New contest Festival of Lights encourages everyone to decorate

This year, Barry County will have a different kind of holiday light contest. The best part? No matter how many strands of lights you can afford, you're still in the running for a \$1,000 grand prize. The Barry County Advertiser is teaming up with its advertisers to bring a new kind of contest for anyone who encourages a "Festival of Lights" across the county.

More locations may be added during the contest. Each time you visit one of the above locations, fill out another form. You can't fill out too many (within reason!). Entry forms will be available beginning Monday, November 27. Ages 18 and up only on forms.

On Monday afternoon, the Cassville Community Foundation (CCF) made their annual grant presentations at the Cassville United Methodist Church. Board president Mike McCracken announced each of the eight foundations receiving grants this year totalling \$6,000.

This year's grant recipients are: the Cassville High School Backpack Program, Cassville Food

Pantry, Cassville Schools Bright Futures, Eagle Rock-Golden-Mano Fire Department, Exeter After School Program, Cassville High School Mercy Clinic, Southwest Preschool Program and the Cassville YMCA.

Representatives of each of the organizations were present to receive their checks and briefly speak about what the grants will go toward in their respective programs.

Backpack Program was represented by counselors Jordi Miller and Michelle Watson. The program sends students in need home with backpacks of food each Friday to ensure food security for them. Watson said, "We have 14 students enrolled in the program right now, and it makes a huge difference." CCF donated \$1,000 to support purchasing food for the students in need.

Cassville Food

Cassville's High School Pantry was represented by director Janet Mills. The pantry received \$1,000 from the CCF. Mills shared that the donation would go to purchase meat for the food boxes. She shared, "We give boxes to 280 to 330 families each month at the pantry, and we do include meat, but this will help to provide more meat protein to those families."

Monett man arrested on drug charges

After a search warrant was served, a Monett man was arrested and charged with drug distribution for allegedly selling his prescription pain medication. Joshua David Planchon, 27, of Monett, is charged with selling marijuana and prescription pain medication after officers with the Monett Police Department served a search warrant at his residence.

On November 11, officers with the Monett Police Department served a search warrant at a residence on Scott Street. When officers arrived, they served a search warrant related to a drug investigation. Inside,

officers stated they found a silver coffee can that contained 39 grams of marijuana. Officers also said they found \$642 in cash and a bag of jewelry.

When Planchon was interviewed, he allegedly told officers that he self-medicates with marijuana and sold it. He also allegedly told officers that he sells his prescription pain pills.

Planchon was charged with delivery of a controlled substance, a felony, and unlawful possession of drug paraphernalia, a misdemeanor. Planchon is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$30,000 cash-only bond.





Shell Knob Boy Scout earns Eagle rank

A large group of family, friends and supporters gathered to dedicate Michael Bernsen's Eagle Scout project on Saturday, November 11. Michael's project is a Meditation Trail located just west of the Central Community United Methodist Church in Shell Knob. Michael coordinated all activities to complete this walking trail as part of the requirements to achieve his Eagle Scout badge, the highest award in Boy Scouting.

The project was originally envisioned last spring, when Michael approached Bill Kenagy, pastor of the church, seeking a project that would benefit the community. Pastor Kenagy had wanted to do something with the unused, wooded area on the church property. Together, Michael and Bill foresaw a short walking trail based on the fourteen stations of the cross as experienced by Christ.

The trail is a short, looped walk through a peaceful wooded area. Along the path there are fourteen stopping points with small plaques indicating the station identity. Two injured in threevehicle wreck on Hwy. 37

Two people were injured in a three-vehicle crash near George's on Monday, November 20, evening. According to the Missouri State Highway Patrol crash report, the wreck happened after one of the vehicles failed to yield.

On Monday, Joshua D. Dowler, 29, of Cassville, was driving a 1997 Honda Accord northbound on Highway 37 in Butterfield. Dowler failed to yield to a second vehicle, a 2012 Dodge Charger driven by Deborah R. Parmley, 49, of Pierce City, hitting the car in the rear. Parmley ran off the roadway and then a third vehicle, a 2014 Chrysler Town and County, driven by Wilbur E. Thomas, 91, of Cassville, hit the Accord before it

came to rest in the middle of the roadway.

Dowler was flown to Mercy Hospital for moderate injuries. It is unknown as to whether he was wearing a seatbelt at the time of the crash. Parmley suffered minor injuries and was taken to Cox Hospital in Monett by a private vehicle. Thomas had no reported injuries at the scene. Parmley and Thomas were both wearing seatbelts at the time of the crash.

All three vehicles involved sustained extensive damage from the wreck. The Accord was towed from the scene by Thomas Towing. The Charger was towed from the scene by Brice's Towing and the Town and Country was removed by









Late Richmiller honored in Veterans Day assembly

During the annual Cassville Jim Richmiller were honored for Mr. Richmiller's service as a United States Marine.

Richmiller served in North Vietnam from 1969-1970 and returned home a decorated combat soldier.

After returning from Vietnam, Jim was a defensive lineman for the Navy-Marine Corps Football Team. He was then stationed at Camp Lejeune in North Carolina where he taught communications to troops preparing for deployment to Vietnam.

After his time in the military, Jim married Mary Grandstaff (now Mrs. Richmiller). They had four children and moved to Cassville where John, Jamie, Phillip and Marti grew up.

During his 13 years in Cassville, Jim devoted himself to many community activities, including volunteering, youth sports, and the First Baptist Church, of Cassville. the community. She said, "It was my leadership class who wrote the grant. When we get the grant idea each year, we talk about, as a group, what the community needs.

"It was a random discussion, and they mentioned that the park in Seligman didn't have a lot of seating."

She said, "People don't realize, but it's a whole different ballgame to write a grant. it's a learning experience to write the grants, and sometimes we don't get them, but this is the third year we've gotten the FCS grant."

Once the school was awarded the \$500 grant, then the funds were turned over

to the other FFA advisor, Bill Caldwell. Caldwell's agriculture structures class is doing the construction.

Caldwell said, "The kids have done a really good job. We've only been in the shop for about three weeks. They have book work to finish first."

As of Monday, November 20, two tables were finished. Caldwell said he anticipates they will be done and delivered by Christmas break.

Brown said, "When the students decided that is what they wanted to do, I called the City [of Seligman] to see if they would take them, and they said yes. So we moved forward."

Brown said in the past, the Shaping Rural Missouri grant has been used for different projects. The first year, they did siding work for the local clothes closet in Washburn. Then, last year they used the money to repaint the First Baptist Church in Washburn.

Caldwell said once the picnic tables are done, his ag structures class will move on to something else. He said they plan to do Adirondack chairs.

Last year, his class built a storage building on Southwest District's campus.

Thanks to the efforts of Southwest's ag students and teachers, the City of Seligman's park will have better seating options for people enjoying the grounds.

He continued, "I started Auto Pro Detailing on the dream of owning a main street business location where people could get professional work done at an affordable price."

Short had an interest in auto work from an early age.

'When I was in auto body and tech in school, I had a teacher tell me that I'd never make it in body work. I was upset and asked why, and he told me I was a perfectionist and you can't make money that way. He told me to get into old car restorations instead," he said.
