Cassville man held in jail on rape charge

A Cassville man was arrested last week on a rape charge after allegedly sexually assaulting his estranged wife. Matthew O'Leary, 29, of Cassville, is charged with felony rape in the first degree and is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$30,000 cashonly bond.

According to the affidavit of probable cause by Barry County Sheriff's Detective Robert Evenson, O'Leary saw his estranged wife at Fastrip in Cassville on November 17 around 1:15 p.m. The two argued in the parking lot before O'Leary took her cell phone and drove off, according to the report.

O'Leary stopped his truck on Farm Road 2172, around one mile west of Highway 37, and the victim tried to get her cell phone back. At that point, he allegedly raped her on the seat in his truck before she escaped to her car. According to Evenson's report, the victim said "no" multiple times.

O'Leary then punched the windshield of her car, causing damage to the glass and hood. O'Leary was arrested on the warrant on Thursday, November 19, on a warrant issued by Barry County Judge Robert Foulke. The Sheriff's Department is awaiting the results of a rape test, which will be submitted as evidence.

SW students step up to help math scores

Every Thursday morning at Southwest High School, the commons area is filled with students studying furiously. At each table, a few students sit together, heads together, pouring over tablets, textbooks, graph paper and notes. Students are learning, guided by one another, and the result is creating a ripple effect among the students.

When Southwest High School math teacher Karen Huffman saw some of her students struggling with test scores below par, she took a proactive approach. Huffman said, "We were struggling with our math scores, and we wanted to bring up our EOC and ACT math scores. So I asked some of my upper level students to help out with the students who were struggling in some of the other classes." All of the upper level students agreed to help, and all but two of the struggling students in some of the lower level math classes accepted the offer for help. Each week, there are between 20 and 25 tutors helping the 30 students in the program. Huffman said, "All of the kids in the program want to be tutored and are working hard. They're appreciative for what they're getting."

For the past few months, every Thursday means an hour of time to get together and work on assignments and concepts that the students didn't grasp during

class. The differences in the test scores have been extraordinary. Huffman said, "I had one girl who got a six percent on her first test to a 75 percent on the second one just from this tutoring." The students in the program agree, the one-on-one time makes a huge difference.

Emily Snyder, a sophomore, said, "My test grades have gone up. The tests have gotten a lot easier since this started."

Hailey Benninger, also a sophomore, said, "If we don't get it during class, we can always bring it to tutoring and ask"

Both Snyder and Benninger work with senior Haven Brown. Brown said that she had been tutoring outside of the program since she was in high school. "I was always helping kids with math since freshman year. So helping now was always going to happen. Now, it's more convenient. Now we have a set time once a week when they know I can help them, and I can still have a life instead of everyone asking me anytime they see me."

Not surprisingly, the students tutoring get a lot out of the program outside of protection of their free time.

Seligman Shop With a Cop brings in almost \$10K in donations

Those benefits just don't impact their grades. Huffman said, "There's no direct benefit for them, no extra credit. They are just helping to help."

The gift of giving is sometimes the greatest reward. For Bryan Jimenez, a junior, tutoring is about passing it on. "It shows how much knowledge you have, and you can apply it to someone

else. Then once they get it, they can pass it on to someone else. It's fun because you bring math to life and actually use it."

Veronica Ray, a sophomore that Jimenez tutors, said, "It means more help, and it's a lot less stressful because I actually get my work done that I can't finish in class."

As you mill around the crowded tables in the commons area, there is mostly quiet with a low murmur as the students talk to each other. Huffman walks around the tables, making herself available, but the students rarely utilize her. Occasionally, she will meet eyes with someone, but as she makes way over, a student who doesn't remember a certain concept will get up and walk to another table to ask another tutor. They might switch tables for a bit until the student grasps what they were missing before they go back.

Instead of relying on their texts or their teacher, they are relying on one another. While they might raise their hands for a tough question,

by the time Huffman makes her way over, someone has usually stepped in to help, and Huffman just gives them a thumbs up and says, "You've got it now? Great job."

There is a camaraderie that exists in the space where there is no judgment and there are no stupid questions.

The safety net provided for students who are struggling is held by their peers.

"It's amazing to watch them. They are engaging and learning; it's really incredible," Huffman said. Walking around listening to the students, incredible is the best word for it.





Community steps up to learn life-saving injection protocol for local boy

Last week, a special class was held at Southwest, but it wasn't a class for students. Alli Gebhardt, mother of four children and two grandchildren in the district, and her daughter-in-law Kendra Outhouse taught a special class to faculty and staff as well as interested people from the community who were willing to learn how to give her son a life-saving injection.

Kaleb Outhouse, 8, has an unusual disorder called adrenal insufficiency, which means his body cannot produce cortisol. Unlike other hormone-related disorders, the lack of cortisol can mean death in a matter of minutes if Kaleb isn't given an injection any time he experiences stress. Stress can be a simple injury, emotional stress or an illness. Without cortisol being released, the body goes into shock and eventually

shuts down.

After Kaleb was diagnosed, his mother, Alli, has fought to educate everyone from teachers and staff to paramedics and first responders on what to do if Kaleb goes into shock. While he is given daily medication to help with the disorder, in the event of trauma, he needs to receive a special steroid injection to keep his body from going into shock.

While at first Gebhardt

was met with some resistance, now more people are willing to learn. She said, "I understand why people don't want to give it, it is a scary thing, but if he needs it, it can mean his life."

At the special class, 13 people came to learn how to give the shot in the case of an emergency. "Before, only the nurse knew how to give his shot, but now we will have more people who can administer it if he's in need."

Gebhardt reached out to elementary principal Jeff Payne to see if the school would be willing to facilitate the learning session. Gebhardt said, "Mr. Payne has been really interested in learning about it, and I really appreciate that." Payne was one of the attendees at the Friday night class.

Elementary principal Payne said, "Kaleb is one of our kids and the last thing we want is to have anything of course go on. But we all need to be prepared for what does happen, and worst case scenario, if no one else is available to do it, I want to have the skills to be able to help. I really wanted to know what to do, so I can feel confident in providing the aid that he needs to get him through it."

Gebhardt said, "Even some of the teachers who are it close, it just is a matter of afraid of it wanted to take the class because they know how important it is."

Part of the importance of training events like this is because Kaleb's injection is not a one-step process. Gebhardt said, "It would be great if this were like an epi-pen, but it's not. It's such a potent steroid that it doesn't take very much to save him." To give Kaleb the injection, a seal has to be broken to mix the steroid, then a separate syringe is used to draw up the solution. On top of that, his vial of medication needs to be kept at room temperature, which means it can't be kept in a car.

Gebhardt said, "There is always one of his packs near him. I carry one, there is one in the nurse's station, his sister carries one. He always has someone knowing how to do

Before this, nurse Gayla Treadwell was the only one who knew how to give Kaleb's injection. Gebhardt said, "Gayla really stepped up and learned a lot about Kaleb's condition when we found out, but if she wasn't there, no one would be able to do

Multiple faculty and staff attended the class, as well as a few first responders from the Washburn area. Gebhardt said, "I just really appreciate everyone who came."

She continued, "If you give him the shot and he doesn't need it, it doesn't hurt him. But if he needs it, you're going to save his life. I just want people to understand





Testing results are in, and the Cassville School District is reporting 10 percent of CHS juniors met all four college readiness benchmark scores. The overall success of the event and past tournaments have been due to the tremendous support of parents, teachers and members of the Cassville community.






