Area Christmas parades start Saturday

'Tis the season for Christmas parades. Most area communities will have parades beginning this upcoming weekend. With Saturday kicking off three parades in Barry County, residents should mark their calendars for where they want to go.

December 2 - Washburn

First up is the Washburn Christmas parade on Saturday, December 2, at 10:30 a.m. The parade will start at the First Baptist Church in Washburn at 10:30 a.m. and end at the Middle School parking lot. The procession will head south from Washburn First Baptist Church to North Street then east to Main Street and south to Highway 90 and proceed east to the end of Southwest Middle School's parking lot.

There are six categories with a trophy for each category. Categories are religious, nonreligious, commercial, marching bands, single unit vehicles and horse-drawn.

December 2 - Exeter

That same day, Exeter's Christmas parade and dinner will follow Washburn's. On Saturday, December 2, Exeter's Christmas dinner will be held from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. at the Exeter Community Building. The dinner is provided by C & C Country store and is \$6 per plate.

Following the dinner, Exeter's Christmas parade will begin at 1:30 p.m. The parade will start at the stop sign at the highway and it goes up the back street to the school and back up Front Street by City Hall. The parade route ends at the school.

First and second places in each category get trophies. One trophy is also given for the City's

Categories are: horses: best presentation and best of show; floats: schools, religious and non-religious; bands: musical and non-musical; tractors: antique (1939 and older) and classic (1940 to 1952); and vehicles: oldest, vintage, most unusual and best modern.

Aurora man allegedly tried to shoot wife

An Aurora man was arrested and charged after allegedly telling his wife that he was going to kill her, stabbing her with a knife and attempting to shoot her with a rifle. Eddie D. Hill, 56, of Aurora, is charged with domestic assault in the first degree with two counts of serious physical injury and two counts of armed criminal action.

According to the affidavits of probable cause, Hill got into two separate altercations with his wife on November 24 at a residence on State Highway 39 in Aurora. The report states that around 5:30 p.m., Hill stabbed his wife in the foot with a steak knife and then fired a rifle inside the home.

The victim then reported that around 9:25 p.m., Hill took his wife's phone to prevent her from calling for help. The victim reported that Hill then pointed a rifle at her and pulled the trigger, but the weapon did not discharge. When she tried to escape by running and locking herself in the car, Hill allegedly unlocked it and began beating her with a metal baseball bat and yelled that he was going to kill her.

Hill allegedly hit her with the baseball bat and his fists

multiple times as well as strangling her until she was unconscious.

When the victim regained her cell phone and called 911, Hill allegedly threatened to kill her and anyone coming to help before fleeing into the woods.

The officer reported that the victim had a stab wound in her right foot, a hematoma in her eye, multiple bruises and lacerations, a broken arm and a laceration in the back of her head.

Hill is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$75,000 cash-only

Purdy man arrested for alleged stabbing **VICTIM FLOWN TO SPRINGFIELD FOR TREATMENT**

Two Purdy men were allegedly involved in a fight that left one of them flown for hospital treatment of stab wounds and the other in jail. According to the Purdy Police Department affidavit of probable cause, the men are brothers and live in the same residence. Michael Shane Whisman, 39, of Purdy, was charged with domestic assault in the first degree and armed criminal

The incident between the two occurred on High Street in Purdy on November 19 around 5:30 p.m. Officers were dispatched for brothers involved in an altercation. Both lived at the residence with their chil-

dren. Two of the children were involved in a fight, and the victim was on top of Whisman's child, attempting to break up the altercation.

Whisman then allegedly stabbed the victim four times. The Purdy Police Department reported that one of the stab wounds was in the chest and the victim was taken by helicopter to a trauma treatment center in Springfield. In a Facebook post, the Purdy Police Department Chief Jack Lowe reported the man was released from the hospital later.

Whisman is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$100,000 cash-only bond.

Two in custody after alleged rock attack, drugs

A Cassville man and woman were arrested for allegedly assaulting another man with a rock last week. Timothy Joseph Pope, 25, of Cassville, is charged with endangering the welfare of a child creating substantial risk in the first degree as a first offense, burglary in the first degree and assault in the first degree with serious special injury to a special victim. Sarah Ann Brideau, 25, of Cassville, is charged with two counts of possession of a controlled substance and one count of endangering the welfare of a child in the first degree creating substantial risk in the first degree as a first offense.

According to the affidavits of probable cause by the Cassville Police Department, Pope went to a home on High Street around 3 a.m. on November 20. While there, Pope allegedly kicked the front door in with his foot

When the victim stepped onto the porch, the report states that Pope hit the victim in the head with a large landscaping rock, which in turn knocked the victim unconscious. Pope then climbed on top of the victim and punched him two times in the head.

According to the report, the cut on the back of the victim's head caused an arterial wound which caused him to bleed profusely and leave him unconscious for an unknown amount of time. During this, the victim was the sole person responsible for caring for a seven month old baby inside the home.

In a separate probable cause affidavit, officers also reported that Brideau was present at the home when the fight occurred and left the residence without her seven month old baby while the victim was unconscious.

When Brideau was located later, officers found her to be in possession of a Clonazepam and methamphetamine.

Pope is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$50,000 cash, corporate surety or 10 percent bond. Brideau was initially held on a \$30,000 bond and bonded out of jail on Tuesday, November 28.

Herrin Animal Hospital holding 18th annual toy drive





Delays expected on Bus. 60

Progress continues on a project to replace the Business 60 railroad bridge east of Monett but construction delays may push the opening of the new bridge into 2018, the Missouri Department of Transportation said.

The original date for completion of the bridge and the reopening of Business Route 60 is December 29. The contractor and MoDOT are working diligently to make that deadline, but construction delays may cause the completion date to move to January 2018.

Winter weather could further delay work. If this occurs, the bridge opening will be delayed until spring 2018. MoDOT will continue to keep the community informed of the bridge progress, with every effort being made to keep the project on track.

Business 60 was closed in mid-July 2017 to allow contractor crews to replace the deteriorating bridge over the railroad tracks.

Hartman Construction of Springfield is the prime contractor on the project. The total estimated project cost is \$3.7 million. who consistently did a great job. She is leaving some big shoes to fill, but I wish her nothing but the best in her retirement. Thank you for your dedication and years of

good. But the good far outweighs the bad."





My wife used the 9-1-1 system to call for an ambulance yesterday, and we were not favorably impressed.

- 1. The dispatcher has such a poor phone system that my wife could barely understand him. Surely the counties could afford a system that is lucid and intelligible.
- 2. The dispatcher asked so many questions that a seriously ill patient could die while the caller is answering them all. We hear that minutes count in many instances, such as stroke. Could the process be streamlined to a few vital ques-
- 3. We live on Highway C south of McDowell—a Cassville address. However, the dispatcher gave our address as Highway C in Pierce City. This had several effects. Since the dispatcher thought we were in Pierce City area he called the Monett ambulance service rather than the Cassville one.

A Cassville ambulance would have been here in a few minutes, but the EMTs first puzzled over the address, as they knew there was no Highway C in Lawrence County. They eventually realized we must be in Barry County and had to find the address in their GPS. They were not familiar with the highways in this neck of the woods, so all in all it took them well over twice as long to get here as it would have a Cassville ambulance, 40 minutes versus 15 minutes.

4. If the dispatcher would have called the Cassville ambulance, the Jenkins Fire Department First Responders would have been here in five minutes, but they do not respond to Monett calls.

When the ambulance finally got here we found the EMTs very competent and

I do hope that someone is trying to make the system more efficient. Remember the saying, "Time lost is never found."

November firearms harvests over 191,000 deer

Preliminary data from the Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) shows that deer hunters in Missouri harvested 191,368 deer during the November portion of fall firearms deer season, Nov. 11-21. Of the 191,368 deer harvested, 99,431 were antlered bucks, 20,148 were button bucks, and 71,789 were does. Top harvest counties were Howell with 4,564 deer checked, Texas with 4,374, and Franklin with 4,095.

Barry County's numbers were 891 antlered bucks, 176 button bucks, and 513 does, for a total of 1,580.

Last year, hunters checked 185,062 deer during the 2016 November portion of firearms deer season with 95,381 being antlered bucks, 18,888 being button bucks, and 70,793 being does.

"The uptick in harvest

this year is likely due to a combination of favorable weather and the continued recovery of deer populations in some areas hit hard by the 2012 drought," MDC Deer Biologist Barb Keller said. "As the November firearms portion creeps one day earlier each year, it tends to coincide with more of the deer in rut – resulting in higher deer harvest."

MDC reported three firearms-related hunting incidents during the fall firearms November portion. One of the hunting incidents involved a hunter wounding another hunter while hunting in Benton County. Another incident involved a hunter loading a gun in a truck and it went off hitting another hunter sitting in the truck in Washington County. Lastly, another hunting incident involved a self-inflicted wound that firearm occurred in Bates County.

archery deer hunting from Nov. 22 through Jan. 15, 2018. The late youth portion of firearms deer season runs Nov. 24-26. The antlerless portion of firearms deer season runs Dec. 1-3. Lastly, the alternative methods portion will run Dec. 23- Jan. 2, 2018.


