## Miner honored for 30 years as Cassville's assistant fire chief

After 30 years, Cassville Fire Protection District's assistant chief Chuck Miner is stepping down from his position. Miner will be taking over the role of administrator instead. To honor him, the fire department held an appreciation dinner and Cassville Fire Chief Millard Andrews presented him with a plaque. Andrews said, "I appreciate Chucks' devotion to the community and to the fire department. I appreciate his friendship over the years, and we've been able to work well together for the last 30 years for the betterment of the community and protecting people and

their lives."

Miner began volunteering with the department in 1986. It wasn't long before their assistant chief stepped down and Miner took over that position. When asked why he decided to volunteer, he said, "I had an urge to do it. You know, some people want to get in and help and some people don't. I guess you have to have that volunteer gene you might say."

Now, Miner said it is time for him to step back from his duties as assistant chief and focus on the administrative side. A ten-year volunteer for the department, Derek Acheson, is the new assistant chief. Miner said,

## Monett Cubs State Football Champs

The Monett Cubs scored two fourth quarter touchdowns to earn a 27-18 comeback victory over Maryville in the Class 3 state championship game at Plaster Field in Springfield on Saturday. The Cubs finished the year 14-1, with a 49-34 loss to the Class 2 state champion Lamar Tigers the only blemish on the schedule. The Cubs ended a 39-year drought since their last football championship in 1977.

Monett had not been in a close game since the 21-20 nailbiter over Cassville in week 6 of the regular season. So when Maryville claimed an 18-14 lead early in the final quarter, there was concern. But the Cubs came up with big play after big play to regain the momentum and the victory.

The Spoofhounds had a 4th and 8 at their own 35-yard line with less than 10 minutes to play, when a bad snap sailed over the punter and Monett recovered at the Maryville one-yard line. It took three plays, but Ian Meyer finally found the end zone to give Monett a 20-18 lead with 7:15 to play.

On the very next possession, Monett's Jedd Anderson intercepted Trey Oglesby to give the Cubs the ball on Maryville's 44-yard line. Intent on burning as much clock as possible, the Cubs went for a 4th and 7 at the Maryville 10-yard line. Meyer threaded a pass to David Turner in the end zone to ice the game.

Brody Crawford intercepted Oglesby to end Maryville's last drive and the

win, the Lamar Tigers won a sixth-consecutive Class 2 title with a 26-18 win over Trinity Catholic on Friday. The Tigers finished 14-0. Before the win over Trinity Catholic, Lamar's

closest game was the 15-point margin over Monett. Lamar's defense pitched five shutouts, and held 13 opponents to 19 points or less in the march to the state championship.

## Ten year old dreams big to rescue human trafficking victims

When you combine the generous spirit, hard work and big drive of ten-year-old Katelyn Cook, you get a big business that benefits those in misfortune. Katelyn, or Kate, is not an ordinary little girl looking for what she is going to get for Christmas; instead, she is looking at how to raise money to give for others.

When you meet Kate, she is a very personable girl. She speaks well, has a lovely personality, and you can tell that she seems to always have a plan. Since she was young, Kate has had a heart for giving. She started giving to Redemption for Haiti, a local Christian organization that does outreach

and support of orphans and orphanages in Haiti.

To raise money for charity, Kate took it upon herself to get a job. She approached a local salon and asked if she could clean up to raise money to help others. The salon pays her \$10 to \$20 to clean, and Kate puts the money away to help.

Over time, Kate asked her mother, Amanda Reese, about something she had heard about: human trafficking. After her mother explained to her that between 100,000 and 300,000 underage girls were being sold for sex in America alone, Kate wanted to help. Over time, she came up with a plan, and that is how Kate's Closet was

Whisenhunt said St. Jude's was a special place to Blazi, which is why she wants to give back. She said, "The Ronald McDonald house had a birthday party for her. Plus the St. Jude's doctors sang happy birthday and gave her a gift. They do whatever they can to help the kids. The sad thing about it is that a lot of the kids in-bound in the hospital, a lot of the families don't have the time or means to get out and do the Christmas shopping. Or they are separated. It's really hard to do it like that."

She continued, "Blazi has a very giving nature anyway and all of her friends, a lot of them will be stuck down there for Christmas. She wrote a letter to Santa that she wanted toys for St. Jude's."

## Four arrested in Cassville drug bust

Four people were arrested for drug possession after the Cassville Police Department executed a search warrant at a home on 11th Street. Arianna Gennarelli, 37, Joshua Jacobs, 23, Jason Marchetti, 31, and Tabitha Mortell, 34, were all charged with drug offenses.

On November 23, officer Colt Beck with the Cassville Police Department executed a narcotics search warrant at a residence at 403 W. 11th Street. Inside the home, Beck found used syringes, adderall, clonazepam and marijuana pipes in a room where Gennarelli and Jacobs were.

In the room with Marchetti and Mortell, officer Beck found used syringes, an empty methamphetamine baggie, cut straws and multiple pills scattered on the ground. There was also a marijuana pipe.

All four were charged with two counts of possession of a controlled substance, one

count of possession of marijuana and one count of unlawful use of drug paraphernalia. Gennarelli and Jacobs both posted \$25,000 bonds. Marchetti and Mortell are still being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of \$25,000 bonds.



# CHS grad recovers relics on school grounds

With the recent renovations of the sidewalks along Main Street this fall, Dustin Atnip, Cassville High School graduate, class of 1998, has been hard at work.

Two years ago, Atnip ventured into the hobby of relic recovery. During the past couple of months, he has focused his recovery efforts along Main Street

while the sidewalks are being replaced.

In particular, he has spent a lot of time searching the grounds in front of the JC Duncan Gymnasium at Cassville R-IV School District and has found many objects that tell a story of events that happened on that soil more than a hundred years ago.

On the Cassville R-IV campus, Atnip has recovered countless old coins and many items dating back to the Civil War.

"I spend a few hours a couple of afternoons a week looking," said Atnip. "At the school, I have found several bullets from the Civil

War, a pocket watch hanger, coins, including an Indian Head penny dated 1907, a Civil War coat button and a Grand Army of the Republic button."

After searching and recovering the buried treasures, Atnip uses online forums and clubs to identify the objects as well as reaching out to other historians.

"After finding an item, I do research to confirm what I have found then clean it up and display it in a plaque or shadow box at

my house," said Atnip.

At this time, Atnip enjoys having his treasures at home to look at and enjoy but says one day he may consider donating them to a museum or library so others can enjoy them as well.

Atnip uses a metal detector that can detect a coin size object that is buried up to 12 inches below the ground. He spends his time searching mostly in Barry County, but has been involved in recovery efforts in the Springfield area as well.



“Essentially, when I walk in the door, I won’t be going in the bay, I’ll be going into the office.”

“I’m not doing the day-to-day operations as far as the trucks and organization of the department. I’m basically pulling back to reserve status if I’m here. When I leave here, the radio will go off.”

Miner recounted some of the big changes in the fire department over the

years. Initially, Cassville had two fire departments: the city fire and rural fire departments. In 2005, the tax district was formed and the departments joined together.

Miner said the city firefighters relied on the siren to the west of the square to let them know when it was time to go out, and the rural side had a phone bank where 10 or so people had a special phone ring in their

houses to let them know to go out. He added, “Then, the directions to the fire were written on the chalkboard in the station. It’s quite a bit different now.”

He added, “The biggest changes came along with the grand process where you could apply for a major

purchase with contributing funds. And then, obviously the formation of the tax district.”

He said, “The support within the district to approve the tax district formation was really incredible.”

After 30 years of being

on call, Miner said it is time for him to take seat and let others do it. He said, “I can’t put my 100 percent to go on calls. Health-wise, that is something to consider. Are you still able to get up in the middle of the night in the cold and go out there.” He added that he

will be focusing on caring for his family now.

Miner said, “I’ve really started considering what is most important. I do a lot of volunteer work with the food pantry, too, and now I can focus more on the administrative part of it here.”

## MO hunters bring in 185K deer during November Firearms season

### BARRY COUNTY HUNTERS BAG 1,671

Preliminary data from the Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) shows that deer hunters in Missouri harvested 185,066 deer during the November portion of fall firearms deer season, Nov. 12-22. Of the 185,066 deer harvested, 95,383 were antlered bucks, 18,889 were button bucks, and 70,794 were does. Top harvest counties were Howell with 3,910 deer checked, Franklin with 3,738, and Texas with 3,562.

Barry County hunters brought in 930 antlered bucks, 144 button bucks and 597 does for an overall total of 1,671.

Last year, hunters checked 186,542 deer during the 2015 November portion of firearms deer season with 90,094 being antlered bucks, 20,911 being button bucks, and 75,537 being does.

MDC reported three firearms-related hunting incidents during the fall firearms November portion. Two of the three incidents involved self-inflicted firearm wounds and occurred in Barry and Camden counties. The third involved one hunter in a party in Grundy County wounding another while shooting at a deer.

Deer hunting in Missouri continues with archery deer hunting from Nov. 23 through Jan. 15, firearms late youth

portion Nov. 25-27, firearms antlerless portion Dec. 2-4, and firearms alternative methods portion Dec. 24 through Jan. 3.



# Barry County courts incarcerate 6 in October

• **Sandra Anderson**, of Verona, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance. Anderson received a suspended imposition of sentencing and three years supervised probation.

Anderson was arrested and charged on April 9, 2015, when the Monett Police Department did a search of her purse. Anderson was stopped behind the library on 6th Street in Monett. Inside her purse, officers found two baggies of a crystallized substance appearing to be methamphetamine, a clear glass pipe with a burnt area, two plastic straws, a metal spoon and Q-tips.

Anderson is to serve probation until October 17, 2019.

• **James L. Beck**, of Cassville, pled guilty to two counts of operating a motor vehicle on a highway while his license was revoked in 2014 and was put on probation. Beck's probation has since been revoked, and he is to serve 120 days of shock incarceration as part of his original four year sentence

with the Department of Corrections.

Beck was charged with driving while revoked when he was in an accident on Highway 37 on April 27, 2011. Beck had been convicted of driving while revoked in the past, as well. Beck had also been involved in another traffic accident on March 21 of that year on Old Exeter Road in Cassville, as well.

• **Ricky J. Buller**, of Monett, pled guilty to two counts of non-support with the total arrears more than 12 months. Buller received a suspended execution of a four year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections and five years supervised probation.

Buller was ordered to pay child support for two different children, one in 2003 and the other in 2011. Buller was in arrears \$13,009.06 for one child and \$8,808 for the other child as of October 30, 2014.

Buller is to serve probation until November 19, 2021.

• **Joshua Dain Busch**, of Cassville, pled guilty to unlawful use of drug paraphernalia. Busch was sentenced to 180 days of incarceration with credit for time already served.

On July 2, 2015, the Cassville Police Department went to Busch's residence on Harold Street in Cassville. When officers were there, they observed drug paraphernalia sitting in plain sight on the coffee table. A search also revealed methamphetamine and syringes stored in the bathroom.

• **Randall Campbell**, of Cassville, made an Alford plea to endangering the welfare of a child in the second degree. Campbell received a suspended imposition of sentencing and two years unsupervised probation.

Campbell was originally arrested for statutory sodomy for events that occurred on November 9 and 10, 2013. The Barry County Sheriff's Department investigated the incident in which Campbell

went into the victim's, a 14 year old girl, bedroom and touched her inappropriately through and under her clothing.

Campbell is to serve probation until October 17, 2018.

• **Bryan Dewayne Davis**, of Cassville, pled guilty to tampering with a motor vehicle in the first degree and burglary in the second degree. Davis received a 120 day shock incarceration with the Department of Corrections as part of an overall six year incarceration sentence.

Davis was charged after a vehicle was stolen on March 16, 2016. The Jeep was recovered at the Concord Cemetery near Exeter. Davis admitted to Barry County Detective Rob Evenson that he stole the Jeep because he needed to get to a job interview.

Davis was also charged with breaking into a home on West State Highway 76 in Cape Fair. Davis stole nine firearms, a crossbow, chainsaw, seven long guns, two handguns, food, ammunition, turkey calls, traps and other items from the home.

• **Donald Keith Hendershot**, of Cape Fair, pled guilty to assault in the second degree, attempted tampering of a motor vehicle in the first degree and burglary in the first degree. Hendershot received two seven year and one four year incarceration sen-

tences with the Department of Corrections with those sentences to run concurrently.

On July 30, 2016, the Barry County Sheriff's Department investigated an incident where Hendershot struck a victim in the head with a wooden handled claw hammer. The victim had a cut and concussion from the incident. The victim was struck after he found Hendershot attempting to steal his truck in from of his residence.

• **Casey Joe Hood**, of Monett, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance and theft/stealing of \$500 to \$25,000 in value. Hood is to serve 120 days of shock incarceration with the Department of Corrections as part of a seven year incarceration sentence.

On February 8, 2013, Hood was in possession of three hydrocodones without a prescription when a residence was searched on Bond Street in Monett.

On December 4, 2013, the Barry County Sheriff's Department found Hood to have stolen a motorcycle earlier that year.

• **Khira Danelle Longacre** made an Alford plea to burglary in the second degree and pled guilty to theft/stealing of any controlled substance in April. Since, Longacre's probation has been revoked, and she is to serve three years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

Longacre was charged with stealing Flexril and Hydrocodone pills from a man's truck at Kwik T's on January 15, 2016, after he gave her a ride, as well as a burglary on December 8, 2015.

• **James Lopez**, of Eagle Rock, pled guilty to trespassing in the first degree. Lopez received a suspended imposition of sentencing and two years unsupervised probation.

Lopez illegally entered Big M Marina's boat dock on July 24, 2014, and broke into a houseboat to steal items.

Lopez is to serve probation until October 17, 2018.

• **Brandi Nicole Plopper**, of Aurora, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance. Plopper received a suspended execution of a five year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections and five years supervised probation.

Plopper was arrested after the Missouri State Highway Patrol organized a sting on January 29, 2015, and the officer purchased a gram of methamphetamine from her near Pierce City on Farm Road 1040. Then, on February 4, 2014, the officer purchased three and a half grams of methamphetamine from her in Monett. Finally, he purchased another three and a half grams of methamphetamine on February 13.

Plopper is to serve probation until October 27, 2021.

• **Christopher Ray Puliam**, of Cassville, pled guilty to two counts of possession of a controlled substance, one count of possession of marijuana, one count of unlawful use of drug paraphernalia, one count of resisting arrest of a felony and one count of distribution of a controlled

substance. Pulliam received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

On September 20, 2015, Pulliam was in possession of marijuana, methamphetamine and hydrocodone pills.

On March 30, 2016, Pulliam was arrested in the Washburn First Baptist Church clothes closet. When officers tried to take him into custody, he put his middle finger up and would not comply. He was in possession of methamphetamine at the time of his arrest.

On July 19, 2016, the Barry County Sheriff's Department was searching for Pulliam for a disturbance. When officers located him, he was carrying an axe and a backpack with 8.7 grams of methamphetamine, digital scales and clean baggies.

Pulliam is to serve probation until October 11, 2021.

• **Heather Lee Stark**, of Monett, pled guilty to receiving stolen property. Stark received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

On August 28, 2016, the Monett Police Department was investigating a stolen check incident. Video from Casey's in Monett showed Stark using stolen checks at the register and cashing them from \$39.39 and \$49.84.

Then, on August 11, 2016, the Monett Police Department found that Stark had possession of a stolen television and a window air conditioner. Stark stated that they had purchased them from a homeless man.

Stark is to serve probation until October 18, 2021.

• **Raven Stephens**, of Joplin, pled guilty to three counts of forgery. Stephens received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

Stephens was charged after taking checks without the victim's permission and cashing them at Arvest Bank in Cassville from October to December 2015. The check amounts varied

from \$500 to \$1,000.

Stephens is to serve probation until October 18, 2021.

• **Herman Thomas Tilford**, of Cassville, pled guilty to tampering with a motor vehicle in the first degree. Tilford received a suspended execution of a five year incarceration sentence with Department of Corrections and five years supervised probation.

On March 7, 2016, Tilford broke several windows and the windshield out of a van located on County Road in Washburn. Tilford was intoxicated and covered in blood when officers found him. The damage was over \$4,500.

Tilford is to serve probation until October 18, 2021.

• **Alcapon Valentine**, of Monett, pled guilty to two counts of theft/stealing of a less than \$500 in value. Valentine received a suspended imposition of sentencing and two years unsupervised probation.

Valentine was arrested after he was found to be part of a group of people stealing from the Monett Walmart. Items were stolen in October and December 2015 and included a car stereo, knives, electronics, flash light and phone accessories.

Barry County Health Dept. continues WIC contract

The Barry County Health Department has continued its contract with the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services to provide the WIC (Women, Infants & Children) program for fiscal year October 1, 2016, through September 30, 2017.

The WIC program serves pregnant women, breastfeeding women up to one year from delivery, non breastfeeding women for 6 months from delivery, as well as infants and children up through the age of 5.

The primary services provided are: health screening, risk assessment, nutrition education, and counseling, breastfeeding promotion and referrals to health care. Nutritious supplemental food is provided at no cost to participant. To be eligible the participant must have an income of less than or equal to 185 percent of the poverty level and be determined by a health pro-

fessional to be at nutritional risk and live in the state of Missouri.

The contract this year is for \$258,967.00, with \$29,132 devoted to education, salaries, and supplies and support for breastfeeding women or prenats involved in breastfeeding education. The expected caseload for the year is 16,277.

The WIC program is located in Cassville at 65 Main Street in the Health Department and can be reached by calling (417) 847-2114 and in Monett at 1000 South Lincoln and phone is (417) 354-8402. There is also a satellite location in Seligman once a month as well as Shell Knob and appointments at those may be made through the Cassville office. ### Holiday season most common time for weight gain

Research shows that most of the weight Americans gain in one year's time occurs between Thanksgiving and New Year's Day. That same research also shows that we do not lose that weight when the holidays are over according to David Burton, civic communication specialist with University of Missouri Extension.

"I'm a living example of this weight gain trend, but I'm making changes," said Burton. "If we can avoid holiday weight gain, we will be taking positive steps to prevent obesity and prevent or delay the development of heart disease, diabetes, and other serious health problems."

The holidays are a time when more food is consumed than normal. There are parties to attend, dinners at the office and church and more family gatherings. Food is the centerpiece for a majority of those events. The challenge is to make another activity the priority during the holidays, starting with Thanksgiving.

#### THANKSGIVING CALORIES

The average American consumes a whopping 4,500 calories from Thanksgiving dinner and snacks, according to the Calorie Counting Council. That is nearly twice the amount needed for daily calorie consumption.

That piece of apple pie is 411 calories and would require a 3.1 mile run to burn it off.

Before you reach for the extra buttered roll, remember it is 210 calories, and you will need 20 minutes of flag football to burn those calories off.

One-half cup of stuffing is 180 calories and it will take ten minutes of running to burn it off. A two-ounce piece of corn bread is 160 calories and will require 15 laps of swimming.

One-half cup of green bean casserole is 70 calories but 14 minutes of dancing can burn that off. Gravy is 45 calories for one-quarter cup and 50 burpees will burn off those calories.

#### ACTIVITY IDEAS

For family fun ways to burn calories, plan a family walk in the afternoon or a

family game of touch football, kickball or baseball outside.

It can also be fun to plan indoor or outdoor activities that will get the family off the couch and on their feet. For example, organize a scavenger hunt, or create an obstacle course for all to enjoy.

Humans can gain health benefits by getting 30 minutes of moderate-intensity aerobic exercise most days of the week and anaerobic exercise (strength training) two to three days per week.

Aerobic exercise can be playing actively with the children, raking leaves and walking up stairs in ten-minute bouts. Regular physical activity helps with weight control by helping to burn excess calories that would normally be stored as fat.

"You may even start the day with exercise-before the big meal. You could exercise 30 minutes on the treadmill, exercise bike, or elliptical, for example, and then wind down the day with a walk, bike ride, or outdoor game with the family," said Burton.

For this holiday season, try focusing on fun instead of food.

### Letter to the Editor

I attended a meeting with the Purdy Special Road District in November of 2014 without any intention of becoming a regular at these meetings. Like anyone else who attends a meeting, I was simply there to voice a personal concern about the creek bed that passes in front of my property.

While our road commissioners were politely explaining why it was "not possible" to build a dirt road that could be "maintained," our bookkeeper volunteered to add false information about the financial status of this district. Our bookkeeper quite confidently stated that there had only been \$130,000 to work with the entire year, when in fact, as of the end of the previous month, the true figure was \$168,000 with two more installments to our account before year's end. The total for the year came to \$214,500.

This is what motivated me to take a look at our financial records and to be placed on the agenda for each meeting in advance for at least the next year. Knowing that all of this interest from a lowly taxpayer was not going to go over very well at all. I have conducted myself quite professionally. I wish I could say the same for our commissioners.

I have asked questions and raised concerns that we would all be demanding answers to, but I have been alone. An alarming number of my comments and questions have been answered with silent blank stares for a moment before changing the subject between themselves as though I wasn't there or they have chosen to make more excuses, usually with more out and out false statements.

Having attended the majority of our meetings for the past

two years, I have come to understand how and why the overall condition of our roads in the Purdy Special Road District have become so shameful compared to any other district in the county. Based on what I have personally witnessed, our roads have been subjected to too many years of incompetence on the part of our commissioners.

Unbelievable levels of irresponsibility, a serious lack of professionalism, a lack of ethics and laziness have all contributed to the steady decay of our roads. All of the lies I have been told have simply been to cover the results of their overall incompetence.

The meetings for the Purdy Special Road District are held on the second Monday of each month at 5:30 p.m. It is anyone's and everyone's right to attend these meetings. 


### Late youth deer season brings almost 3K deer statewide

Preliminary data from the Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) shows that young deer hunters ages 6 through 15 checked 2,944 deer during Missouri's late youth portion of this year's deer hunting season, Nov. 25-27. Of the 2,944 deer harvested, 1,149 were antlered bucks, 426 were button bucks, and 1,369 were does. Top harvest counties were Pike with 70 deer checked, Howell with 55, and Lincoln and Osage with 52 each.

Last year's late youth portion harvest total was 2,353 with 664 being antlered bucks, 376 button bucks, and 1,313 does.

Deer hunting in Missouri continues with archery deer hunting through Jan. 15, firearms antlerless portion Dec. 2-4, and firearms alternative methods portion Dec. 24 through Jan. 3. Missouri offers some of the best deer hunting in the country and deer hunting is an important part of many Missourians' lives and family traditions. Deer hunting is also an important economic driver in Missouri and gives a \$1 billion annual boost to the state and local economies.
