efforts were made to accommodate the local banks. "It is nice that our marketing procedures facilitated this local involvement while still receiving attractive interest rates," Dr. Massey commented.

The Board President Lewis Royer pointed out that the \$86,423 of interest savings for the Series 2015 refunding, which is an improvement of \$8,478 from the September 29, 2015 projections, is not all the District may realize due to the Series 2015 Refunding Bonds having a call feature on March 1, 2018 at no pen-

"If interest rates are lower in 2018 or later, we an take advantage of that. Meanwhile we are locking in these levels that are nearly one and eighty seven hundredths percent (1.87 percent) lower than they were in 2007," stated Mr. Royer.

L.J. Hart and Company of St. Louis prepared the refunding proposal and Brad M. Wegman, Assistant Vice President of the firm, explained how it can fit into the long range plans of the District. Mr. Wegman mentioned that the three significant factors making the Series 2015 refunding possible were lower interest rates in 2007, the fact that the Series 2007 bonds are subject to prepayment on March 1, 2017 at no penalty, and the District's ability to participate in the State of Missouri's Direct Deposit Program. This program makes it possible for the district to receive an "AA+" rating from Standard and Poor's Corporation on the refunding bonds.

L.J. Hart and Company complimented Dr. Massey for his prompt and thorough preparations to supply the data necessary for the rating application and official statement, as well as the Board of Education for their foresight in making the Series 2007 bonds callable in ten years.

The proceeds from the Series 2015 Refunding Bonds will be placed in an escrow account with UMB Bank, N.A. and reinvested in U.S. Treasury Securities. The earnings from this escrow account meet the interest payments on the callable Series 2015 Bonds through March 1, 2017 and

then produce the \$935,000 necessary to prepay (call) the Series 2007 bonds on that date. The Series 2015 refunding Bonds were underwritten by L.J. Hart and Company. The closing for the Series 2015 Refunding Bond issue is to occur in November 19, 2015.

Several board members commended Dr. Massey and L.J. Hart and Company for developing the attractive refunding plan. "It is nice to be able to save \$86,423 of our taxpayers' money, while receiving strong support from the Security Bank of Southwest Missouri," commented Dan Goostree, Vice President of the Board of Education. The legal documents to complete the issuance of the bonds were prepared by John W. Brickler, Esq. of Spencer Fane LLP in its role as bond counsel for the District.





local health services. The district will evaluate how the new sales tax money, which is estimated to bring in over \$6000,000 annually, will be spent once regular collections occur. The first payment to the district was for \$4,198.26 on November 10. In the next few months, the Board should have a better idea what their new revenue will be to make a budget

A three-man sub-committee of the SBCAD Board comprised of Ken Cielinski, Tom Rees and Rod Gilreath heard proposals from both CoxHealth and Mercy before making a recommendation to the Board to choose Mercy. The complete six-person board chose Mercy unanimously during a closed session vote on Tuesday night. The Board then voted again during open session, also accepting Mercy's proposal unanimously.

In a press release from the Board, they stated, "As the District moves forward in an increasingly complex future, they believe that through the competitive bid process, the District will receive from Mercy EMS excellent service, additional resources at

a better value for its citizens, along with improved cooperation and interface with all levels of emergency personnel"

When asked what the driving factors were that encouraged the sub-committee to opt for Mercy instead of continuing CoxHealth's contract, the Board mentioned a few items, including their "excellent" performance in other ambulance districts, the proximity of other Mercy ambulance districts in Branson West, Joplin and Rogers, Ark., three helicopters in the area, and Instrument Flight Rules, which allows the helicopters to fly during times of low visibility.

Cielinski also noted, "Transparency was a driving issue." When in conversation with both CoxHealth and Mercy, both stated that Missouri had released additional Federal Reimbursement Allowance (FRA), making it possible to operate the ambulance service without any additional stipend from the

CoxHealth said in their presentation that the FRA funds were available for the past 18-months, however, CoxHealth had not of-

fered to remove the current \$95,400 stipend until the RFP was sent out. The Board was concerned why Cox was charging over \$95,000 and then was able to drop that to no stipend during the bidding process.

CoxHealth media relations coordinator Kaitlyn Connell said, "CoxHealth's expense reductions over the last two years, as well as market and volume changes, made it possible to eliminate the \$94,500 stipend."

McConnell added, "Federal Reimbursement Allowance (FRA) is something that hospitals providing ambulance services receive, and is largely dependent on government appropriates. It is also an amount that varies year to year, making it impossible to rely on a specific amount for funding.

"CoxHealth supported the sales tax levy because of the need for equipment in Barry County. It was believed that the increase would help provide things like ambulances, costing more than \$120,000 each, as well as other equipment necessary in the Cassville and Shell Knob ambulance services. The stipend could've helped

with such expenses, but additional funding would've been a necessity regardless of provider."

Mercy's executive director of emergency services Bob Patterson said, "When making its proposal, Mercy took a number of factors into consideration. Based on the data provided to us, we believe that sufficient revenue opportunities exist to support operations without a subsidy."

Cielinski said, "I don't want any hard feelings. We are here for our constituents and for the county. We are not here for Mercy. We are not here for Cox. We think this will genuinely be better for the county." Mercy will hold the contract for five-years, and the contract will be renewed annually.

Following the Board's decision, McConnell released the following statement on behalf of Cox:

"Throughout its operations in the Barry County Ambulance District, Cox-Health has diligently served residents by offering high-quality EMS clinical services and employment opportunities. These relationships make it greatly disappoint-

ing that its most recent bid to continue these services wasn't accepted. However, in line with the current contract, CoxHealth will continue its EMS operations in Barry County through Feb. 29, 2016."

Patterson also said, "We've very excited to be able to serve the people of this community, and with resources like Mercy Hospital Cassville, as well as three Life Line helicopters and three other ground ambulance services in close proximity, we'll be able to get patients the help they need quickly."

Now that the decision has been made, the question remains about what the District's 17 employees are going to choose. With a combined 125 years of experience in the SBCAD, many of the employees feel a loyalty to their present employer and do not plan to leave Cox.

Ricky Savage, western regional manage for prehospital service for CoxHealth, stated, "CoxHealth in South Barry County has provided ambulance service for 27 years. Some of our employees have been with us since the very first day in 1988; they have helped CoxHealth

EMS grow into the only high performance system in the area that we operate today.

"Many of our current employees chose to work for CoxHealth for many reasons other than pay. CoxHealth provides the most advanced simulation based training in the region for our EMS providers. We have led the way in many cutting-edge advances in EMS throughout the nation in our 27 years in South Barry County, thus ensuring we provide the best possible care to anyone who uses a CoxHealth ambulance. CoxHealth has some of the best family practice physicians in southwest Missouri whom care for many of our employees and their families. CoxHealth is the only locally governed health system in the Springfield area, which allows the company as a whole to focus on the community and its employees."

CoxHealth also stated that all employees who wish to remain with Cox will be reassigned to new positions after February 29, 2016, if they choose to stay on.

Some called into question to the pay scale matching by Mercy. With years of service ranging from a few months all the way up to 27 years, the board asked for a direct answer from Mercy about matching their current benefits and pay. Cielinski said, "My point of contact Bob Patterson assured me that he cannot anticipate that anyone would be taking a pay cut, and its possible that they may even get an increase."

Patterson stated, "Mercy will honor the seniority, paid time off, pay and benefits for the current EMS co-workers who join Mercy.

"We hope current Barry County EMS co-workers will consider working for Mercy. if we can't fill all the open positions with co-workers who are currently in place, we will begin recruiting. If needed, many of our almost 400 emergency medical personnel would be willing to travel to provide care in Barry County."

Speaking for Cox employees, Savage said, "Changing your employer is much more than salaries and benefits; it is a life-changing event that will not only impact our employees, but their families as well. CoxHealth understands the importance of this decision, and we are prepared to continue employment with all of our South Barry County Paramedics and EMTs if they choose to accept it."

During Tuesday night's meeting, Cielinski addressed employees' concerns. He said, "At the Board meeting, I said if they believe in the culture at Cox, and they have a place for them, then don't go anywhere. But if you want to stay with South Barry County, you have that option."

Cielinski stated, "It's been one of the toughest decisions I've ever had to make, but we really expect a smooth transition from Cox to Mercy."

## Preliminary firearms deer harvest numbers in

Preliminary data from the Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) shows that deer hunters in Missouri harvested 97,171 deer during the opening weekend of the November portion of fall firearms deer season, Nov. 14 and 15. Of the 97,171 deer harvested, 53,359 were antlered bucks, 10,320 were button bucks, and 33,492 were does.

Top harvest counties for opening weekend were Texas County with 2,184 deer checked, Howell County with 1,959 and Franklin County with 1,899.

Barry County hunters took 456 antlered bucks, 72 button bucks and 245 does, for a total of 773 altogether.

The November portion of the fall firearms deer season continues through Nov. 24. Archery deer hunting opens again from Nov. 25 through Jan. 15, 2016. The firearms antlerless portion will run Nov. 25 through Dec. 6. The

firearms alternative methods portion will run Dec. 19-29 followed by the firearms late youth portion Jan. 2-3, 2016. Missouri's early youth weekend ran Oct. 31 and Nov. 1. The firearms deer urban zone portion ran Oct. 9 through





The Board convened at 7:00 p.m.

The Board approved the consent items, including the employment of Rodney Morgan as maintenance assistant. Mr. Morgan will be replacing Mike Taylor who will soon be

There were no old business items addressed at this meet-

Under new business, the Board approved recent proposed Policy/Procedure updates as provided by the Missouri School Board Association. Also approved were various bids in respect to district surplus property.

Various reports were reviewed by the Board, including those pertaining to the district's Library Media Centers and Technology as submitted by Librarian Billie Sapp and Technology Director Dan Shelton. In addition, a Facilities/ Grounds update was provided by Superintendent Bob Walker, which included his confirming that work has been completed on the district's running track and that it is now open for public use. Also mentioned was the reconstruction of the home baseball dugout, creating a larger space and a new storage area. Blocks for this project were donated by district resident Troy Wolf. Also reviewed were the regular monthly reports provided by the other district administrators and the Maintenance Director. Curriculum Director Kara Hendrix provided information concerning the district's most recent Annual Performance Report (APR), which indicated an excellent score of 92.5 percent. Mr. Walker praised the Southwest students, teachers and building level administrators for this achievement.

The Board entered executive session at 7:19 p.m. to discuss personnel items. They returned to open session at 8:51 p.m. and voted to accept the resignation of Superintendent Walker, effective June 30, 2016.
