Angel Tree to provide gifts for needy children

The Angel Tree program this year will have a new sponsor thanks to the First Christian Church. The program which provides Christmas gifts to needy children all over Barry County, has been a project by the Barry County Sheriff's Department over the years. However, according to Sheriff Mick Epperly, it just became to be too big of an undertaking for the staff.

Epperly said, "We had so many gifts last year that it took a long time to even wrap the gifts, not counting anything else. We just don't have enough people to keep it running, so the First Christian Church is going to take it over."

Families have to meet certain income requirements to qualify for the program, and there is an application process to ensure that

Downtown building upgrade draws attention on Main Street Tax revenue

Cassville's Main Street got a new face last week on the east side of the north end of the 900 block on Main Street when workers completed the front and north side of a forty foot front and side of the building owned by Robert (Bob) Bishop and Carolyn Bishop, his wife.

The Bishops purchased the building from Carolyn's mother's estate when she passed away. According to Carolyn, the work to the outside was just part of the total renovation to the building. Inside, the Bishops had the ceilings, lighting and bathrooms redone as well as fresh coats of paint and new countertops. On the exterior of the building, a brick facade was put on the front. They also put in new columns, windows and doors.

While the work ended up being much more than they originally anticipated, the result will greatly improve the downtown area. Carolyn said, "We just wanted to improve the appearance of the buildings downtown."

Once the work is completed, the whole block will

also have new asphalt on the parking lot. The building, which is divided into two sections, will house a chiropractic office and a copying service in mid-January and early-January, respectively.

The disastrous fire which destroyed the entire Cassville business district in April of 1893 destroyed the old LeCompte home which was owned by L.D. Oxford and the large Oxford barn which was located in the

900 block where the Bishop building is located.

Then in 1896 the Cassville-Exeter railroad was built which accounts for the odd shape of the Bishop building on the north side at the east end of the building.

On February 4, 1939, 75 years ago, the late Fred Meador, who for many years owned the Meador Hardware, sold the Bishop lots to John Ray, one of

the owners of the Cassville Democrat. Ray died in 1854 and his widow sold the lots to Rusty Morgan on June 10, 1954, who later sold it back to Mrs. Ray and her daughter, Elizabeth Orton in 1967, when Mrs. Orton sold it to J.B. and Verna Mae Nations. Nations, Carolyn's mother, owned the building until the Bishops had the deed turned over November 1, 2012.

continues upward trend

As 2014 nears a close, both the county and the city of Cassville are continuing their upward trend of revenue collected from sales tax. For the year, Cassville is up 6.0 percent from their total last year at this time. Barry County's revenue is up 10.72 percent over last year's numbers. The rise in revenue may be indicative of an economic upturn.

For the month of October, Barry County's sales tax revenue was up 10.95 percent over last year's figures, generating an extra \$16,287.05 for the county. In 2013, October's revenue was \$148,891.57, and this year, that total was \$165,188.90.

With a full twelve months of information for November 2013 through October 2014, the 1/8 cent general revenue tax approved by Barry County voters that began in October 2013 meant an additional \$463,095.23 in funds.

For the month of October, Cassville's sales tax was up 3.6 percent. For all three taxes of \$0.02 per dollar, the city received \$129,477.99. That total is up \$4,509.81 from 2013's \$124,968.18.



Stay warm and save money this cold season

Brr. Cold weather hit the Ozarks with a vengeance this year. Temperatures plunged overnight from a high of 73 degrees on November 10 to a low of 27 degrees on November 11. Fortunately, we've been spared the deep snow that has hit the northern U.S., but the frigid temperatures still pose a challenge to those trying to stay warm while staying within a budget.

For those looking to save money while heating their homes this winter, the Ozarks Area Community Action Corporation (OACAC) has released a list of energy saving tips through their weatherization program.

One of the tips OACAC suggests is sealing around windows and doors with weather stripping and caulk. Sealing around plumbing pipes, ducting and light fixtures that go through the walls, ceilings or floors is also recommended.

Another tip for saving money is lowering the thermostat to 68 degrees or lower during the winter. For

every degree lower, OACAC says you can save three to five percent on your heating bill. Also, replace your furnace filter regularly (every month to every 90 days, depending on the filter you're using) and have the furnace serviced before the heating season to make sure it is both safe and efficient.

You can also use solar power for warmth. Open the blinds on your windows on the south side of your home to let warmth from the sun in. As sunset approaches, close the blinds to prevent heat from escaping.

You can also save money by preparing your water heater for winter weather. OACAC recommends setting your water heater's temperature to 120 degrees and insulating it, especially if it is in an unheated area, such as your garage.

Ventilation fans should also be used carefully. According to OACAC, ventilation fans left unattended can remove a houseful of heated air in an hour. If you are using ventilation fans to remove moisture or contaminants from the air, watch them carefully and turn the fans off when they have done their job.

Other tips from OACAC include keeping your fireplace damper closed tightly when not in use and repairing any holes in the walls, floor or ceiling of your home and making them airtight. A complete list of energy-saving tips and other information about weatherization can be found on-line at http://oac.ac/oacac/content/weatherization. Hard copies of the list can also be picked up at the OACAC office at 402 E. Highway 248 in Cassville.





For four Washburn area residents, a lot of hard work, training, perseverance and patience paid off when they travelled to New York two weeks ago to run the New York City Marathon. Each of the runners trained for different lengths of time, ranging from three to five months, and all but one plan to run anther marathon in the future. Shockley said, "This is my last year for a marathon, but I'll do a triathalon or an Iron Man again in the future."

According to Cord, the most impressive part of the trip was seeing his wife, Kayle's, dedication. He said, "I am very proud of my wife, Kayle. She had major ankle surgery last year where they actually cut the tendon in her ankle in order to tighten the ankle up due to multiple ankle sprains from the past. She set her goal of running in the NYC marathon even before her surgery, and she was able to accomplish that goal, even running it nine minutes faster than any of her other marathons. There was a lot of pain during training for her, but with the determination that she had, when it came race day, she was ready." Cord himself finished the 26.2 mils in 4:37:40.

Even through the intense winds and chilly temperatures, the four and their friend from Bentonville, Ark., Pauline Mohler, finished one of the most exciting marathons one can run in.

Cassville students help break cup stacking world record

It was cup crazy on Thursday, November 13, as thousands of participants took part in what Guinness World Records terms the "World's Largest Sport Stacking Event." During the course of the Guinness World Records Day, sport stackers from all reaches of the world up stacked and down stacked various pyramids in prescribed patterns at lightning speed for at least 30 minutes, all combined with a variety of fitness activities. Sights were set on 600,000 stackers participating as sport stacking with Speed Stacks continues to gain popularity around the world.

The Cassville Cat Stackers had over 40 students participate in the event this year. Not only did they stack but coaches Treslyn Pollreisz and Maria San Paolo challenged the students to bring canned food items to benefit the local food pantry for the upcoming holidays. "We wanted to tie in some type of community service with our event to show the students that fun activities can also be opportunities to give back to a community that gives so much to our schools," said Coach Pollreisz.

Sport stacking has been termed a "track meet for your hands at warp speed." It is an exciting sport where students up stack and down stack 12 specially designed cups called Speed Stacks in predetermined sequences as fast as they can. Stackers race against the clock, compete in relays and often combine sport stacking with fitness challenges as part of physical education classes (check out thewssa.com or speedstacks.com).

Last year, 555,932 stackers participated to break the previous year's STACK UP! record of 483,658. Once again, tens of thousands of stackers contributed their sport stacking skills from across the United States and around the world in countries such as Hungary, Germany, Israel, South Korea, New Zealand, Columbia, and Taiwan.

According to Bob Fox, WSSA Founder and CEO, the Guinness event is a wonderful way to bring together sport stackers across the globe. He said, "Sport stacking is an activity enjoyed by all ages and cultures. It promotes hand-eye coordination, fitness, teamwork, speed and lots of fun."

Sport stacking with Speed Stacks is in more than 37,000 schools and youth organizations worldwide.

At the time of press, 556,401 people participated, breaking last year's world record. With hundreds of schools still unreported, the goal of 600,000 is within reach.



Regional hay school Dec. 9, 11 in Cassville

Southwest Missouri hay producers will have an opportunity to attend a regional school December 9 and 11 in Cassville to learn how to improve their hay making skills. This program is offered by the Barry County extension center in cooperation with the Cassville High School agriculture department.

This two-night non-credit course is specifically designed for livestock producers who already own hay equipment or have hay custom harvested on their land. All aspects of hay and round bale silage production will be covered.

"There is a lot at stake when making hay and many things to consider to make it worth the effort and to be profitable," said Tim Schnakenberg, an agronomy specialist with University of Missouri Extension. "Attending a hay school is an important management tool to insure that you are getting the most out of your land, time and hay equipment."

The program will focus on topics like economics of hay production, forage options, hay quality issues and testing, fertility management, round bale silage management, hay storage, feeding to keep losses low and nutritional needs of cattle.

This regional hay school will be held from 5:30 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. on Tuesday, December 9 and continue at the same times on Thursday, December 11 at the Cassville High School Vo-Ag Department at Cass-

Hunters check 91,460 deer firearms opening weekend

The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) reports that hunters checked 91,460 deer during the opening weekend of the 2014 November Portion of Firearms Deer Season this past weekend. Top harvest counties for the opening weekend were Franklin with 1,839 deer checked, Howell with 1,793, and Callaway with 1,791. Barry County hutners checked 738 deer.

Last year's firearms opening weekend deer harvest was 61,446. Other recent prioryear harvest totals for firearms opening weekend were: 2012: 69,614; 2011: 89,728, 2010:

97,856, and 2009; 86,202.

For 2014 harvest totals by hunting portion and county, visit mdc.mo.gov/node/29442.

MDC also reports that there were three deer-hunting incidents over the weekend with two being fatal. One fatality was in Ste. Genevieve County where a heater in a hunting blind exploded, killing the hunter. The second involved a fall from a tree stand in Crawford County. A third non-fatal incident involved a hunter in Phelps County shooting himself in the leg while loading his rifle.

has been scheduled for November 25 at 10 a.m. at the Cassville Library. This orientation will serve as a helpful resource to provide you with a general overview of the Master Gardening program. The ten session program will meet on Tuesdays and Thursdays beginning December 2 through January 20, excluding last week of December and first week of January.

A minimum participation is required for this program to run, so please contact your local Extension Office to register if you are unable to attend orientation.
